# English

### Texts that we will be reading this term

### Reading focus

- To infer from characters feelings and actions.
- Responding to questions in full sentences.
  Discussing characters, settings and pictures.
- Phase 5 phonics.

### Genres of writing that will be covered

- Fiction: Character descriptions.
- Non-fiction: Diary entries.
- Poetry: Acrostic poems.

### **GPaS** focus:

- Use capital letters, full stops and spaces to separate words.
- Use a range of adjectives and conjunctions.
- Use capital letters for names and the pronoun I

# Mathematics

### Number and Place Value

- Know number name.
- Reading, writing and counting numbers to 50.
- Know off by heart pairs of numbers that make 10 and 20.
- Begin to understand simple place value e.g.
  17= 1 ten and 7 ones.
- To add and subtract numbers crossing 10.
- To be compare number sentences using 'greater than', 'less than' and 'equal to'.
- Counting to 50 in 2's, 5's and 10's.
- Identifying related facts e. g. 2+5=7 5+2=7 7-5=2 7-2=5

#### Measurement

- Measuring lengths, height, weight and volume.
- Adding lengths.
- Comparing lengths and height.
- Comparing weights.

 Material properties. Seasons – How do the seasons change?

### Computing

Digital writing – how to create and change text.
 Grouping data – how to collect and group data.

- Dance (growing): How to respond to rhythm and patterns through their movement.
