# Fragment-based discovery of bromodomain inhibitors part 2: optimization of phenylisoxazole sulfonamides

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#### **Supplementary Methods**

X-ray crystallography. E.coli expressed His6-tagged BRD2-BD1(67-200) was purified to homogeneity using a HisTrap column followed by gel filtration using a Sephadex S200. Typically the protein was concentrated to ~10mg/ml in 20mM HEPES pH7.5, 100mM NaCl. Apo crystals were grown in 100nl+100nl sitting drops using MRC or in 1ul+1ul hanging drops in Nextal plates at 20°C using 20-30% PEG3350, 0.1-0.3M (NH4)2SO4, 100mM HEPES pH 7.0-8.5. Apo crystals were soaked with compound concentration ranging from 1mM to saturating concentrations, in 0-5% DMSO, between 1hr to overnight. Crystals were briefly transferred to a cryoprotectant buffer consisting of the well solution plus 20% ethylglycol prior to flash freezing. Data from single frozen crystals were collected at the European Synchrotron Radiation Facility, Grenoble or on an in house RIGAKU FRE+ SUPERBRIGHT/A200 system. Data processing was achieved using MOSFLM(14), HKL(15), or d\*TREK(16) and scaled using SCALA(14) or SCALEPACK. The C2 cell has 3 molecules in the ASU and after rigid body refinement using a previously determined in house structure, model building was performed Coot(17) and refined using REFMAC(18). There was clear difference density for the ligands in at least one of the three acetyl-lysine binding sites and the binding modes could be unambiguously determined The statistics for the data collection and refined co-ordinates are given in Supporting Information Fig. S1..

Peripheral blood mononuclear cell (PBMC) preparation. Blood containing 15% v/v ACD-A anticoagulant (Baxter Healthcare) was collected and 30ml poured into 50ml Leucosep tubes (Greiner Bio-one) pre-filled with Ficoll. The tubes were centrifuged for 15 minutes at 800 x g (r.t.). The enriched cell fractions from each Leucosep tube were pooled in a 500ml centrifuge tube. The pooled fractions were centrifuged at room temperature for 10 minutes at 400 x g, and the supernatant discarded. The cell pellet was resuspended in 40ml PBS and the cells counted on a haematology analyser (Sysmex). The cells were centrifuged at 300 x g for 10 minutes (r.t.), the supernatant discarded, and the cell pellet resuspended in freezing medium (90% heat-inactivated FBS, 10% DMSO) to make a final concentration of 4x10<sup>7</sup> cells/ml. The cells were aliquoted and cryopreserved.

Compound plates containing 0.5µl test sample in 1% DMSO were prepared (two replicates on account of PBMC donor variability). PBMCs were thawed from frozen stocks and resuspended in warm media (500ml DMEM, 50ml Heat Inactivated Australian Foetal Bovine Serum, 5ml Penicillin/Streptomycin, 5ml Glutamax) at a concentration of 2x10<sup>5</sup>cells/ml. 1ng/ml lipopolysaccharide was added then 50µl added to each well of the compound plates. The seeded plates were then lidded and placed in the humidified primary cell incubator for 18-24 hours at 37°C, 5% CO<sub>2</sub>.

Inhibition of IL-6 production. 10µl of cell supernatant was placed in a low-profile 384-well MSD plate pre-coated with human IL-6 capture antibody. The plates were sealed and placed on a shaker at 600rpm for 2 hours (r.t.). A 1% solution of MSD Blocker A (Mesoscale Discovery, USA) was prepared by dissolving solid Blocker A in Phosphate buffered saline (Invitrogen, UK). This was used to dilute the anti-human IL-6 antibody labelled with MSD SULFO-TAG<sup>TM</sup> reagent to 1µg/ml. 10µl of the antibody solution was then added to each well of the MSD plates. The plates were then re-sealed and shaken for another 2 hours before washing with PBS. 35µl of 2X MSD Read Buffer T (stock 4X MSD Read Buffer T was diluted 50:50 with de-ionised water) was then added to each well and the plates read on the MSD Sector Imager 6000

Inhibition of TNF $\alpha$  production.  $5\mu l$  of cell supernatant was placed in a white low volume Greiner 384-well plate.  $2\mu l$  of Acceptor Mix Solution ( $0.7\mu g/ml$  biotinylated anti-human TNF $\alpha$  antibody (BAF210),  $11.7\mu g/ml$  conjugated AlphaLISA acceptor beads, all in AlphaScreen buffer (30mM Tris pH7.4, 0.02% Tween 20, 0.02% Casein)) was added and the plates incubated for 90 minutes in the dark (r.t.).  $2\mu l$  of Streptavidin donor bead solution ( $180\mu g/ml$  of Streptavidin donor beads in AlphaScreen buffer) was added followed by 90 min incubation in the dark (r.t.). Plates were then read on an EnVision spectrofluorometer (Perkin Elmer, UK) at an excitation wavelength of 680nm and an emission wavelength of 615nm.

**Chemistry.** All solvents were purchased from Fisher Scientific Ltd and commercially available reagents were used as received. All reactions were followed by TLC analysis (TLC plates GF254, Merck) or LCMS (liquid chromatography mass spectrometry) using a Waters ZQ instrument. The purity of all compounds was determined by LCMS and  $^1H$  NMR. NMR spectra were recorded on a Bruker AVANCE 400 spectrometer or a Bruker Ultrashield 400 MHz instrument, both referenced as follows:  $^1H$  (400 MHz), internal standard TMS at  $\delta=0.00;\,^{13}\mathrm{C}$  (100.6 MHz), internal standard CDCl3 at  $\delta=77.23$  or DMSO-D6 at  $\delta=39.70$ . Column chromatography was performed on pre-packed silica gel columns (30-90 mesh, IST) using a Biotage SP4. Mass spectra were recorded on a Waters ZQ (ESI-MS) spectrometer. All microwave reactions were carried out in a Biotage Initiator 60 focussed beam microwave (400 W). Abbreviations for multiplicities observed in NMR spectra: s; singlet; br s, broad singlet; d, doublet; t, triplet; q, quadruplet; p, pentuplet; spt, septuplet; m, multiplet.

LCMS methodology

a) 2-minute method – formate. The UPLC analysis was conducted on an Acquity UPLC BEH C18 column (50 mm x 2.1 mm, i.d. 1.7  $\mu$ m packing diameter) at 40 °C. The solvents employed were (A) 0.1% v/v solution of formic acid in water (HPLC grade), (B) 0.1% v/v solution of formic acid in acetonitrile (HPLC grade). The gradient employed was:

The UV detection was a summed signal from a wavelength of 210 nm to 350 nm.

b) 25 minute method – TFA. The HPLC analysis was conducted on an X-Bridge C18 250 mm X 4.6 mm, 5  $\mu$ m packing diameter). The solvents employed were (A) 0.1% v/v TFA in water (HPLC grade), (B) 0.1% v/v TFA in acetonitrile (HPLC grade). The gradient employed was:

UV detection was at a fixed wavelength of 267 nm.

#### Procedures: see Scheme 1.

a) For  $R_1=Me,$  a mixture of 4-iodo-3,5-dimethylisoxazole (1.0 g, 4.48 mmol), 4-tolylboronic acid (0.9 g, 6.73 mmol) and aqueous sodium carbonate solution (2M) (0.73 mL) in 1,2-dimethoxyethane (DME) was degassed and Pd(PPh<sub>3</sub>)4 (0.26 g, 0.22 mmol) was added. The reaction mixture was stirred at 85 °C for 2 h before being cooled to room temperature and concentrated. The residue was diluted with water and extracted with ethyl acetate (3 x 35 mL). The combined organic extracts were washed with brine (100 mL), dried (Na $_2$ SO $_4$ ), filtered and concentrated. The residue was purified by flash column chromatography (silica gel, 0-10% ethyl acetate / hexanes) to yield 3,5-dimethyl-4-(4-methylphenyl)isoxazole S1 (0.61 g, 3.26 mmol, 73%) as an orange solid;  $^1$ H NMR (400 MHz, METHANOL-d $_4$ ) 8 7.27 (m, 2H), 7.20 (m, 2H), 2.38 (s, 6H), 2.22 (s, 3H); LCMS (2 minute method): (ES+) 188, retention time 1.14 min., >99% pure.

For R<sub>1</sub>=OMe, 4-methoxyphenylboronic acid (3.41 g, 22.42 mmol), 4-iodo-3,5-dimethylisoxazole (1.00 g, 4.48 mmol), Pd(PPh<sub>3</sub>)<sub>4</sub> (104 mg, 0.09 mmol) and sodium carbonate (3.09 g, 29.10 mmol) as a suspension in 1,2-dimethoxyethane (DME) (100 mL) and water (15 mL) were stirred and heated at 85 °C for 3.5 days. After cooling, the reaction mixture was concentrated, water (100 mL) was added and the product extracted using ethyl acetate (3 x 100 mL). The combined organics were washed with brine (70 mL), dried and concentrated to yield a bright yellow residue. Purification by flash column chromatography (silica gel, 0-100% ethyl acetate/cyclohexane) afforded 3,5-dimethyl-4-[4-(methyloxy) phenyl]isoxazole S1 (810 mg, 3.99 mmol, 89%) as a white solid; <sup>1</sup>H NMR (400 MHz, DMSO-d<sub>6</sub>) δ 7.31 (m, 2H), 6.03 (m, 2H), 3.79 (s, 3H), 2.20 (s, 3H); LCMS (2 minute method): (ES+) 204 [MH+], retention time 1.03 min., >96% pure.

b) For  $R_1$ =Me, to a solution of 3,5-dimethyl-4-(4-methylphenyl)isoxazole  $\bf S1$  (0.61g, 3.26 mmol) in dichloromethane (DCM) was added chlorosulfonic acid (2.0 mL, 3.89 mmol) and PCl<sub>5</sub> (0.68 g, 3.26 mmol) at 0°C under  $N_2$ . After stirring at 0°C for 10 min, the reaction mixture was heated to 70°C for 4 h. The mixture was allowed to cool and then poured onto crushed ice/water with stirring. The resulting suspension was filtered through celite and the filtrate was extracted with DCM (2 x 75 mL). The combined organic extracts were washed with brine (70 mL), dried (Na<sub>2</sub>SO<sub>4</sub>), filtered and concentrated to afford 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylbenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride  $\bf S2$  (630mg, 68%) as a brown oil;  $^1$ H NMR (400 MHz, DMSO-d<sub>6</sub>) 8 7.67 (d, J = 2.0 Hz, 1H), 7.23 (m, 2H), 2.55 (s, 3H), 2.36 (s, 3H), 2.18 (s, 3H); LCMS (2 minute method); (ES+) No clear peak for product, retention time 1.23 min, >93% pure.

For R1=OMe, 3,5-dimethyl-4-[4-(methyloxy)phenyl]isoxazole S1 (560 mg, 2.76 mmol) was dissolved in dichloromethane (DCM) (10 mL). Chlorosulfonic acid (183  $\mu L$ , 2.76 mmol) was added dropwise to the reaction mixture at 0 °C. The reaction mixture was stirred under N $_2$  at room temperature overnight. Further chlorosulfonic acid (367  $\mu L$ , 5.52 mmol) was added at 0 °C and the reaction mixture stirred for a further 4 h. The reaction mixture was poured onto ice (15 mL) before being cooled to 0 °C. The white solid which precipitated out was collected by filtration and dried under vacuum. The residue and phosphorus pentachloride (487 mg, 2.340 mmol) were dissolved in phosphoryl chloride (3 mL, 31.8 mmol) and the resulting solution

stirred under  $N_2$  at 90 °C from for 4.5 h. Ice/water (6 eq, 190 g, 190 mmol) was added and a grey precipitate formed. More ice was added to the solution (~6 mL) and the precipitate was collected by filtration and dried to afford 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4yl)-2-methoxybenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride  $\mathbf{S2}$  (216 mg, 0.64 mmol, 41%) as an oralegil; <sup>1</sup>H NMR (400 MHz, METHANOL-4<sub>4</sub>)  $\delta$  7.86 (d, J = 2.5 Hz, 1H), 7.77 (dd, J = 8.5 and 2.5 Hz, 1H), 7.47 (d, J = 8.5 Hz, 1H), 4.10 (s, 3H), 2.41 (s, 3H), 2.25 (s, 3H); LCMS (2 minute method): (ES+) 302 [MH+], retention time 1.08 min., >90% pure.

c) General procedure (A) for formation of sulfonamides: to a solution of the amine (3 eq.) in ethyl acetate (100 mL/8 mmol) was added the sulfonyl chloride (1 eq.) under N<sub>2</sub>. The reaction mixture was stirred overnight and then diluted with ethyl acetate. The mixture was washed with aqueous HCl (0.5 M) and brine before being dried (Na<sub>2</sub>SO<sub>4</sub>), filtered and concentrated to give a residue which was purified by flash column chromatography on silica gel to give the desired sulfonamide.

General procedure (B) for formation of sulfonamides: the amine (2.5 eq.) and the sulfonyl chloride (1 eq.) in DCM (15 mL/mmol) were treated with DIPEA (1.5 eq.). The reaction mixture was then stirred for 2.5 h. The reaction mixture was washed with water (15 mL/mmol), dried and concentrated to yield the crude sulfonamide product. Purification by flash column chromatography on silica gel yielded the desired sulfonamide.

General procedure (C) for formation of sulfonamides: the amine (2.5 eq.) and the sulfonyl chloride (1 eq.) in DCM (15 mL/mmol) were treated with DIPEA (1.5 eq.). The reaction mixture was then stirred for 2.5 h. The reaction mixture was applied directly to a silica column. Purification by flash column chromatography yielded the desired sulfonamide.

General procedure (D) for Boc-deprotection: the Boc-protected amine (1 eq.) was dissolved in dichloromethane (DCM) (1 mL). Trifluoroacetic acid (3 mL/mmol) was added and the mixture stirred at room temperature for 1 h. The crude products were applied to SCX SPE columns and washed with MeOH (2CV) followed by 2M NH<sub>3</sub> in MeOH (4CV). The basic fractions were concentrated and dried. The residue was dissolved in methanol (15 mL/mmol) and HCl (1.25 M in methanol) (1 eq.) was added. The solution was concentrated by flow of nitrogen gas to leave the desired sulfonamide amine as the hydrochloride salt.

Following general procedure (A), combination of 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylbenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride  $\bf S2$  (200 mg, 0.70 mmol) and 2-methoxyethylamine (158 mg, 2.1 mmol) afforded 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-N-(2-methoxyethyl)-2-methylbenzenesulfonamide  $\bf 18a$  (58 mg, 0.18 mmol, 26%),  $^1$ H NMR (400 MHz, DMSO-d<sub>6</sub>)  $\delta$  7.92 (m, 1H), 7.74 (s, 1H), 7.52 (m, 2H), 3.27 (t, J=5.5 Hz, 2H), 3.10 (s, 3H), 3.00 (m, 2H), 2.61 (s, 3H), 2.41 (s, 3H), 2.23 (s, 3H); LCMS (25 minute method): (ES+) 325, retention time 9.70 min., >99% pure

Combination of 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylbenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride **S2** (150 mg, 0.52 mmol) and 3-amino-1-propanol (119 mg, 1.57 mmol) by general procedure (A) afforded 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-N-(3-hydroxypropyl)-2-methyl benzenesulfonamide **19a** (88 mg, 0.27 mmol, 51%);  $^1\text{H}$  NMR (400 MHz, DMSO-d<sub>0</sub>)  $\delta$  7.72 (m, 2H), 7.56 (dd, J=8.0 and 2.0 Hz, 1H), 7.51 (d, J=8.0 Hz, 1H), 4.42 (br. s, 1H), 2.88 (m, 2H), 2.60 (s, 3H), 2.52 (m, 2H), 2.41 (s, 3H), 2.23 (s, 3H), 1.51 (m, 2H); LCMS (25 minute method): (ES+) 325, retention time 9.18 min., >99% pure

Following general procedure (A), combination of 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylbenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride  $\mathbf{S2}$  (150 mg, 0.52 mmol) and 0.88 S.G. ammonium hydroxide (27 mg, 1.57 mmol) afforded 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylbenzenesulfonamide  $\mathbf{21a}$  (44 mg, 0.16 mmol, 31%);  $^1\text{H}$  NMR (400 MHz, DMSO-d<sub>0</sub>)  $\delta$  7.78 (m, 1H), 7.50 (m, 4H), 2.62 (s, 3H), 2.42 (s, 3H), 2.23 (s, 3H); LCMS (25 minute method): (ES+) 266, retention time 7.76 min., >99% pure

Following general procedure (C), combination of 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylbenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride \$2 (39 mg, 0.14 mmol) and 1-Boc-piperazine (63 mg, 0.34 mmol) followed by flash column chromatography (silica gel, 7-35% ethyl acetate/cyclohexane) afforded tert-butyl 4-((5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylphenyl)sulfonyl)piperazine-1-carboxylate. Deprotection following general procedure (D) afforded 3,5-dimethyl-4-(4-methyl-3-(piperazin-1-ylsulfonyl)phenyl)isoxazole hydrochloride, 27a (26 mg, 0.07 mmol, 66%) as a white solid; <sup>1</sup>H NMR (400 MHz, METHANOL-d<sub>4</sub>) 8 7.83 (s, 1H), 7.56 (m, 2H), 3.33 (m, 4H), 3.11 (m, 4H), 2.67 (s, 3H), 2.43 (s, 3H), 2.27 (s, 3H); LCMS (2 minute method): (ES+) 336 (MH+), retention time 0.65 min., >98% pure.

Following general procedure (C), combination of 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylbenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride **S2** (39 mg, 0.14 mmol) and 4-amino-1-Bocpiperidine (68 mg, 0.34 mmol) followed by flash column chromatography (silica gel) -45% ethyl acetate/cyclohexane) afforded *tert*-butyl 4-(5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylphenylsulfonamido)piperidine-1-carboxylate. General procedure (D) deprotection gave 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methyl-N-(piperidin-4-yl)benzene sulfonamide hydrochloride **29a** (27mg, 0.07mmol, 66%) as a white solid; <sup>1</sup>H NMR (400 MHz, METHANOL-d<sub>4</sub>) & 7.90 (s, 1H), 7.50 (s, 2H), 3.26 (m, 1H), 3.14 (m, 2H), 2.76 (m, 2H), 2.69 (s, 3H), 2.42 (s, 3H), 2.26 (s, 3H), 1.82 (m, 2H), 1.58 (m, 2H), LCMS (2 minute method): (ES+) 350 (MH+), retention time 0.61min., >98% pure.

Following general procedure (C), combination of 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methylbenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride **S2** (39 mg, 0.14 mmol) and 3-amino-1-Bocpiperidine (68 mg, 0.34 mmol) followed by flash column chromatography (silica gel, 9-45% ethyl acetate/cyclohexane) afforded *tert*-butyl 3-(5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-

yl)-2-methylphenylsulfonamido)piperidine-1-carboxylate. Deprotection following general procedure (D) afforded 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methyl-N-(piperidin-3-yl)benzenesulfonamide hydrochloride 30a (26mg, 0.06 mmol, 63%) as a white solid;  $^1\mathrm{H}$  NMR (400 MHz, METHANOL-d\_4)  $\delta$  7.89 (s, 1H), 7.51 (s, 2H), 3.34 (s, 1H), 3.0 (m, 1H), 3.21 (m, 1H), 3.08 (m, 1H), 2.71 (m, 5H), 2.42 (s, 3H), 2.26 (s, 3H), 1.81 (m, 2H), 1.52 (m, 2H); LCMS (2 minute method): (ES+) 350 (MH+), retention time 0.63 min., >98% pure.

Following general procedure (B), combination of 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methoxybenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride S2 (36 mg, 0.12 mmol) and 1-Boc-piperazine (56 mg, 0.30 mmol) followed by flash column chromatography (silica gel, 15-75% ethyl acetate/cyclohexane) afforded *tert*-butyl 4-((5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methoxyphenyl)sulfonyl)piperazine-1-carboxylate. Deprotection following general procedure (D) afforded 4-(4-methoxy-3-(piperazin-1-ylsulfonyl)phenyl)-3,5-dimethylisoxazole hydrochloride **27b** (18 mg, 0.04 mmol, 64%) as a white solid;  $^1$ H NMR (400 MHz, METHANOL-d<sub>4</sub>) 8 7.79 (d, J = 2.0 Hz, 1H), 7.63 (dd, J = 2.0, 8.5 Hz, 1H), 7.37 (d, J = 8.5 Hz, 1H), 4.02 (s, 3H), 3.48 (m, 4H), 3.21 (m, 4H), 2.41 (s, 3H); LCMS (2 minute method): (ES+) 352 (MH+), retention time 0.59 min., >98% pure.

Following general procedure (B), combination of 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methoxybenzene-1-sulfonyl chloride **S2** (36 mg, 0.12 mmol) and 4-amino-1-Bocpiperidine (60 mg, 0.30 mmol) followed by flash column chromatography (silica gel, 15-75% ethyl acetate/cyclohexane) afforded *tert*-butyl 4-(5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methoxyphenylsulfonamido)piperidine-1-carboxylate. Deprotection following general procedure (D) afforded 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methoxy-N-(piperidin 4-yl)benzenesulfonamide hydrochloride **29b** (17 mg, 0.04 mmol, 59%) as a white solid; <sup>1</sup>H NMR (400 MHz, METHANOL-d<sub>4</sub>) & 7.79 (d, J = 2.5 Hz, 1H), 7.59 (dd, J = 2.5, 8.5 Hz, 1H), 7.32 (d, J = 8.5 Hz, 1H, 4.03 (s, 3H), 3.30 (m, 2H), 3.14 (m, 2H), 2.74 (m, 2H), 2.40 (s, 3H), 2.24 (s, 3H), 1.81 (dd, J = 3.5, 13.5 Hz, 2H), 1.57 (m, 2H); LCMS (2 minute method): (ES+) 366 (MH+), retention time 0.56 min., >99% pure.

Combining 5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methoxy benzene-1-sulfonyl chloride **S2** (36 mg, 0.12 mmol) and 3-amino-1-Boc-piperidine (60 mg, 0.30 mmol) by general procedure (B) followed by flash column chromatography (silica gel, 11-55% ethoxy acetate/cyclohexane) afforded *tert*-butyl 3-(5-(3,5-dimethylisoxazol-4-yl)-2-methoxy phenylsulfonamido)piperidine-1-carboxylate.
