

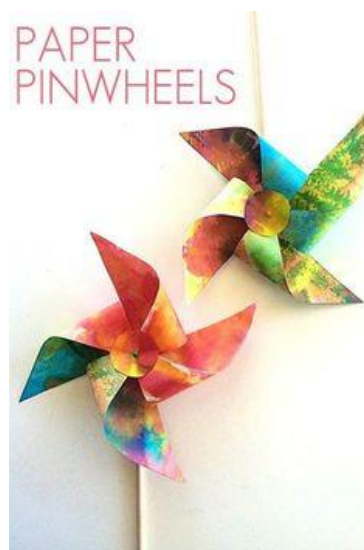


**Week 12**

We are going to be doing lots of activities this week all about summer!

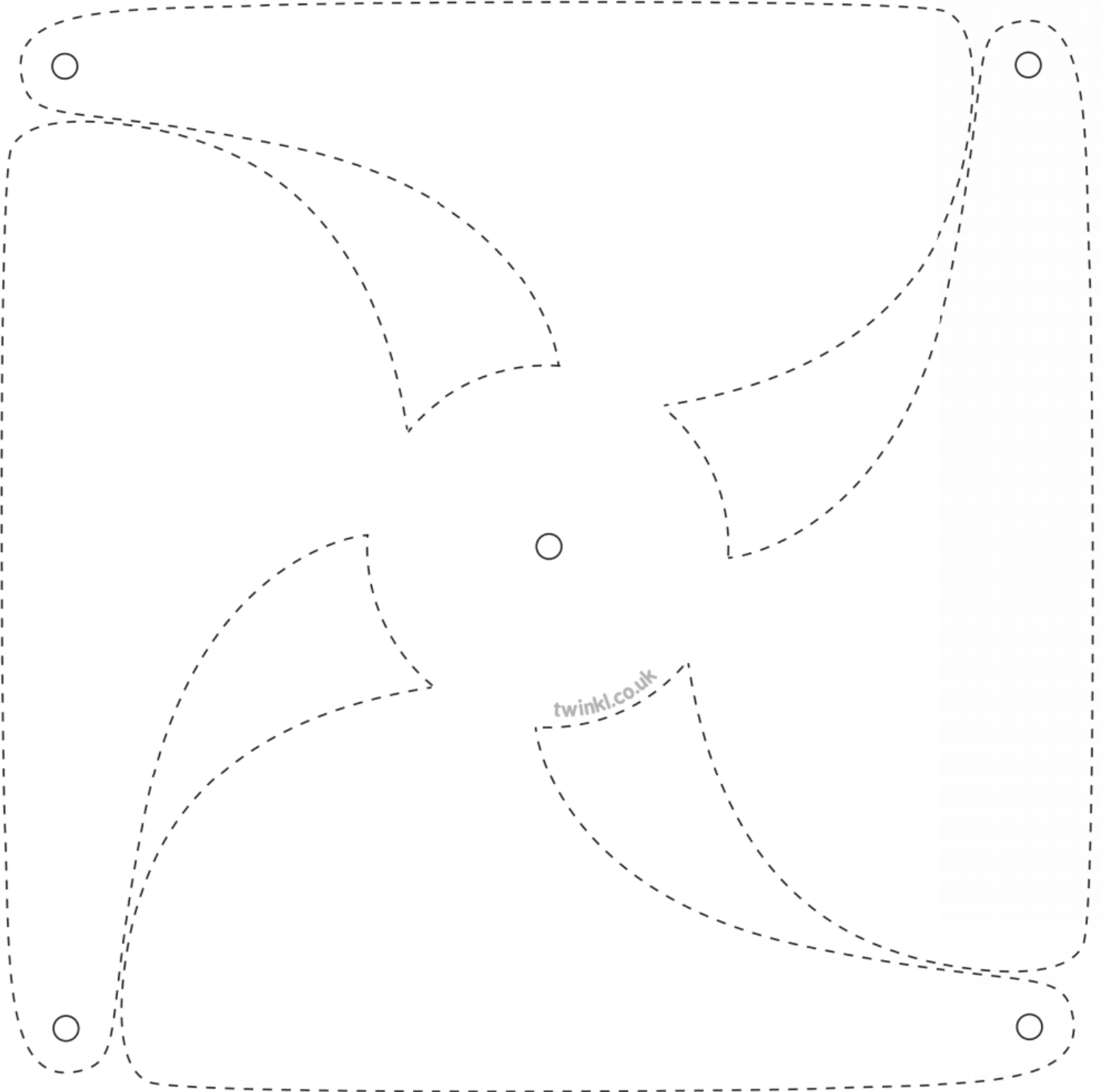

# Printable Pinwheel

You will need:

- Pinwheel template
- Scissors
- Colouring pens or pencils
- Drawing pin
- Wooden dowel (approximately 30cm long)
- Sticky tack

What to do:

- Colour in the pinwheel template on both sides.
- Cut out the pinwheel template along the dotted lines.
- Fold the small circles at the ends of the sails in to meet the small circle at the centre of the pinwheel.
- Carefully push the drawing pin through all the small circles at the centre.
- Place the dowel behind the pinwheel and push the drawing pin into the dowel to secure the pinwheel to its handle. Don't push the drawing pin in too tightly, or the pinwheel won't spin.
- Check the back of the dowel to ensure the sharp end of the drawing pin is not sticking out. Place some sticky tack over it if it is.

Now test your pinwheel outside on a windy day!

#### Ice Paint

Tools:

Food colouring/ water-based paint

Water

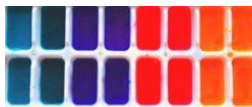
Ice tray

Lollipop sticks

#### Instructions:

Fill an ice tray up with water. In each cube, mix some food colour into the water and place a lolly stick 'handle' into each colour and freeze overnight.

## Frozen Sunny Lollies

**Makes 6**

### Ingredients

- 5 large carrots
- 3 large oranges (including the zest of 1)
- 1 satsuma

### Equipment

- thin tea towel
- sink
- ice lolly moulds
- lolly sticks (if desired)
- jug
- freezer
- juicer
- knife (adult use/ supervision)
- grater (adult use/ supervision)

### Method

1. Wash the ingredients before use.
2. Finely grate the carrot.
3. Then, wrap the grated carrot pieces in the tea towel - making sure that it can't fall out when picked up.
4. Put the jug in the sink.
5. Squeeze the tea towel over the sink and catch the carrot juice in the jug.
6. Cut the three oranges in half and juice them.
7. Then, add the juice of the oranges to the jug.
8. Grate the zest of one orange.
9. Add the zest to the jug and stir well.
10. Peel the satsuma and chop each segment into small pieces. Add these to the jug and stir.
11. Pour this mixture evenly into the lolly moulds and add the lolly sticks, if desired.
12. Leave overnight to freeze and enjoy the next day!





## Wednesday Ice painting

## Thursday

Today is the last day of nursery! to keep you busy today and over summer, are a few activities you can do. Have a look at the activities and see which one you would like to do first.

### Water Painting:

Use pots of water and brushes to paint on a dry pavement. Talk about what you are drawing and what is happening to the water as it dries.

### Planting:

Plant some flowers in your garden or at home. Talk about what plants need to grow and use watering cans to water the flowers. What is happening to the flower over time? Are there any minibeasts on your flower?

### Finding bees and butterflies:

Draw a number of different butterflies and bees. Ask your family to hide the pictures around your house. Can you use a camera to take a picture of all the minibeasts you find? You can do this activity outside too by taking pictures of any insects you might find.

### Make your own boats:

Use a selection of materials to make your own model boats. Try materials such as foil trays, tubs, lolly sticks, paper and clay. Remember to test your boat out in water.

### Looking at shadows:

On a sunny day, explore shadows outside. What objects are making the shadows? Can you draw around the shadows using chalk?

### Seaside pictures:

Make your own seaside pictures. Maybe you could use real sand on your picture?

### Kites:

Use lolly sticks, diamond shaped paper, cellophane and ribbon for children to make your own kite.
