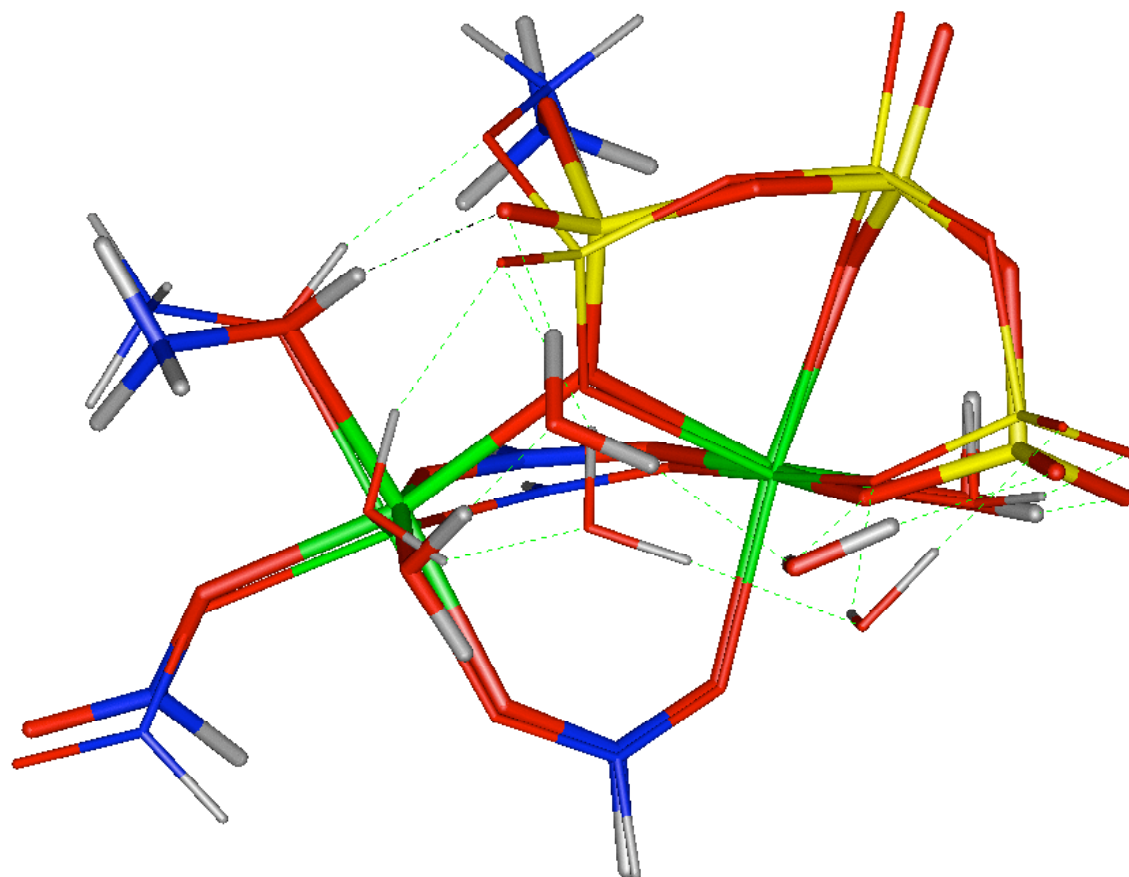


Figure S1. Overlap of **A** (thinner lines) and **B** (thicker lines).

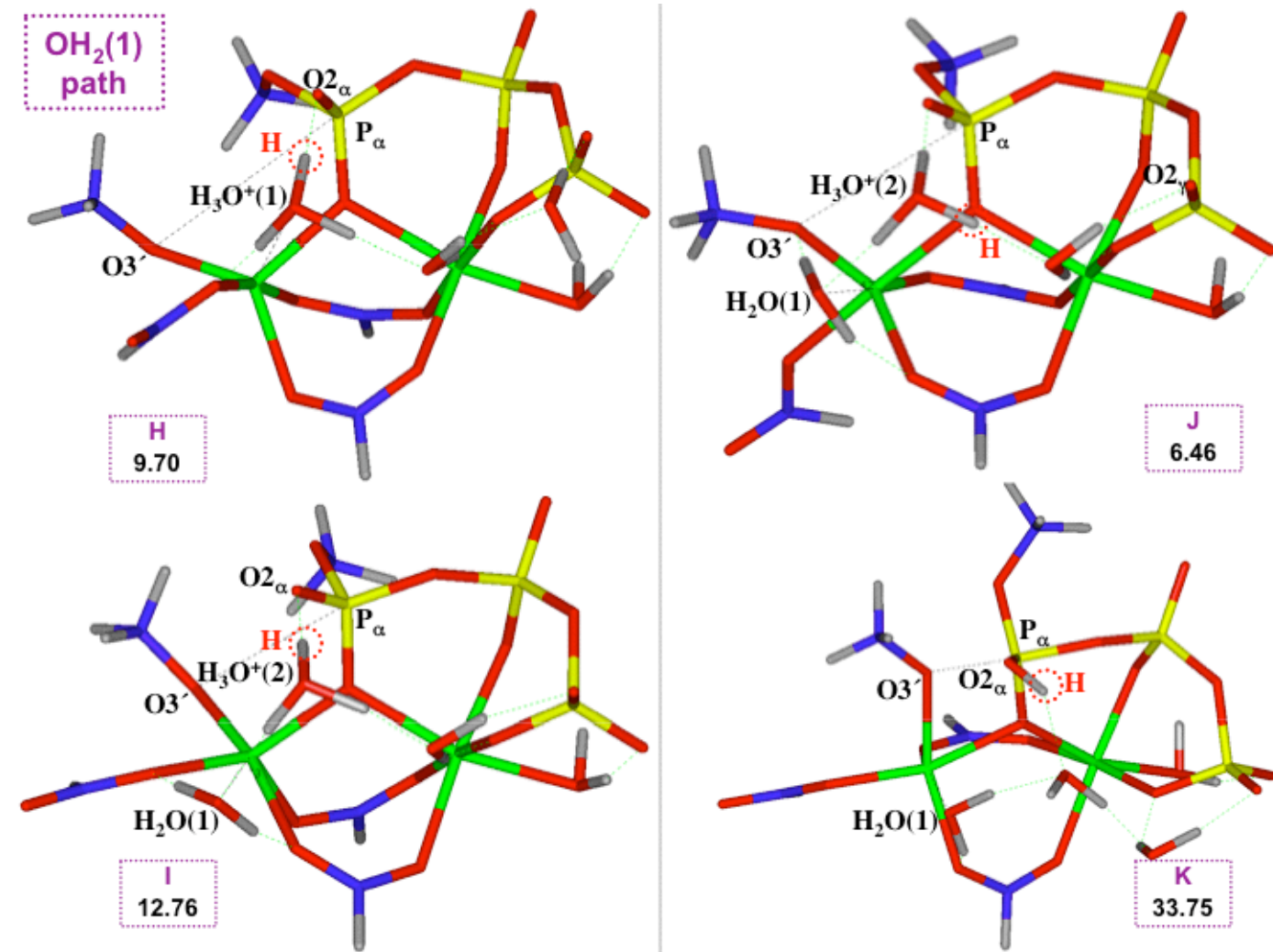

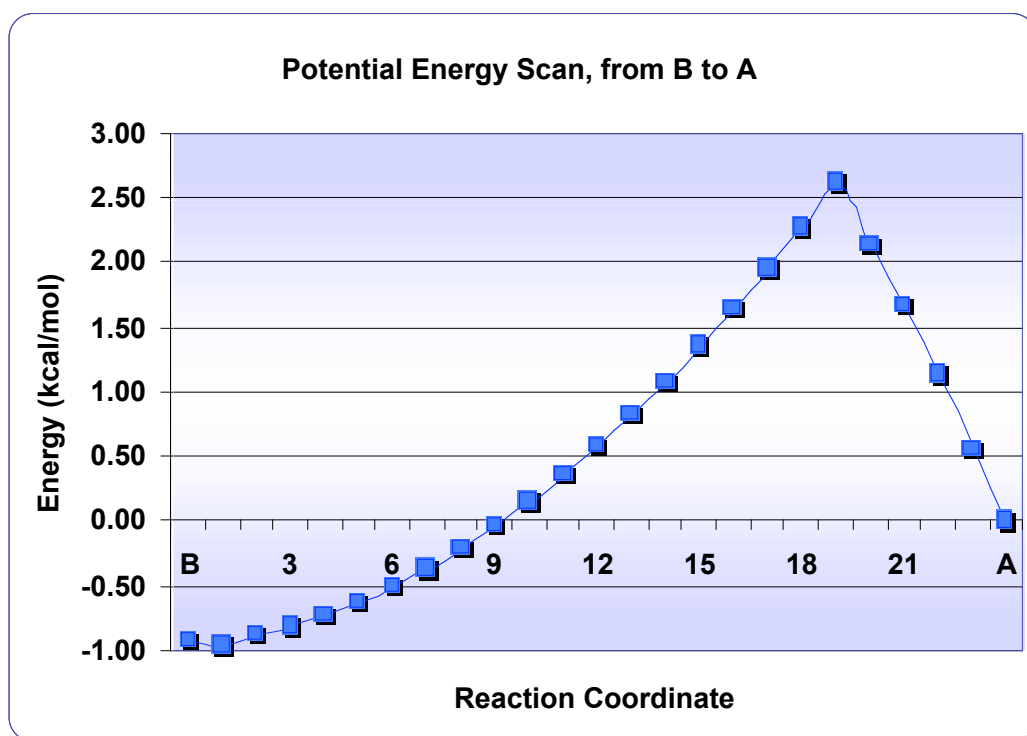

In series 1 (rotation above), the dihedral angle $O5'-P_{\alpha}-O2_{\alpha}-H$ was varied from -90° to $+90^{\circ}$, so that the proton passes on the same side with $O5'$, to capture the proton's rotation around the $O2_{\alpha}-P_{\alpha}$ bond, and the $O3'-H$ distance was varied, to capture the proton shift from $O3'$ to $O2_{\alpha}$. In the second series (rotation below), the dihedral angle $O5'-P_{\alpha}-O2_{\alpha}-H$ was varied from -90° to $+90^{\circ}$, so that the proton passes on the same side with $OH_2(2)$, to capture the proton's rotation around the $O2_{\alpha}-P_{\alpha}$ bond, and the $O3'-H$ distance was varied, to capture the proton shift from $O3'$ to $O2_{\alpha}$.

Graph G1b. C–B potential energy surfaces, computed using the B3LYP/6-31G(d,p) method, performed in two steps. In series 1 (rotation above), the dihedral angle $O5'-P_{\alpha}-O2_{\alpha}-H$ was varied from -90° to $+90^{\circ}$, so that the proton passes on the same side with $O5'$, to capture the proton's rotation around the $O2_{\alpha}-P_{\alpha}$ bond, and the $O3'-H$ distance was varied, to capture the proton shift from $O3'$ to $O2_{\alpha}$. In the second series (rotation below), the dihedral angle $O5'-P_{\alpha}-O2_{\alpha}-H$ was varied from -90° to $+90^{\circ}$, so that the proton passes on the same side with $OH_2(2)$, to capture the proton's rotation around the $O2_{\alpha}-P_{\alpha}$ bond, and the $O3'-H$ distance was varied, to capture the proton shift from $O3'$ to $O2_{\alpha}$.

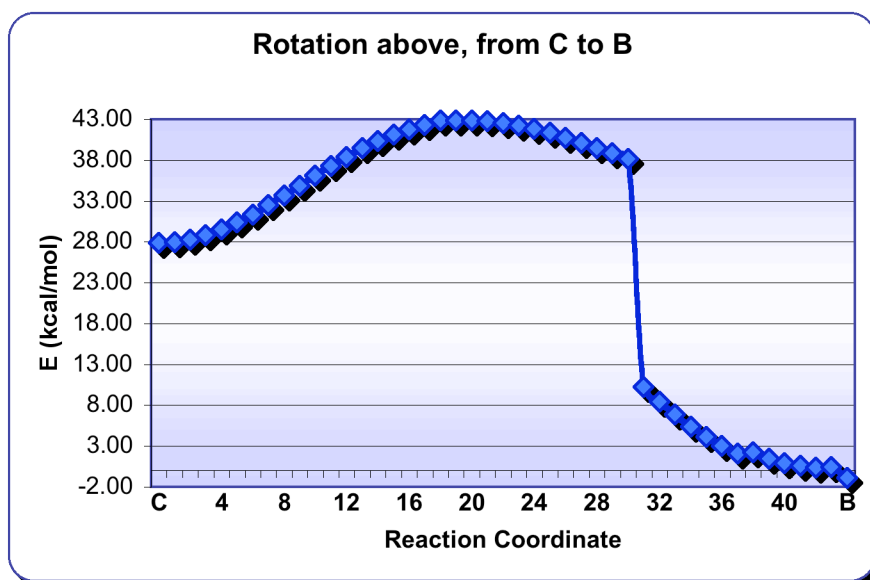
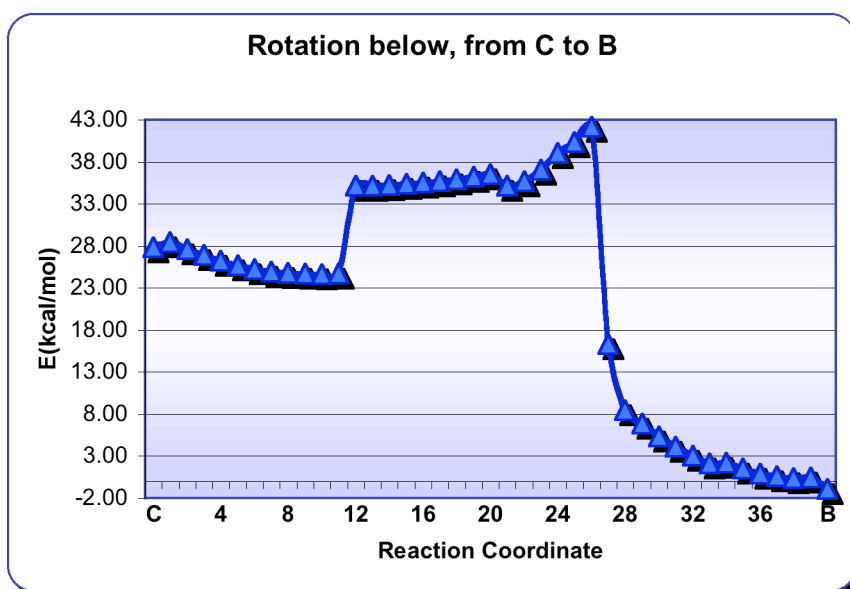
