In Situ Generation of the Coates Catalyst: APractical and Versatile Catalytic System for theCarbonylation of Meso-Epoxides

General remarks

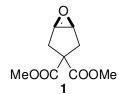
NMR spectra were recorded on Varian Inova 300 MHz and Varian 400 MHz FT spectrometers at room temperature with CDCl₃ as the internal standard. The reference values used for CDCl₃ were 7.26 and 77.0 ppm for ¹H and ¹³C NMR spectra, respectively. The relative stereochemistry of the bicyclic 5- and 7-membered β-lactones was confirmed by NOESY studies. High resolution mass spectra were measured on a Waters/Micromass GCT and Waters 2996 Photodiode Array Detector instruments. Infrared spectra were recorded on a Varian 3100 FT-IR spectrometer at room temperature. Melting points were recorded in open capillaries on a digital Barnsted Electro Thermal 9300 melting point apparatus and are uncorrected. Elemental analysis was performed by UCD's School of Chemistry and Chemical Biology micro analytical service. All carbonylation reactions were carried out in a 100 mL custom built Parr reactor equipped with magnetic stirrer, which has an inlet, outlet, syringe port and pressure burst volve. Heating was performed in an oil bath.

Materials

All reagents were obtained from commercial suppliers and used without further purification. Carbon monoxide gas (99.97% purity) was purchased from CK Gas Ltd. Tetraphenylporphyrinchromium(III) chloride and Co₂(CO)₈ were purchased from Strem Chemicals and used as received. 3-Chloroperoxybenzoic acid, cis-cyclooctene, 1,5cyclooctadiene, cyclopentene, 2,5-dihydrofuran, cis-2-butene-1,4-diol, cis-2,3dimethyloxirane were purchased from Fisher Scientific Ltd, and 1,2-epoxybutane was purchased from Sigma Aldrich. Dry THF was obtained from a solvent purification system and degassed prior to use. Thin layer chromatography was performed on Merck Aluminium sheets (silica gel 60 F₂₅₄). Detection was carried out by UV and by coloration with ceric ammonium molybdate (CAM) or vanillin. Flash column chromatography was performed using Merck silica gel 60 (230-400 mesh).

The following compounds were synthesized according to literature procedures: (TPP)CrCl,¹ (TPP)AlCl,¹ (TPP)CoCl,¹ (TPP)FeCl,² 1,2-epoxy-5-cyclooctene,³ *cis*-cyclooctaneoxide,⁴ *cis*-cyclohepteneoxide,⁵ *cis*-cyclopenteneoxide,⁶ *cis*-1,2-epoxycyclododecane,⁷ *cis*-4-octeneoxide,⁸ *cis*-2,3-dibenzyloxirane,⁹ *cis*-2,3-bis(ethoxymethyl)oxirane,¹⁰ *cis*-1,4-dibenzyloxy-2,3-epoxybutane,¹¹ 3,4-epoxytetrahydro-furan,¹² dimethyl cyclopent-3-ene-1,1-dicarboxylate¹³ and 1-tosyl-2,3,6,7-tetrahydro-1H-azepine.¹⁴ All epoxides were dried by either column chromatography or by distillation over CaH₂ prior to use.

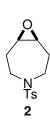
Dimethyl 6-oxa-bicyclo[3.1.0]hexane-3,3-dicarboxylate (1)



To a stirred solution of dimethyl cyclopent-3-ene-1,1-dicarboxylate (920 mg, 5.0 mmol) in dichloromethane (20 mL) was added at 0 $^{\circ}$ C *m*-CPBA (77% purity, 1.46 g, 6.5 mmol) portionwise over 10 min. The resulting reaction mixture was allowed to warm to room temperature and stirred for

24 h. The precipitate was filtered and the filtrate was diluted with dichloromethane (20 mL), washed with saturated aqueous NaHCO₃ solution and water. The organic layer was dried over Na₂SO₄ and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. The residue was purified by flash column chromatography (SiO₂; pentane/Et₂O, 80:20), to give the title compound (910 mg) as colorless liquid in 91% yield. 4-Tosyl-8-oxa-4-azabicyclo[5.1.0]octane (2)



To a stirred solution of 1-tosyl-2,3,6,7-tetrahydro-1H-azepine (1.0 g, 3.98 mmol) in dichloromethane (20 mL) was added at 0 $^{\circ}$ C m-CPBA (77% purity, 1.46 g, 6.5 mmol) portionwise over 10 min. The resulting reaction mixture was allowed to warm to room temperature and stirred for 12 h. The precipitate was filtered and the filtrate was diluted with dichloromethane (20 mL), washed with saturated aqueous

NaHCO₃ solution and water. The organic layer was dried over Na₂SO₄ and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. The residue was purified by flash column chromatography (neutral Al₂O₃; pentane/Et₂O, 50:50) to give the title compound (925 mg) as white solid in 87% yield. General procedure for carbonylation of *meso*-epoxides (Table 2)

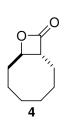
(TPP)CrCl (0.002-0.1 mmol), Co₂(CO)₈ (0.003-0.15 mmol) were placed in an oven-dried Schlenk tube under N₂ atmosphere. Dry THF (3.0 mL) and the appropriate epoxide (2.0 mmol) were added and the reaction mixture was degassed by three vacuum/nitrogen cycles. The reaction mixture was injected via a syringe into an oven dried reactor under N₂. The reactor was pressurized with CO gas to about 20 psi and vented. Subsequently, it was pressurized to 500 psi, placed in an oil bath and heated at 70 °C for 16 h. The reactor was allowed to cool to room temperature and the CO gas was vented off carefully. The reaction mixture was evaporated under reduced pressure and the residue was purified by flash column chromatography to give the pure β -lactone.

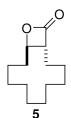

4-Ethyloxetan-2-one (**16**)²⁰

(TPP)CrCl (7.0 mg, 1×10^{-8} mmol), $Co_2(CO)_8$ (5.0 mg, 1.5×10^{-8} mmol) were placed in an oven-dried Schlenk tube under N_2 atmosphere. Dry THF (10mL) and 1,2-epoxybutane (7.2 g, 100.0 mmol) were added and the reaction mixture was degassed by three vacuum/nitrogen cycles. The reaction mixture was injected *via* a syringe into an oven dried reactor under N_2 . The reactor was pressurized with CO gas to about 20 psi and vented. Subsequently, it was pressurized to 500 psi, placed in an oil bath and heated at 70 °C for 16 h. The reactor was allowed to cool to room temperature and the CO gas was vented off carefully. 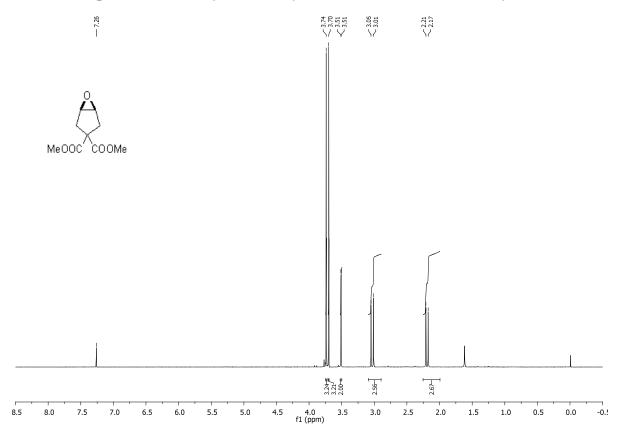
Trans-4-aminotetrahydrofuran-3-carboxylic acid (17)²²

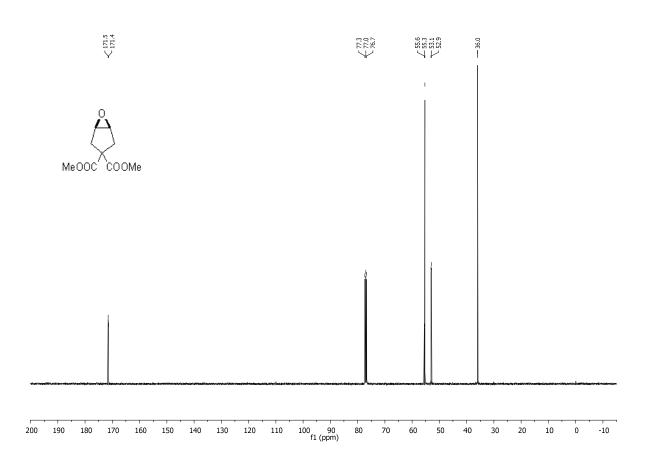
To a stirred solution of 3,6-dioxabicyclo[3.2.0]heptan-7-one (150 mg, 1.3 CO₂H mmol) in dry DMF (5 mL) was added NaN $_3$ (427 mg, 6.5 mmol) under N $_2$ atm. The reaction mixture was stirred at room temperature for 48 h and diluted with water (10 mL). The pH was adjusted to 8 with saturated aqueous NaHCO₃ solution and extracted with EtOAc (10 mL). The aqueous layer was acidified to a pH of 2 with 1 M HCl and then extracted with Et₂O (3 x 30 mL). The combined Et₂O layers were washed with brine (2 x 20 mL), dried over Na₂SO₄ and evaporated to dryness to yield the crude azide. The crude azide was dissolved in methanol (3 mL) and 10 % Pd/C (10 mg) was added and the reaction mixture stirred under a H₂ atmosphere (1 atm, H₂ balloon) for 12 h. The reaction mixture was filtered through a pad of celite using methanol as the eluent and evaporated to dryness to afford the crude amino acid, which was triturated with Et₂O (5 mL) and dried under high vacuum to afford the title compound as white solid (73 mg) in 56 % yield. ¹H NMR (300 MHz, D₂O): δ 2.96-3.03 (m, 1 H, CHCOOH), 3.71-3.76 (m, 1 H, CHHO), 3.80-3.88 (m, 2 H, CH₂CHNH₂), 3.97-4.14 (m, CHNH₂) 4.18 (virtual t, J = 8.8 Hz, 1 H, CHHO).

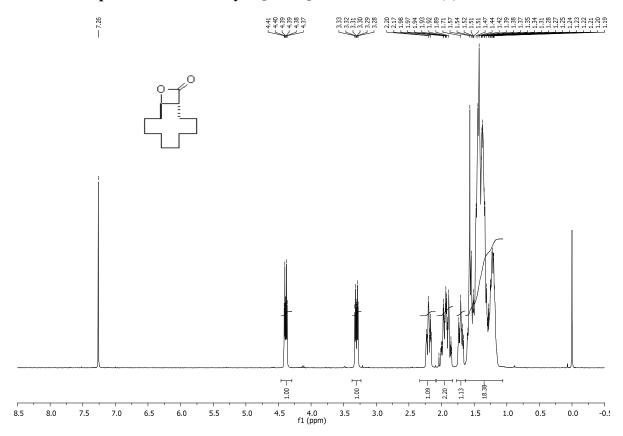


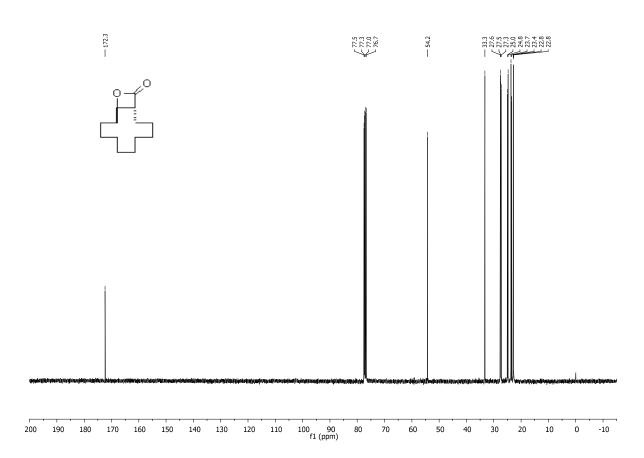
¹H and ¹³C Spectra of 9-Oxabicyclo[6.2.0]decan-10-one (4)



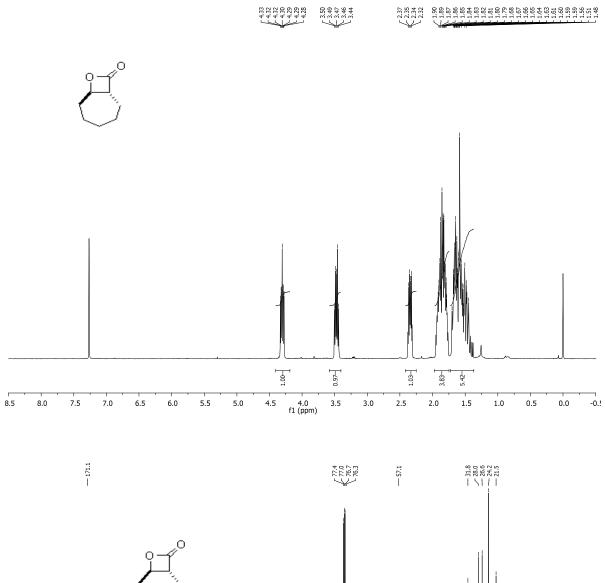


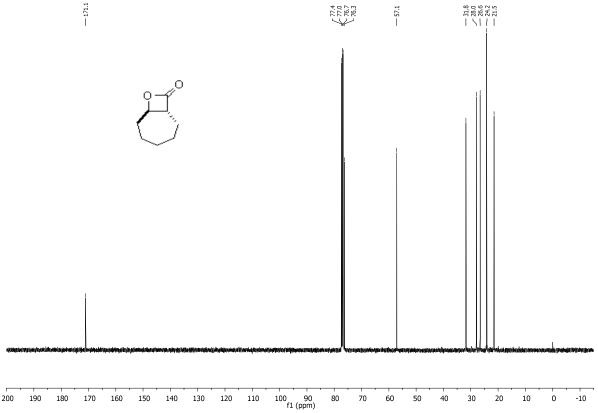
¹H and ¹³C Spectra of 13-Oxabicyclo[10.2.0]tetradecan-14-one (5)



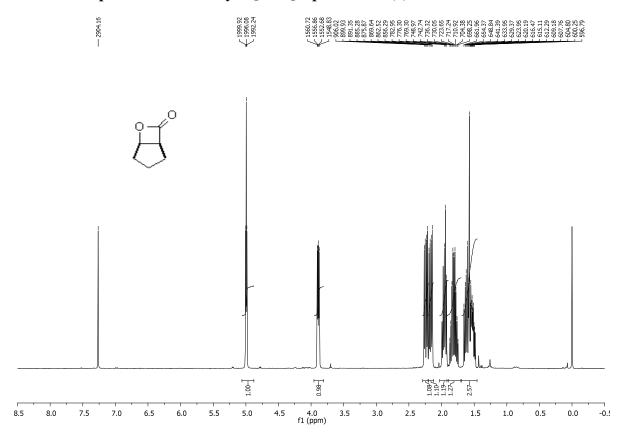


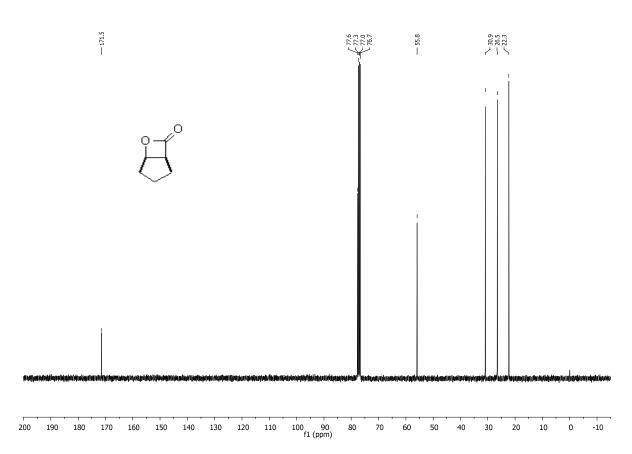
¹H and ¹³C Spectra of 8-Oxabicyclo[5.2.0]nonan-9-one (6)



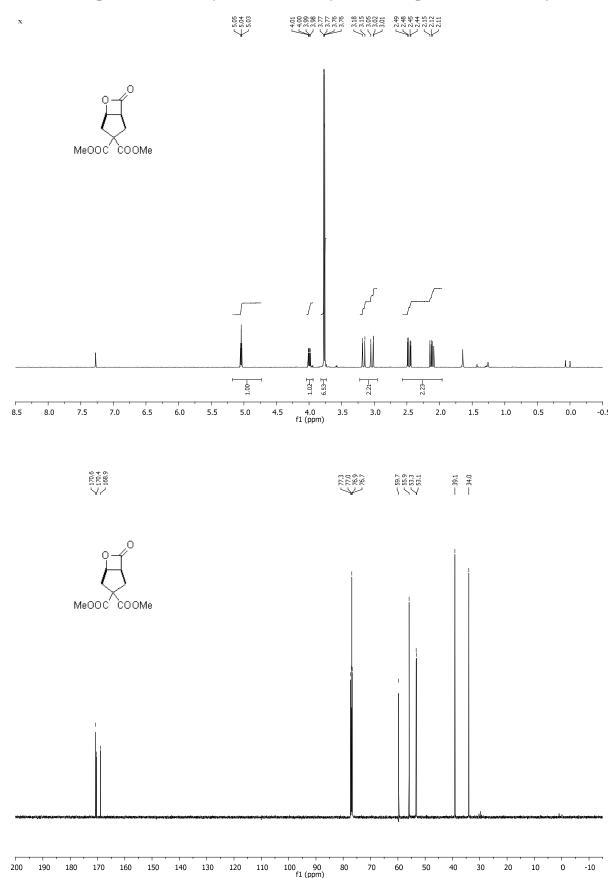

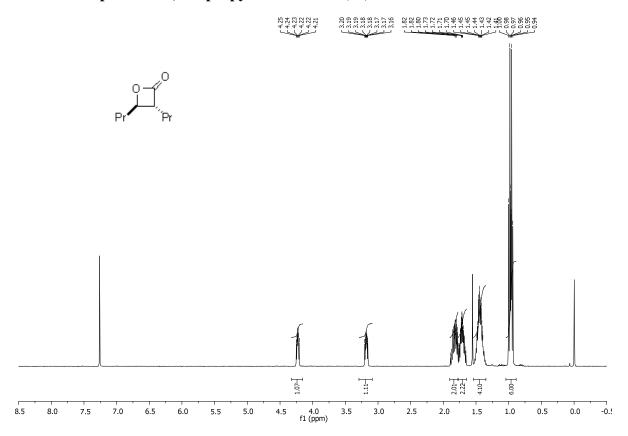


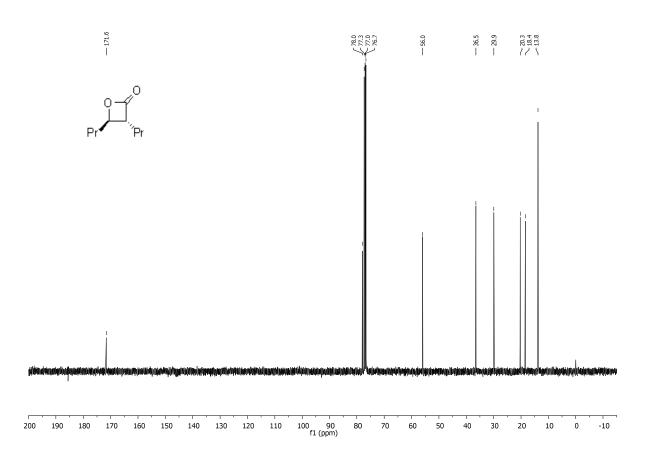
¹H and ¹³C Spectra of 3,4-Dimethyloxetan-2-one (9)



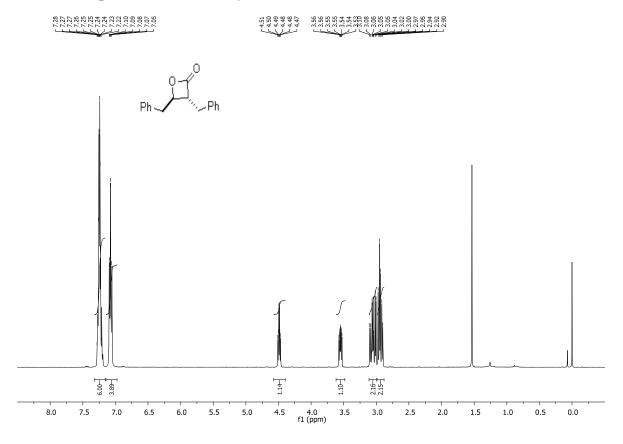


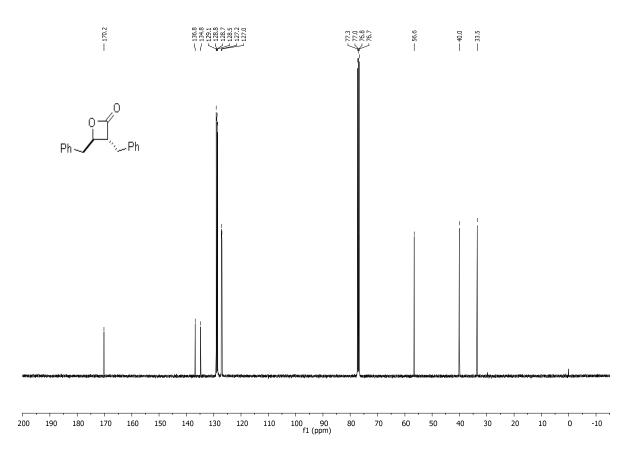
¹H and ¹³C Spectra of 3,4-Dipropyloxetan-2-one (10)



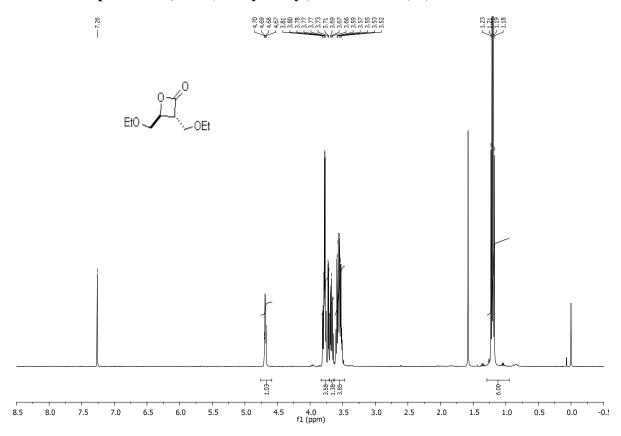


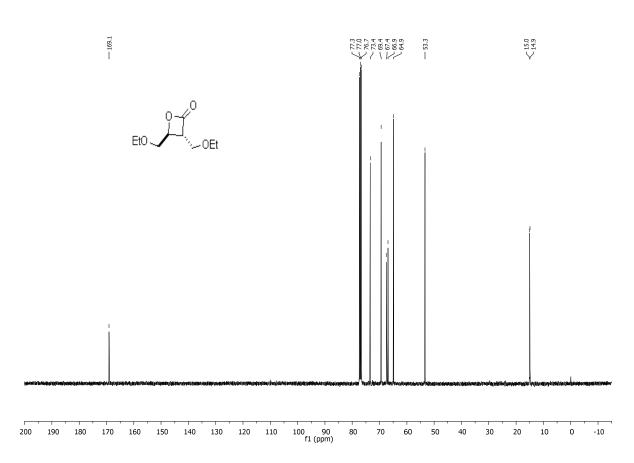
¹H and ¹³C Spectra of 3,4-Dibenzyloxetan-2-one (11)



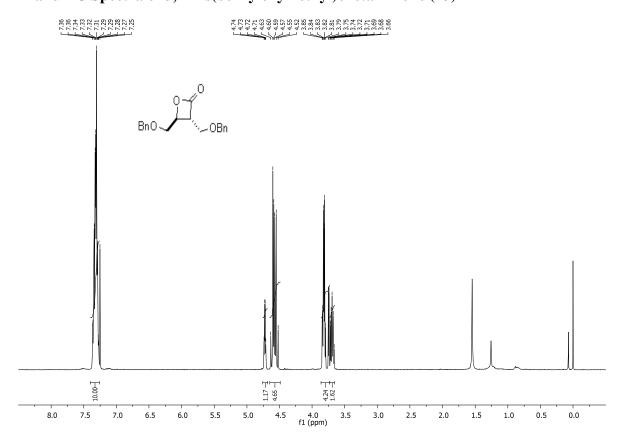


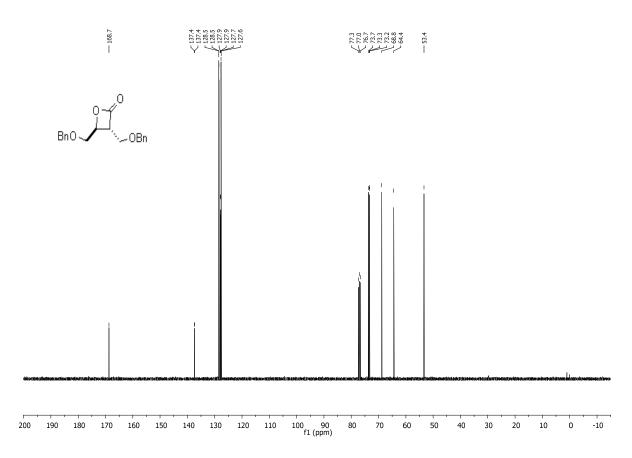

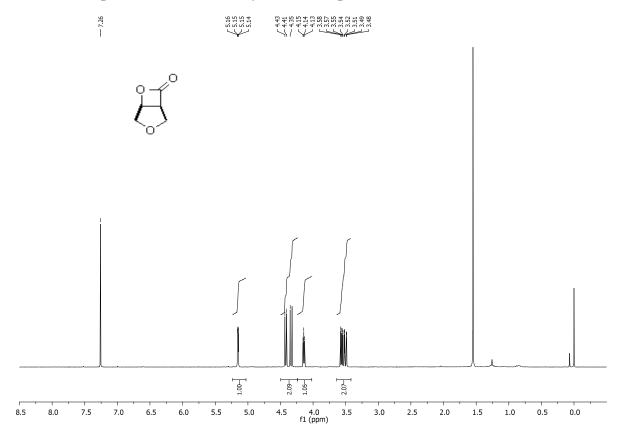


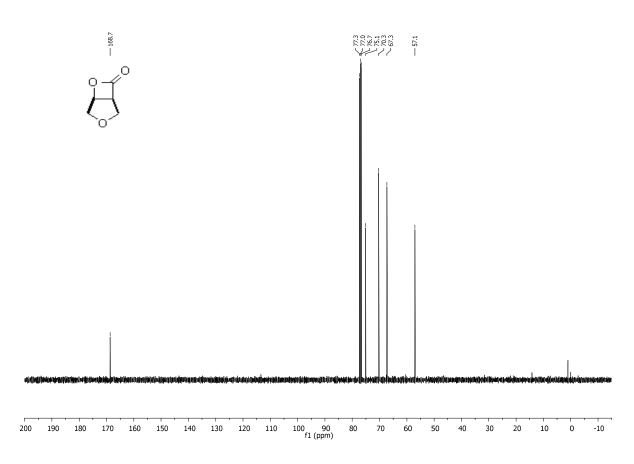
¹H and ¹³C Spectra of 3,4-Bis(benzyloxymethyl)oxetan-2-one (13)



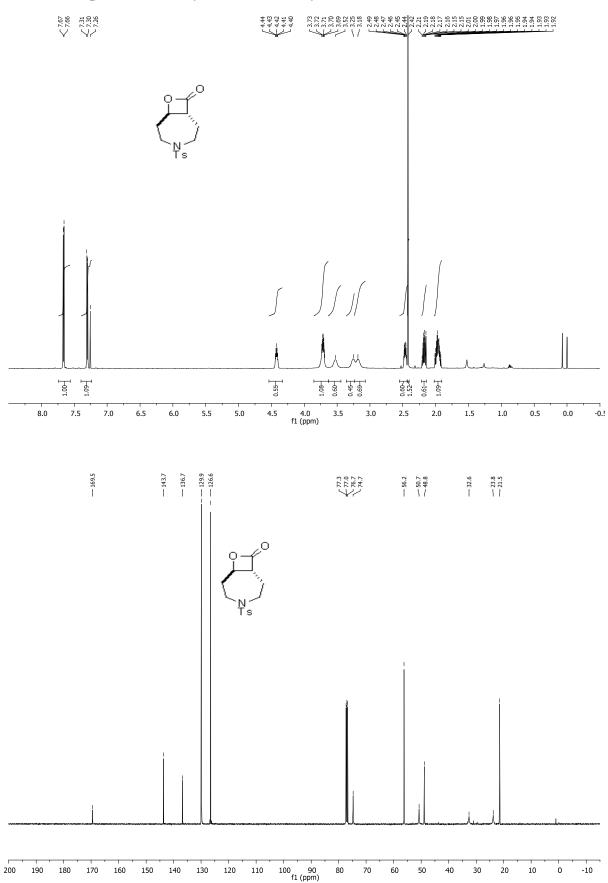


¹H and ¹³C Spectra of 3,6-Dioxabicyclo[3.2.0]heptan-7-one (14)

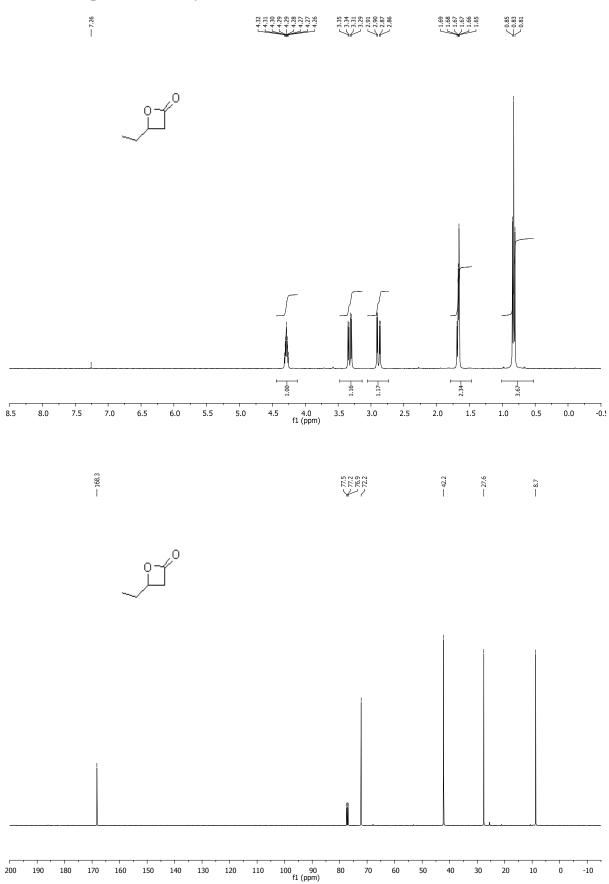
