

Catalytic Michael Reactions of Ketoesters with a Camphor Derived Acrylate Equivalent: Stereoselective Access to All-Carbon Quaternary Centers

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
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1. General

All reactions were carried out under an atmosphere of nitrogen in flame-dried glassware with magnetic stirring. Tetrahydrofuran (THF) was distilled from sodium metal/benzophenone ketyl. Acetonitrile (CH₃CN) was distilled from calcium hydride. Dichloromethane (CH₂Cl₂) was distilled from P₂O₅. Cu(OTf)₂, Yb(OTf)₃, ReCl₅, La(OTf)₃, Sc(OTf)₃, AuCl, Ni(ClO₄)₂.6H₂O, RuCl₃.nH₂O, FeCl₃.6H₂O, PdCl₂(CH₃CN)₂, Zn(OTf)₂, Mg(OTf)₂, ethyl 2-methylacetooacetate, ethyl 2-oxocyclohexanecarboxylate, ethyl and methyl 2-oxocyclopentanecarboxylate were purchased from Aldrich Chemical Co and were used without further purification. Purification of reaction products was carried out by flash chromatography using silica gel 60 (230-400 mesh). Analytical thin layer chromatography was performed on 0.25 mm silica gel 60-F plates. Visualization was accomplished with UV light and p-anisaldehyde solution followed by heating. Melting points were measured with a Mettler FP 80 melting point apparatus and are uncorrected. Infrared spectra were recorded on a Nicolet Avatar 360 FT-IR spectrometer. ¹H NMR and ¹³C NMR spectra were recorded on a Varian Gemini-200 spectrometer and are reported in ppm from internal CHCl₃. Optical rotations were measured at 25 ±0.2°C on a Jasco Polarimeter DIP-370 in methylene chloride unless otherwise stated. Analytical high performance liquid chromatography (HPLC) was performed on a Waters chromatograph equipped with a diode array UV detector. Combustion analyses were performed on a Carlo Erba CHNS-O EA1108 elemental analyzer.

2. Preparation of hydroxy enone **1** from (+)-camphor

(1*R*)-2-*endo*-propenoyl-1,7,7-trimethylbicyclo[2.2.1]heptan-2-ol (**1**)¹



Methoxyallene² (2.94 g, 42 mmol) was added to a solution of nBuLi (2.5 M in hexanes, 16 mL, 40 mmol) in THF (20 mL) cooled to -30°C under a nitrogen atmosphere. After

stirring for 30 minutes at the same temperature, TMDA (6.1 mL, 40 mmol) and a solution of (1*R*)-(+)-camphor (3.04 g, 20 mmol) in THF (2.6 mL) were added drop-wise. The resulting mixture was allowed to stir for 2 hours at -30 °C and then was quenched with a saturated aqueous solution of NH₄Cl (20 mL). The aqueous layer was extracted with CH₂Cl₂ (2 x 20 mL) and washed twice with 1N HCl (15 mL). The organic layer was dried over MgSO₄, filtered and the solvent was removed under reduced pressure to give the vinyl ketone **1** that was purified by flash silica gel column chromatography using a 1:30 ethyl acetate/hexane mixture as the eluant. Yield: 3.12 g (75%), white solid; m.p. 72-73 °C; $[\alpha]_D = -34.5$ ($c = 1.0$, CH₂Cl₂); IR (neat, cm⁻¹) 3488 (OH), 1685 (C=O); ¹H NMR (CDCl₃) δ 6.88 (dd, 1H, HC=C, $J = 10.6$ Hz, $J' = 17.2$ Hz), 6.34 (dd, 1H, HCH=C, $J = 2.2$ Hz, $J' = 16.9$ Hz), 5.67 (dd, 1H, HCH=C, $J = 2.2$ Hz, $J' = 10.3$ Hz), 2.88 (s, 1H, OH), 2.34-2.25 (m, 1H, HCH), 1.88-1.64 (m, 2H, HCH), 1.44-0.80 (m, 4H, HCH), 1.10 (s, 3H, CH₃), 0.89 (s, 3H, CH₃), 0.82 (s, 3H, CH₃); ¹³C NMR (CDCl₃) δ 201.6, 131.8, 128.7, 86.9, 52.6, 50.6, 45.2, 41.3, 30.2, 26.5, 20.9, 20.4, 10.6; Anal. 
3. Preparation of β -keto esters

Isopropyl 2-methylacetoacetate (**4**)³

Titanium tetrakisopropoxide (6.4 mL, 21.6 mmol) was added to a solution of ethyl 2-methylacetoacetate (7.4 mL, 50 mmol) in isopropanol (185 mL). The resulting mixture was heated under reflux for 14 h and then concentrated in *vacuo*. The residue was dissolved in hexane (150 mL), and washed with 1 N HCl (2 x 100 mL). The organic layer was dried over MgSO₄, and the solvent was removed under reduced pressure. The residue was distilled in a Kugelrohr apparatus (100° C, 0.18 mmHg) to give the title compound: 6.32 g (80%); colorless liquid; IR (neat, cm⁻¹) 1735 (C=O), 1712 (C=O); ¹H NMR (CDCl₃) δ 5.03 (m, 1H, CH), 3.43 (m, 1H, CH), 2.21 (s, 3H, CH₃), 1.30 (d, 3H, $J = 6.6$ Hz, CH₃), 1.22 (d, 6H, $J = 6.6$ Hz, 2CH₃); ¹³C NMR (CDCl₃) δ 203.2, 169.6, 68.5, 53.5, 28.1, 21.4, 21.3, 12.4.



tert-Butyl 2-methylacetoacetate (6)⁴



A solution of diisopropylamine (5.1 mL, 36 mmol) in diethyl ether (60 mL) was cooled to -78°C under N_2 , and *n*-butyllithium (14.4 mL, 36 mmol) was added. The resulting mixture was stirred for 15 min. and then a solution of *tert*-butyl propionate (5.4 mL, 36 mmol) in diethyl ether (3mL) was added dropwise. After stirring for 1 h, a solution of the *N*-methoxy-*N*-methylacetamide (3.2 mL, 30 mmol) in 3 mL of diethyl ether was slowly added. The reaction mixture was stirred at -78°C for 3 h, warmed to near room temperature, and poured into 1 N HCl. The mixture was extracted twice with ether, and the combined organic layers were dried over MgSO_4 and evaporated to dryness. The residue was distilled in a Kugelrohr apparatus (70°C , 0.18 mmHg) to give the title compound: 3.4 g (66%); colorless liquid; IR (neat, cm^{-1}) 1736 (C=O), 1712 (C=O); ^1H NMR (CDCl_3) δ 3.35 (m, 1H, CH), 2.17 (s, 3H, CH_3), 1.40 (s, 9H, 3CH_3), 1.22 (d, 3H, $J = 7.3$ Hz, CH_3); ^{13}C NMR (CDCl_3) δ 203.8, 169.5, 81.6, 54.5, 28.3, 27.8, 12.5.


tert-Butyl 2-ethylacetoacetate (7)⁴



A solution of *tert*-butyl butyrate (3.30 g, 22.88 mmol) in diethyl ether (3 mL) was added slowly to a solution of LDA (22.88 mmol, prepared in the usual fashion in 40 mL of ether) at -78°C . After 30 min., a solution of *N*-methoxy-*N*-methylacetamide (2.7 mL, 25.17 mmol) in diethyl ether (3 mL) was slowly added, and the reaction mixture was stirred at -78°C for 8 h. The solution was warmed at room temperature and the mixture was then treated as above to give a residue which was purified by distillation (95°C , 0.18 mmHg): 3.07 g (72%); colorless liquid; IR (neat, cm^{-1}) 1735 (C=O), 1711 (C=O); ^1H NMR (CDCl_3) δ 3.17 (t, 1H, $J = 7.3$ Hz, CH), 2.15 (s, 3H, CH_3), 1.77 (m, 2H, CH_2), 1.40 (s, 9H, 3CH_3), 0.86 (t, 3H, $J = 7.3$ Hz, CH_3); ^{13}C NMR (CDCl_3) δ 203.5, 168.8, 81.6, 62.4, 28.6, 27.9, 21.5, 11.8.



tert-Butyl 2-benzylacetoacetate (8)⁵



A solution of benzyl bromide (6.0 mL, 50 mmol) in benzene (50 mL) was added to a stirred solution of *tert*-butyl acetoacetate (8.3 mL, 50 mmol) and DBU (7.5 mL, 50 mmol) in benzene (250 mL). The reaction mixture was stirred at room temperature for 48 h, then washed with water and the organic layer was dried over anhydrous magnesium sulfate. After removal of the solvent, the resulting crude product was purified by distillation (120°C, 0.11 mmHg) to afford the title compound: 4.63 g (37%); colorless liquid; IR (neat, cm^{-1}) 1732 (C=O), 1713 (C=O); ^1H NMR (CDCl_3) δ 7.24-7.14 (m, 5H, arom.), 3.67 (t, 1H, J = 7.3 Hz, CH), 3.09 (d, 2H, J = 7.7 Hz, CH_2), 2.16 (s, 3H, CH_3), 1.36 (s, 9H, 3 CH_3); ^{13}C NMR (CDCl_3) δ 202.7, 168.1, 138.2, 128.7, 128.4, 126.4, 82.0, 62.3, 33.9, 29.5, 27.8.

tert-Butyl 2-oxocyclopentanecarboxylate (11)⁶




Sodium hydride (60% in oil, 1.51 g, 37.3 mmol) was washed with several portions of dry hexane under nitrogen in the normal way to remove the oil. Dry benzene (15 mL) was added and the suspension was stirred under nitrogen and di-*tert*-butyl adipate (0.19 g, 0.75 mmol) and *tert*-butanol (0.07 mL) were added in one portion. The mixture is then boiled under reflux with vigorous stirring for 30 min. A second portion of di-*tert*-butyl adipate (4.43 g, 17.4 mmol) in dry benzene (7.5 mL) was then added drop-wise to the boiling mixture over 45 min. and the mixture was boiled under reflux with vigorous stirring for a further 4.5 h. The resulting thick suspension was then cooled to 0°C and sufficient 10% aqueous acetic acid was added to obtain a neutral (litmus) solution. The mixture was then poured into water (30 mL), extracted with diethyl ether (2 x 20 mL), the combined extracts washed with saturated aqueous sodium hydrogen carbonate solution (15 mL) and water (15 mL), dried with MgSO_4 , and the solvent removed in *vacuo*. Distillation under reduced pressure (93°C, 0.11 mmHg) gave the title compound: 2.43 g (73%); colorless liquid; IR (neat, cm^{-1}) 1750 (C=O), 1716 (C=O); ^1H NMR (CDCl_3) δ 3.02 (t, 1H, J = 8.8 Hz, CH), 2.30-2.17 (m 4H, 2 CH_2), 2.08 (m, 1H, $H\text{CH}$), 1.83 (m, 1H, $H\text{CH}$), 1.44 (s, 9H, 3 CH_3); ^{13}C NMR (CDCl_3) δ 212.8, 168.6, 81.7, 55.8, 38.1, 28.0, 27.5, 21.0.

tert-Butyl 2-oxocyclohexanecarboxylate (13)⁷



Sodium hydride (60% in oil, 2.51 g., 62.8 mmol) was washed with several portions of dry hexane under nitrogen in the normal way to remove the oil. Dry benzene (25 mL) was added and the suspension was stirred under nitrogen and di-*tert*-butyl pimelate (0.34 g, 1.30 mmol) and *tert*-butanol (0.13 mL) were added in one portion. The mixture was then boiled under reflux with vigorous stirring for 30 min. A second portion of di-*tert*-butyl pimelate (7.94 g, 29.16 mmol) in dry benzene (12.6 mL) was then added drop-wise to the boiling mixture over 45 min. and the mixture was boiled under reflux with vigorous stirring for a further 4.5 h. The resulting thick suspension was then cooled to 0°C and sufficient 10% aqueous acetic acid was added to obtain a neutral (litmus) solution. The mixture was then poured into water (40 mL), extracted with diethyl ether (2 x 30 mL), the combined extracts washed with saturated aqueous sodium hydrogen carbonate solution (20 mL) and water (20 mL), dried with MgSO₄, and the solvent removed in vacuo. Distillation under reduced pressure (101°C, 0.21 mmHg) gave the title compound like a tautomers mixture: 4.04 g (67%); colorless liquid; IR (neat, cm⁻¹) 1737 (C=O), 1715 (C=O); *Major tautomer* ¹H NMR (CDCl₃) δ 12.38 (s, 1H, OH), 2.25-2.11 (m 4H, 2CH₂), 1.68-1.53 (m 4H, 2CH₂), 1.47 (s, 9H, 3CH₃); *Both tautomers* ¹³C NMR (CDCl₃) δ 206.5, 172.4, 171.0, 169.0, 98.7, 81.3, 80.5, 57.7, 41.4, 29.9, 29.0, 28.2, 27.9, 27.1, 23.0, 22.7, 22.4.

4. General procedure for the copper catalyzed Michael addition of β-keto esters to vinyl ketone 1

Method A:

A solution of vinyl ketone **1** (0.1042 g, 0.5 mmol) in CH₂Cl₂ (0.6 mL) was added drop-wise to a mixture of copper (II) triflate (0.0181 g, 0.05 mmol) and the β-keto ester (1 mL) in 0.4 mL of CH₂Cl₂ at -20°C. The reaction mixture was stirred at the same temperature overnight. Then, CH₂Cl₂ (5 mL) was added, and the resulting solution was washed twice with 5 mL of water. The organic layer was dried over MgSO₄ and filtered, and the solvent was removed under reduced pressure. The crude product was purified by column chromatography (eluant EtOAc/hexane 1:10). The diastereomeric ratio was


determined in each case by ^{13}C NMR analyses and in some cases by HPLC analyses. Purification to obtain the major diastereomer was effected by flash column chromatography, using a 1:20 EtOAc-hexane mixture as the eluant.

Method B

Vinyl ketone **1** (0.1042 g, 0.5 mmol) was added to a mixture of copper (II) triflate (0.0181 g, 0.05 mmol), molecular sieves 4 Å powder (100 mg) and the β -keto ester (1 mL) at -20°C. The reaction mixture was stirred at the same temperature overnight. The same work-up and purification procedure of Method A was followed.




The title compound was prepared according to the general procedure **B** from ethyl 2-methylacetooacetate. The mixture was stirred for 18h. The diastereomeric ratio (90:10) was determined by ^{13}C -NMR after removal of the remaining β -keto ester (vacuum evaporation followed by short flash chromatography). Yield: 0.161 g (91%). 






The title compound was prepared according the general procedure **A** from *tert*-butyl 2-methylacetooacetate. The mixture was stirred for 7h. The diastereomeric ratio (93:7) was determined by ^{13}C NMR analysis and by HPLC analysis (Purospher Si column; Hexane/ iPrOH 99/1; 1 mL/min) after removal of the remaining β -keto ester (vacuum evaporation followed by short flash chromatography). Yield: 0.171 g (90%). 6. General procedure for the oxidation of Michael adducts to the corresponding carboxylic acids


To a solution of the corresponding α -hydroxy ketone (1 mmol) in acetonitrile (12 mL) at 0 °C was added dropwise a solution of cerium ammonium nitrate (CAN) (1.64 g, 3 mmol) in water (6 mL) and the mixture was stirred at 0 °C for 20 minutes. Then, water (3 mL) was added and the mixture was extracted with CH_2Cl_2 (2 x 20 mL). 7. General procedure for the enantioselective Michael addition of β -keto esters to α' -hydroxy enone 27

Copper (II) triflate (0.0362 g, 0.1 mmol) and the diamine ligand **28** (0.0498 g, 0.11 mmol) were combined under a nitrogen atmosphere and anhydrous toluene (6 mL) was added.
