Supporting Information For: Catalytic Dimerization of Crotonates

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1. General Considerations

All reactions and polymerizations were performed in a nitrogen-filled glovebox or using standard Schlenk techniques under nitrogen unless otherwise specified. All glassware was oven-dried

and/or flame dried under vacuum prior to use. Nuclear magnetic resonance (NMR) spectra were recorded at room temperature on a 400 MHz, 500 MHz or 600 MHz spectrometer, with shifts reported in parts per million downfield from tetramethylsilane and referenced to the residual solvent peak. Gel permeation chromatography (GPC) was performed in tetrahydrofuran (THF) at a flow rate of 1.0 mL/min on a Waters chromatograph equipped with four 5 µm Waters columns (300 mm x 7.7 mm) connected in series. Polymer solutions for GPC (ca. 5 mg/mL) were prepared by dissolving the polymer in THF. High-resolution mass spectra were obtained using a desorption electrospray ionization (DESI) nanoelectrospray ionization methods on a LTQ-Orbitrap XL Hybrid mass spectrometer in positive mode, using 10 microliters of a sample of concentration 0.01 M in methanol, with 10 microliters of an internal standard prepared from 1.63 mg caffeine and 1.85 mg gram of rhodamine-123 dissolved in 10 mL of methanol. High-resolution tandem mass spectrometry (MS-MS) spectra were also recorded on a hybrid LTQ-Orbitrap-XL in positive mode. (Infuse rate: 10 uL/min, Spray (source) voltage: 3.4 kV, Nebulizing (sheath) gas: 120 psi N₂, Resolution: 30,000 at m/z 400). Nano-electrospray ionization (nano-ESI) mass spectra were recorded on a hybrid LTO-Orbitrap-XL in positive mode. Electrospray ionization mass spectrometry (ESI-MS) was also performed at the Vincent Coates Foundation Mass Spectrometry Laboratory, Stanford University Mass Spectrometry using a Waters 2795 HPLC system with dual wavelength UV detector, and ZQ single quadrupole MS with electrospray ionization source. FTIR spectra were recorded on a Thermo Scientific Nicolet 6700 FTIR spectrometer using an attenuated total reflectance (ATR) method. CHN elemental analysis was performed by Robertson Microlit Laboratories, New Jersey, USA.

2. Materials

Methyl crotonate and methyl 2-nonenoate were purchased from Sigma-Aldrich and distilled from calcium hydride. Isopropyl crotonate and tert-butyl crotonate were purchased from TCI America and distilled from calcium hydride. Methyl methacrylate (Sigma-Aldrich) was twice washed with 5 wt% NaOH (aq), twice washed with deionized H₂O, and then dried with calcium hydride and vacuum distilled. Diisopropyl adipate (TCI America) and dimethyl adipate (Sigma-Aldrich) were dried with calcium hydride and vacuum distilled prior to use. Ethylene glycol (Sigma-Aldrich) was dried using 4A molecular sieves. 1,4-butanediol (Sigma-Aldrich) was dried with magnesium sulfate followed by filtration and distillation. 4-Nitrophenol (Sigma-Aldrich) was purified by recrystallization from toluene followed by sublimation. Tetrahydrofuran (THF) and toluene were distilled from sodium/benzophenone and degassed three times via freeze-pump-thaw cycles. Anhydrous dimethylformamide (DMF) (Sigma-Aldrich), in a sure-seal bottle was used as received. 1.3-diisopropyl-4.5-dimethylimidazol-2-vlidene (IⁱPr₂Me₂) was prepared according to the literature procedure. 1,5,7-Triazabicyclo[4.4.0]dec-5-ene (TBD) (Sigma-Aldrich) was purified by sublimation. 1,3,4-triphenyl-4,5-dihydro-1H-1,2,4-triazol-5-ylidene was prepared by heating the commercially available 5-methoxy-1,3,4-triphenyl-4,5-dihydro-1H-1,2,4-triazol-5ylidene at 80°C under high vacuum overnight. 1,8-Diazabicyclo[5.4.0]undec-7-ene, (DBU), potassium tert-butoxide (KO^tBu), 1,3-bis(2,4.6-trimethylphenyl)imidazol-2-ylidene (IMes), hydrochloric acid (ACS reagent grade, 37%), and CH₃COOD (98%D) were used as received from Sigma Aldrich. All other solvents were purchased from Fisher Scientific and used as received.

4. Synthetic Procedures

Dimethyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate

The reaction was performed in a 20 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (72.0 mg, 0.399 mmol) in THF (20 mL) was added methyl crotonate (4.00 g, 40.0 mmol) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred at room temperature for 24 hours. The reaction was then quenched by adding approximately 100 mg of 4-nitrophenol. The reaction mixture was removed from the glovebox and the solvent evaporated *in vacuo*. Flash column chromatography (10% ethyl acetate: 90% hexanes by volume, $R_f = 0.3$ [E and Z appearing as one overlapping spot]) afforded 3.60 g (90% yield) of a colorless oil, dimethyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate in an 83:17 E:Z isomeric ratio).

¹H-NMR spectrum is in good agreement with literature spectra. ³⁻⁵

Dimethyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate

- alternative procedure using potassium tert-butoxide as catalyst

The reaction was performed in a 4 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of potassium *tert*-butoxide (14.0 mg, 0.1249 mmol) in THF (1 mL) was added methyl crotonate (250 mg, 2.497 mmol) in one portion. The resulting yellow solution was stirred at room temperature for 15 seconds. The reaction was then quenched by adding approximately 20 mg of hydrochloric acid (37%). The THF was removed *in vacuo*, before the crude product was placed in a separating funnel and 15 mL diethyl ether added. The mixture was then washed twice with water, and the ethereal layer dried with anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and evaporated. Flash column chromatography (10% ethyl acetate: 90% hexanes by volume, $R_f = 0.3$ [E and Z appearing as one overlapping spot]) afforded 222 mg (89% yield) of a colorless oil, dimethyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate in an 80:20 *E:Z* isomeric ratio).

¹H-NMR spectrum (shown in Figure S1) matches that of the IⁱPr₂Me₂-catalyzed methyl crotonate dimerization and is also in good agreement with literature spectra.³⁻⁵

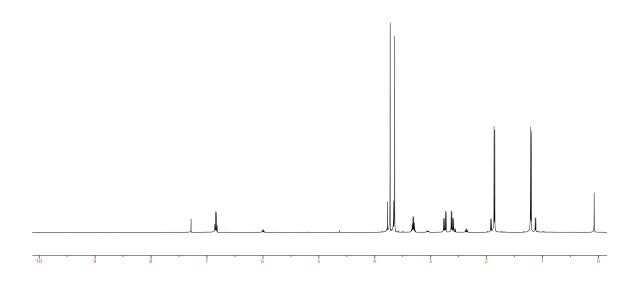


Figure S1. ¹H-NMR spectrum of dimethyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate prepared with KO^tBu catalyst.

Diisopropyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate

The reaction was performed in a 20 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (28.1 mg, 0.156 mmol) in THF (13.4 mL) was added isopropyl crotonate (2.00 g, 15.6 mmol) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred at room temperature for 24 hours. The reaction was then quenched by adding approximately 100 mg of 4-nitrophenol. The reaction mixture was removed from the glovebox and the solvent evaporated *in vacuo*. Flash column chromatography (5% ethyl acetate: 95% hexanes by volume) afforded a colorless oil, 1.75g (87% yield) of diisopropyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate in a 4:1 E:Z isomeric ratio). $R_f = 0.46$ in eluent of 10% ethyl acetate in hexanes [E and Z appearing as one overlapping spot])

Di-tert-butyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate

The reaction was performed in a 4 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (2.2 mg, 0.0122 mmol) in THF (0.2 mL) was added tert-butyl crotonate (34.7 mg, 0.2443 mmol) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred at room temperature for 24 hours. The reaction was quenched by addition of "wet" CDCl₃ and a crude NMR was taken to determine conversion. The crude mixture was then passed through a plug of silica using a solvent mixture of 10% ethyl acetate: 90% hexanes by volume, before the solvent was removed *in vacuo* to give a colorless oil, di-*tert*-butyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate, isolated yield 25 mg (72%) (68:32 *E:Z* isomeric ratio).

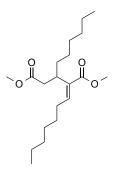

Dimethyl (E)-2-heptylidene-3-hexylpentandioate



The reaction was performed in a 20 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of potassium *tert*-butoxide (16.6 mg, 0.148 mmol) in THF (3 mL) was added methyl 2-nonenoate (501 mg, 2.942 mmol) in one portion. The resulting yellow solution was stirred at room temperature. Conversion to products was assessed by ¹H-NMR after 30 minutes (>99% conversion; ratio (*E*)-isomer: (*Z*)-isomer: side-product 56:11:32) and after 18 hours (>99% conversion; ratio (*E*)-isomer: (*Z*)-isomer: side-product 69:13:18).

After 18 hours the reaction was quenched by adding approximately 20 mg of hydrochloric acid (37%). The THF was removed *in vacuo*, and then the crude product was placed in a separating funnel and 15 mL diethyl ether added. The mixture was washed twice with water, and the ethereal layer dried with anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and evaporated. The yield of crude product (containing (*E*)-isomer, (*Z*)-isomer and side-product) was 471 mg (94% yield).

Reverse-phase high performance liquid chromatography (HPLC), gradient 50 to 100% acetonitrile in water (containing 0.1% trifluoroacetic acid), was used demonstrate the isolation of the (E)-isomer product: 25 mg of the crude product mixture was dissolved in 1 mL of methanol and injected into the column. The HPLC trace is shown in Figure S2. Fractions 53-54 resulted in the (E)-isomer (colorless oil). Yield: 16 mg (64%).

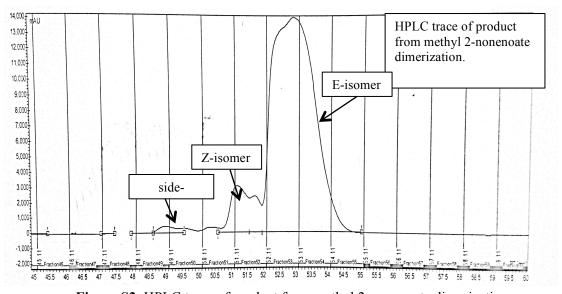


Figure S2. HPLC trace of product from methyl 2-nonenoate dimerization

(*E*)-stereochemistry was confirmed by ${}^{1}\text{H}$ - ${}^{1}\text{H}$ NOESY NMR spectroscopy, which revealed an NOE between protons at δ 2.23 and δ 3.07-3.14 (Figure S3).

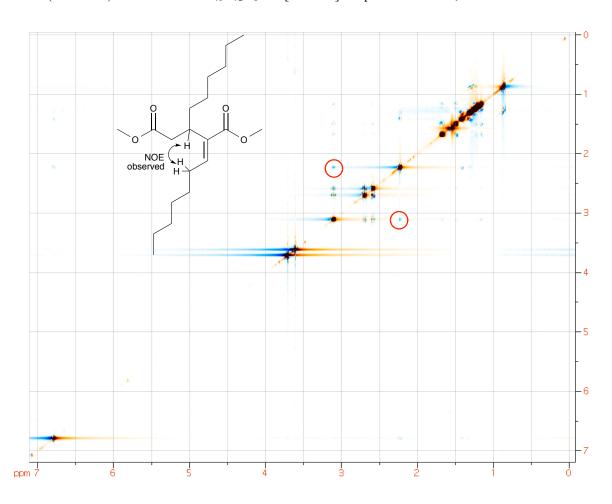


Figure S3. ¹H-¹H NOESY spectrum of *E*-dimethyl 2-heptylidene-3-hexylpentandioate.

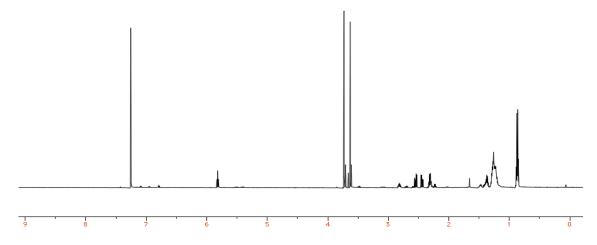


Figure S4. ¹H-NMR of fractions 51-52 (containing mainly (*Z*)-isomer).

Fraction 50 (yield 1 mg) contained the side-product (Figure S5). The side-product was assigned as dimethyl 2-(hept-1-en-1-yl)-3-hexylpentanedioate based on ¹H-¹H COSY (Figure S6), and defined as isomer *X* in Scheme 2 of the main paper.

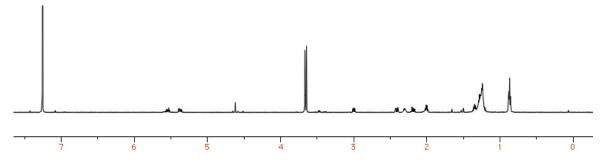


Figure S5. Crude ¹H-NMR of fraction 50 (containing the side-product).

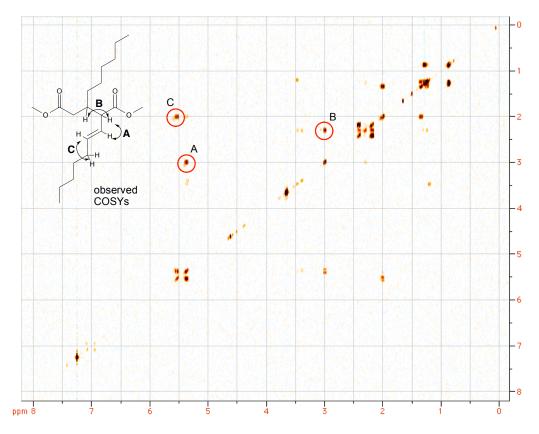

The reaction was repeated with 5 mol% IⁱPr₂Me₂ instead of KOⁱBu (Table 1, Entry 16 in the main paper). Comparing crude NMR spectra (Figure S7) of the reaction mixture of both these reactions, it is clear that the dimethyl 2-heptylidene-3-hexylpentandioate and dimethyl 2-(hept-1-en-1-yl)-3-hexylpentanedioate (defined as Isomer *X* in Scheme 2 of the main paper) are formed in both IⁱPr₂Me₂ and KOⁱBu –catalyzed dimerization.

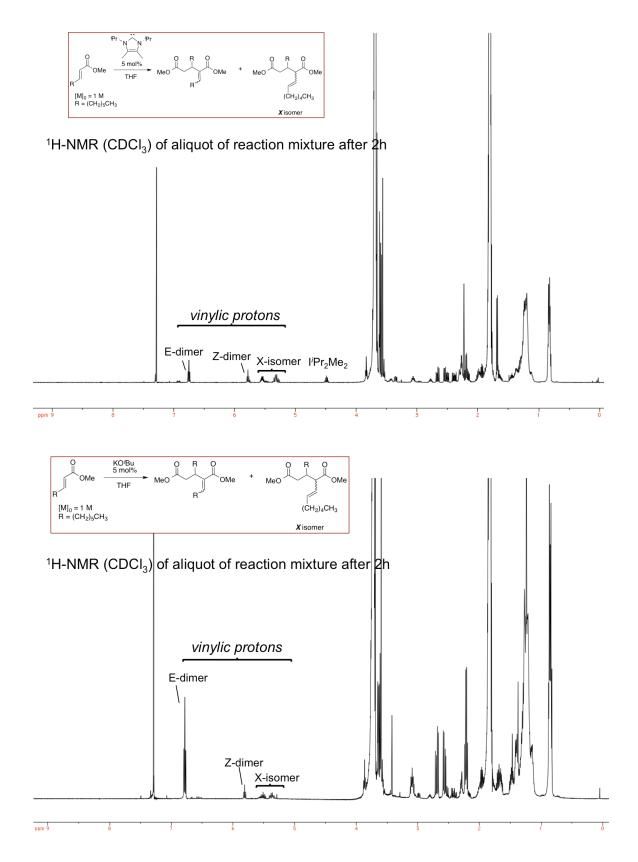

Dimethyl 2-ethyl-3-methylpentanedioate

A 100 mL round bottom flask was charged with 20 mL anhydrous methanol and dimethyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate (1.00 g, 4.99 mmol) and sealed with a rubber septum. Nitrogen gas was bubbled through the mixture for 15 minutes to remove any oxygen gas present. 10% Pd on C (132.2 mg, 0.125 mmol) was then added in one portion to the mixture, the rubber septum replaced, and N_2 bubbled through the mixture for another 15 minutes. The nitrogen was then replaced for a balloon filled with hydrogen gas. The reaction was then stirred under this hydrogen gas for 24 hours, after which time the atmosphere in the flask was replaced with N_2 , and the flask then was opened to the air. The reaction mixture was then filtered through celite wetted with ethyl acetate (taking care not to let the celite dry out). The filtrate was then concentrated on a rotary evaporator to remove volatiles. Flash column chromatography (40% ethyl acetate: 60% hexanes by volume) afforded 0.906 g (90% yield) of a colorless liquid, $R_f = 0.8$.

Diisopropyl 2-ethyl-3-methylpentanedioate

A 10 mL round bottom flask was charged with 2 mL anhydrous methanol and diisopropyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate (100 mg, 0.387 mmol) and sealed with a rubber septum. Nitrogen gas was bubbled through the mixture for 15 minutes to remove any oxygen gas present. 10% Pd on C (10 mg, 0.00940 mmol) was then added in one portion to the mixture, the rubber septum replaced, and N_2 bubbled through the mixture for another 15 minutes. The nitrogen was then replaced for a balloon filled with hydrogen gas. The reaction was then stirred under this hydrogen gas for 16 hours, after which time the atmosphere in the flask was replaced with N_2 , and the flask then was opened to the air. The reaction mixture was then filtered through celite wetted with ethyl acetate (taking care not to let the celite dry out). The filtrate was then concentrated on a rotary evaporator to remove volatiles. Flash column chromatography (20% ethyl acetate: 80% hexanes by volume) afforded 91 mg (90% yield) of a colorless liquid, $R_f = 0.3$.

(E)-2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioic acid

In a 25 mL round bottom flask with stirbar was added dimethyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate (300 mg, 83:17 E:Z isomer ratio, 1.245 mmol E:0.255 mmol Z) and 1 mL methanol. The flask was placed in an oil bath at 45 °C. Potassium hydroxide pellets were crushed up using a mortar and pestle and the powder (342 mg, 6.00 mmol) added in one portion. The flask was stoppered was a rubber septum and stirred for 3 hours. Over time solid began to precipitate and the reaction mixture turned slightly yellow. Water (5 mL) was added to quench the reaction, and the reaction mixture then transferred to a separating funnel. Diethyl ether (2 x 5 mL) was added to remove any unreacted ester, and the organic layers discarded. 1N HCl was added to the aqueous layer until pH 2 was reached. Diethyl ether was added (3 x 10 mL), the ethereal layers combined, dried with sodium sulfate and concentrated on a rotary evaporator, and placed on a high vacuum line to dry. Flash column chromatography (67% hexanes: 33% ethyl acetate to 50% hexanes: 50% ethyl acetate) enabled the separation of the E isomer from the remainder of the reaction mixture as a white solid, isolated yield (150 mg, 0.871 mmol, 58% isolated yield, 70% of the theoretical maximum yield of E isomer).

Dimethyl 2-heptyl-3-hexylpentanedioate

The crude product mixture from the dimerization of methyl 2-nonenoate (*vida supra*) was hydrogenated, transforming to a single product, namely dimethyl 2-heptyl-3-hexylpentanedioate.

A 10 mL round bottom flask was charged with 3 mL anhydrous methanol and 150 mg crude dimethyl 2-heptylidene-3-hexylpentandioate and sealed with a rubber septum. Nitrogen gas was bubbled through the mixture for 15 minutes to remove any oxygen gas present. 10% Pd on C (10 mg, 0.0094 mmol) was then added in one portion to the mixture, the rubber septum replaced, and N_2 bubbled through the mixture for another 15 minutes. The nitrogen was then replaced for a balloon filled with hydrogen gas. The reaction was then stirred under this hydrogen gas for 24 hours, after which time the atmosphere in the flask was replaced with N_2 , and the flask then was opened to the air. The reaction mixture was then filtered through celite wetted with ethyl acetate (taking care not to let the celite dry out). The filtrate was then concentrated on a rotary evaporator to remove volatiles. The crude product 1 H-NMR spectrum indicated that only one main product was formed (Figure S8). A final purification was performed using flash column chromatography (5% ethyl acetate: 95% hexanes by volume), which afforded 120 mg (80% yield) of a colorless liquid.

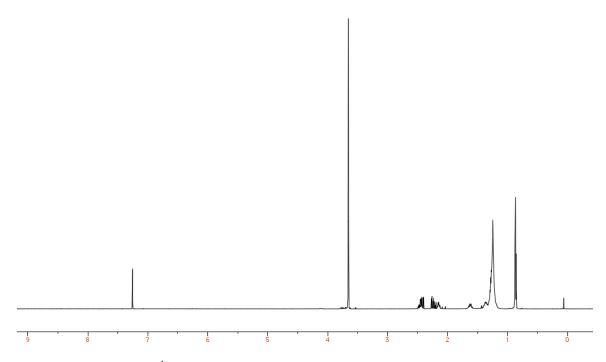

5. Reactions of Crotonates with other Organic Catalysts

5a. Reactions of catalytic quantities of DBU and TBD with isopropyl crotonate

Experimental

The reactions were performed in a 4 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of base – either TBD or DBU – (0.0780 mmol) in THF (0.6 mL) was added isopropyl crotonate (100 mg, 0.780 mmol) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred at room temperature for 24 hours. After this time, a small aliquot was withdrawn, CDCl₃ added, and a crude NMR was taken to determine monomer conversion.

Results

The reaction of 10 mol% DBU with isopropyl crotonate in THF resulted in no visible monomer conversion by ¹H-NMR (Figure S9).

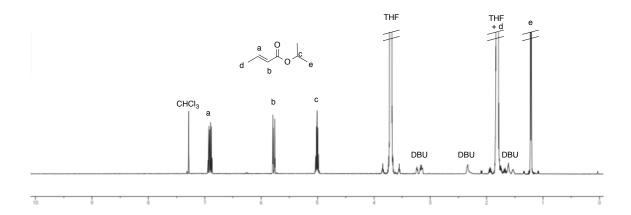


Figure S9. Crude ¹H-NMR spectrum of reaction mixture of 10 mol% DBU and isopropyl crotonate in THF (24 h)

The reaction of 10 mol% TBD with isopropyl crotonate in THF resulted in approximately 6% conversion of the isopropyl crotonate to a "3-TBD butanoate" addition product (Figure S10).

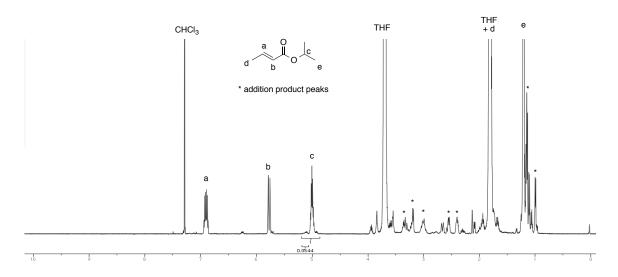


Figure S10. Crude ¹H-NMR of reaction mixture of 10 mol% TBD and isopropyl crotonate in THF (24 h)

5b. Reactions of stoichiometric quantity of TBD with isopropyl crotonate

To confirm the presence of the "3-TBD butanoate addition" product described in Section 5a, the reaction of a stoichiometric amount of TBD with isopropyl crotonate was carried out.

Experimental

In a nitrogen-filled glovebox to a J-Young tube was added a solution of TBD (69.6 mg, 0.500 mmol) in d⁸-THF (0.5 mL) and then isopropyl crotonate (64.1 mg, 0.500 mmol) in one portion. A small amount of the TBD failed to dissolve. The tube was sealed and taken out of the glovebox. A ¹H-NMR spectrum was was taken after 15 minutes, 145 minutes and 1010 minutes.

Results

After 15 minutes (Figure S11), the conversion of monomer to the "isopropyl 3-TBD butanoate" addition product is approximately 30%.

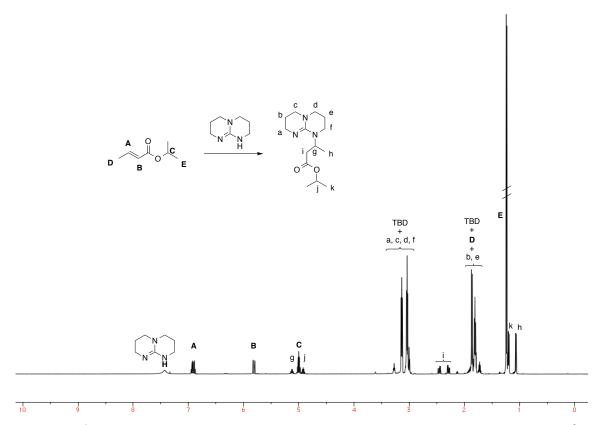

After 145 minutes (Figure S12), the conversion of monomer to the "isopropyl 3-TBD butanoate" addition product is approximately 70%. Isopropyl alcohol also begins to appear in the spectrum and by 1010 minutes (Figure S13) has significantly increased in concentration. After 1010 minutes the ¹H-NMR spectrum also contains significant (unassigned) side-products.

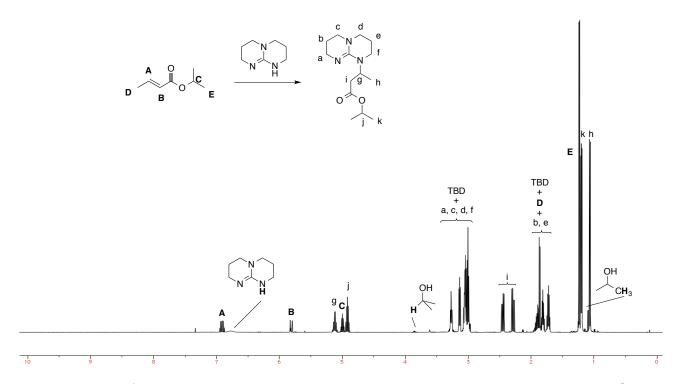

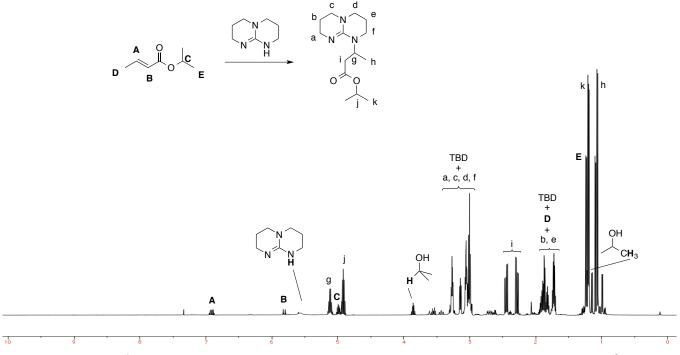

5c. Reaction of catalytic quantity of TPT with methyl crotonate

In a nitrogen-filled glovebox, TPT (6.7 mg, 0.023 mmol, 0.1 equiv.) was added to a 4 mL vial with Teflon screw top, followed by methyl crotonate (22.7 mg, 0.227 mmol, 1 equiv.), and 1 mL d⁸-toluene, and a magnetic stirbar. The vial was sealed, removed from the glove box, and stirred in an oil bath at 80°C for 18 hours. After this time, the vial was brought back into a glove-box and added to a J-Young tube. ¹H-NMR was then taken to assess conversion.

Results

The reaction of 10 mol% TPT with methyl crotonate in d^8 -toluene resulted in conversion of 10% of the methyl crotonate and all present TPT to the single-addition product (Figure S14). The isomeric ratio of products is 2:1, however we were unable to ascertain whether the E or Z isomer was the major product.

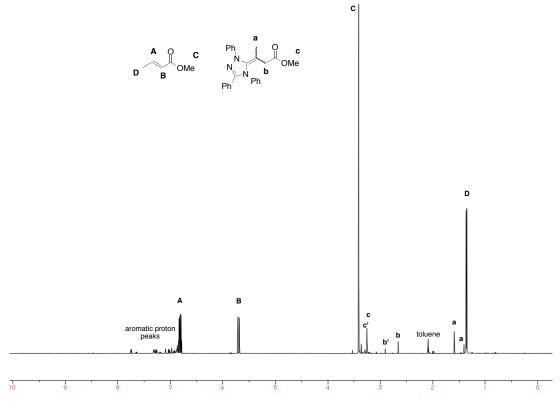

5d. Reaction of stoichiometric quantity of TPT with methyl crotonate

Experimental

The reaction was then repeated using the same conditions but with 1 equiv. TPT (67.4 mg, 0.227 mmol) and 1 equiv. methyl crotonate (22.7 mg, 0.227 mmol). Again, ¹H-NMR was taken to assess conversion, and high-res mass spectrometry was used to confirm the mass of the product.

Results

The reaction of 1 equiv. TPT with methyl crotonate in d^8 -toluene resulted in 91% conversion of the methyl crotonate to the single-addition product (Figure S15). The isomeric ratio of products is 2.7:1, however we were unable to ascertain whether the E or Z isomer was the major product. The mass of the product was confirmed by high-resolution mass spectrometry (Figure S16).

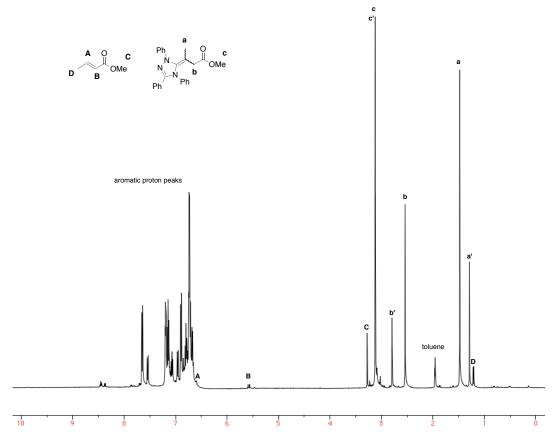

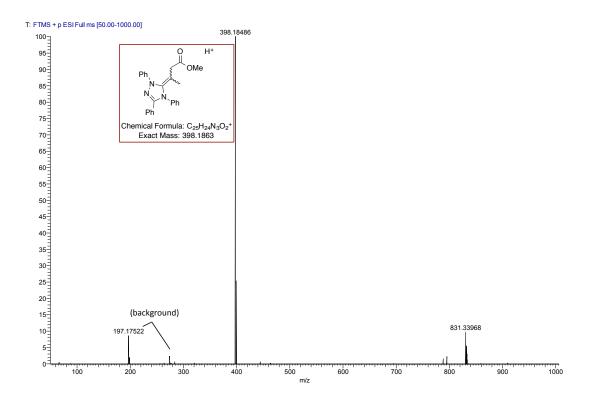


Figure S16. High-resolution DESI mass spectrum of reaction between methyl crotonate and 1 equiv. TPT in toluene

5e. Reaction of stoichiometric quantity of IMes with methyl crotonate

Experimental

In a nitrogen-filled glovebox, IMes (21.9 mg, 0.0719 mmol, 1 equiv.) was added to a 4 mL vial, followed by d⁸-THF (0.5 mL) and methyl crotonate (7.2 mg, 0.0719 mmol, 1 equiv.). The resulting reaction mixture was immediately transferred to a J-Young tube, and the tube sealed and removed from the box. 1 hour later, the reaction mixture was analyzed by ¹H-, ¹³C-, ¹H-¹³C HMBC and ¹H-¹³C HSQC NMR spectroscopy (Figures S17 – S20), and nano-ESI mass spectrometry (Figure S21).

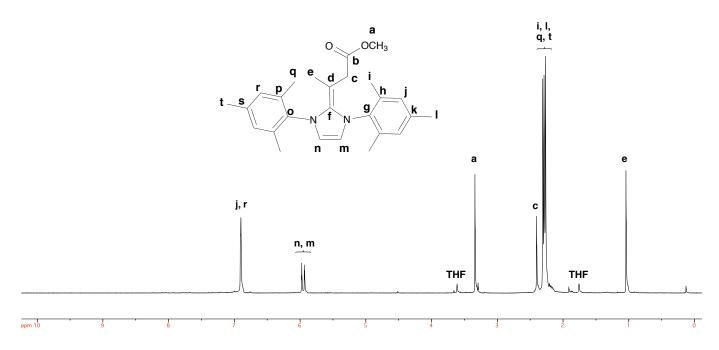


Figure S17. ¹H-NMR (d⁸-THF) of reaction between methyl crotonate and 1 equiv. IMes.

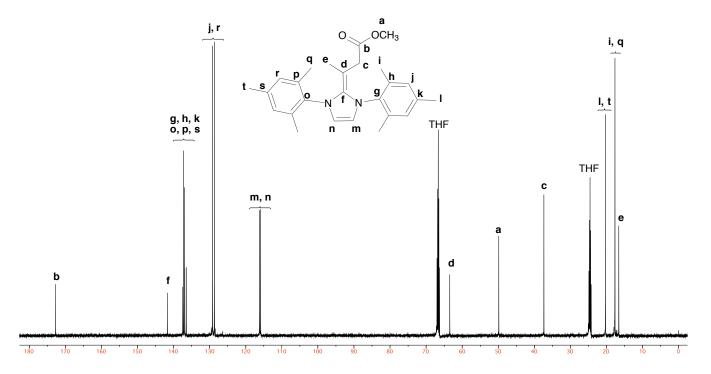


Figure S18. ¹³C-NMR (d⁸-THF) of reaction between methyl crotonate and 1 equiv. IMes.

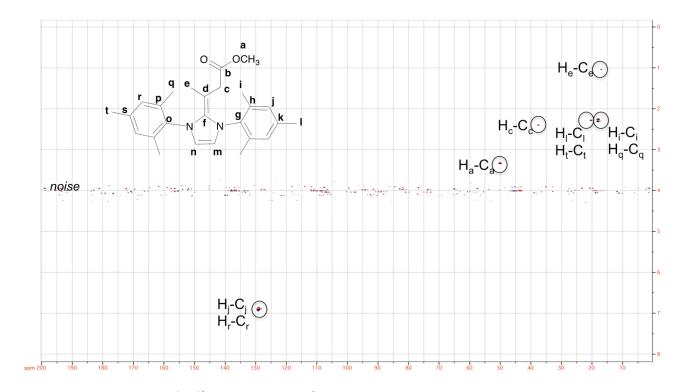
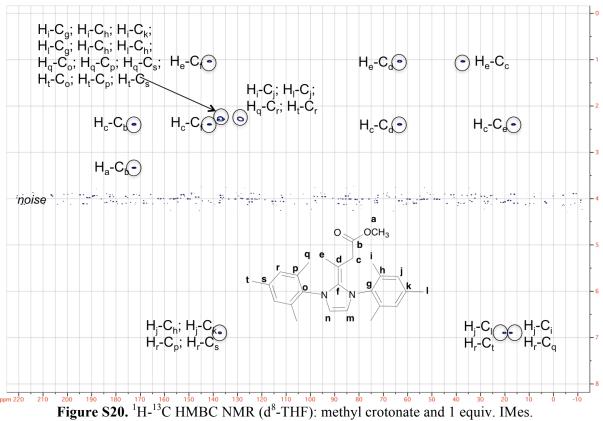


Figure S19. ¹H-¹³C HSQC NMR (d⁸-THF): methyl crotonate and 1 equiv. IMes.



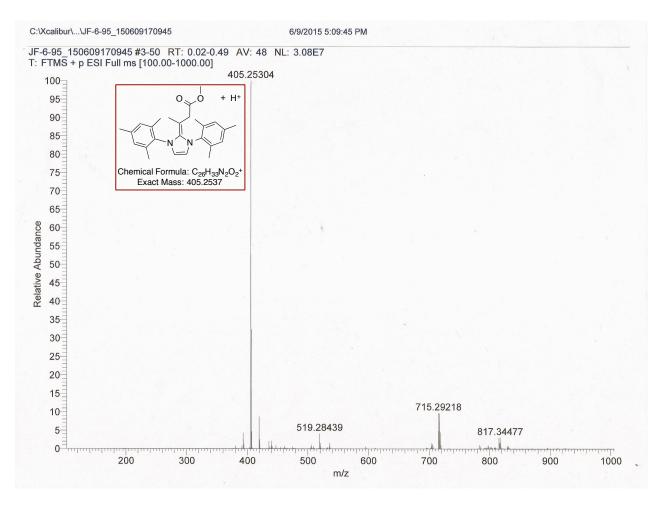


Figure S21. nano-ESI mass spectrum (0.002 M in THF) of crude reaction mixture of methyl crotonate and 1 equiv. IMes.

5f. Reaction of methyl methacrylate with IiPr2Me2

Experimental

In a nitrogen-filled glovebox, a J-Young tube was charged with methyl methacrylate (10.1 mg), d8-THF (0.45 mL), and IⁱPr₂Me₂ (18.2 mg). The tube was sealed, removed from the box, and a ¹H-NMR was taken to assess conversion after 30 minutes (Figure S22 (iii)). The J-Young tube was returned to the glovebox, where another 15 mg of methyl methacrylate was added to the tube to give a total of 2.5 equiv. of methyl methacrylate to 1.0 equiv of IⁱPr₂Me₂. The tube was sealed, removed from the box, and a ¹H-NMR was taken after a further 30 minutes (Figure S22 (iv)). HSQC and HMBC (Figures S24 and S25) aided product assignments. High-resolution mass spectrometry (Figure S26) was used to confirm product mass.

Results

The ¹H-NMR spectra (Figure S22) shows that there is 2:1 stoichiometry of methacrylate:IⁱPr₂Me₂ in the product. The ¹H-NMR spectra of the starting materials methyl methacrylate and IⁱPr₂Me₂ are also shown in Figures S22(i) and (ii) respectively for comparison. There is quantitative conversion of the carbene. A ¹³C-NMR spectrum is also included (Figure S23). HSQC (Figure S24) and HMBC (Figure S25) show that the product is likely to be of the type reported recently by Taton and coworkers. ⁶ ¹H- and ¹³C-NMR assignments are shown on the right. High-resolution mass spectrometry (Figure S26) confirmed product mass. There was a 2.5:1.0 isomeric ratio, however we were unable to ascertain which isomer was the major product.

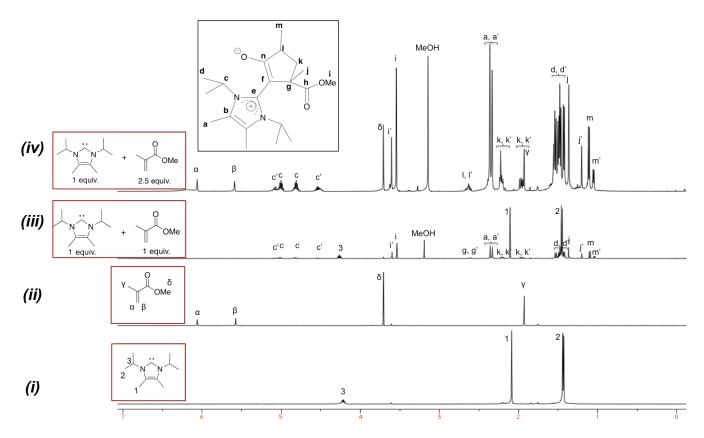
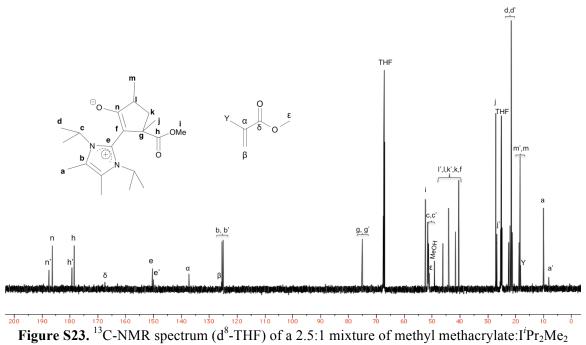

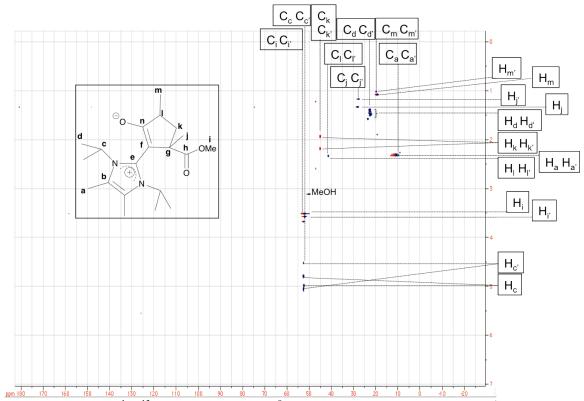

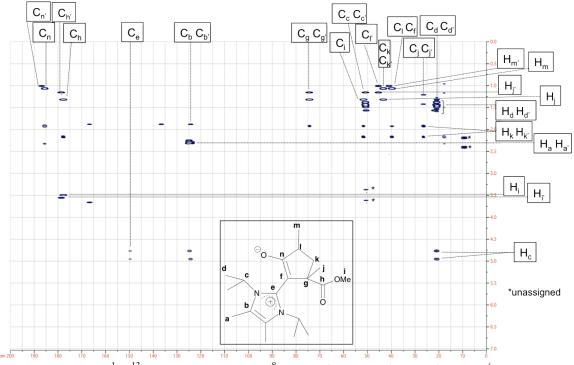

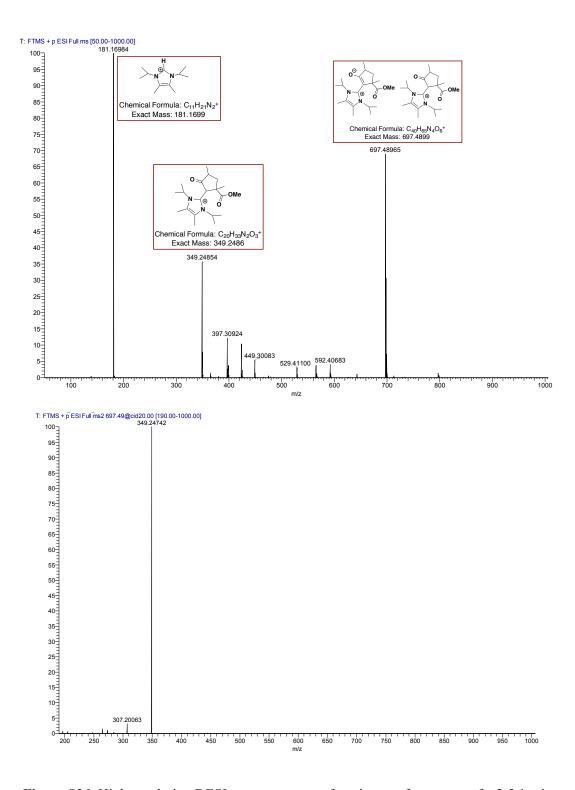

5g. Reaction of methyl methacrylate with TPT

Experimental

This was a repeat of literature experiments⁷⁻⁹ to ensure the TPT was of sufficient quality to carry out subsequent reactions with crotonates.

The reagents were added in a nitrogen-filled glovebox, and the reaction vessel used was a 1 dram vial with a screw cap septum. To 50.1 mg of methyl methacrylate (0.500 mmol) was added 14.9 mg of TPT (0.050 mol). The vial was removed from the glovebox, and stirred under nitrogen in an oil bath for 8 hours at 80 °C. An aliquot was then removed, CDCl₃ added and a ¹H-NMR spectrum taken to assess conversion (Figure S27).

Results

Conversion to the tail-to-tail dimer (measured by NMR) was 60%. A crude spectrum is shown in Figure S27.

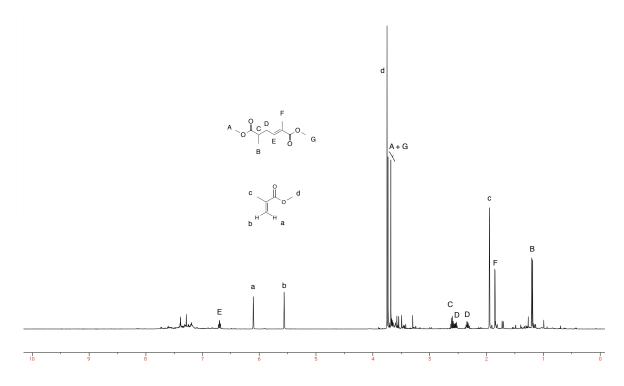

6. Mechanistic Studies by Mass Spectrometry

6a. ESI Tandem MS-MS of 1 M isopropyl crotonate + 5 mol% IⁱPr₂Me₂ in THF (Scheme 4A, Main Paper)

Experimental

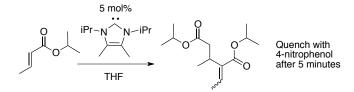
The reaction was performed in a 4 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (10.0 mg, 0.0555 mmol) in THF (1 mL) was added isopropyl crotonate (142.2 mg, 1.10932 mmol) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred for 5 minutes and then quenched with excess 4-nitrophenol. The solution was diluted to 0.0001 M in THF and injected into a hybrid LTQ-Orbitrap-XL to perform tandem MS-MS. A full spectrum is shown in Figure S28. The peak at m/z 437 (corresponding to the dimer-carbene) adduct was then fragmented by collision induced dissociation (CID). Figure S29 shows the *successive* fragmentation of the peaks at m/z 437.34 (Spectrum A), then 395.29 (Spectrum B), then 353.24 (Spectrum C) and then 311.20 (Spectrum D) respectively.

Results

From Figure S28, a large peak at m/z 437.3361 corresponds to the mass of the isopropyl crotonate dimer plus $I^iPr_2Me_2$. Tandem MS-MS was then performed which allowed for fragmentation of the peak at m/z 437.3361 (Figure S29). The fragmentation pattern shows peaks corresponding to the loss of one (peak a), two (peak b) and three (peak c) isopropyl (C_3H_7) groups from the cation. Further fragmentation of peak b at m/z 353.2419 reveals the loss of the final isopropyl group. At no point in the tandem MS-MS experiment is the loss of $I^iPr_2Me_2$ from the m/z

437.3361 species detected, and we can therefore be confident that the peak at m/z 437.3361 is indeed an addition product between $I^iPr_2Me_2$ and the dimer and not simply an ion pair between $I^iPr_2Me_2$ and dimer. Interestingly, a peak corresponding to an addition product of monomeric isopropyl crotonate and $I^iPr_2Me_2$ was not detected in the ESI-MS experiment, suggesting that either addition of crotonate to $I^iPr_2Me_2$ is followed by rapid enolate addition into a second monomer, or that the peak at m/z 437.3361 is formed by addition of the $I^iPr_2Me_2$ directly into the dimer and that such an addition species may not necessarily be part of the catalytic cycle (Scheme 3, Main Paper).



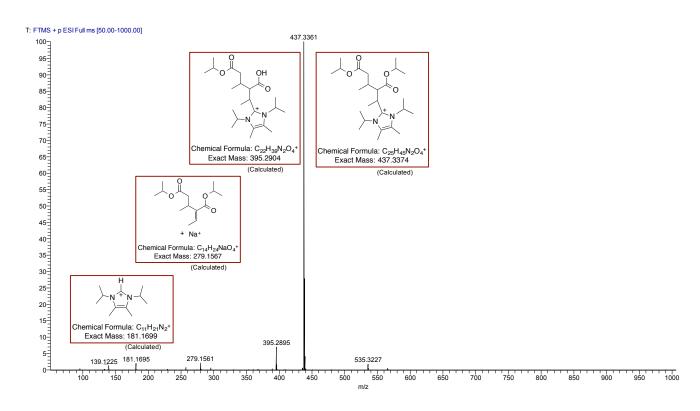

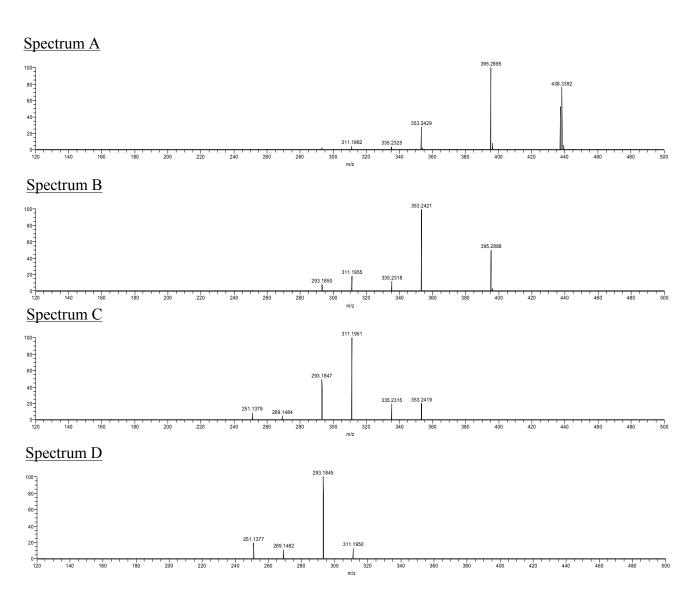

6b. High-resolution ESI-MS study of $I^i Pr_2 Me_2$ -catalyzed dimerization of methyl crotonate, quenched with CH_3COOH

Experimental

The reaction was performed in a 4 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (4.5 mg, 0.02496 mmol) in THF (0.5 mL) was added methyl crotonate (50.0 mg, 0.4992 mmol) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred at room temperature for 120 seconds (corresponding to a monomer conversion of \sim 25%). The reaction was then quenched by addition of approximately 60 mg of CH₃COOH. The reaction mixture was diluted 100-fold in THF, and immediately taken to a mass spectrometer, where high-resolution ESI-MS was performed.

Results

The resulting spectrum is shown in Figure S30, with zoom-ins of the regions m/z 180-185 and 380-385 shown in Figures S31 and S32 respectively.

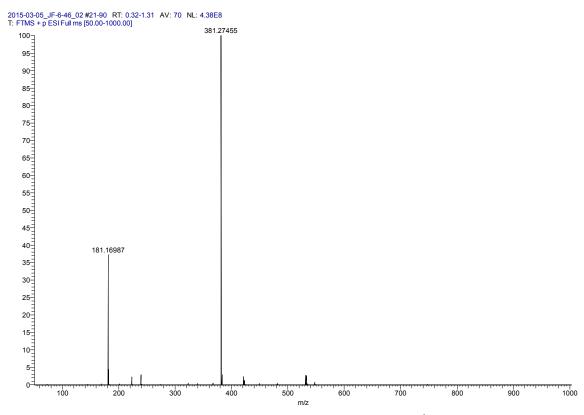

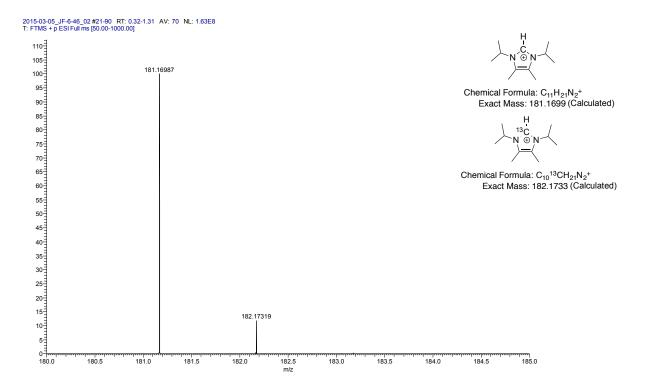

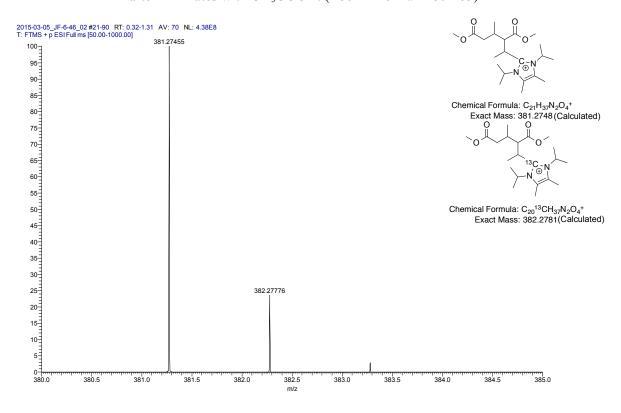

6c. High-resolution ESI-MS study of IⁱPr₂Me₂-catalyzed dimerization of methyl crotonate, quenched with CH₃COOD

Experimental

The reaction was performed in a 4 mL vial in a nitrogen-filled glovebox at room temperature. To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (4.5 mg, 0.02496 mmol) in THF (0.5 mL) was added methyl crotonate (50.0 mg, 0.4992 mmol) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred at room temperature for 120 seconds (corresponding to a monomer conversion of \sim 25%). The reaction was then quenched by addition of approximately 60 mg of CH₃COOD. The reaction mixture was diluted 100-fold in THF, and immediately taken to a mass spectrometer, where high-resolution ESI-MS was performed.

Results

The resulting spectrum is shown in Figure S33, with zoom-ins of the regions m/z 180-185 and 380-385 shown in Figures S34 and S35 respectively.

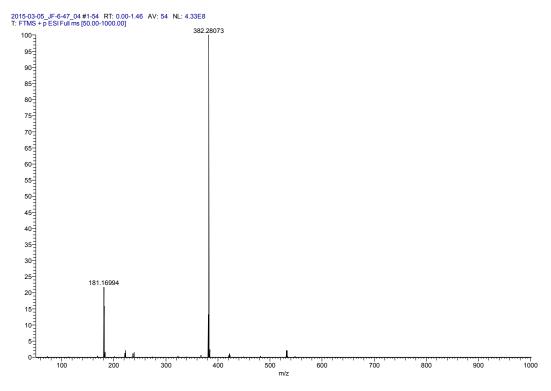

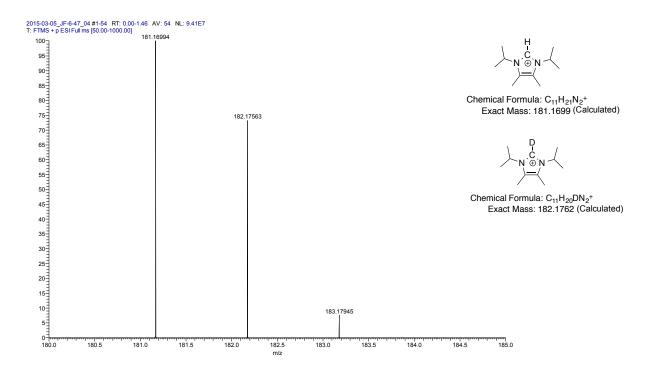

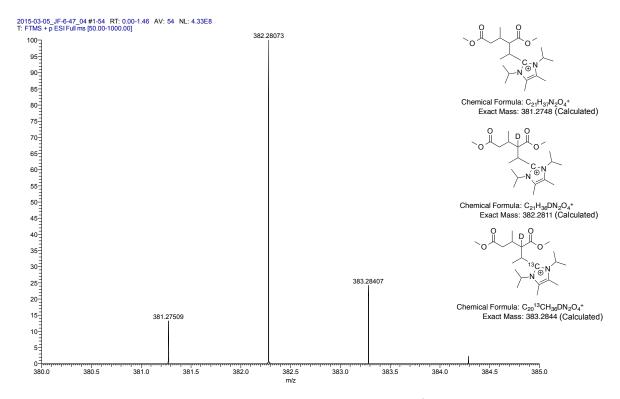

Experimental

To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (7.0 mg, 0.0390 mmol) in THF (0.080 mL) was added diisopropyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate (10.0 mg, 0.0390 mmol) (prepared via KO^tBu-catalyzed dimerization) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred for 5 minutes and then quenched with 35 mg CH₃COOH. The solution was diluted to 0.0001 M in THF and injected into a hybrid LTQ-Orbitrap-XL to perform ESI mass spectrometry.

Results

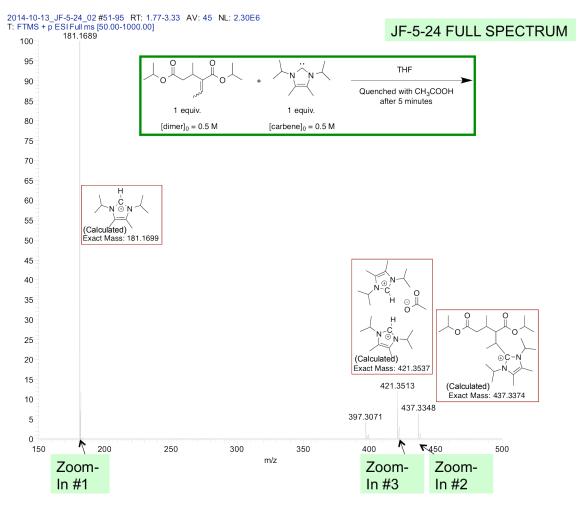
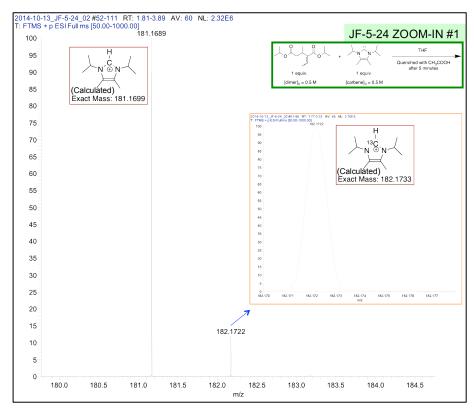

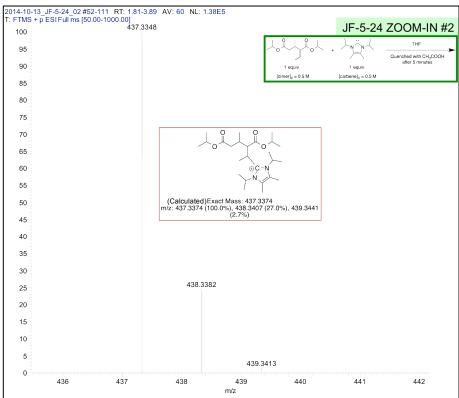

6e. ESI-MS: 1 M diisopropyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate and 1 M IⁱPr₂Me₂ in THF, quenched with CH₃COO<u>D</u>

Experimental

To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (7.0 mg, 0.0390 mmol) in THF (0.080 mL) was added diisopropyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate (10.0 mg, 0.0390 mmol) (prepared via KO^tBu-catalyzed dimerization) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred for 5 minutes and then quenched with 35 mg CH₃COOD. The solution was diluted to 0.0001 M in THF and injected into a hybrid LTQ-Orbitrap-XL to perform ESI mass spectrometry.

Results

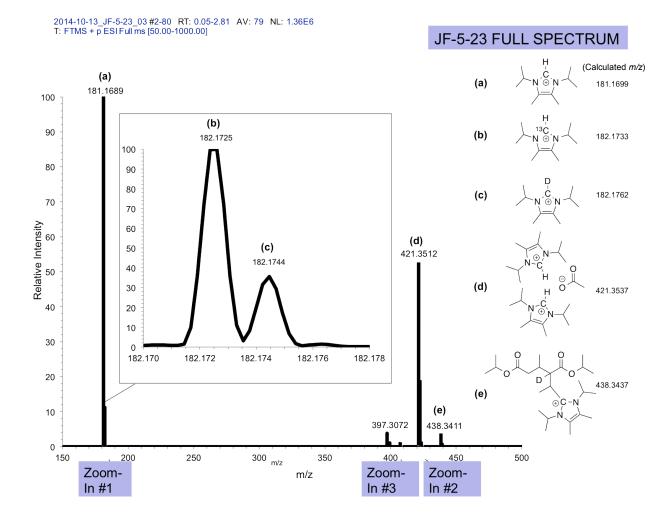
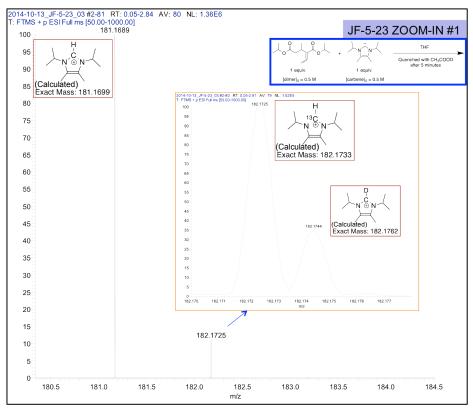

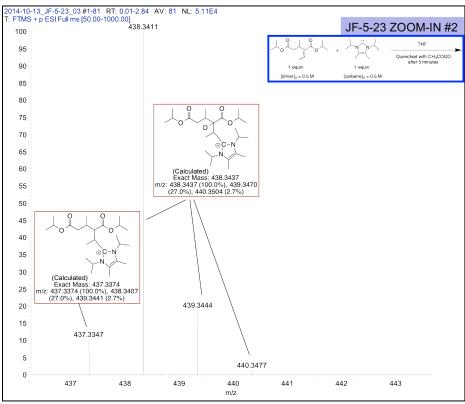

6f. ESI-MS: to assess potential contribution from H/D exchange on peak intensities in mass spec mechanistic experiments

Experimental

To a stirred solution of 1,3-diisopropyl-4,5-dimethylimidazol-2-ylidene (9.0 mg) in THF (0.5 mL) was added a solution of diisopropyl 2-ethylidene-3-methylpentanedioate (100.1 mg) in THF (0.5 mL) in one portion. The resulting solution was stirred for 5 minutes and then quenched with 60 mg CH₃COOH. 0.1mL of the reaction mixture was removed, diluted to 0.0001M in THF, and injected into a hybrid LTQ-Orbitrap-XL to perform ESI mass spectrometry. To the remaining reaction mixture (0.9 mL) was added CH₃COOD. At various time-points, 0.1mL aliquots were removed, diluted to 0.0001M in THF, and injected into a hybrid LTQ-Orbitrap-XL to perform ESI mass spectrometry, and the observed relative peak intensities noted in Tables S2 and S3.

From these results we can see that the addition of an equimolar amount of CH_3COOD to an already CH_3COOH -quenched reaction mixture has a negligible impact on species detected by mass spec, even after 4 hours. All the mass spectra in this paper were acquired within 1 hour of quenching the reaction mixture. Therefore, we can be confident that species in the mass spectra in this manuscript are not ascribable to H/D exchange arising from quenching the reaction mixture.

The mass spectra for this experiment are given in Section 11 of this Supporting Information.

7. Attempted NHC-catalyzed Group Transfer Polymerization of isopropyl crotonate

(where M = isopropyl crotonate; I = initiator = MTS silyl ketene acettal; C = catalyst = $I^{i}Pr_{2}Me_{2}$)

The reaction was performed inside a nitrogen-filled glovebox. A stock solution of IiPr₂Me₂ was prepared by dissolving 3.0 mg (0.0166 mmol) of IiPr₂Me₂ in 2 mL of THF, From this solution, 0.100 mL was withdrawn and added to a vial (equipped with a magnetic stir bar) containing 0.570 mL of THF. To this vial was added 0.035 mL (0.174 mmol) of MTS silyl ketene acetal. With stirring, 1.000 mL of isopropyl crotonate (6.94 mmol) was then added over 3 minutes at room temperature. Immediately after addition of the isopropyl crotonate the solution turned yellow. After 24h, methanol was added to quench the reaction and the solution turned clear. The solution was then analyzed by ¹H-NMR (Figure S38), which showed negligible transformation of the any of the starting crotonate.

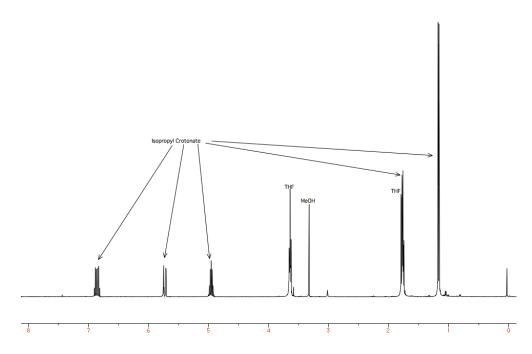

8. Polymerization Screening: Step-growth by transesterification

Reactions were carried out in a Schlenk flask or in glass vials fitted with a septum screw cap. In a nitrogen-filled glovebox, the diester, diol and catalyst were added to the reaction flask, the flask sealed and brought into a fume hood. The reaction mixture was then subjected to the conditions listed in Table S4.

"In most cases the yield, M_n and M_w/M_n are taken for the crude sample, with any residual solvent simply evaporated at the end of the reaction, and the weight, M_n (by PS-calibrated GPC) and M_w/M_n (by PS-calibrated GPC) of the crude sample recorded.

^bCatalyst **2** was generated in situ by the reaction of 0.1 equiv. 1,3-dimethylimidazolium methyl sulphate with 0.08 equiv. potassium *tert*-butoxide in 2 mL THF, and stirred for 1 h before being filtered into a Schlenk flask, to which diester A (0.531 g, 1 equiv.) and EG (1 equiv.) were added. The Schlenk flask was then evacuated on a vacuum line and stirred for 24 hours at 65 °C.

^cCatalyst **3** (0.002 equiv.) was added to A (0.531 g, 1 equiv.) and EG (1.2 equiv.) in a round bottom flask in a nitrogen-filled glovebox and sealed with a rubber septum. The flask was then removed from the glovebox and placed in a hood, and the septum quickly exchanged for a short-path vacuum distillation apparatus. The flask was then heated at 105 °C under N₂ for 2 hours, and then cooled to 80 °C before being slowly opened to vacuum. When full vacuum was achieved the flask was heated in steps to (temperature °C, time hrs): (85,0.5; 90,0.5; 100,1.25; 115,1; 130,0.5; 150,0.5; 170,0.5).

^dIn a nitrogen-filled glovebox, catalyst **1** (0.05 equiv) was added to a solution of diester A (50 mg) and diol in 2 mL THF in a 4 mL vial with a septum screw cap. The vial was removed from the glovebox, placed on a vacuum line and stirred under vacuum for 24 hours at 65 °C.

^eCrude reaction mixture at end of reaction consisted primarily of monomer.

^fIn a nitrogen-filled glovebox, catalyst **1** (0.05 equiv) was added to a solution of diester A (50 mg) and diol in 2 mL THF in a 4 mL vial with a septum screw cap. The vial was removed from the glovebox, placed on a vacuum line and stirred under vacuum for 24 hours at 65 °C, 23 hours at 100 °C and 1 hour at 120 °C.

^hIn a nitrogen-filled glovebox, in a round bottomed flask fitted with a vacuum adapter, catalyst **1** (0.001 equiv.) was added to diester B (0.531 g, 1 equiv.) and EG (1 equiv.). The flask was removed from the glovebox and the reaction mixture stirred under vacuum for 24h at 85 °C.

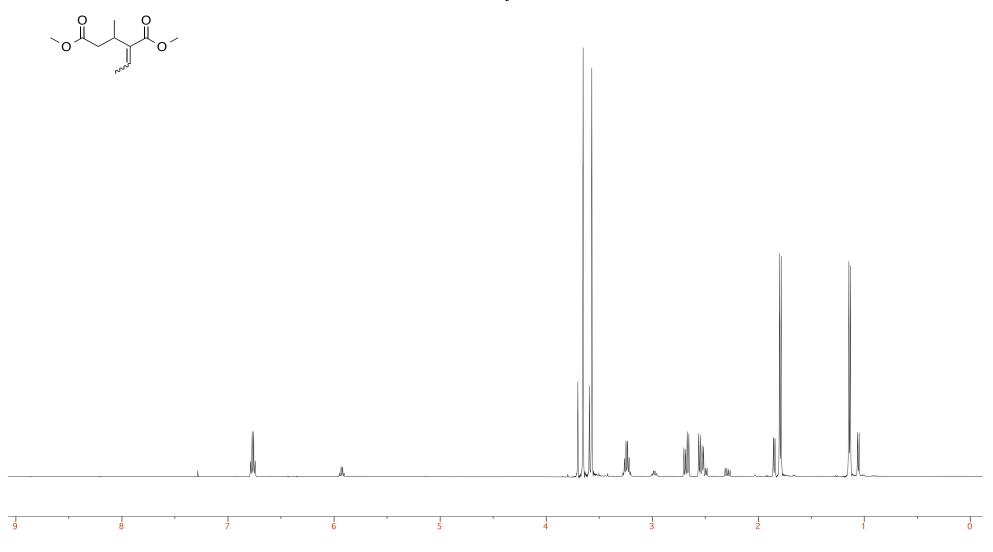
