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Figure S1. 1H NMR of compound 18

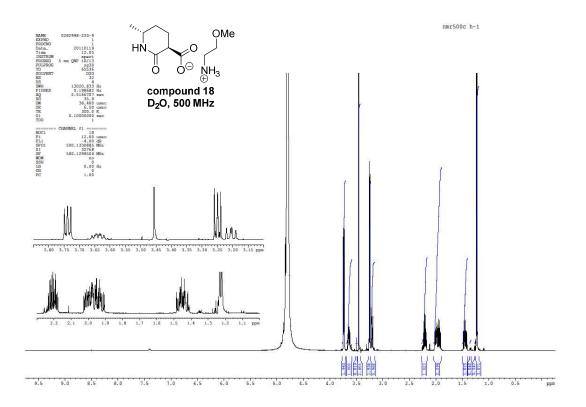
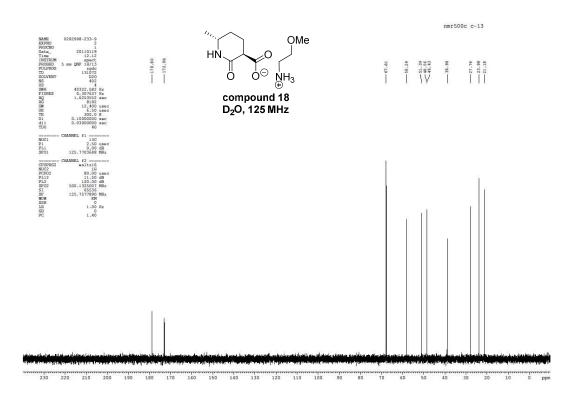


Figure S2. 13C NMR of compound 18



#### Compound 3 trans-cis ratio determination via benzoyl derivatization and chiral LC method:

Column: Lux 3µ Cellulose-4 Phenomenex, 4.6 x 150 mm

Temperature: 40 °C Detector: 210 nm Injection volume: 4 μL Flow Rate: 1.0 mL/min

Mobile Phase Composition: A: 0.1% H<sub>3</sub>PO<sub>4</sub>, B: acetonitrile

Gradient: 20% B to 60% B over 13 min, then to 80% B over 4.5 min, post time 5.5 min

### Derivatization procedure:

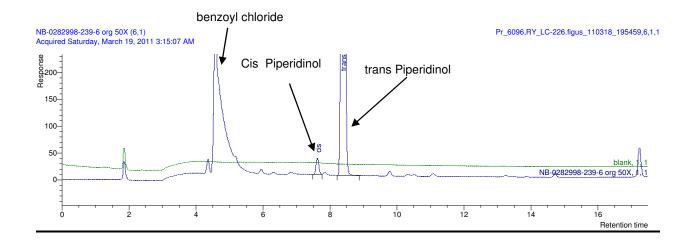
Weighed out 41.42 mg (0.5 mmol) of Piperidinol HCl salt 3, added 0.5 mL of 1.0 N NaOH (1.0 mmol), 0.5 mL of dichloromethane, and finally 60 µL of benzoyl chloride (~1.5 eq). Stirred the reaction mixture for ~5 min and allowed layers to separate (until clear phases are shown). Bottom layer (org layer where the product is): 20 µL into 2.0 mL acetonitrile. For the aqueous layer, 50 µL into 1.0 mL acetonitrile and filtered the solution.

Diluent for org fraction: pure acetonitrile

Diluent for aq fraction: 50/50 MeCN/H<sub>2</sub>O v/v%

Peak NameRTCis-benzamide7.63 minTrans-benzamide8.39 min

#### Crystal data and structure refinement for Compound 20 (CCDC 1417569)

A single crystal grown from acetonitrile and water by slow evaporation was selected for single crystal X-ray data analysis. The crystal was a small colorless lathe with dimensions of 0.02mm x 0.13mm x 0.34mm. Data collection was performed at 100K on an Oxford Gemini system with a Cu radiation source. The unit cell was determined to be orthorhombic in space group P2<sub>1</sub>2<sub>1</sub>2<sub>1</sub> with two independent ion pairs in the asymmetric unit of the crystal lattice along with two molecules of water. Crystallographic data is summarized in Table 1. Absolute configuration was established by reference to the known chiral center at the C6 position and supported by anomalous-dispersion effects in diffraction measurements on the crystal. Results confirmed that the stereochemistry of Compound 20 was 3R, 6R. Figure 1 shows an ORTEP representation of Compound 20 with thermal ellipsoid set at the 30% probability level. Full structural details have been deposited with the Cambridge Crystallographic Data Centre (CCDC 1417569).

**Figure S4**: ORTEP representation of Compound **20** with thermal ellipsoids set at the 30% probability level.

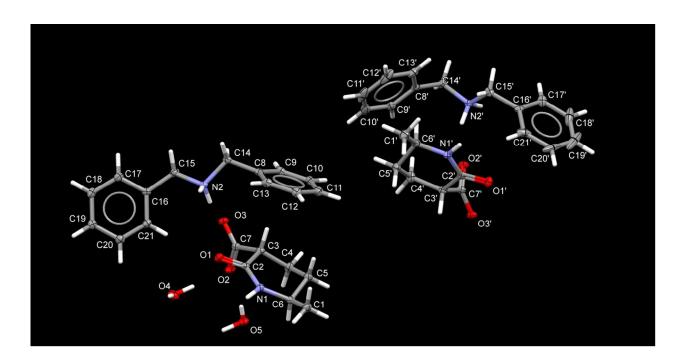

The XRPD patterns of seven samples of MEA salts 18 are essentially identical. The two extra peaks in XRPD pattern of sample 5 is due to the cis isomer, since the sample is 89% d.e.

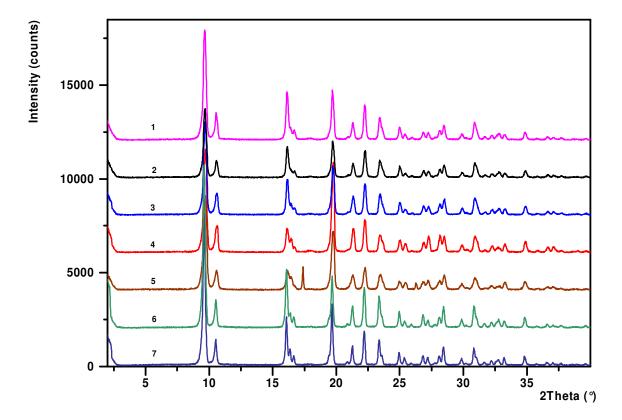
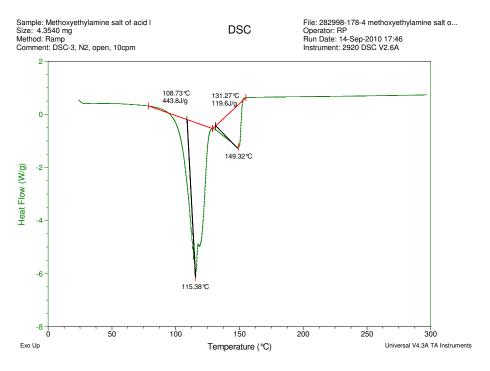
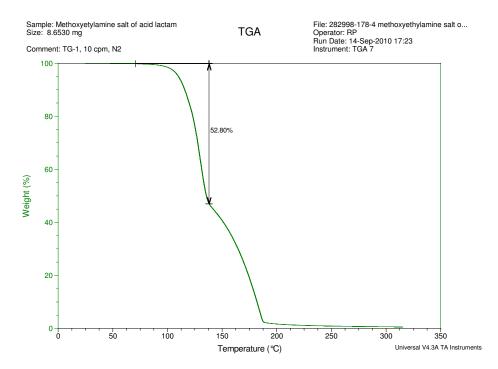
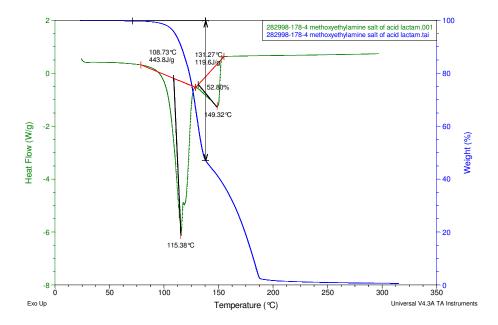


Figure S6: Differential scanning calorimetry (DSC) and Thermogravimetric analysis (TGA) of compound  $18\,$

## **Summary:**

All samples contain the same crystalline form, except sample 5, which is known to have lower purity compared to the other samples. The TGA and DSC data showed that the crystal melts at 109 °C and decomposes immediately after melting. The low solvent content of the samples suggests that the analyzed samples contain anhydrous crystalline form.
