


Celebrating Diversity at OGPS...



Then, click on a book and it will take you to a person reading that book for you, there are lots to choose from!










OGPS Gate Update...

Portraits (without faces!)

Challenge #1 - Outline

Portraits are pictures of People. Self-portraits are pictures of you, made by you.

Portraits tell us something about a person. Many portraits show a face, but portraits can tell us a lot more about a person than what they look like.

Take a portrait of yourself or someone else in your household without showing their face! This will be the front of your postcard.

Objects Over Time

Challenge #2 - Outline

Take a series of photographs about 'change' and write a postcard.

Objects and spaces change over time: A flower left in a vase will open up and then slowly start to wilt until its petals have fallen off. Your kitchen changes throughout the day. At night, it is quiet while everyone sleeps. By the morning, it is busy as breakfast is made and the day begins. Take lots of pictures of one object or a space to see how it changes.
