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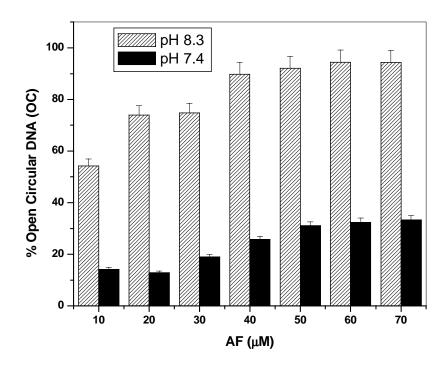


Figure S1. Relative levels of open circular DNA (OC DNA) (%) vs. AF (μM) at varying pH.

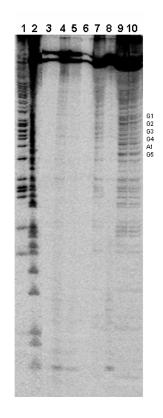

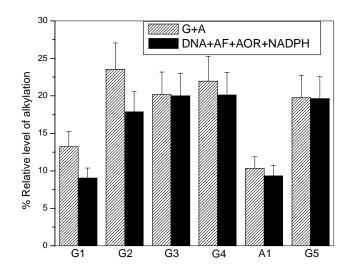

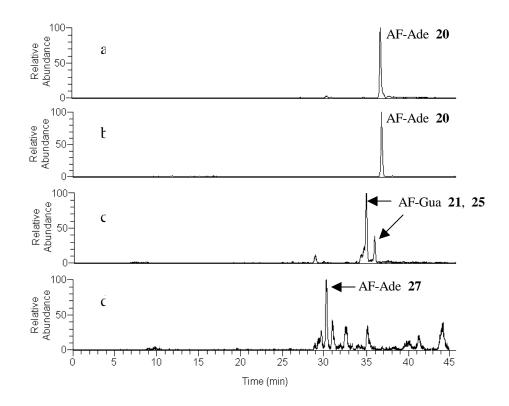

Chemical Synthesis

2,4-dimethyl-4-(2-methyl-cyanoethyl)phenol (10): Anhydrous AlCl₃ (6.5 g, 49.2 mmol) was added slowly at 25 °C to a vigorously stirred mixture of methacrylonitrile (7.9) g, 98.4 mmol) and 2, 4-dimethylphenol (10.0 g, 82.0 mmol). The mixture was heated at 90 °C and dry HCl was bubbled through the solution continuously for 30 min. A HClsaturated atmosphere was maintained with a HCl-filled balloon, which was charged periodically to maintain pressure. After stirring for 6 h, the reaction was quenched by adding 100 mL ice water and extracted with 150 mL ethyl acetate. The organic extract was washed successively with saturated aqueous NaCl and H₂O, dried, and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. Unreacted 2, 4-dimethylphenol was removed by vacuum distillation (0.1 Barr, 80 °C) and the residue was purified by flash chromatography (5% ethyl acetate/hexanes), yielding 10 (7.5 g, 75%) as a white solid. Mp 68-70 °C; ¹H NMR (500 MHz, acetone- d_6) δ 1.29 (d, J = 6.5 Hz, 3H), 2.19 (s, 3H), 2.25 (s, 3H), 2.75 (m, 2H), 2.91 (d, J = 9.5 Hz, 1H), 6.85 (s, 1H), 6.91 (s, 1H); 13 C NMR (125 MHz, acetone- d_6) δ 32.8, 33.4, 38.4 50.0, 52.5, 141.6, 143.4, 144.5, 148.5, 166.7, 189.4; HRMS calcd for $C_{12}H_{15}NO$ [M-1] = 188.1075, found 188.1071.

2,4-dimethyl-4-(2-methyl-carboxylpropyl)phenol (**11**): A solution of **10** (3.0 g, 15.9 mmol) in 20 mL MeOH and 80 mL 10% aq. NaOH was heated at 100 °C for 2 d. After cooling to 25 °C, the mixture was acidified by adding 45 mL of 20% aqueous HCl and extracted twice with 100 mL ethyl acetate. The organic extract was washed successively with saturated aq NaCl and H₂O, dried, and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. The residue was recrystallized in a 1:1 mixture of acetone/hexanes to afford yielding **11** (3.0 g, 90%) as a white solid. Yield: 95%. Mp 108-110 °C; ¹H NMR (500

MHz, acetone- d_6) δ 1.21 (d, J = 7.5 Hz, 3H), 2.18 (s, 3H), 2.20 (s, 3H), 2.67 (m, 1H), 2.87 (s, 1H), 3.02 (s, 1H), 6.78 (s, 2H), 7.25 (s, 1H), 10.81 (s, 1H); ¹³C NMR (125 MHz, acetone- d_6) δ 26.4, 27.6, 30.3, 44.3, 50.4, 135.0, 136.5, 138.8, 139.7, 140.2, 161.4, 188.8; HRMS calcd for $C_{12}H_{16}O_3$ [M-1]⁻ = 207.1021, found 207.1050.

2,3-dihydro-2,5,7-trimethyl-4-hydroxy-1*H***-inden-1-one** (**12**): A mixture of anhydrous AlCl₃ (20.0 g, 150 mmol), NaCl (10.0g, 169 mmol), and **11** (4.0 g, 19.1 mmol) was heated at 200 °C for 1 h. After cooling to 25 °C, the dark solid was dissolved in 200 mL ice water and extracted with 300 mL ethyl acetate. The organic extract was washed successively with saturated aq NaCl and H₂O, dried, and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. The residue was purified by flash chromatography (20% EtOAc/hexances) yielding **12** (3.3 g, 90%) as a white solid. Mp 170-172 °C; ¹H NMR (500 MHz, acetone- d_6) δ 1.23 (d, J = 7.5 Hz, 3H), 2.28 (s, 3H), 2.46 (s, 3H), 2.61 (m, 2H), 3.33 (s, 1H), 6.91 (s, 2H), 7.76 (s, 1H); ¹³C NMR (125 MHz, acetone- d_6) δ 34.1, 34.4, 34.9, 49.3, 60.6, 110.7, 147.2, 148.8, 150.6, 151.2, 158.4, 168.7; HRMS calcd for $C_{12}H_{14}O_{2}$ [M-1]⁻ = 189.0916, found 189.0914.

2,3-dihydro-2,5,7-trimethyl-4-hydroxy-6-chloromethyl-1*H***-inden-1-one** (**13**): To a solution of **12** (2.5 g, 13.2 mmol) in 50 mL dry CH_2Cl_2 was added MOMCl (3.16 g, 39.6 mmol). SnCl₄ (6.8 g, 26.4 mmol) was then added slowly. The resulting dark solution was stirred at 25 °C for 24 h, and quenched by adding 100 mL ice water. Ethyl acetate extraction followed by flash chromatography (20% EtOAc/hexances) yielding **13** (2.2 g, 70%) as a white solid. Mp 225-227 °C; ¹H NMR (500 MHz, acetone- d_6) δ 1.25 (d, J = 8.0 Hz, 3H), 2.42 (s, 3H), 2.59 (m, 2H), 2.61 (s, 3H), 3.35 (m, 1H), 4.85 (s, 2H); ¹³C

NMR (125 MHz, acetone- d_6) δ 30.0, 34.3, 49.0, 59.2, 60.7, 110.7, 147.5, 148.9, 151.0, 154.0, 158.9, 168.7; HRMS calcd for $C_{13}H_{15}ClO_2$ [M-1] = 237.0682, found 237.0697. **2,3-dihydro-2,5,7-trimethyl-4-hydroxy-6-cyanomethyl-1***H***-inden-1-one (14):** To a solution of **13** (1.80 g, 7.6 mmol) in 20 mL dimethylformide (DMF), was added KCN (0.49 g, 7.6 mmol). The mixture was stirred at 25 °C for 16 h, then partitioned between 80 mL H_2O and 150 mL ethyl acetate. The organic extract was washed successively with saturated aq NaCl and H_2O , dried, and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. The residue was purified by flash chromatography (20% EtOAc/hexances) yielding **14** (1.6 g, 88%) as a white solid. 2,3-dihydro-2,5,7-trimethyl-4-hydroxy-6-carboxylethyl-1*H***-inden-1-one** (**15**): A solution of **14** (2.20 g, 17.1 mmol) in 20 mL MeOH and 80 mL 10% aq NaOH was heated at 100 °C for 1 d. After cooling to 25 °C, the mixture was acidified with 45 mL of 20% aqueous HCl and extracted twice with 100 mL ethyl acetate. The organic extract was washed successively with saturated aq NaCl and H₂O, dried, and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. The residue was purified by flash chromatography (20% EtOAc/hexances) yielding **15** (2.3 g, 95%) as a white solid. 2,4,6-trimethyl-5-hydroxylethyl-7-hydroxyl-1*H***-indene (8):** To a solution of **15** (0.5 g, 3.34 mmol) in 20 mL dry THF, was added BH₃ (1.0 M solution in THF, 6.7 mL, 6.7 mmol) at 0 °C. The mixture was warmed to 25 °C and stirred for 24 h. It was then cooled to 0 °C and quenched by adding 30 mL 5 % H₂SO₄ solution. The mixture was extracted twice with 50 mL ethyl acetate and the organic extract was washed successively with saturated aq NaCl and H₂O, dried, and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. (16) To a solution of **8** (0.20 g, 0.92 mmol) in 1 mL dry pyridine was slowly added a solution of 2-mesitylenesulfonylchloride (0.22 g, 1.1 mmol) in 0.5 mL pyridine and the mixture was stirred at 25 °C for 12 h. 2-(7-hydroxy-2,4,6-trimethyl-1H-inden-5-yl)ethyl-4-methylbenzenesulfonate (**17**) To a solution of **8** (0.20 g, 0.92 mmol) in 1 mL dry pyridine was slowly added a solution of p-toluenesulfonylchloride (0.21 g, 1.1 mmol) in 0.5 mL pyridine and the mixture was stirred at 25 °C for 12 h. 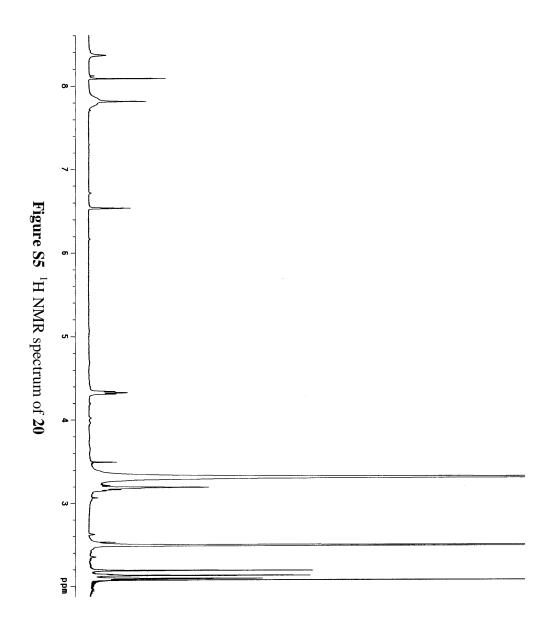
2,4,6-trimethyl-5-bromoethyl-7-hydroxyl-1*H***-indene** (**18**): To a solution of **17** (0.21 g, 0.57 mmol) in 2 mL DMF was added NaBr (0.47 g, 4.6 mmol). The suspension was stirred at 25 °C for 12 h. The mixture was partitioned between 10 mL H₂O and 20 mL ethyl acetate, and the organic layer was washed successively with saturated aq NaCl and H₂O, dried, and the solvent was evaporated under reduced pressure. The residue was purified by flash chromatography (20% EtOAc/hexances) yielded **18** (0.08 g, 50%) as a white solid. 2,4,6-trimethyl-5-iodoethyl-7-hydroxyl-1*H***-indene (19)** To a solution of **17** (0.21 g, 0.57 mmol) in 20 mL acetone was added NaI (0.85 g, 5.7 mmol). The suspension was stirred at 70 °C for 12 h. Solvent was removed under the reduced pressure, and the residue was washed with CH₂Cl₂. The organic solution was filtered and concentrated, and was purified by flash chromatography (15% EtOAc/hexances) yielded 19 (0.17 g, 90%) as a white solid. Solvent was removed under reduced pressure. The residue was purified first by normal phase flash chromatography (10% MeOH/CH₂Cl₂), and then using a Biotage Sp1 high performance flash chromatography system (Biotage, Charlottesville, VA) equipped with a Biotage C18 reverse phase flash column (12 + M). This system was pre-equilibrated with 100% water for 2 min at 12 mL/min. After sample introduction, the column was eluted with 100% water for 2 min followed by a linear gradient to 40% acetonitrile in water over the course of 15 min. The product 20 was eluted in the 20 to 30% acetonitrile fractions. Yield: 2%. (21) A mixture of 19 (105 mg, 0.32 mmol) and dGuo (171 mg, 0.64 mmol) in 2 mL DMA was stirred at 25 °C for 12 h, and was then heated at 80 °C for 12 h. Solvent was removed under reduced pressure. The residue was purified using a Biotage Sp1 high performance flash chromatography system (Biotage, Charlottesville, VA) equipped with a Biotage C18 reverse phase flash column (12 + M), using a solvent method same as that for compound 20. The product 21 was eluted in the 20 to 30% acetonitrile fractions. Yield: 5%. 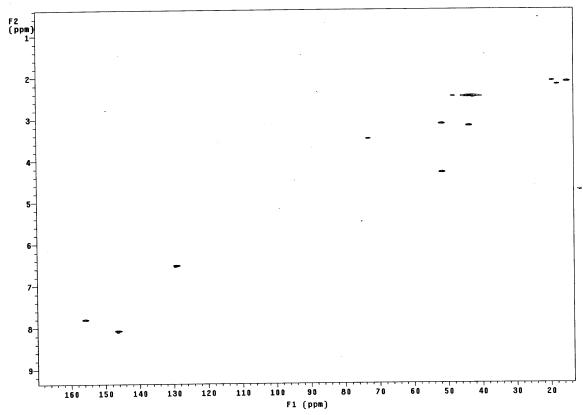


Figure S6 HMQC NMR spectrum of 20

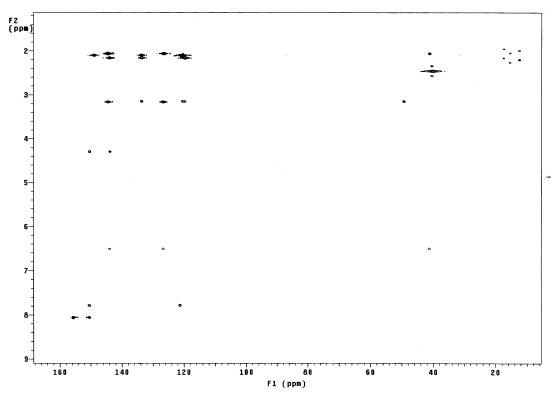


Figure S7 gHMBC NMR spectrum of 20

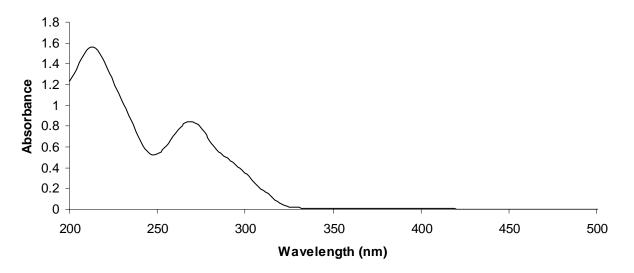


Figure S8 UV-vis spectrum of 20

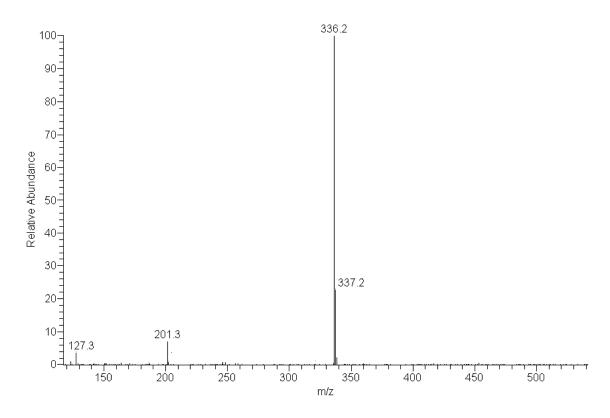
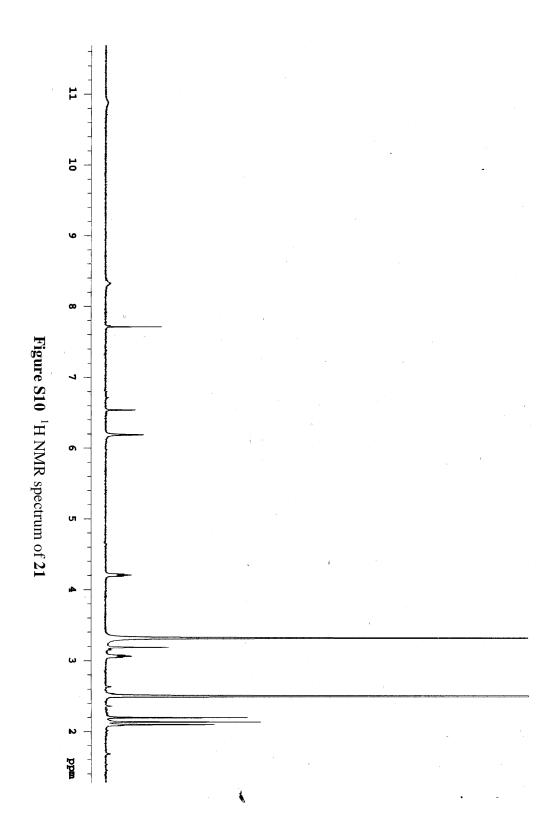
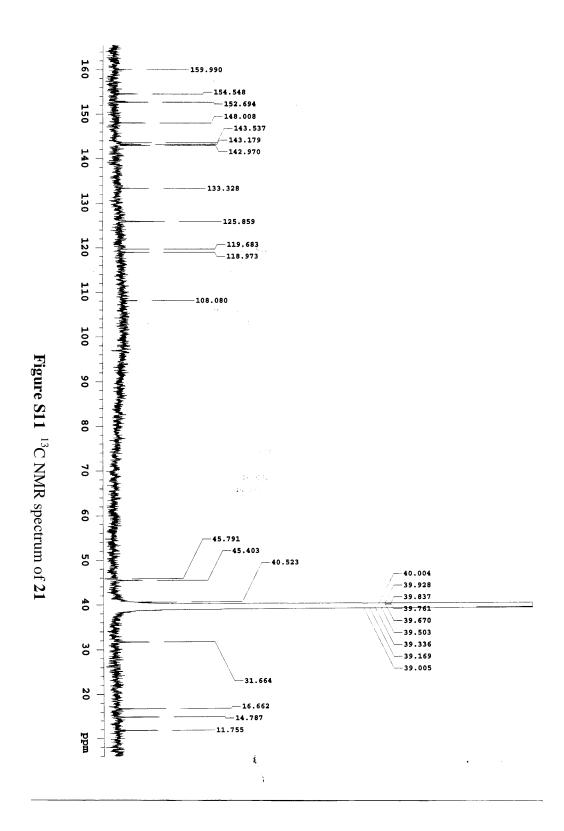


Figure S9 Mass Spectrum of 20





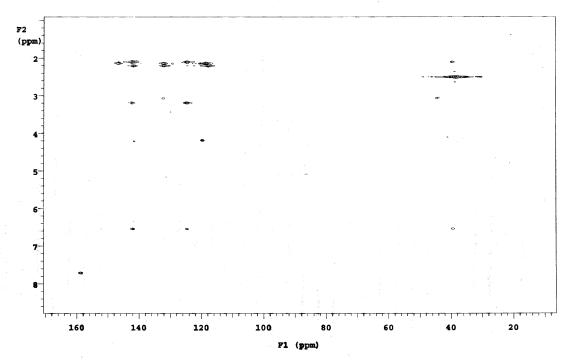


Figure S12 gHMBC NMR spectrum of 21

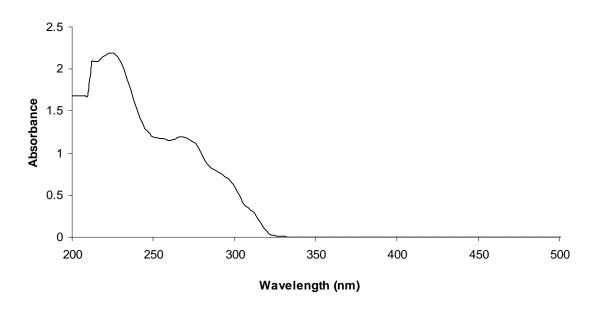


Figure S13 UV-vis spectrum of 21

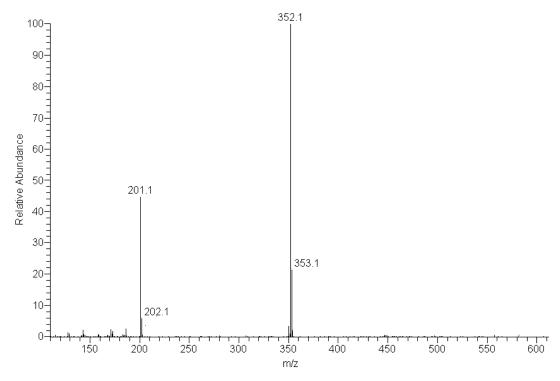


Figure S14 Mass spectrum of 21
