What is the Multiplication Tables Check?

- The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) is a statutory times tables assessment for Year 4 pupils taken in June of each academic year.
- All pupils, who are able to access the Year 4 Maths learning objectives, will take the test.
- The check can be administered over the first 3 weeks of June. Year 4 OGPS pupils will sit their test the week beginning **5th June**.





- The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) consists of 25 times table questions (assessing knowledge of times tables up to 12 X 12) and should take approximately 5 minutes to complete.
- The questions DO NOT include associated division facts.
- Pupils will be given 6 seconds to answer each question
- The test is electronic so pupils will use a laptop to take the test.





What is the purpose of the MTC?

- The purpose of the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) is to assess whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently (up to 12 x tables)- Times tables fluency is essential for future success in mathematics.
- The outcome of the test will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables so that additional support can be given.





Access Arrangements for SEND (pupils with special educational needs or disabilities) and EAL (English as an additional language) pupils

- There are several access arrangements that teachers can put in place to support pupils with specific needs, disabilities or pupils who are new to English.
- Access arrangements include additional time, an input assistant, longer
 pauses between questions and special features for pupils who are visually
 impaired or have a hearing impairment.





How children will be assessed

- There is no pass mark for the test
- Once schools receive the individual scores for each pupil, these will be shared with parents/carers and pupils





 Pupils are currently practising mock tests using the laptops once a week to familiarise themselves with the test.

Here are some strategies if your child is struggling with their times tables:

- Start with the 2's, 5's, and 10's
- Then the 4 and 8 times table
- Move on to the 3's, 6's, and 9's
- Finally the 7, 11 and 12 times table

Practice FREQUENTLY in SHORT bursts (10-15 minutes per day is enough)
