Mesyl chloride (0.84 mL, 10.7 mmol) was added to a solution of (5-bromo-2-pyridinyl)methanol (**153**) (1.00 g, 5.32 mmol) and Et₃N (2.22 mL, 15.9 mmol) in anhydrous THF (15 mL) at 0 °C. The solution was stirred at 0 °C for 1 h, and then partitioned between EtOAc and water. The organic layer was dried and concentrated to give a crude mesylate. The mesylate was dissolved in acetone (20 mL), LiBr (2.0 g, 23 mmol) was added, and the stirred mixture was refluxed under N₂ for 1 h. The cooled mixture was filtered and evaporated, and the residue was diluted with water and extracted with CH₂Cl₂.
