# English

#### Reading focus

- To infer story settings and descriptive language.
- Oral discussion: to respond to questions in full sentences and discuss settings and pictures.
- Phase 4 and phase 5 phonics.

## Genres of writing that will be covered

- Fiction: Writing a setting description for a story.
- Non-fiction: Creating a persuasive poster.

#### GPaS focus:

- Use capital letters, full stops and spaces to separate words.
- Use a range of adjectives and conjunctions.
- Use capital letters for names and the pronoun I.

# **Mathematics**

### Number and Place Value

- Confident reading and working with numbers to 100.
- Identifying numbers using pictures and objects.
- Read and write numbers to 20 using numerals and words.
- Identifying one more and one less of any given number up to 20.

#### Addition and subtraction

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.
- Represent and use number bonds and related subtractions facts within 20.

#### Geometry

- Recognising and naming 2D and 3D shapes.
- Describe position, direction & movement, including whole, half, quarter, and three-quarter turns.

# Physical Education
