Question One (1 Mark)

1 mark for identifying the correct phrase

Question Two (2 Marks)

1 mark for an appropriate impression. 1 mark for supporting evidence.

Impression – She is very opinionated and rude.

Evidence – ‘nothing more than a mere vandal’

‘...brandishing her nose in the air’

‘...I heard her sniff self-righteously’

Question Three (2 Marks)

1 mark for a simple explanation

E.g. The black and white lone girl is trying to grab a colourful balloon despite it being unlikely for her to get it.

2 marks for a more developed response

E.g. Because he wanted to provide an optimistic message through his imagery. Also, the black and white lone girl is trying to grab a colourful balloon despite it being unlikely for her to get it.

Question Four (1 Mark)

1 mark for an appropriate response

E.g. It suggests that his work had a lot of meaning to the author/his work is relatable.

Question Five (1 Mark)

1 mark for ticking the correct answer

To be unique and get peoples attention



Question Six (2 Marks)

1 mark for an appropriate feeling with no elaboration

E.g. disappointed, upset, irritated, confused

2 marks for a more developed response

E.g. Confused as Scarlett didn't appreciate his talent like she did.
Irritated as Scarlett was blunt with her opinion.

Question Seven (2 Marks)

1 mark for a simple explanation

E.g. Yes because he enjoyed it and had a talent for creating art.

2 marks for a more developed response

E.g. Yes because he enjoyed it and had a talent for creating art. Also, he wanted to get people thinking as it says 'what message was he trying to give us?'

Question Eight (2 Marks)

1 mark for selecting 'yes' and for each of the following points (maximum of 2 marks)

She rolled her eyes when others spoke badly of him.

She certainly appreciated Banksy and what he stood for.

He had always intrigued her.

The images seemed to speak to her.

She had researched him.

She was transfixed by his work.
