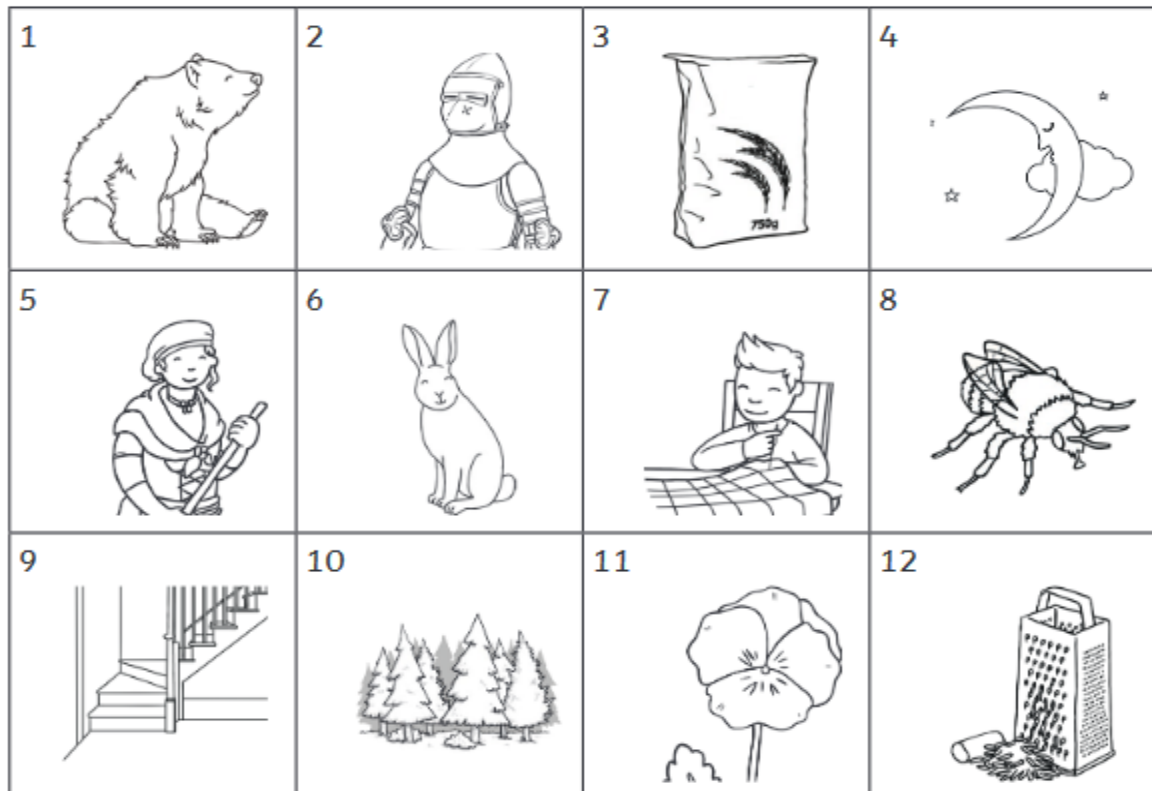


Homophones
