



Oliver Goldsmith Primary School 2022 – 23 PE and Sport Premium

Our vision at Oliver Goldsmith is to equip every child in our school with the knowledge and skills needed to pursue and enjoy physical activity and sports. These experiences are ultimately aimed to inspire and motivate students to lead physically active and healthy lives in their teenage years and beyond into adulthood.

Previous funding for PESP at OGPS has been £19,500. See website for past action plans and impact analysis.

In 2022-23 the PESP funding received is £19,530. (This is split into an October/February payment of £11,393 and an April payment of £8,137).

Additionally, £12,305 from last year remained unspent due to delays in building works; these will be added to this year's expenditure.

Therefore, £31,835 have been allocated to 2022/23 in total.

The school will measure the impact of the funding throughout the year through a range of methods such as observation of PE lessons in EYFS, KS1 and KS2, pupil voice, teacher voice, parent feedback, staff surveys as well as attendance and offers of clubs. The PE department is in regular contact with the responsible subject governor, Himesh Patel.
