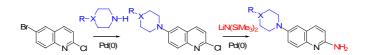

General Considerations. Unless otherwise specified all reagents were purchased from commercial suppliers and used without further purification. Toluene, trifluoromethylbenzene, DME and 1,4-dioxane were distilled and dried according to standard procedures.¹ Commercially available lithium bis(trimethylsilyl)amide (LHMDS) was used as a 1.0 M solution in THF. Reactions conducted under pressure were carried out in an ACE pressure tube purchased from Sigma-Aldrich (product number Z181064). Microwave reactions were carried out in either a CEM MARS multimode platform system or CEM Discover single mode system.

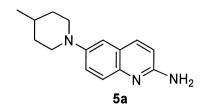
¹H & ¹³C NMR Signals for all new compounds were assigned using a combination of COSY, ROESY, heteronuclear multiple quantum coherence (HMQC) and heteronuclear multiple bond correlation (HMBC) spectral data. The evaluation of binding of compounds to the murine Tec IV SH3 domain using NMR chemical shift perturbation experiments were performed according to methods described previously.²

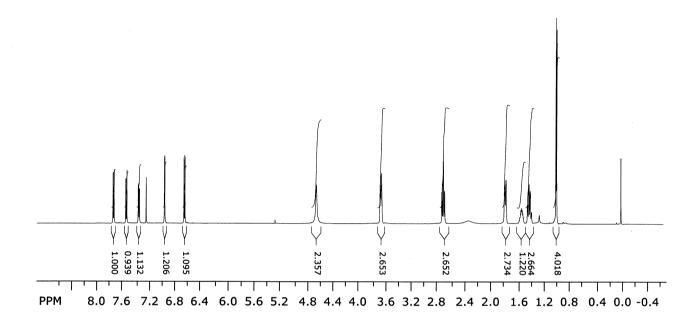
¹H and ¹³C NMR spectra are provided for all desired products **5** and **6**. In addition, spectroscopic data for by-products **8**, **17**, **18**, **19**, **20**, **21** and **22** is included where appropriate. In cases where a compound has been isolated as a mixture and as the pure compound NMR data is provided for both the mixture and the pure compound. For compounds obtained as a mixture, characterization was achieved using COSY, ROESY, HMQC and HMBC NMR data. A representative example of 2D data utilised for the characterization of **6** isolated as a mixture with **8** is provided with heterocycle **i**. Similarly, a representative example of 2D data utilised for the characterization of **6** isolated as a mixture with **16** is provided with heterocycle **a**.

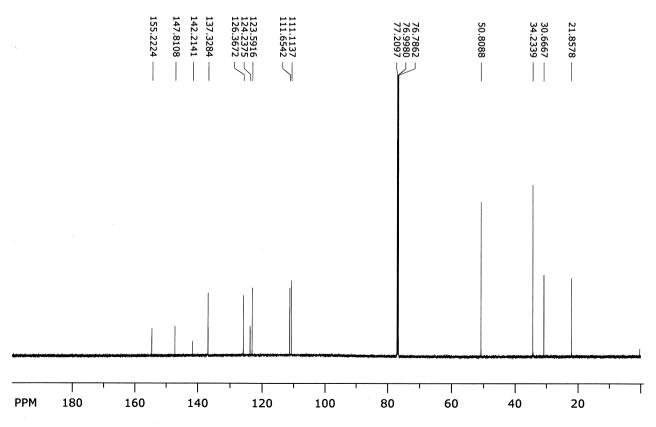


Figure S2: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 5b obtained using General Procedure 5.

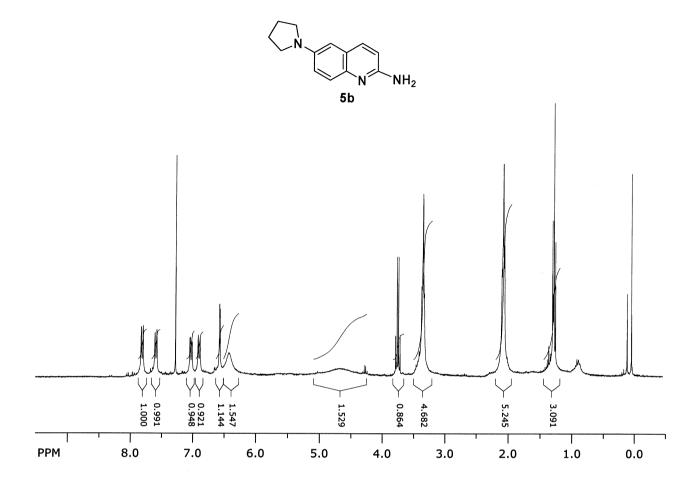

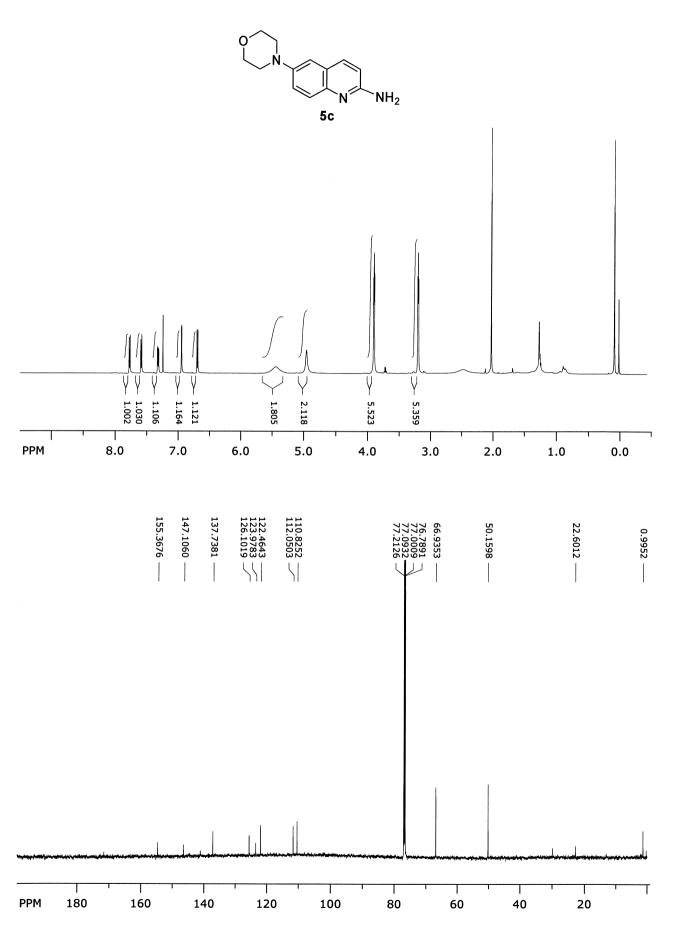

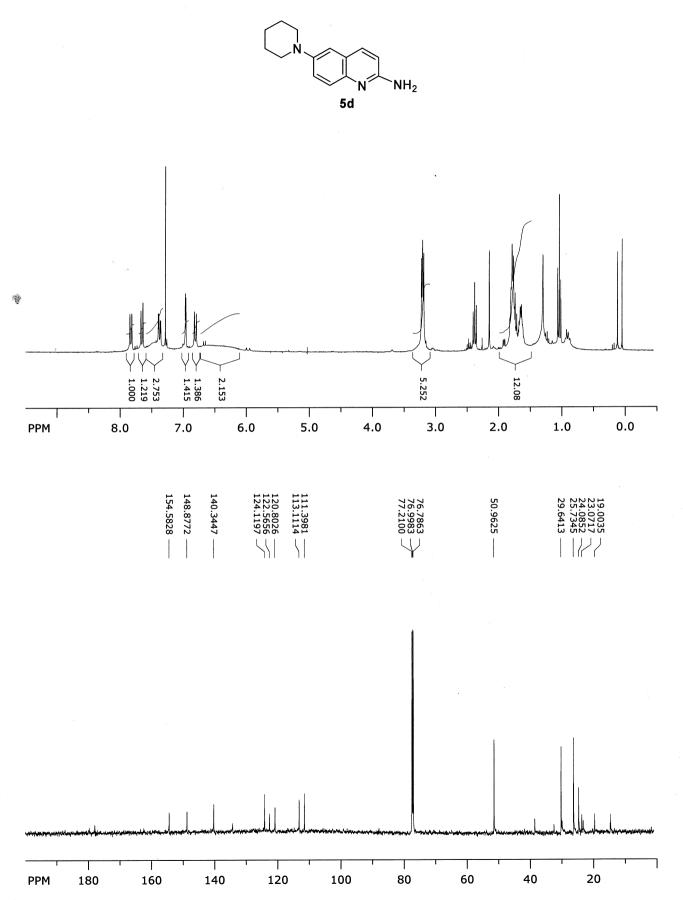
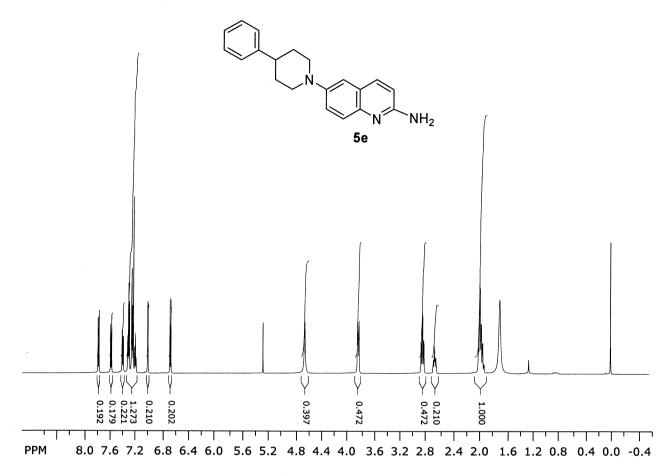

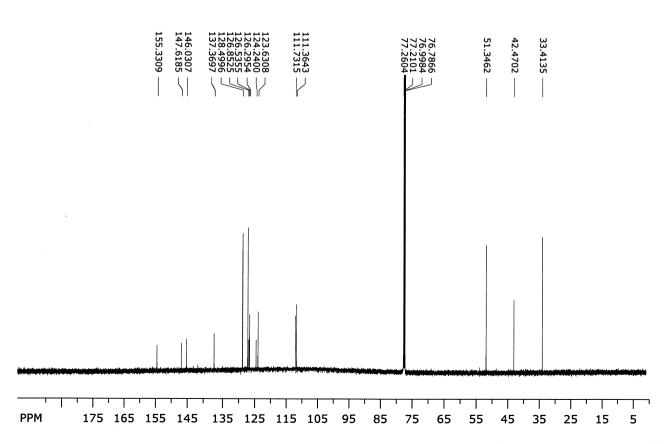
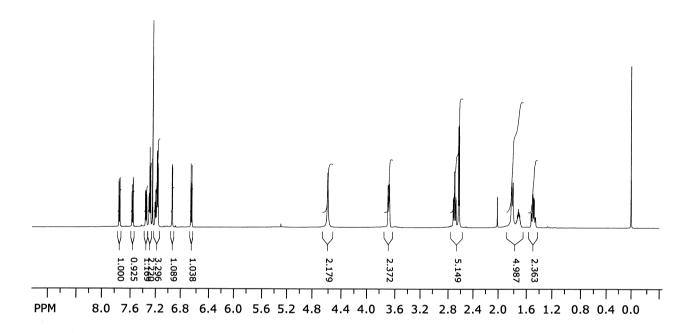

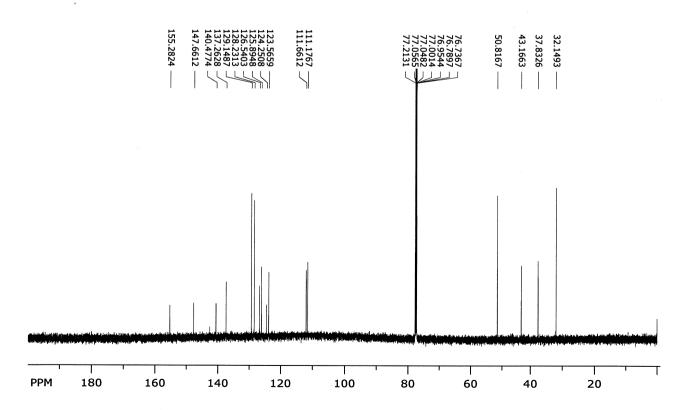
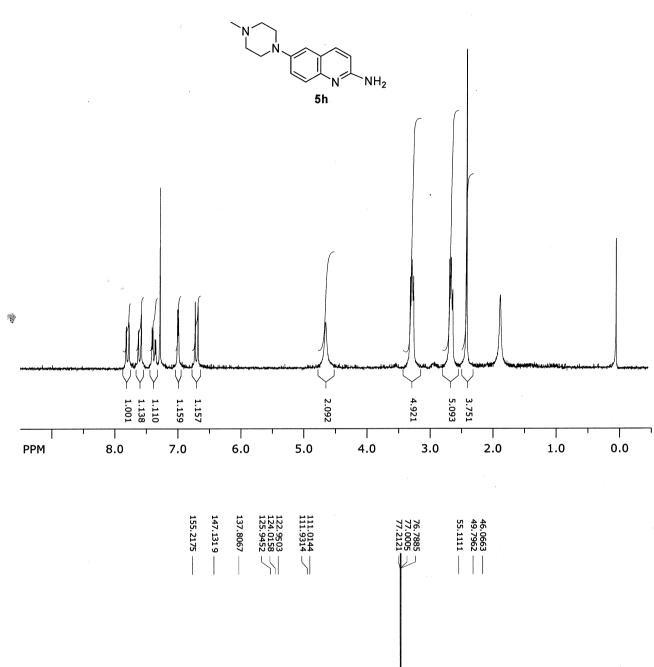

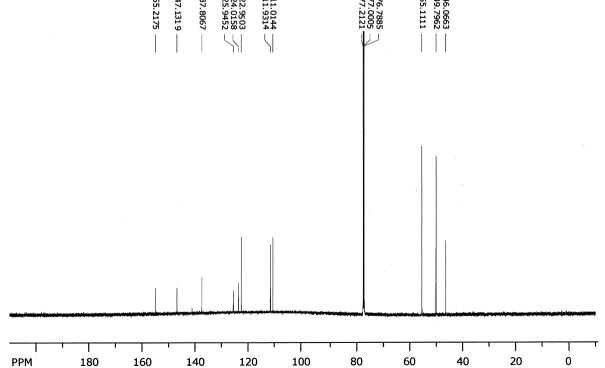
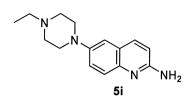
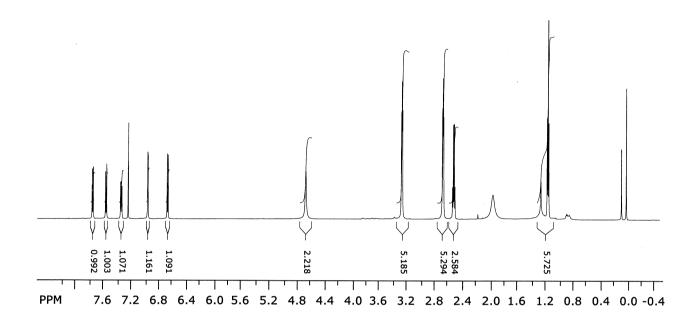

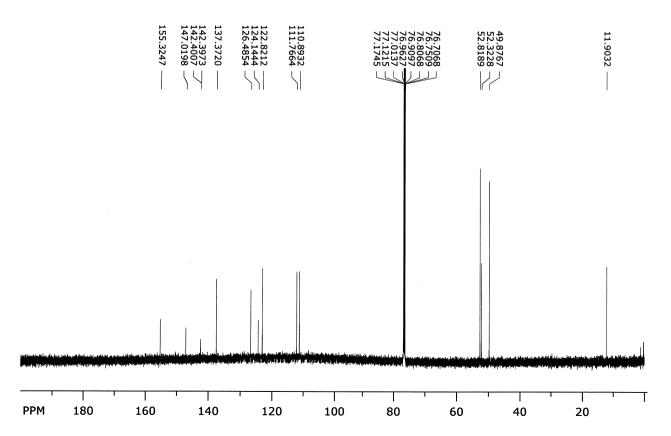


Figure S9: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 5j obtained using General Procedure 5.

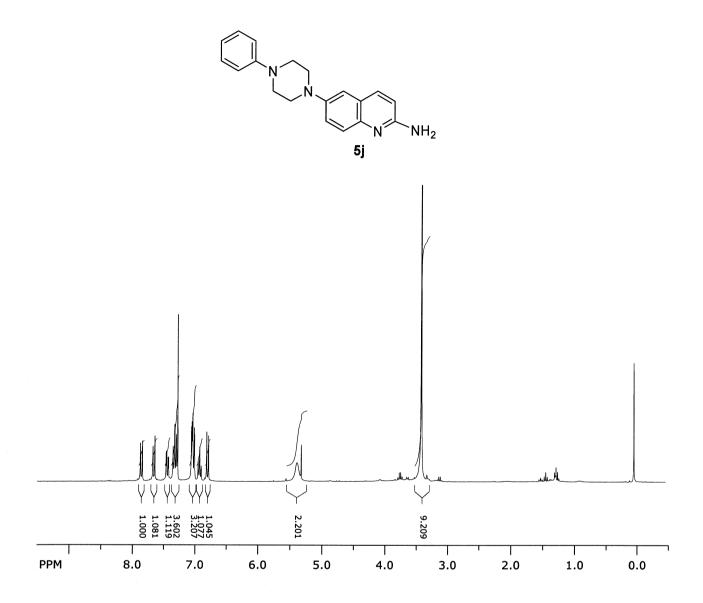
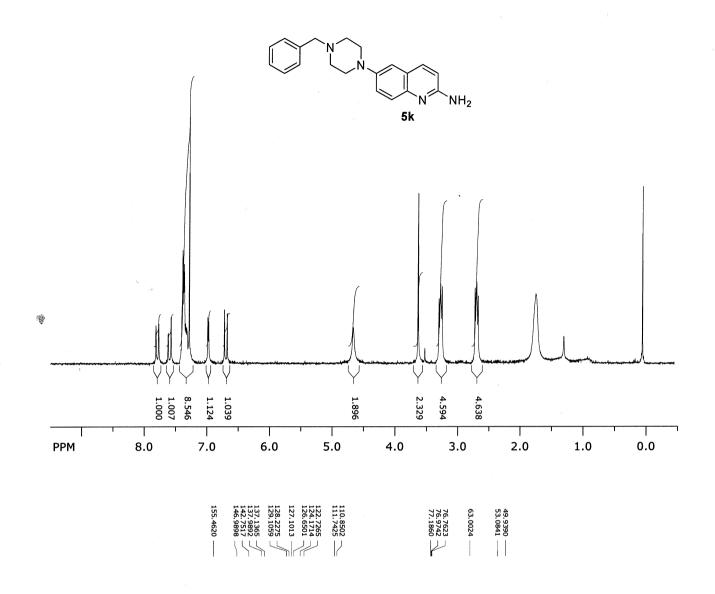

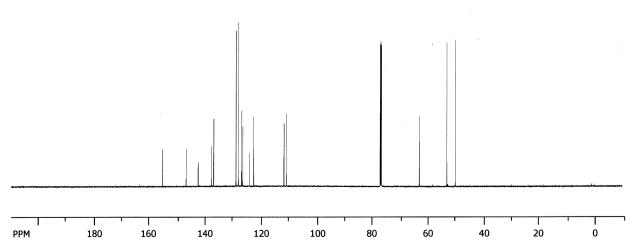
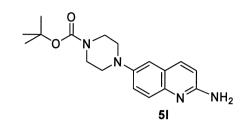


Figure S11: 600 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 5l obtained using General Procedure 5.



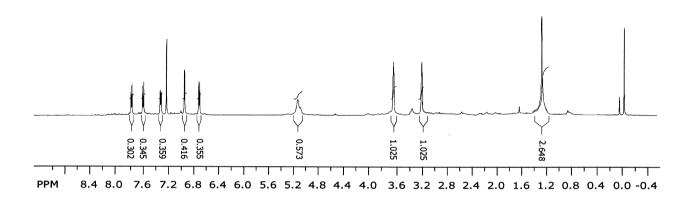

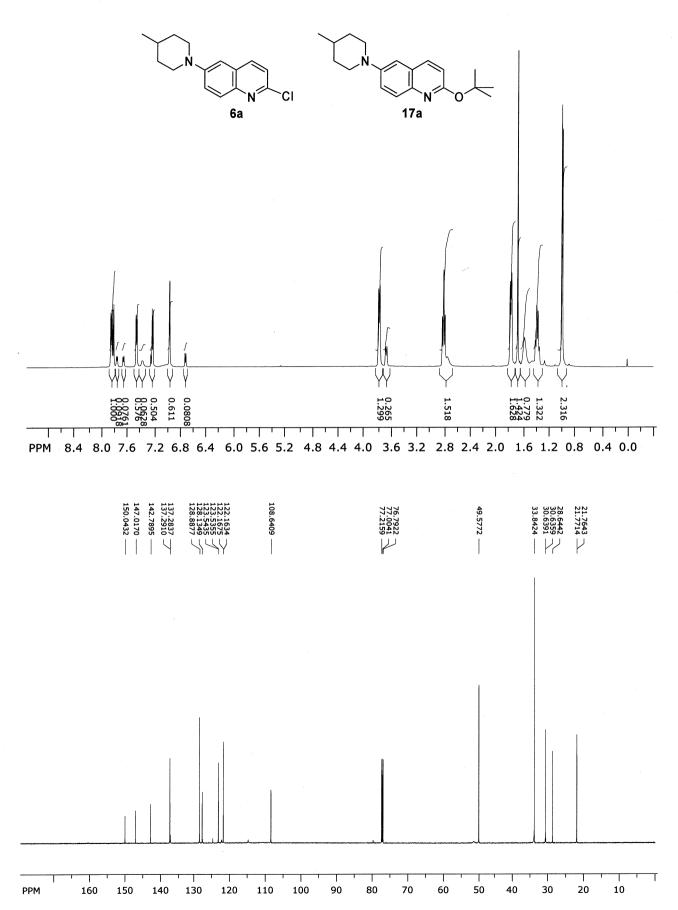


Figure S13: COSY and ROESY spectra (CDCl₃) respectively of 6a and 16a mixture obtained using General Procedure 1.

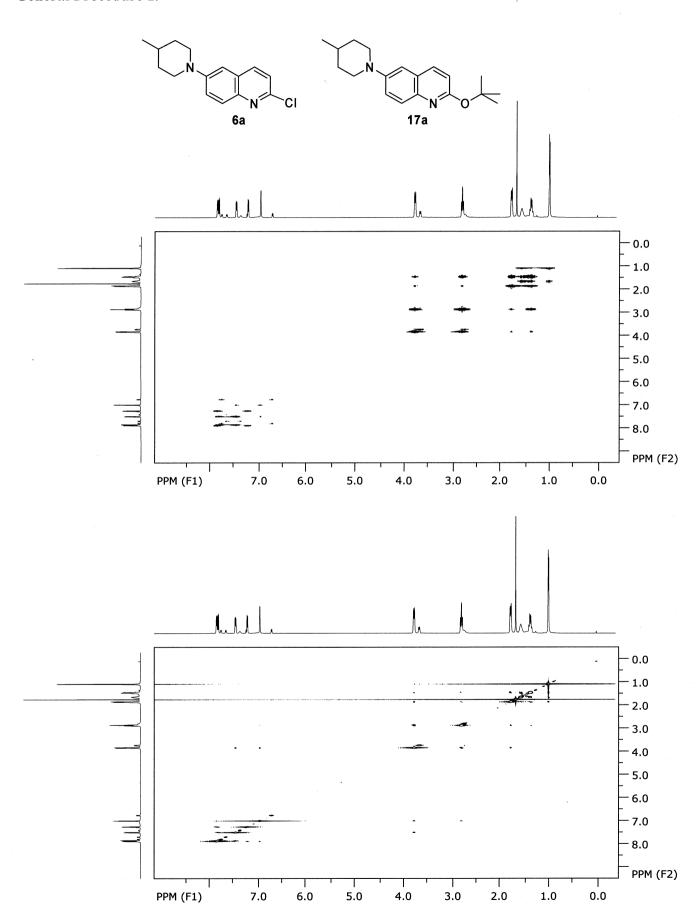


Figure S14: HMQC and HMBC spectra (CDCl₃) respectively of 6a and 16a mixture obtained using General Procedure 1.

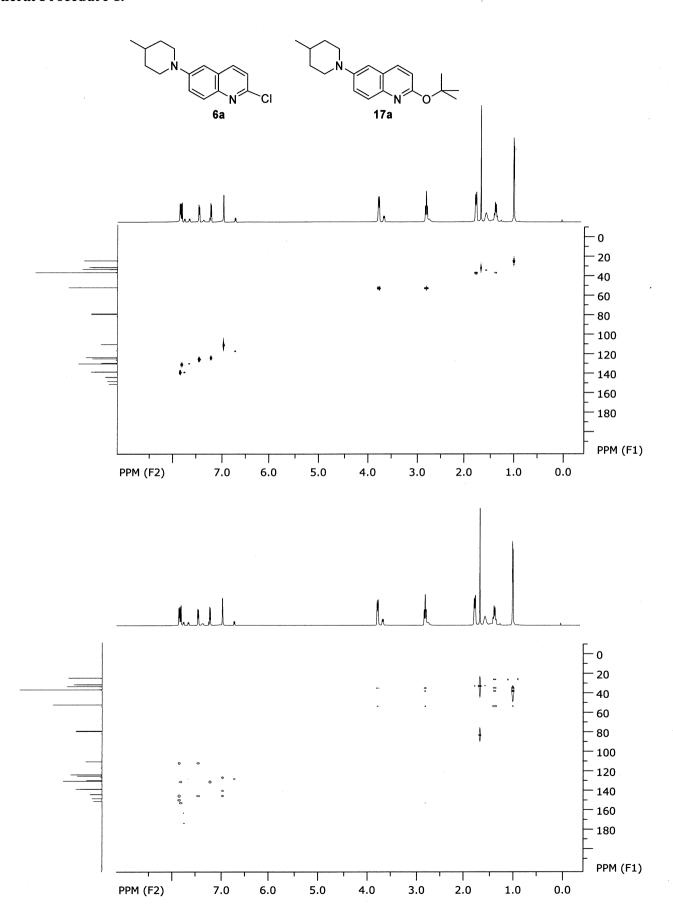


Figure S15: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 6a obtained using General Procedure 2.

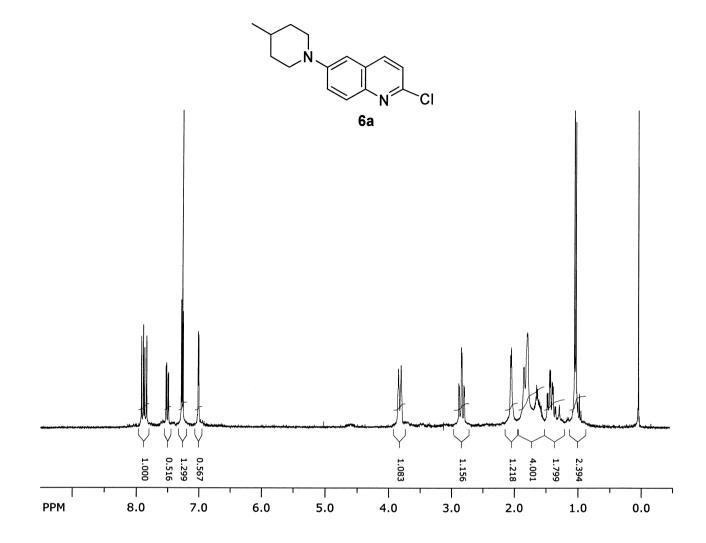
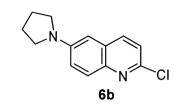


Figure S16: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 6b obtained using General Procedure 1.



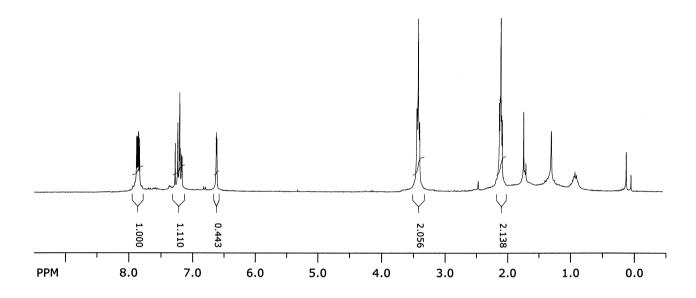
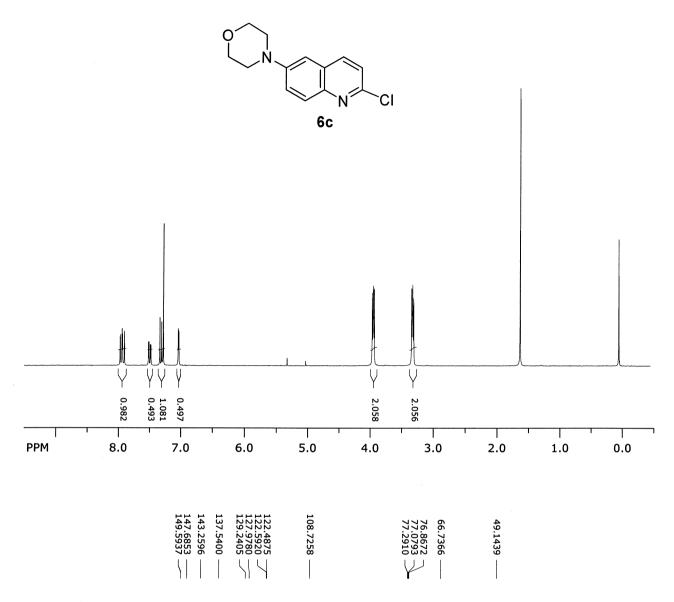


Figure S17: 300 MHz ¹H and 150 MHz ¹³C NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 6c obtained using General Procedure 1.



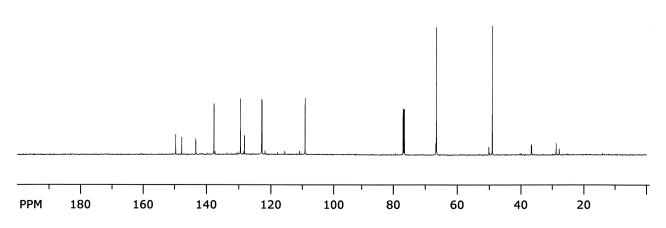
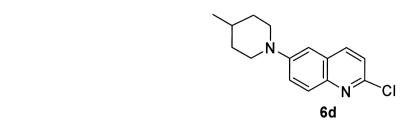
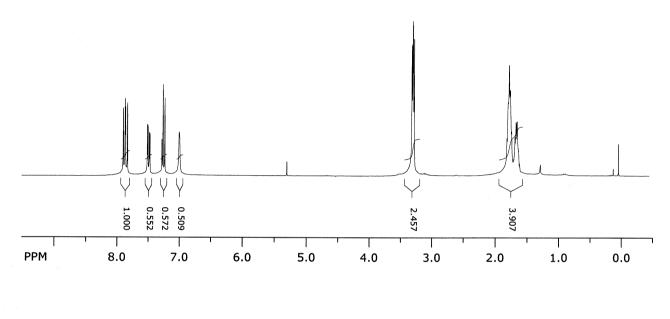


Figure S18: 300 MHz ¹H and 75 MHz ¹³C NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 6d obtained using General Procedure 1.







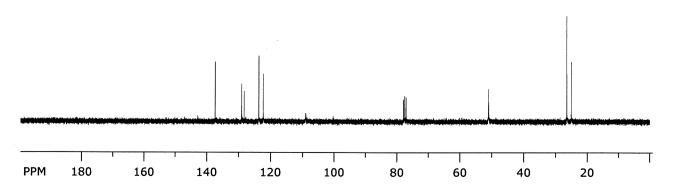
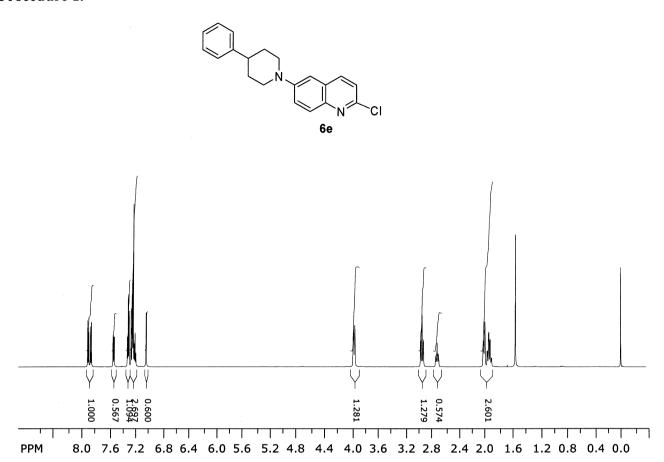


Figure S19: 300 MHz ¹H and 75 MHz ¹³C NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 6e obtained using General Procedure 1.



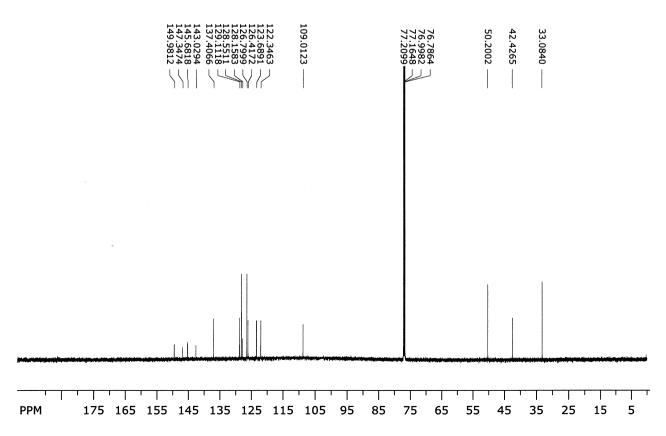
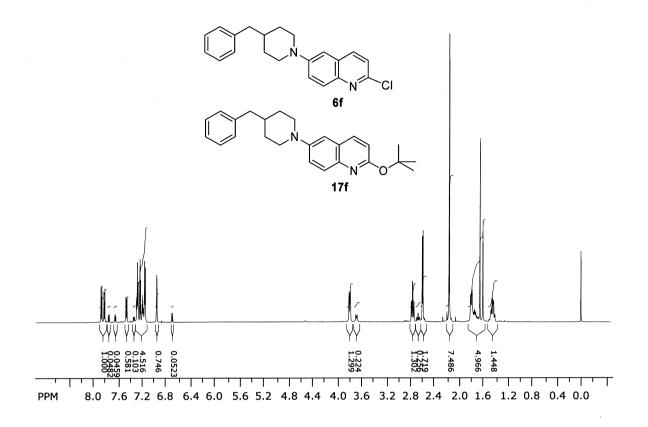

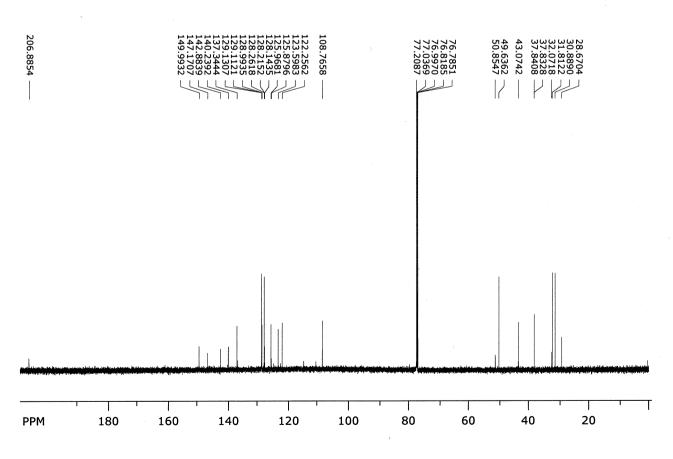


Figure S21: 600 MHz ¹H NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 6f obtained using General Procedure 1.

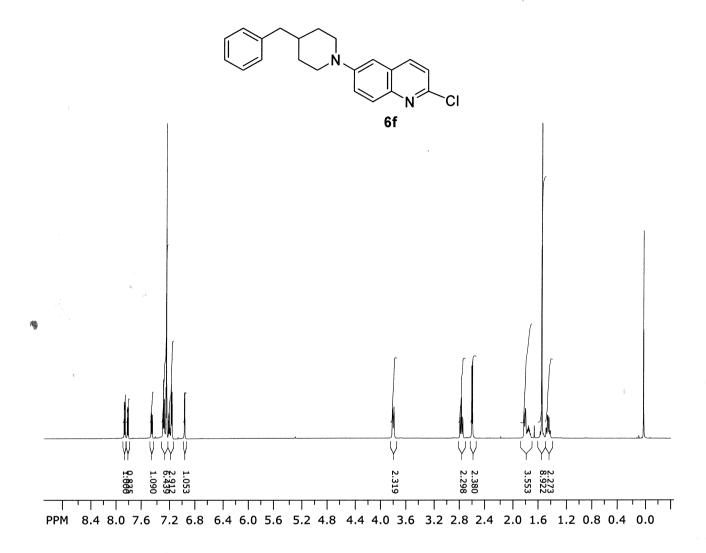
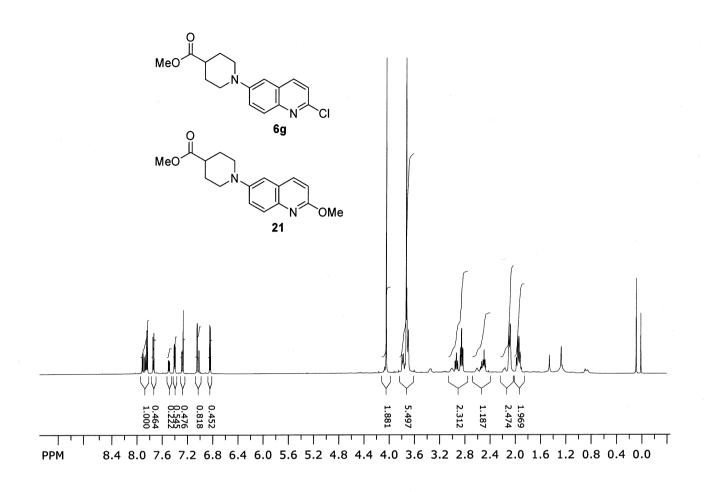

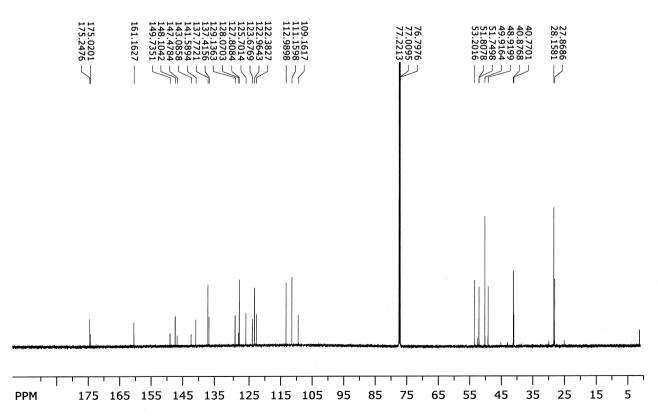
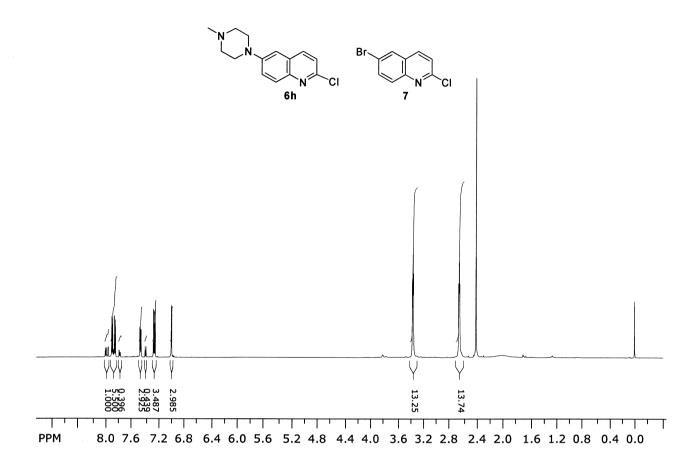

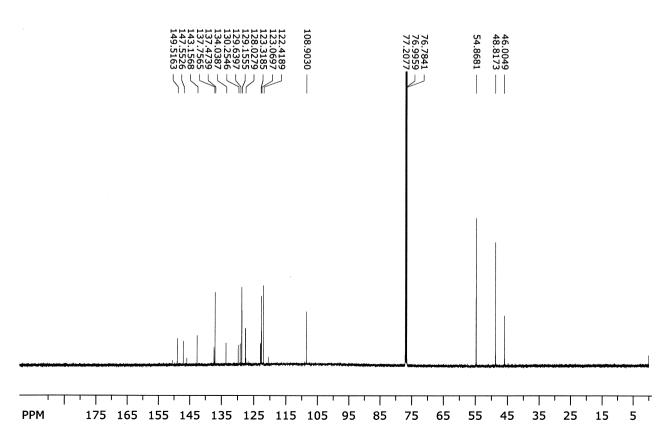


Figure S24: 600 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 6h obtained using General Procedure 3.

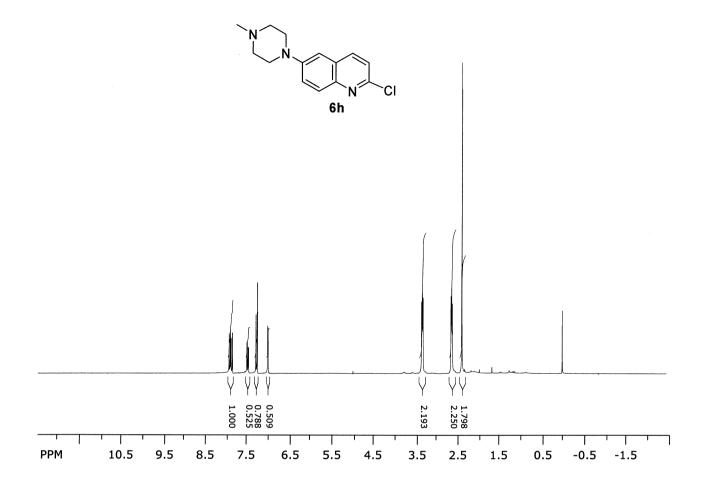

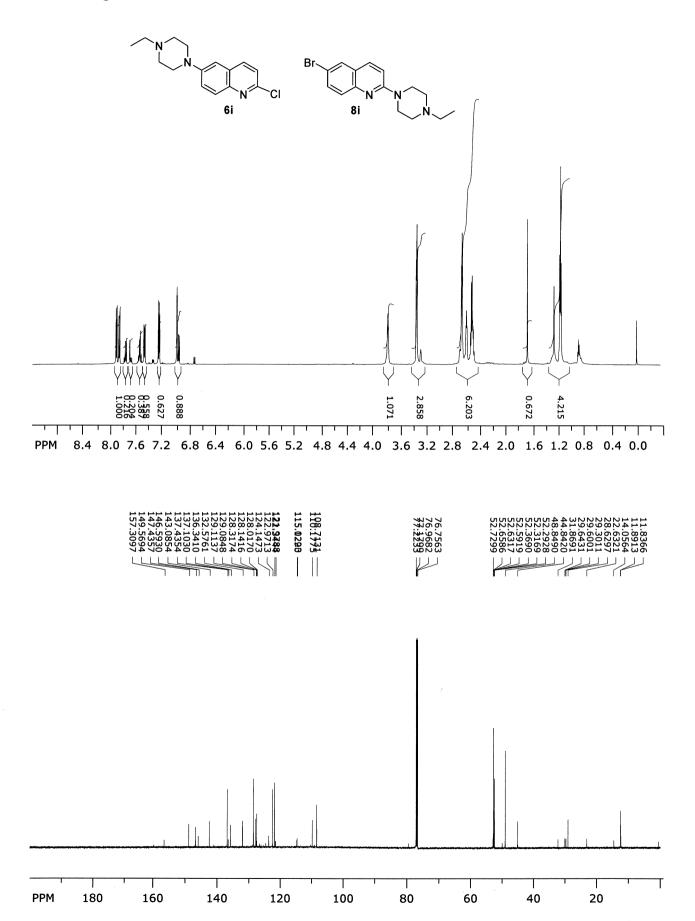


Figure S26: COSY and ROESY NMR spectra respectively (CDCl₃) of 6i and 8i mixture obtained using General Procedure 1.

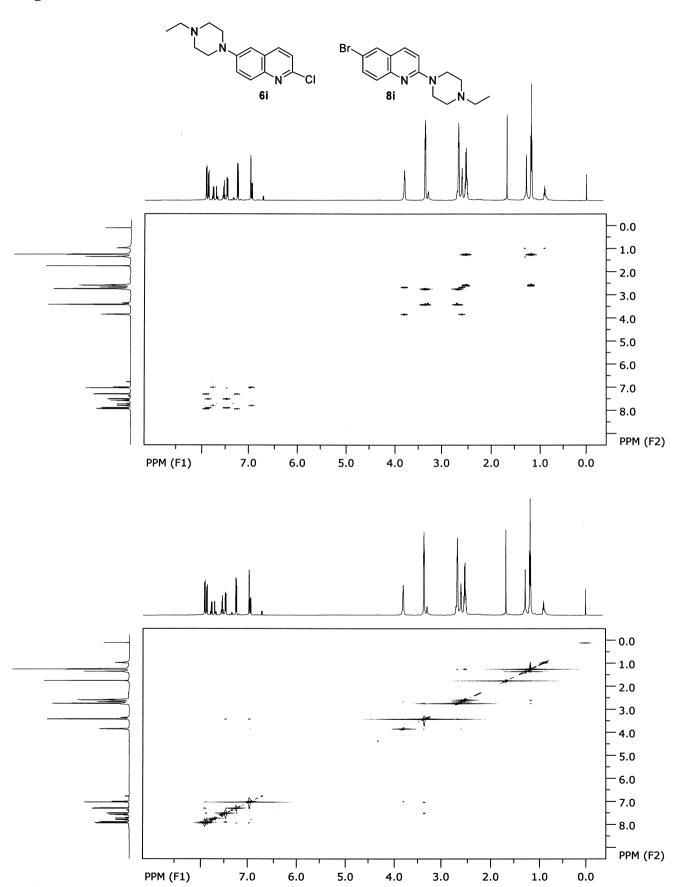


Figure S27: HMQC and HMBC NMR spectra respectively (CDCl₃) of 6i and 8i mixture obtained using General Procedure 1.

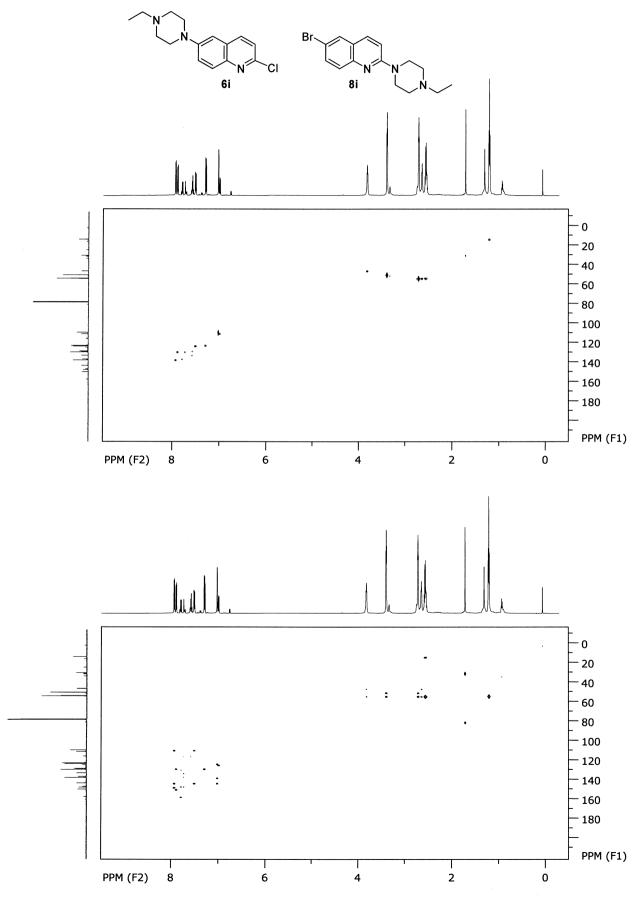
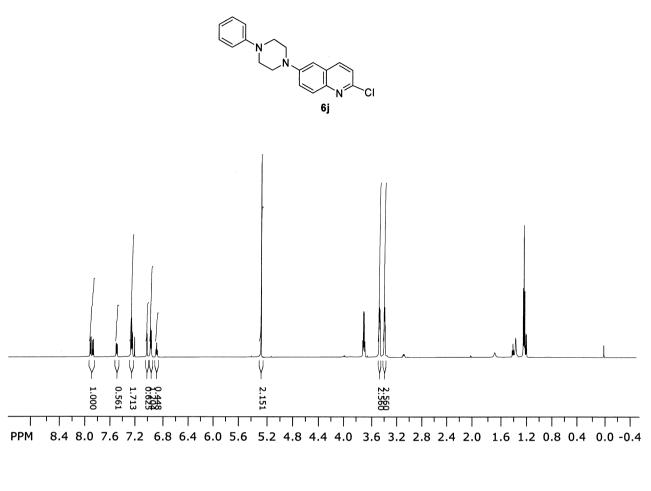


Figure S28: 300 MHz ¹H and 150 MHz ¹³C NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 6j obtained using General Procedure 1.



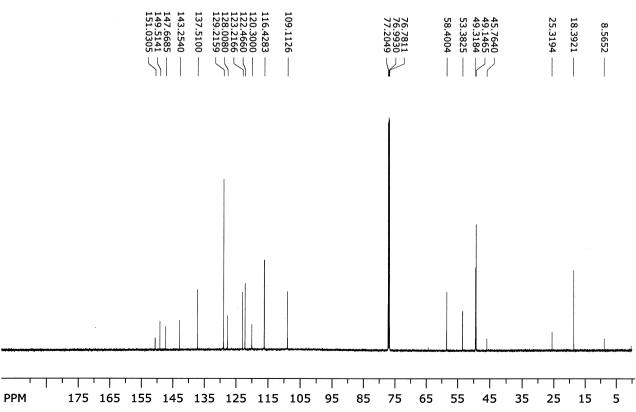
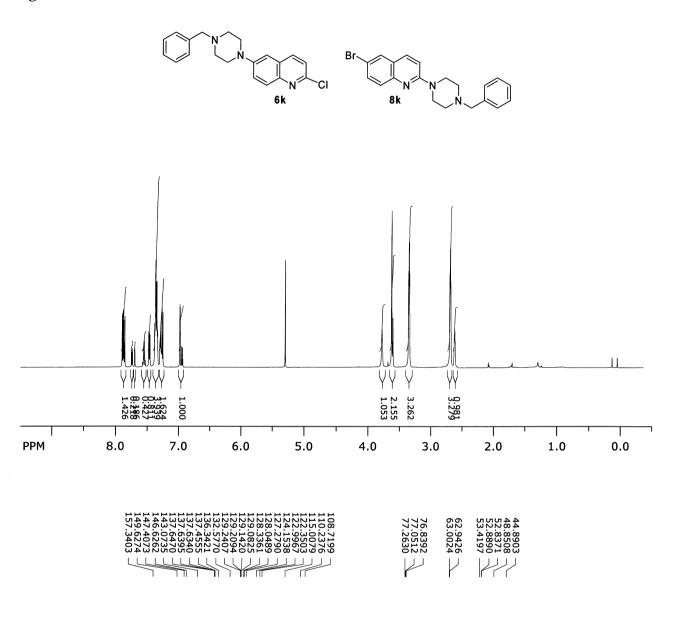

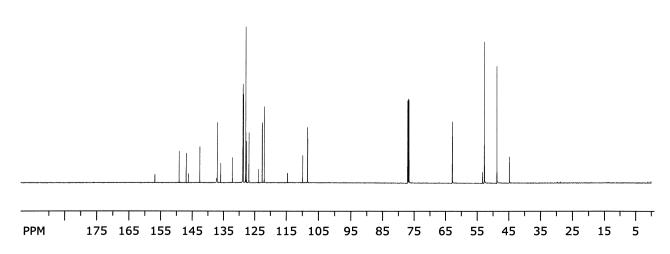


Figure S30: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 6k obtained using General Procedure 2.

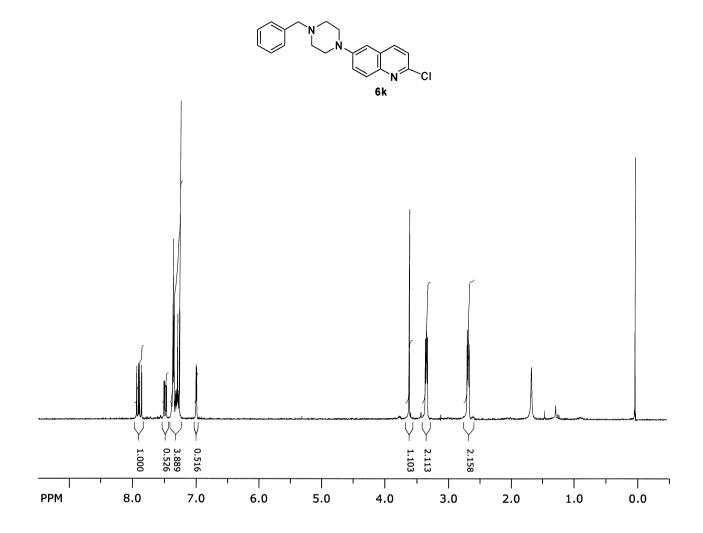

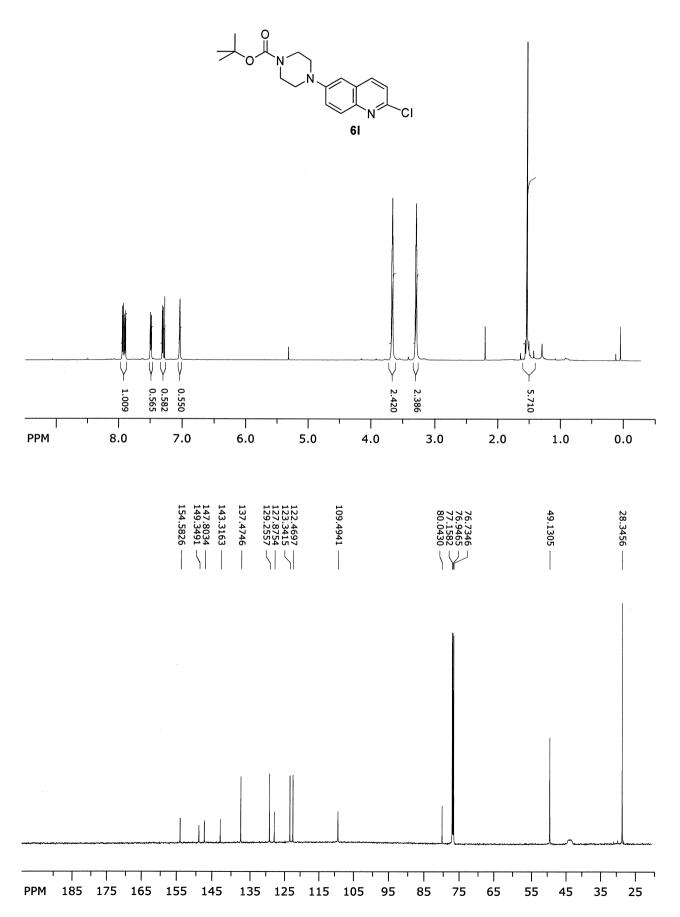


Figure S32: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 8a obtained using General Procedure 1.

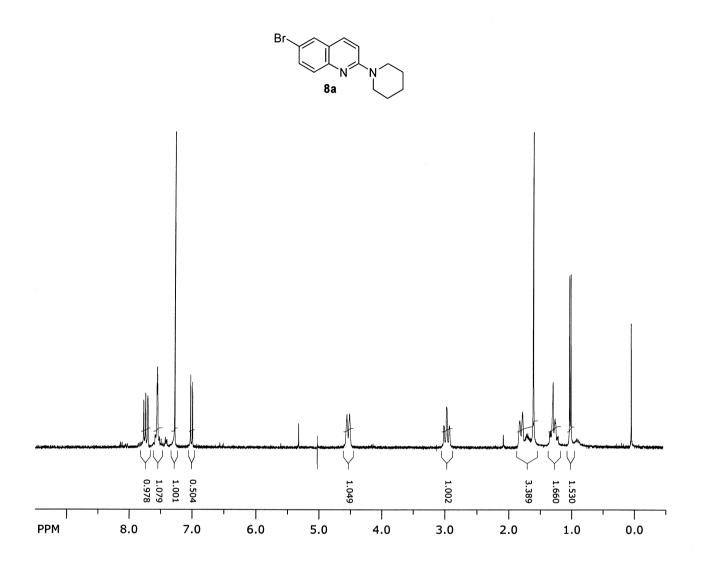


Figure S33: 600 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 8i obtained using General Procedure 1.

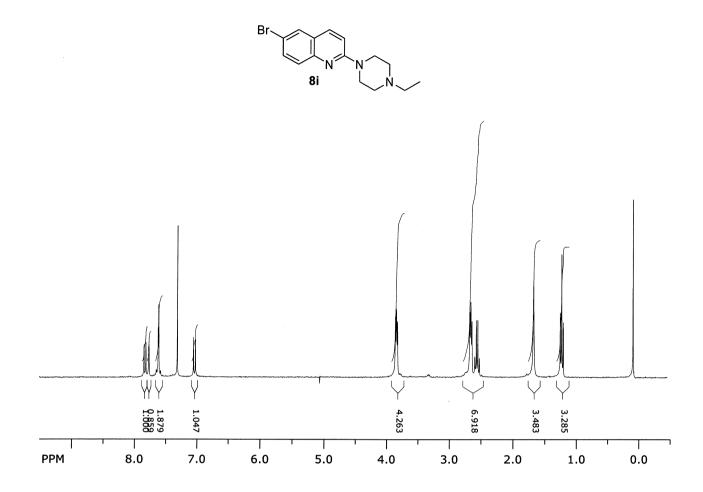


Figure S34: 300 MHz ¹H and 75 MHz ¹³C NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 8j obtained using General Procedure 1.

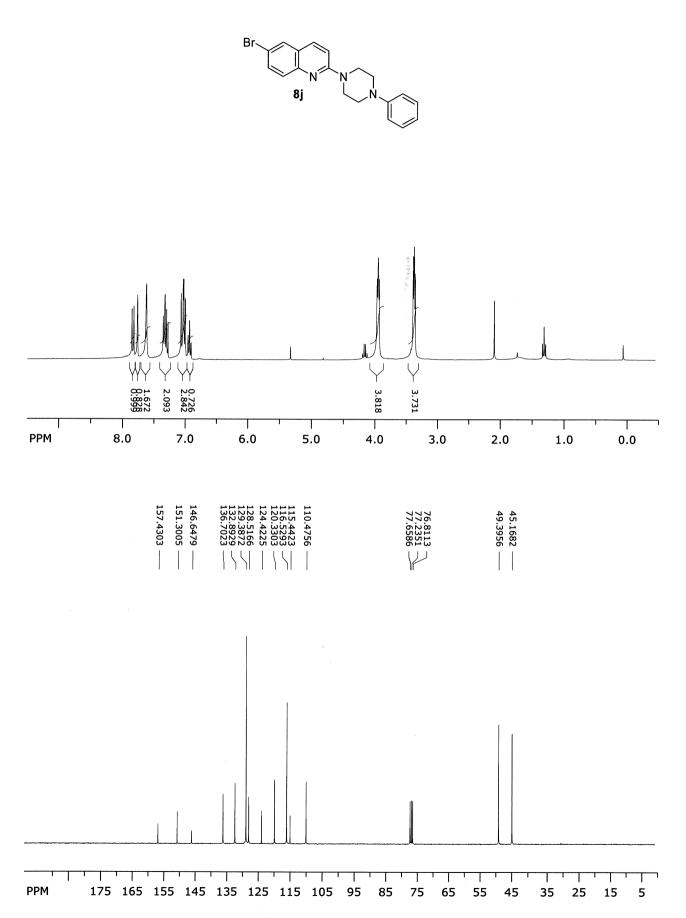
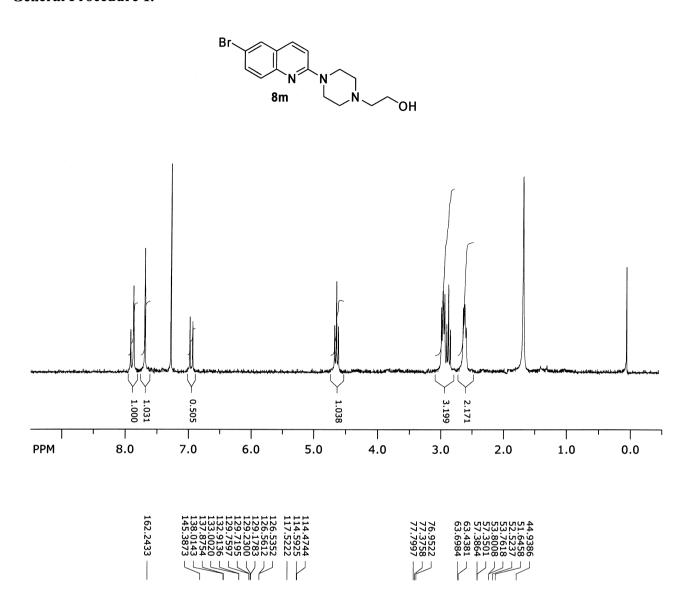

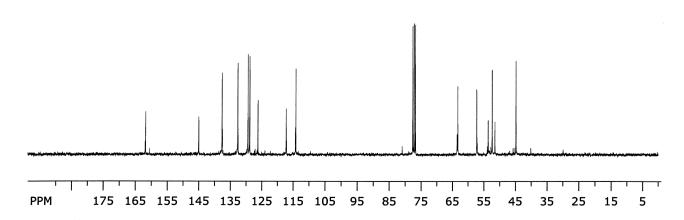


Figure S36: 600 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 16i obtained using General Procedure 1.

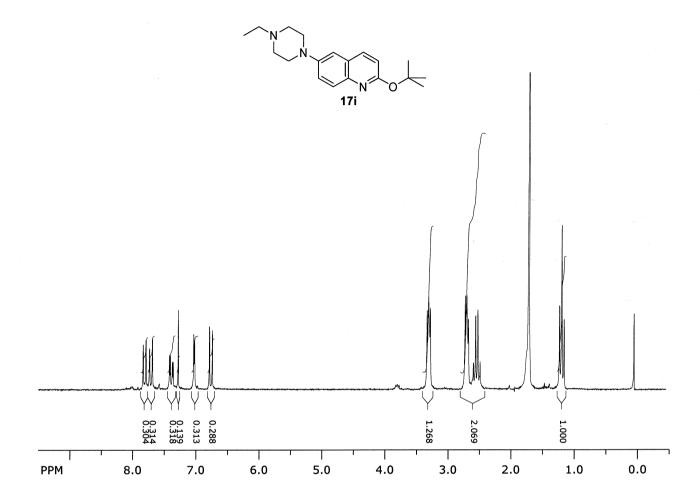


Figure S37: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 16k obtained using General Procedure 2.

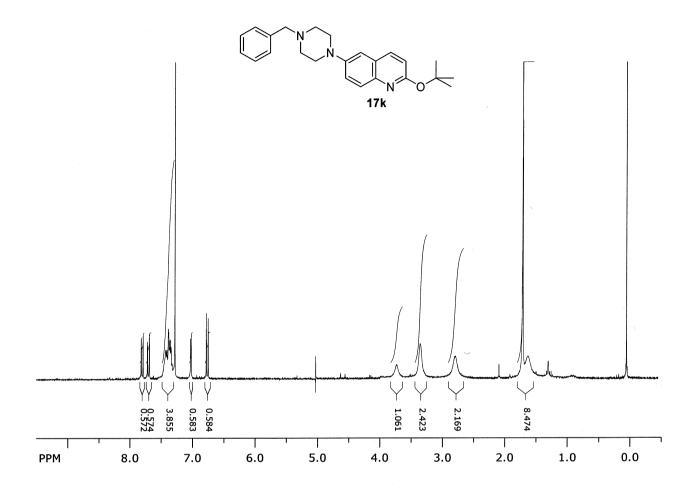
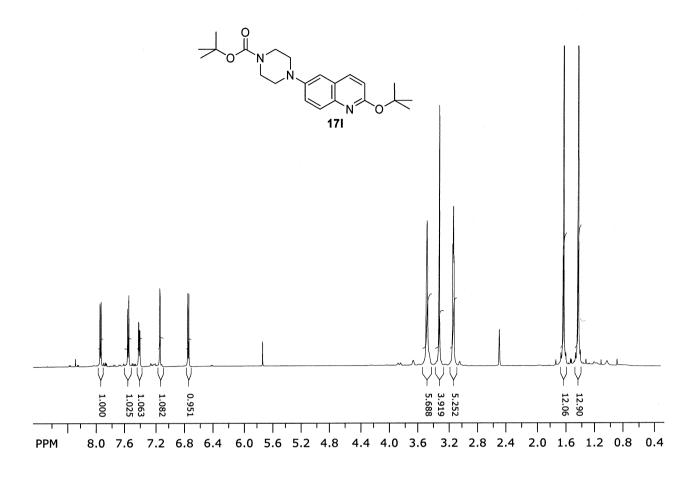


Figure S38: 600 MHz ¹H and 150 MHz ¹³C NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 16l obtained using General Procedure 1.



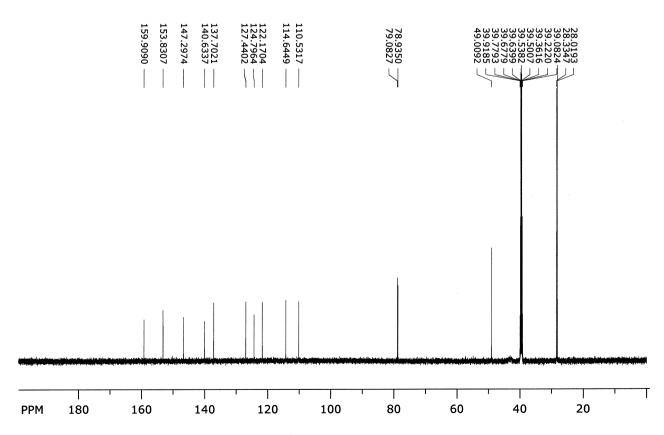


Figure S39: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 17 obtained using General Procedure 1.

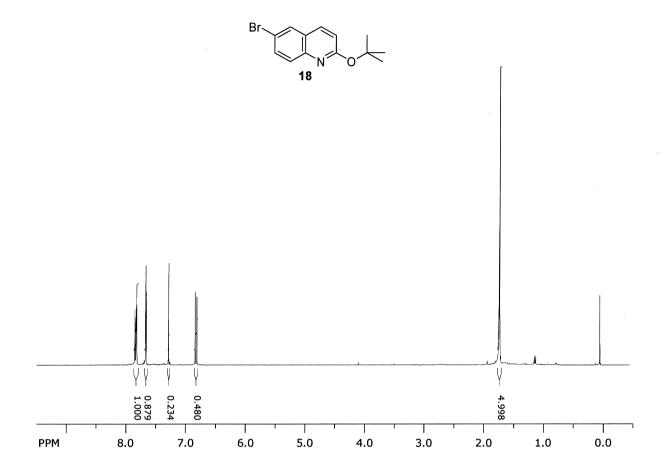
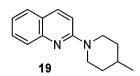


Figure S40: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 18 obtained using General Procedure 1.



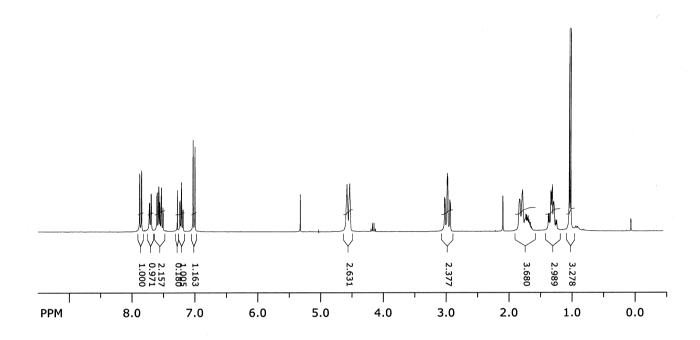


Figure S41: 600 MHz ¹H and 150 MHz ¹³C NMR spectra (CDCl₃) of 19 obtained using General Procedure 1.

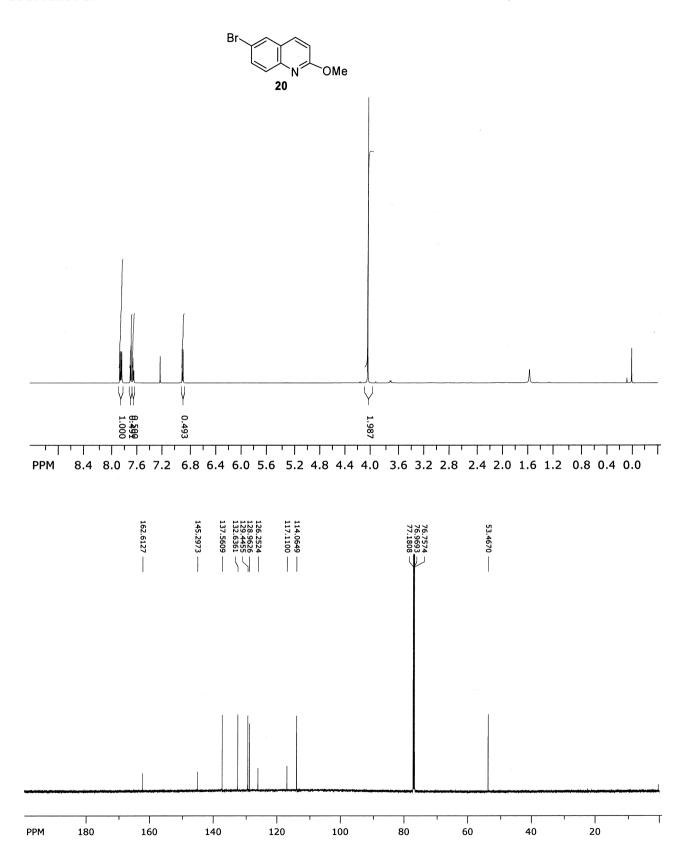


Figure S42: 300 MHz ¹H NMR spectrum (CDCl₃) of 22 obtained using General Procedure 1.
