# 3D molecular descriptors important for clinical

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Sheets S1 and S2. See accompanying Excel sheets. Screening assays, designed to test for inhibition of binding or enzyme activity, provide information about the biological activity and selectivity of compounds tested. Values are expressed as the percent inhibition of specific binding and represent the average of replicate tubes at the concentration tested. The standard baseline range runs from -20% to +20% inhibition of binding or enzyme activity. Compounds exhibiting results in this range are considered inactives at those receptor sites, while those showing 50% inhibition or greater are considered as actives.

## S5. nAChRs binding assay.

Binding to nAChRs was conducted by modification of standard methods.  $^{66,67}$  The human epithelial cells, SH-EP1, and SH-SY5Y cells expressing human  $\alpha$ 4 $\beta$ 2 and  $\alpha$ 3 $\beta$ 4 nAChRs, were used as membrane sources, respectively. [ $^{3}$ H]nicotine and [ $^{3}$ H]epibatidine were used as radioligands at  $\alpha$ 4 $\beta$ 2 and  $\alpha$ 3 $\beta$ 4, respectively. For human  $\alpha$ 7 nAChR, the HEK\_Human  $\alpha$ 7/RIC3 cell line and [ $^{3}$ H]epibatidine were used as membrane source and radioligand, respectively. The HEK\_human  $\alpha$ 7/RIC3 cells were obtained from Jon Lindstrom (University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, PA). Both [ $^{3}$ H]nicotine and [ $^{3}$ H]epibatidine were purchased from Perkin Elmer (Waltham, MA). For rat  $\alpha$ 4 $\beta$ 2 binding assay, membranes from the cortex of female Sprague-

Dawley rats were used. The radioligand concentration for  $\alpha 4\beta 2$ ,  $\alpha 3\beta 4$ , and  $\alpha 7$  binding assays were 2, 1, and 10 nM, respectively. In brief, membranes were freshly reconstituted from their frozen stocks and incubated for 2 h on ice in 150  $\propto$ l assay buffer containing (in mM) Tris (50), NaCl (154), pH 7.4, in the presence of test compound (10 pM to 100  $\propto$ M) and radioligand. Nonspecific binding was determined in the presence of 100  $\propto$ M nicotine. Incubation was terminated by rapid filtration on a 96-channel manifold tissue harvester (Brandel, Gaithersburg, MD), using glass-fiber filters presoaked in 0.33% (w/v) polyethyleneimine. Filters were washed three times with ice-cold assay buffer and the retained radioactivity was determined by liquid scintillation counting. Data were analyzed with GraphPad Prism 5.0 (GraphPad Software, Inc., CA) fitting them to the built-in non-linear least-square equation for IC50 determination and Ki calculation. For the Cheng-Prussof equation the Kd value of 0.7 nM for [ $^3$ H] nicotine, 0.3 nM and 6.3 nM for [ $^3$ H] epibatidine were used for  $\alpha$ 4 $\beta$ 2,  $\alpha$ 3 $\beta$ 4 and  $\alpha$ 7, respectively.

[ ${}^{3}$ H]epibatidine was used as radioligand at  $\alpha 3\beta 4$ , the ganglion-type nicotinic receptors on SH-SY5Y cellular membranes and human  $\alpha 7$  nAChR in the HEK.
