# Wacker-Type Oxidation and Dehydrogenation of Terminal Olefins Using Molecular Oxygen as the Sole Oxidant without Adding Ligand

#### 1. General Information

All commercial reagents and solvents were used as received without further purification. Reactions were followed with TLC (0.254 mm silica gel 60-F plates). Visualization was accomplished with UV light. Flash chromatographies were carried out on silica gel 200-300 mesh. All NMR spectra were obtained at ambient temperature using Varian INOVA-400MHz spectrometer.  $^{1}$ H NMR and  $^{13}$ C NMR spectra were recorded using CDCl<sub>3</sub> as solvent. Spectra were referenced internally to the residual proton resonance in CDCl<sub>3</sub> ( $\delta$  7.26 ppm), or with tetramethylsilane (TMS,  $\delta$  0.00 ppm) as the internal standard. Chemical shifts ( $\delta$ ) were reported as part per million (ppm) in  $\delta$  scale downfield from TMS. Multiplicities are reported as follows: s = singlet, d = doublet, t = triplet, m = multiplet, br. s = broad singlet. The known products were characterized by comparing to the corresponding  $^{1}$ H-NMR and  $^{13}$ C-NMR from the literatures. Infrared (IR) spectra were recorded using KBr Solid on a Brucker EQUINOX55 instrument. High resolution mass spectrometry data were obtained on a micro TOF-Q II (hybrid quadrupolar/time-of-flight) API US system by electrospray ionization (ESI) in the positive ion mode using a Bruker instrument.

### 2. Representative Procedure for the Synthesis of Butenylated Arenes: 3b-3f<sup>1</sup>

To a flame-dried 100 mL flask was added benzyl bromide (1.0 equiv) and 20 mL anhydrous THF. The reaction flask was under an atmosphere of nitrogen and allylmagnesium bromide was added dropwise (1.0 M in Et<sub>2</sub>O, 2.0 equiv). The reaction was stirred for 4h at RT and then quenched with saturated aqueous NH<sub>4</sub>Cl. The aqueous layer was extracted with CH<sub>2</sub>Cl<sub>2</sub> and the combined organics were dried over MgSO<sub>4</sub>, filtered through celite, and concentrated in vacuo. The crude product was purified by flash chromatography (eluent: hexane), affording the desired product as a clear, colorless oil.

## 3. General Procedure for Palladium-Catalyzed Wacker Oxidant Using Oxygen as the Oxidant

A seal tube containing terminal olefins  $\mathbf{1}$  (1 mmol) and Pd(OAc)<sub>2</sub> (10 mol %), was evacuated and filled with dioxygen gas using an oxygen containing balloon. Then, DMSO (2.5 mL), H<sub>2</sub>O (0.25 mL) and trifluoroacetic acid (TFA) (1 mmol) were sequentially added to the system via syringe under an oxygen atmosphere. The reaction mixture was stirred at 70 °C until completion of the reaction (TLC). Then the reaction was cooled to RT and partitioned between water and ethyl acetate. The layers were separated and the organic layer was washed with aqueous saturated brine solution, dried over MgSO<sub>4</sub>, filtered and concentrated under reduced pressure. Purification by flash chromatography afforded the methyl ketones 2.

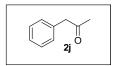
