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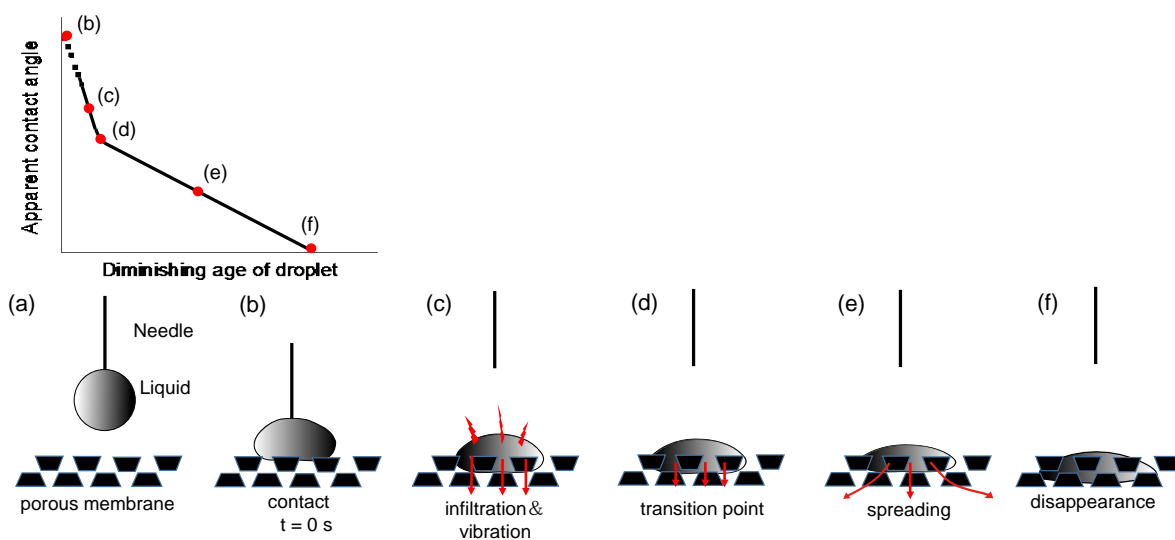


Figure S1. Illustration of the diminishing process of a liquid droplet on the porous membrane surface.
