Many of which were held at KHS which also continuous to help with transition links as many of our Y6 pupils move to KHS in Y7. Y6 pupils won the Y6 challenge trophy for the second year running.
Develop provision for PE and Sport throughout the school PE equipment £500 Fixed Playground Development £4000	 Audit and replenish PE resources as necessary Redevelop the KS1 & KS2 playground facilities in summer 2016 to enable the school grounds to support active playtimes for pupils. 	 Over the summer of 2016, both KS1 & KS2 playgrounds were refurbished with a key focus on increasing active engagement or pupils. KS1 had a new adventure playground and new sports area created. KS2 had a new MUGA sports area fitted as well as a cricket area and two ball catchers. Children are more actively engaged across KS1/2 Feedback from parents and children has been very positive. Overall, the school invested approx. £80k in the playgrounds.
Playground game equipment £135	Development of informal physical activity at break times by purchasing new play equipment for Peer Mentors to engage pupils at break times and SMSAs to help engage pupils at lunchtimes	 The elected Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher for the day from our May 2016 election used the money to purchase playground equipment to be distributed to KS1/2. The equipment is used on a daily basis to increase active play at both playtimes and lunchtimes.

Extra Term of Swimming Tuition £1711	Swimming was previously taught over two terms in Y4. Using Sports Premium money, a further term of swimming is directly funded to ensure more children reach the minimum requirement of 25m unaided swimming.	As a direct result of the extra term of swimming, 13 more children managed to reach the requirement of swimming 25m unaided, an increase of 22% of the year group.
Transport for extra term of swimming and costs to attend other tournaments or fixtures £2153	As above To enable pupils to attend competitions etc. without relying upon the support of parents	Money enabled swimming transport to be arranged for the summer term with impact as seen above.
