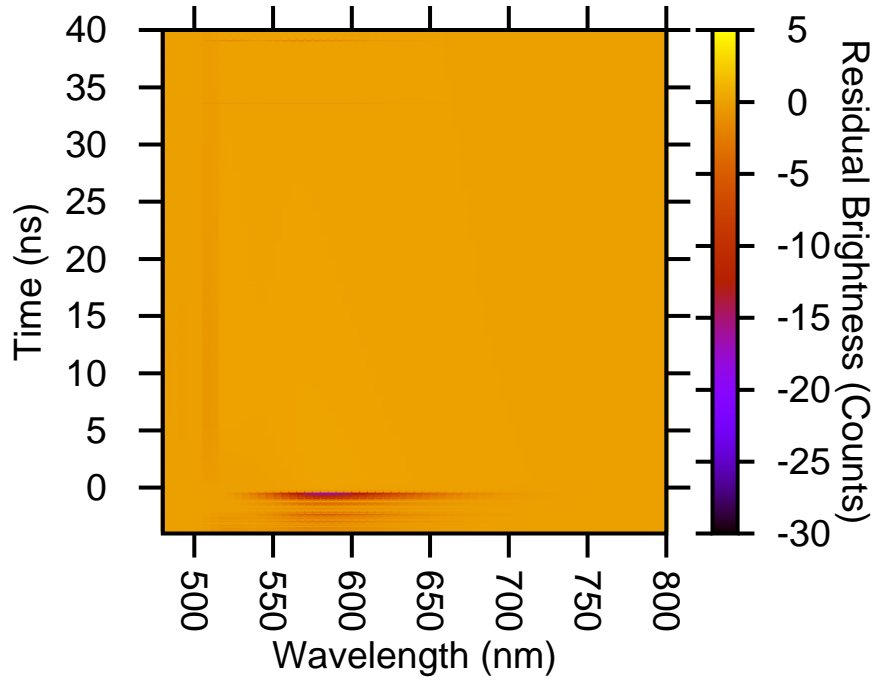


Figure S1: Residuals of the decomposition in Fig. 7 of the main text. In the data, the peak brightness per bin is 10^4 , so the residuals are negligible. We conclude the two component model completely describes the data.
