Our vision at Oliver Goldsmith is to equip every child in our school with the knowledge and skills needed to pursue and enjoy physical activity and sports. These experiences are ultimately aimed to inspire and motivate students to lead physically active and healthy lives in their teenage years and beyond into adulthood.

In 2023-24 the PESP funding received is £20,150.

Additionally £14,109 from last year remained unspent; these will be added to this year's expenditure.

Therefore £31,259 has been allocated to 2023/24 in total.

The school will measure the impact of the funding throughout the year through a range of methods such as observation of PE lessons in EYFS, KS1 and KS2, pupil voice, teacher voice, parent feedback, staff surveys as well as attendance and offers of clubs. The PE department is in regular contact with the responsible subject governor, Himesh Patel.
