# **Supporting Information**

Discovery of 2-[4-{{2-(2S, 5R)-2-cyano-5-ethynyl-1-pyrrolidinyl]-2-oxoethyl]amino]-4-methyl-1-piperidinyl]-4-pyridinecarboxylic acid (ABT-279); a very potent, selective, effective and well-tolerated inhibitor of dipeptidyl peptidase-IV, useful for the treatment of diabetes

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- 1. Partial Purification of Human DPPIV Caco-2 cells were obtained from American Type Culture Collection (P.O. Box 3605, Manassas, VA), cultured and maintained at 37 °C with 5% CO<sub>2</sub> in low glucose DMEM media supplemented with 10% Fetal Bovine Serum and antibiotic/antimycotic. In preparation for making an extract, cells were seeded at a density to achieve confluence within 7 days. The cells were cultured for an additional 14 days to allow for maximal DPPIV expression. On the day of harvest, cells were washed once with Dulbecco's PBS and solubilized in a 10 mM NaCl

containing 50 mM Tris HCl, 0.5% Nonidet P40 and 0.3 ug/mL aprotinin at pH 8.0. The extract was clarified by centrifugation at 35,000 g for 30 minutes at 4 °C.

**2. Inhibition constant (K<sub>i</sub>) measurement** DPPIV activity was determined by measuring the rate of hydrolysis of a surrogate substrate Gly-Pro-7-amidomethylcoumarin (Gly-Pro-AMC, Sigma, St. Louis, MO). The assay was carried out at room temperature in black 96 well polypropylene or polyethylene plates in a total volume of 100 µL per well. Appropriate dilutions of the compounds were made in DMSO and then diluted ten fold into water. 10 µL of 5 concentrations of the inhibitor or 10% DMSO in water were added to individual wells containing 80 µL of DPPIV diluted in assay buffer containing 25 mM HEPES (pH 7.5), 150 mM NaCl and 0.12 mg/mL BSA. After 10 minutes at room temperature, the reaction was initiated by adding 10 µL of either 280, 700, 1750, or 3500 µM Gly-Pro-AMC in water. The DPPIV activity results in the formation of the fluorescent product amidomethylcoumarin (AMC) which was continuously monitored by excitation at 350 nm and measurement of fluorescent emission at 460 nm every 112 seconds for 37 minutes using an appropriate plate reader. The fluorescence at 460 nm was converted to nanomoles of AMC using a standard curve and the initial rate of AMC formation was calculated. For each concentration of inhibitor or DMSO control, the initial rates were used to fit the rectangular hyperbola of Michaelis-Menten by non-linear regression analysis (GraphPad Software Prism 3.0). The ratio of the apparent Km/Vmax vs. inhibitor concentration was plotted and the competitive K<sub>i</sub> was calculated by linear regression to be the negative x-intercept.

- 3. Chemical Stability Assay A solution of each DPPIV compound was prepared in an appropriate mobile phase. This was injected and analyzed by HPLC to identify the parent drug peak in the chromatograms. Stability solutions were prepared in 50 mM phosphate buffer pH 7.4 adjusted to  $\mu$ =0.155. Samples were weighed using a Mettler-Toledo microbalance and transferred into a 20 mL glass scintillation vial or a volumetric flask. The phosphate buffer pH 7.4 was added with an EDP Plus 10 mL electronic pipette. The samples were sonicated for approximately 2 minutes and filtered using a PTFE membrane syringe filter. The filtrate was transferred to amber HPLC vials and placed in an autosampler at 37 °C. The first sample was immediately injected and counted as the time zero sample. The solution concentration was measured at various timepoints using an appropriate HPLC method. After data acquisition was completed, the chromatograms were processed for each compound. The rate and halflife were determined from a plot of log<sub>10</sub> peak area remaining/peak area at zero time vs. exposure time @ 37 °C using Microsoft® Excel 2000. Rates of reaction and half-lives were calculated using a pseudo-first order kinetic model.
- **4. Pharmacokinetic Experiments** (**PK**) Compounds were prepared as solutions in ethanol: propylene glycol: D5W vehicles (10/30/60 v/v) at concentrations appropriate for a 1 mL/kg dose volume for intravenous (IV) or oral administration. Sprague-Dawley rats (Charles River, Portage, MI), beagle dogs (Marshall Research Animals, North Rose, NY) or Cynomolgus monkeys were fasted overnight prior to dosing and three (monkey) or twelve (rat and dog) hours post dose, but were permitted free access to water. The IV dose (5 mg/kg in rat or 2.5 mg/kg in dog and monkey) was administered as a slow bolus while the oral dose was administered by gavage. Serial EDTA blood samples were

obtained from each animal at selected points following drug administration. Plasma was separated by centrifugation (16000 rpm x 4 minutes, ~4°C) and stored frozen (< -15°C) until analysis.

Compounds were separated from the plasma using protein precipitation with methanol and acetonitrile. A plasma aliquot (100  $\mu$ L, sample or spiked standard) was combined with 150  $\mu$ L of internal standard (prepared in methanol) and 150  $\mu$ L acetonitrile. The samples were vortexed vigorously for one minute followed by centrifugation at 2000 rpm for 10 minutes (4°C). An aliquot of the supernatant (100  $\mu$ L) was transferred to a clean 96-well plate and diluted with 500  $\mu$ L 1% acetic acid in water. Samples were analyzed simultaneously with spiked plasma standards.

The parent compound and the internal standard were separated from each other and coprecipitated contaminants on a 100 x 3 mm Kromasil 3 μm column (Higgins) with an acetonitrile: 1% aqueous acetic acid mobile phase at a flow rate of 0.3 mL/min. Analysis was performed on a Sciex API4000<sup>TM</sup> Biomolecular Mass Analyzer with a turbo-ionspray interface. Analytes were ionized in the positive ion mode with a source temperature of approximately 400 °C. Detection was in the multiple reaction-monitoring (MRM) mode. Peak areas were determined using the Sciex Analyst<sup>TM</sup> software. The plasma drug concentration of each sample was calculated by least squares linear regression analysis (weighted as 1/concentration) of the peak area ratio (parent/internal standard) of the spiked plasma standards versus concentration.

**5. Protein X-ray crystallography analysis** methods Purified human DPPIV (39-766) was crystallized according to previously described conditions [1]. The complex was

prepared by soaking a crystal in the presence of compound and preserving it in liquid nitrogen for data collection at 100K. X-ray diffraction data were collected at the Advanced Photon Source of Argonne National Laboratory on the IMCA beamline 17-ID with an ADSC quantum 210 ccd detector, and processed using the program HKL2000 [2]. The structure was solved by molecular replacement with the program MOLREP using atomic coordinates with pdb accession code 1N1M [3]. The structure of the compound was built into the electron density maps that clearly revealed the protein-inhibitor complex, and the structure was refined against all data using the programs QUANTA (Accelrys) and REFMAC5 [4, 5].

Coordinates for the refined atomic structure will be submitted to the public RCSB protein data bank, and the accession code will be provided upon technical release.

- **6. Compound Synthesis** Unless otherwise specified, all solvents and reagents were obtained from commercial suppliers and used without further drying or purification. All reactions were performed under nitrogen atmosphere unless otherwise noted. Normalphase flash chromatography was done using Merck silica gel 60 (230-400 mesh) from E. M. Science or was performed on an Analogix IntelliFlash system with prepacked columns. Reverse-phase preparative chromatography was performed using a Gilson HPLC system equipped with a Gilson 215 liquid handler and a Waters Nova-Pak column 25x100 mm C18 column. Fraction collection was triggered by UV absorption at 214 nm. Final products were eluted with linear gradient 0-70% CH<sub>3</sub>CN/H<sub>2</sub>O with 0.1%

trifluoroacetic acid (TFA) in the aqueous phase as TFA salts.  $^{1}H$  NMR spectra were recorded at 300 and 500 MHz spectrometers; all chemical shift ( $\delta$ ) values were referenced to tetramethylsilane as an internal standard and are reported as shift (multiplicity, proton count). Mass spectral analysis was accomplished using fast atom bombardment (FAB), electrospray (ESI), or direct chemical ionization (DCI) ionization techniques. All elemental analyses were done at QTI or Robertson and are consistent with theoretical values to within  $\pm 0.4\%$  unless otherwise indicated.

dimethyl (2S)-5-oxopyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate

To a cold (-78 °C) solution of methyl (S)-(+)-2-pyrrolidone-5-carboxylate (4.80 grams, 33.5 mmol) in tetrahydrofuran (90 mL) was added a solution of lithium bis(trimethylsilyl) amide (1 *M* solution in hexanes, 40.0 mL, 40.0 mmol) dropwise via syringe over 15 minutes; then methyl chloroformate (2.90 mL, 36.9 mmol) was added dropwise via syringe over 5 minutes. The resulting slurry was stirred at -78 °C for 1 hour after which the reaction was quenched with 1 *M* HCl (50 mL). The mixture was allowed to come to room temperature, concentrated under reduced pressure and the residue partitioned between ethyl acetate (200 mL) and 1 *M* HCl (200 mL). The aqueous layer was extracted with ethyl acetate (2 X 200 mL) and the combined organic layers were dried (sodium sulfate), filtered, and concentrated to provide the titled compound. dimethyl (2S)-5-methoxypyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate

To a cold solution (-78 °C) of dimethyl (2S)-5-oxopyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate (5.80 g, 28.8 mmol) in tetrahydrofuran (100 mL) was added a solution of lithium triethylborohydride (1 M in THF, 35 mL, 35 mmol) dropwise via syringe over 10 minutes. The resulting solution was stirred at -78 °C for 30 minutes, quenched by the careful addition of saturated sodium bicarbonate solution (50 mL), allowed to warm to 0 °C and 30% hydrogen peroxide (6 mL) was carefully added dropwise. The mixture was stirred for 30 minutes at room temperature, reduced in volume under reduced pressure, and diluted with ethyl acetate (300 mL) and brine (200 mL). The milky agueous layer was separated and further extracted with ethyl acetate (2 X 300 mL). The combined organic layers were dried (sodium sulfate), filtered, and concentrated to a light yellow oil. The yellow oil was taken up in methanol (50 mL) containing para-toluenesulfonic acid hydrate (487 mg, 2.6 mmol) and stirred at room temperature for 16 hours. The reaction was diluted with aqueous sodium bicarbonate solution (40 mL), the volatile solvents were removed under reduced pressure and the residue partitioned between ethyl acetate (200 mL) and brine (200 mL). The aqueous layer was further extracted with ethyl acetate (200 mL), the combined organic layers were dried (sodium sulfate), filtered, and concentrated to an oil which was chromatographed on a Biotage 40M with 60% hexane/40% ethyl acetate to provide the titled compound as a mixture of diastereomers. dimethyl (2S,5R)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)pyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate (**5**) and dimethyl (2S,5S)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)pyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate (**6**)

To a cold -45 °C solution of dimethyl (2S)-5-methoxypyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate (3.30 g, 15.20 mmol) and bistrimethylsilylacetylene (5.20 g, 30.4 mmol, 2.0 equiv) in methylene chloride (45 mL) was added a solution of tin (IV) chloride (1 M in methylene chloride, 20.0 mL, 20.0 mmol, 1.3 equiv) dropwise via syringe over 15 minutes. To the dark yellow solution was added solid aluminum chloride (2.77 g, 20.8 mmol, 1.4 equiv) in one portion. The resulting mixture was allowed to warm to room temperature and stirred at room temperature for 48 hours. The reaction mixture was carefully poured into aqueous sodium bicarbonate solution (100 mL) with ice cooling. A white precipitate forms and 1 M HCl (ca. 50 mL) was added until the solids dissolved. This mixture was extracted with ethyl acetate (2 X 200 mL). The combined organic layers were filtered, dried (sodium sulfate), filtered, and concentrated. The residue was chromatographed on a Biotage flash 40 M eluting with 70% hexane/30% ethyl acetate to afford (2S,5S)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)pyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate (trans compound Rf of 0.3 in 70% hexane/30% ethyl acetate) and dimethyl (2S,5R)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)pyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate (cis compound Rf of 0.2 in 70% hexane/30% ethyl acetate). methyl (5R)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)-L-prolinate (23)

A solution of dimethyl (2S,5R)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)pyrrolidine-1,2-dicarboxylate (5.43 g, 19.16 mmol) and iodotrimethylsilane (3 mL, 28.74 mmol) in chloroform (100 mL) was heated to 65 °C for 3 hours, was cooled to room temperature, concentrated under reduced pressure and flash chromatographed with 35% ethyl acetate/65% hexane to provide the titled compound. MS (DCI/NH<sub>3</sub>) m/e 226 (M+H)<sup>+</sup>.

methyl *N-(tert-*butoxycarbonyl)-L-leucyl-(5R)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)-L-prolinate

To a solution of methyl (5R)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)-L-prolinate (1.6 grams, 7.48 mmol), dimethylaminopyridine (913 mg, 7.48 mmol), N-methylmorpholine (1.23 mL, 11.22 mmol), and N-(tert-butoxycabonyl)-L-leucine monohydrate (2.24 g, 8.98 mmol) in dichloromethane (30 mL) at room temperature was added 1-(3-dimethylaminopropyl)-3-

ethylcarbodiimide hydrochloride (1.72 g, 8.98 mmol). The resulting mixture was stirred 16 hours at room temperature, and partitioned between ethyl acetate (200 mL) and 1 *M* HCl (200 mL). The aqueous layer was further extracted with ethyl acetate (200 mL). The combined organic layers were dried (sodium sulfate), filtered, and concentrated. The residue was chromatographed with a Biotage 40 M cartridge with 40% ethyl acetate/hexane provide the titled compound. MS (DCI/NH<sub>3</sub>) m/e 439 (M+H)<sup>+</sup>.

*N*-(*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)-L-leucyl-(5R)-5-ethynyl-L-proline

To a solution of methyl *N*-(*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)-L-leucyl-(5R)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)-L-prolinate (1.24 g, 2.83 mmol) in dioxane (12 mL) at room temperature was added a solution of 2 *M* lithium hydroxide (3 mL, 6.0 mmol). The resulting mixture was stirred at room temperature for 6 hours. The reaction was diluted with 1 *M* HCl solution (50 mL), and the aqueous mixture was extracted with ethyl acetate (3 X 50 mL). The combined organic layers were dried (sodium sulfate), filtered, and concentrated to provide the titled compound which was used in the next experiment without further purification.

*N*-(*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)-L-leucyl-(5R)-5-ethynyl-L-prolinamide

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To a cold (0 °C) solution of *N*-(*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)-L-leucyl-(5R)-5-ethynyl-L-proline (2.83 mmol) and N-methyl morpholine (0.39 mL, 3.50 mmol) in THF (15 mL) was added isobutyl chloroformate (0.42 mL, 3.25 mmol). The resulting cloudy white mixture was stirred at 0 °C for 30 minutes followed by the addition of a solution of ammonia (0.5 *M* in dioxane, 10.0 mL, 5.0 mmol). The solution was allowed to warm to room temperature and stirred for 16 hours. The reaction mixture was diluted by the addition of 1 *M* HCl (100 mL), and extracted with ethyl acetate (3 X 100 mL). The combined organic layers were dried (sodium sulfate), filtered, and concentrated to provide the titled compound which was used in the next experiment without further purification.

*N*-(*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)-L-leucyl-(5R)-5-ethynyl-L-pyrrolidine-2-carbonitrile

To a cold solution (-40 °C) of *N*-(*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)-L-leucyl-(5*R*)-5-ethynyl-L-prolinamide (1.07 g, 3.05 mmol) and imidazole (208 mg, 3.05 mmol) in pyridine (15 mL) was added POCl<sub>3</sub> (0.57 mL, 6.10 mmol) via syringe. The resulting mixture was stirred, maintaining the temperature below -20 °C, for 1 hour followed by the addition of 1 *M* HCl (100 mL). The aqueous mixture was extracted with ethyl acetate (3 X 100 mL), and the combined organic layers were dried (sodium sulfate), filtered, concentrated and chromatographed with 30% ethyl acetate/hexane to provide the titled compound. Compound **14** (2S,5R)-5-ethynyl-1-L-leucylpyrrolidine-2-carbonitrile hydrochloride

To a solution of *N*-(*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)-L-leucyl-(5R)-5-ethynyl-L-pyrrolidine-2-carbonitrile (250 mg) in ether (1 mL) was added 4 *M* HCl in dioxane (2 mL). The resulting mixture was stirred at room temperature for 5 hours and the solvents removed under reduced pressure. The white solid was triturated with ether to provide the titled compound. methyl (5R)-1-{(2S)-2-((*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)amino)-2-cyclopentylethanoyl}-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)-L-prolinate

To a stirred solution of methyl (5R)-5-((trimethylsilyl)ethynyl)-L-prolinate (1.2 g, 5.32 mmol) in dichloromethane (30 mL) at ambient temperature under nitrogen was added 4-dimethylamino pyridine (0.65 g, 5.32 mmol), 4-methylmorpholine (0.9 mL, 7.98 mmol), 1-(3-(dimethylamino)propyl)-3-ethyl carbodiimide hydrochloride (1.22 g, 6.39 mmol), and (2S)-((*tert*-butoxycarbonyl)amino)(cyclopentyl)acetic acid dicyclohexylamine salt (1.55 g, 6.39 mmol). The reaction mixture was stirred at room temperature for 16 hours,

diluted with ethyl acetate and washed with 1 M HCl. The aqueous layer was further extracted with ethyl acetate (2X) and the combined ethyl acetate layers were dried (Na<sub>2</sub>SO<sub>4</sub>) and evaporated. The residue was purified by flash chromatography 30% ethyl acetate/hexane to provide the titled compound. MS (CI) m/e 451 (M+H)<sup>+</sup>.
