What is bullying?

- We've covered this a lot.
- People get confused with how bullying is different between being mean or being silly.
- Can you remember the difference?



What is bullying?

Bullying:

- It doesn't happen just once; it goes on over time and happens again and again.
- It is deliberate, hurting someone on purpose, not accidentally.
- It is unfair, the person doing the bullying is older, stronger and more powerful (or there are more of them) and even if the bully is enjoying it, the person being bullied is not.

Not Bullying:

- It happened one time.
- It can be done accidentally.
- No one is getting offended or hurt.
