1 GENERAL EXPERIMENTAL CONDITIONS

All reactions were carried out under argon in flame-dried glassware. Solids were added in a counter flow of argon. Syringes and cannulas were flushed with argon before use. Oxygen or water sensitive substances were stored and handled in a "Braun Labmaster 130" glovebox. If not indicated differently, all chemicals were employed as purchased. **Solvents** were distilled prior to use. Tetrahydrofuran (THF), 2-methyl-tetrahydrofuran, diethylether and methy-tert-butylether (MTBE) were distilled from sodium/benzophenone under argon. Dichloromethane and tetrachloromethane were distilled from CaH₂ under argon. MeOH was distilled from Mg with I₂ and stored over molecular sieves 3 Å. Amines like TMEDA, NEt₃ or pyridine were distilled from CaH₂ under argon. Pentane was filtered through Alox B prior to use. Anhydrous N,N-dimethylformamide and anhydrous DMSO were purchased from Acros

(AeroSeal®) and stored over molecular sieves. Deuterated chloroform (CDCl₃) was stored over molecular sieves 3 Å.

The evaporation of solvents was performed under vacuum using a Büchi Rotavapor RE 111 with a membrane pump. The water-bath-temperature was 40 °C if not indicated differently. The concentration of **butyllithium** solutions was determined prior to use by titration against N-benzylbenzamide in THF. The concentration of purchased Grignard reagents was determined by titration against I₂ in a 0.5 M LiCl-solution in THF at 0 °C.²

Flash column chromatography was performed on silica gel DAVISIL®LC60A 40-63 μm from GRACE Davision, silica gel 60 M 0.04-0-063 nm (230-400 mesh) ASTM from Macherey Nagel or Silica for Column Chomatography 0.035-0.070 nm, 60 A from ACROS. Reactions were monitored by analytical thin layer chromatography (TLC) using Merck silica gel 60 F254 aluminum plates (visualization by UV light (λ =254 nm) or by staining with a cerium reagent followed by heating).

Gas chromatography – mass spectrometry (GC-MS) was performed on an Agilent GC 6890N gas chromatograph coupled with a HP 5973N series mass selective detector and a HP 7683 GC auto sampler using a 30-m x 0.25-mm, HP-5 MS column. The column temperature was initially held at 50 °C for 2 min, then the temperature was raised to 300 °C in a rate of 25°C/min and held for 5 min. The injector temperature was maintained at 300 °C and the injection volume was 1.0 µl in the split mode. Mass spectra were scanned from m/z 35-500, the electron impact ionization energy was 70 eV.

Mass spectra were recorded on a MAT Incos 50 Galaxy System from Finnigan. The ionization energy in [eV] is given with the respective dataset. Intensities of the ratios of m/z are given relative to the intensity of the basic peak (100 %). A MAT 900 (Finnigan) mass spectrometer was used for the high-resolution mass spectra (HRMS).

Enantiomeric purities were determined by chiral gas chromatography, performed on a HP 6890 apparatus using a BGB 176 SE (30m x 0.25mm) column. The column temperature was initially held at 80 °C for 5 min, then the temperature was raised to 150 °C in a rate between 1 °C/min and 0.2 °C/min held for 5 min. Finally the temperature was held at 150 °C for 5 min.

NMR spectra were recorded on spectrometers from Bruker (AV 300 [300 MHz], DPX 300 [300 MHz], AV 400 [400 MHz], DRX 500 [500 MHz], AV 600 [600 MHz]) for ¹H at room

temperature using CDCl₃ as a solvent. Proton shifts are reported in ppm (δ) downfield from TMS and were determined by reference to the residual solvent peaks (CDCl₃: 7.24 ppm). Data are reported as follows: chemical shift (multiplicity [singlet (s), doublet (d), triplet (t), quartet (q), quintet (quint.), multiplet (m)], coupling constants [Hz], integration, assignment). ¹³C NMR spectra were recorded using the APT sequence with complete proton decoupling. Multiplicities (C, CH₂ or CH, CH₃) were deduced from these spectra. ¹³C chemical shifts are reported in ppm (δ) relative to solvent resonance as the internal standard (CDCl₃: 77 ppm). The non-trivial assignments were effected by H,H-COSY, HMQC and HMBC spectra. Infrared spectra were recorded on a Paragon 100 FT IR instrument (Perkin-Elmer) at room temperature under attenuated total reflectance (ATR). The absorptions are given in wave numbers \widetilde{V} [cm⁻¹] and characterized by the abbreviations weak (w), middle (m), strong (s) or broad (br).

CD spectra were measured on a Jasco J-810 spectropolarimeter with the following conditions: scan speed 20 nm/min., response 1 sec, band-width 1 nm, 5 scans at 20 °C. For each compound a solution 1.5-2.4 mM in Methanol was prepared and spectra were acquired using a cell with 0.1 cm path-length length.

Optical rotations ($[a]_D^{20}$) were determined on a polarimeter *Perkin-Elmer* 343 at 20 °C in CHCl₃ in a cuvette of 1 dm. The respective concentrations are given by definition in g/100 ml. **X-ray** diffractograms were measured with a *Nonius Kappa* CCD-diffractometer. The complete dataset for full characterization of the compounds is adherent.

Hydrogenations were performed in a 50 ml pressure reactor from *Parr Instrument Company,* series 5500 (max. working pressure 200 bar). The pressure used is given in the respective experimental procedure.

2 EXPERIMENTAL PROCEDURES

1-Bromo-2,3-dimethoxy-4-methylbenzene (9)

A dried 1 l three-necked flask with a 100 ml dropping funnel was charged with 8.5 g (55.8 mmol, 1.0 equiv.) of **8** dissolved in 440 ml of pentane³/Et₂O (10/1) before 11.8 ml of dry TMEDA (78.2 mmol, 1.4 equiv.) were added. The stirred mixture was the cooled to -45 °C and 46.2 ml (67.0 mmol, 1.2 equiv.) of a solution of *t*-butyl lithium (1.45 M in pentane) were added dropwise over 45 min. Stirring was continued at -45 °C for 30 min. and for 3 h at 0 °C before the mixture was re-cooled to -50 °C and 36.3 g (111.6 mmol, 2.0 equiv.) of dibromotetrachloroethane, dissolved in 100 ml dry THF, were added over 1 h. The stirred mixture was allowed to warm to rt (16 h) before 170 ml of a saturated aqueous NH₄Cl solution were added and the layers were separated. The aqueous layer was extracted with 100 ml of MTBE and twice with 100 ml of EtOAc. The combined organic layers were washed with saturated brine and dried with MgSO₄. After filtration, the solvent was removed *in vacuo* and the crude product was purified by flash column chromatography (silica gel, CyHex/EtOAc = $100/0 \rightarrow 20/1 \rightarrow 10/1$) to yield 8.81 g (38.1 mmol, 68%) of **9** as a yellow oil. As sample crystallized upon prolonged storage and was additionally characterized by X-ray crystallography.

A dried 1 l three-necked flask equipped with a dropping funnel was charged with 8.81 g (38.1 mmol, 1 equiv.) of **9** and 380 ml of dry CH_2Cl_2 . The stirred solution was cooled to -78 °C before 152.4 ml (152.4 mmol, 4 equiv.) of a BBr₃ solution (1 M in CH_2Cl_2) were added dropwise over 3 h. The mixture was stirred for additional 4 h whilst warming to -20 °C before 20 ml of H_2O were carefully added. After warming to 0 °C, additional 100 ml of H_2O were added and the layers were separated. The aqueous layer was extracted with 2 x 100 ml of CH_2Cl_2 and the combined organic layers were dried with MgSO₄. After filtration, the solvent was removed *in vacuo* to give 7.34 g (36.2 mmol, 95%) of the catechol **24** as red-brown oil, which proved to be sufficiently pure to be used in the next step without any purification. Only forr analytical purposes a small sample of **24** was purified by flash column chromatography on silica gel (CyHex/EtOAc = $4/1 \rightarrow 3/1$).

1-(7-Methylbenzo[d][1,3]dioxol-4-yl)prop-2-en-1-ol (rac-11)

A dried 250 ml Schlenk flask was charged with 3.78 g (17.58 mmol, 1 equiv.) of bromide **10** and 176 ml dry THF. The stirred solution was cooled to -78 °C before 21.1 ml (21.1 mmol, 1.2 equiv.) of *n*-butyl lithium (1.0 M in hexane) were added dropwise over 12 min. After stirring at -78 °C for 20 min 2.35 ml (35.16 mmol, 2 equiv.) of acrolein⁴ were added rapidly via syringe and stirring was continued for 16 h while the mixture was slowly warming to rt. Then 20 ml of saturated aqueous NH₄Cl solution were added. After addition of additional 50 ml saturated NH₄Cl solution the layers were separated and the aqueous layer was extracted with 3 x 100 ml of MTBE. The combined organic layers were dried with MgSO₄ and filtered before the solvent was removed *in vacuo*. The crude product was purified by flash column chromatography (silica gel, CyHex/EtOAc = $9/1 \rightarrow 7/1 \rightarrow 5/1 \rightarrow 3/1$) to give 2.50 g (13.01 mmol, 74%) of *rac-***11** as slightly yellow oil, which crystallized upon standing.

(E)-4-(3'-Chloroprop-1'-enyl)-7-methylbenzo[d][1,3]dioxole (7)

A dried 250 ml Schlenk flask was charged with 164 ml of dry CH_2Cl_2 and cooled to -78 °C before 5.2 ml (61.45 mmol, 3 equiv.) of oxalyl chloride and 5.82 ml (81.94 mmol, 4 equiv.) of DMSO were added. Stirring was continued for 25 min at -78 °C before 3.94 ml (20.48 mmol, 1 equiv.) of allylic alcohol *rac-*11, dissolved in 40 ml dry CH_2Cl_2 , were added via syringe within a few minutes. After 2 h at -78 °C, 17.13 ml (122.91 mmol, 6 equiv.) of anhydrous NEt_3

were added and stirring was continued at -78 °C for 10 min and for 1 h at rt. The yellow reaction mixture was poured into 150 ml of ice cold aqueous HCl (1M) and the layers were separated. The aqueous layer was extracted with $3 \times 70 \text{ ml}$ of CH_2Cl_2 and the combined organic layers were washed with $3 \times 50 \text{ ml}$ of H_2O and dried with MgSO₄. After filtration, the solvent removed *in vacuo* (at max. $35 \,^{\circ}$ C water bath temperature)⁵ to give $4.31 \,^{\circ}$ g (20.45 mmol, 100%) of **7** as an orange oil, which, due to its sensitivity towards silica and heat, was used for the next step without purification within a few days.

(S)-4-(But-3'-en-2'-yl)-7-methylbenzo[d][1,3]dioxole (6)

A dried 500 ml three-necked flask was charged with 195 mg (0.23 mmol, 3 mol%) of ligand 12, 39.3 mg (0.19 mmol, 2.5 mol%) of CuBr·SMe₂ and 51 ml of dry MTBE. The mixture was stirred for 30 min at rt before 1.61 g (7.64 mmol, 1 equiv.) of 7 were added. The solution was cooled to -78 °C before a solution of MeMgBr (3.7 ml, 9.17 mmol, 1.2 equiv. of a 2.5 M solution in Et₂O diluted with 80 ml dry CH₂Cl₂) was added dropwise in two portions over 10 h by means of a syringe pump. The mixture was stirred for additional 10 h at -78 °C before the reaction was stopped by addition of 2 ml of HCl (1 M). Further 30 ml of aqueous HCl (1 M) and 50 ml of Et₂O were added and the layers separated. The aqueous layer was extracted with 3 x 50 ml Et₂O and the combined organic layers dried with MgSO₄ before the solvent was removed *in vacuo* to give 1.41 g (7.41 mmol, 97%) of pure 6 as a slightly yellow oil.

A dry 250 ml Schlenk flask was charged with 3.97 g (20.03 mmol, 1 equiv.) of **25** and 116.0 ml of dry CH_2Cl_2 before 8.33 ml (60.09 mmol, 3 equiv.) of dry NEt_3 and 490 mg (4.01 mmol, 20 mol%) of DMAP were added. Purification by flash-column chromatography on silica gel (CyHex/EtOAc = 25/1 \rightarrow 10/1 \rightarrow 3/1 \rightarrow 0/1) afforded 254 mg (604 μ mol, 38%) of the hydrogenated product 19a and 196 mg (640 μ mol, 40%) of its desilylated derivative 19b as inseparable mixture of diastereomers.⁸

Helioporin C (1)

A dried GC vial was charged with 7 mg of alcohol **3** (21.1 μ mol, 1 equiv.) dissolved in 0.47 ml of dry CH₂Cl₂. 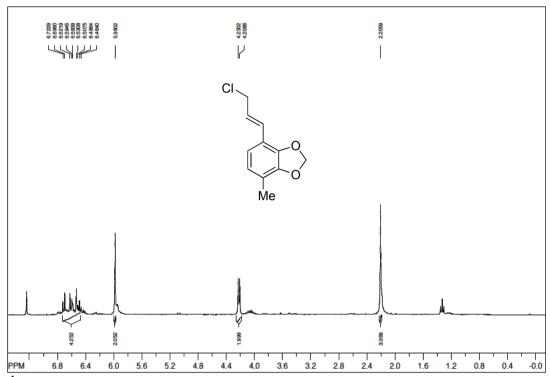

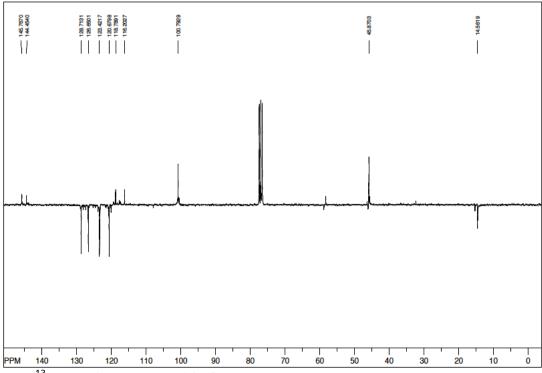

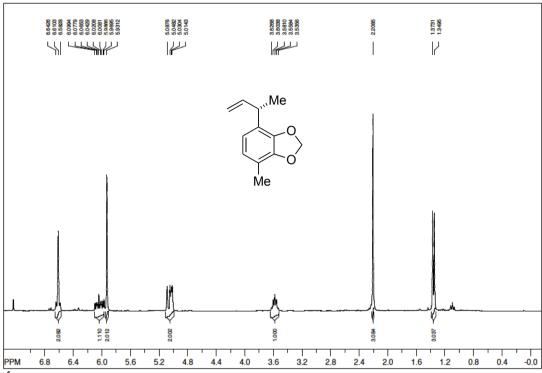


 1 H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) of **7**.

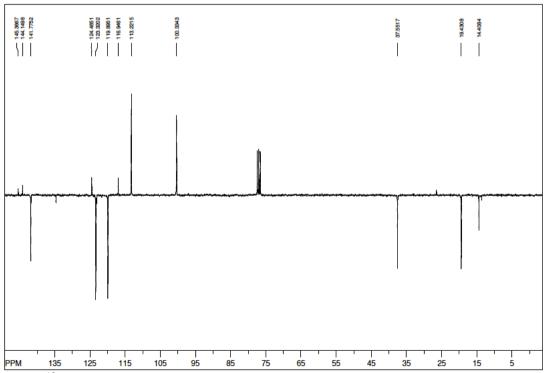


APT ¹³C NMR (75 MHz, CDCl₃) of **7**.

(S)-4-(But-3'-en-2'-yl)-7-methylbenzo[d][1,3]dioxole (6)

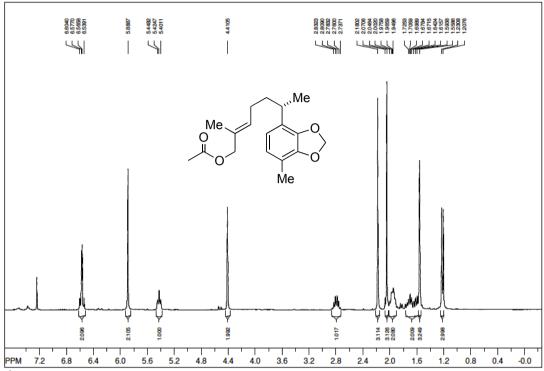

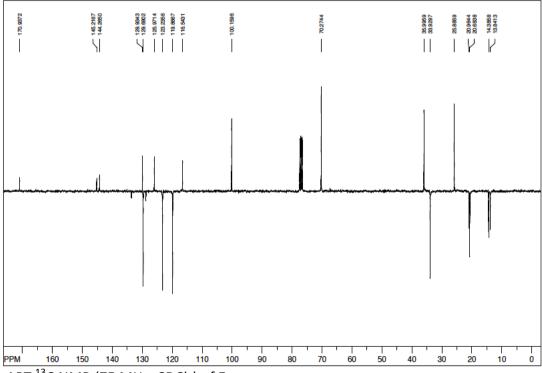


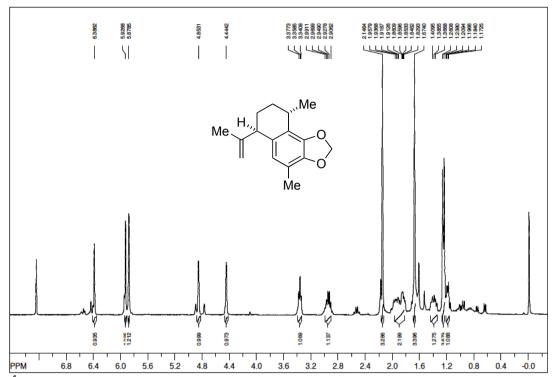

(S,E)-2-methyl-6-(7-methylbenzo[d][1,3]dioxole-4-yl)hept-2-enyl-acetat (5)

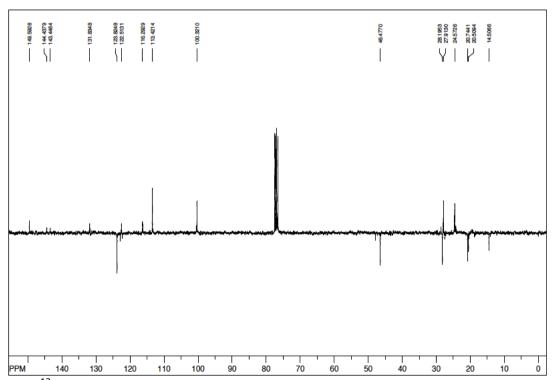


¹H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) of **5**.



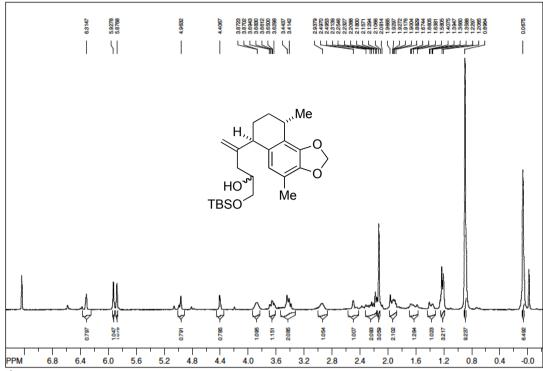


¹H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) of **4** (4:1 diastereomeric mixture).

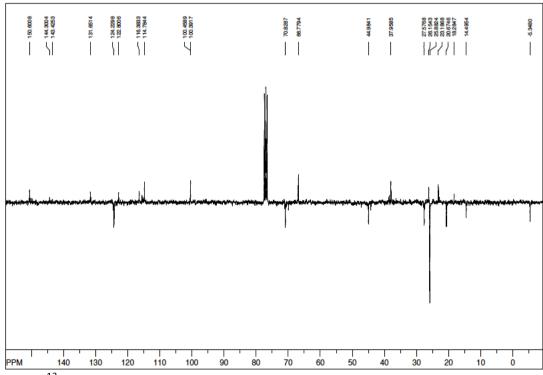


APT ¹³C NMR (75 MHz, CDCl₃) of **17** (4:1 diastereomeric mixture).

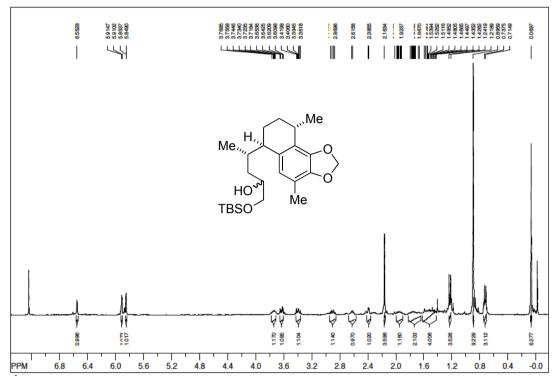


¹H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) of **17** (4:4:1:1 diastereomeric mixture).

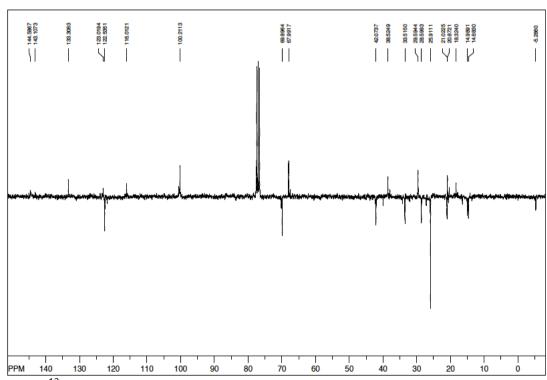


APT ¹³C NMR (75 MHz, CDCl₃) of **17** (4:4:1:1 diastereomeric mixture).

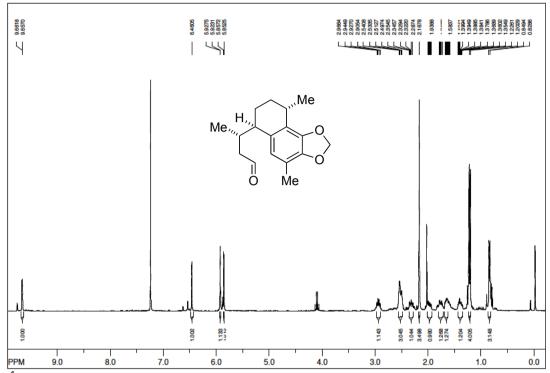


¹H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) of **19a** (4:4:1:1 diastereomeric mixture).

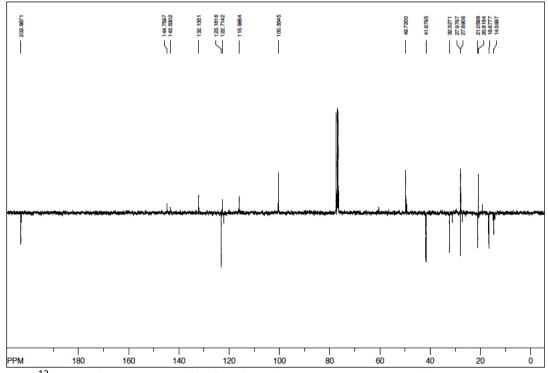


APT ¹³C NMR (75 MHz, CDCl₃) of **19a** (4:4:1:1 diastereomeric mixture).

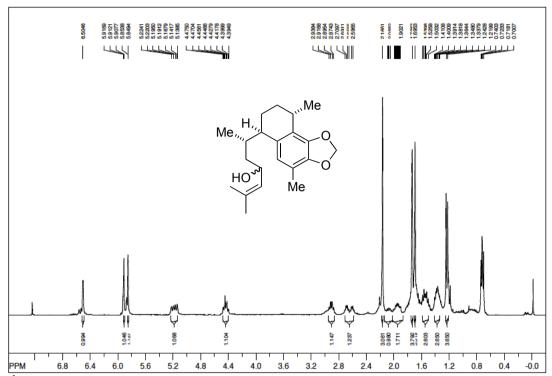

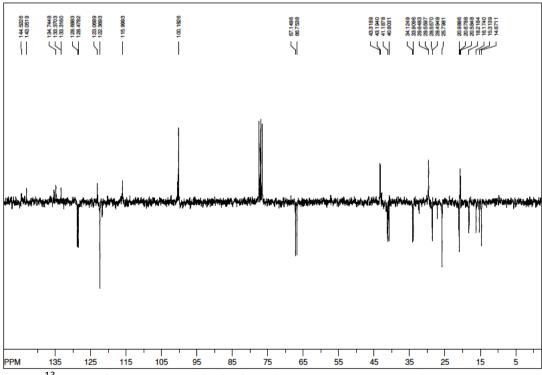


APT ¹³C NMR (75 MHz, CDCl₃) of **20** (4:1 diastereomeric mixture).

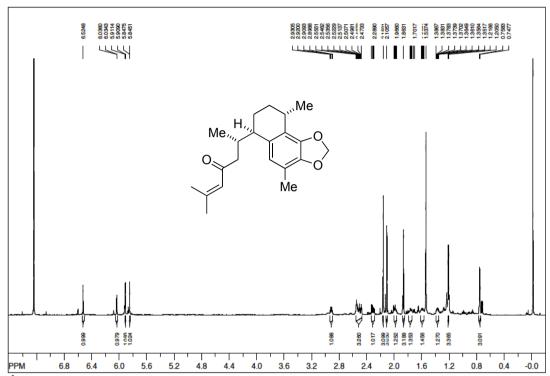


¹H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) of **3** (4:1 diastereomeric mixture).

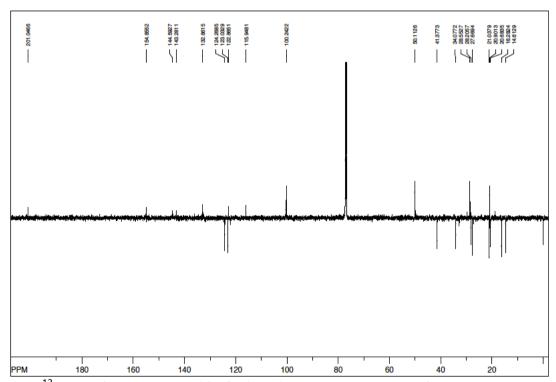


APT ¹³C NMR (75 MHz, CDCl₃) of **3** (4:1 diastereomeric mixture).

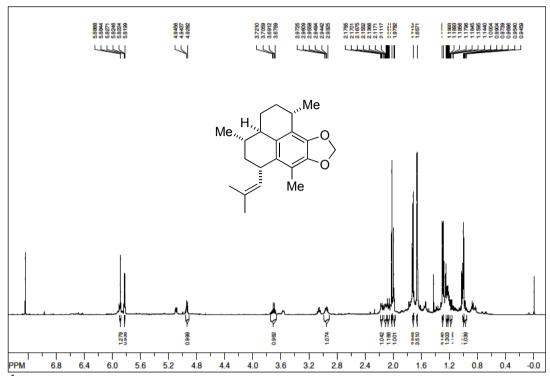


 1 H NMR (600 MHz, CDCl₃) of **1** (4:1 diastereomeric mixture).

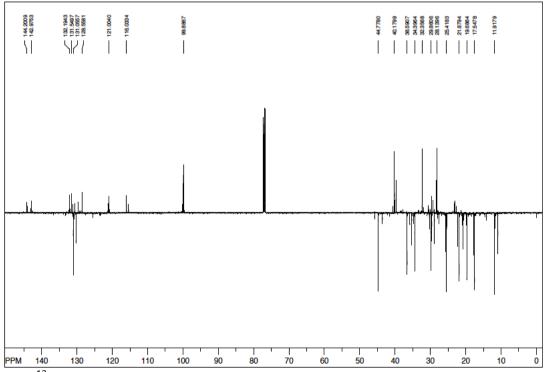


APT ¹³C NMR (150 MHz, CDCl₃) of **1** (4:1 diastereomeric mixture).

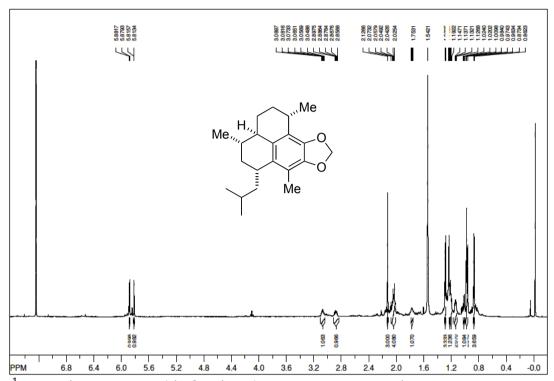

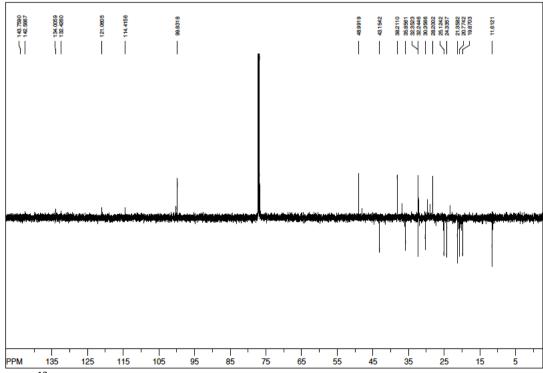
¹H NMR (600 MHz, CDCl₃) of **2** (12:4:3:1 diastereomeric mixture).

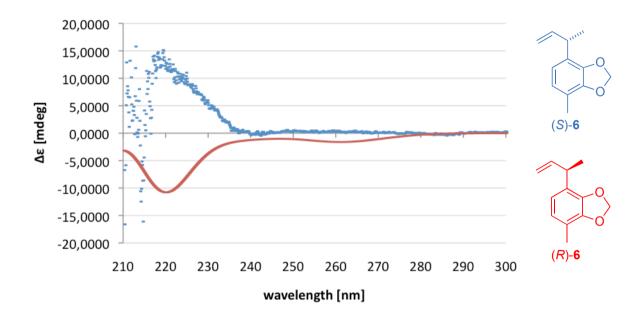

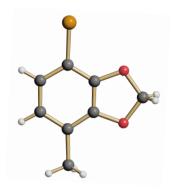

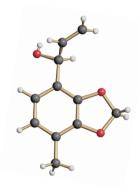
