Supplemental Table 2. Example input table for SRM 2682c showing the calculated S mass fraction result  $c_x$ , and corresponding metadata used to determine the mean and expanded uncertainty for a single permutation of the ID-MIC-SF-ICPMS measurement function (1 of 32 possible permutations, based on individual sample and spike solution pairs). The metadata are fed into a Kragten spreadsheet to estimate the uncertainty of the ID-MIC-SF-ICPMS method. The data for each quantity are presented in the following pattern: quantity value, reported uncertainty (standard deviation), method of evaluating uncertainty (Type A or Type B), standard uncertainty and degrees of freedom. Reported uncertainties evaluated by Type A methods were normalized to standard uncertainties by division by  $\sqrt{n}$ . Reported uncertainties with evaluated by Type B methods were modeled as rectangular distributions (normalized to standard uncertainties by division by  $\sqrt{3}$ ), with the exception of published expanded uncertainties, which were normalized to standard uncertainties using the published coverage factor. The S mass fraction data for SRM 2682c described in the text are based on the average of all permutations ( $0.4902\% \pm 0.0068\%$ ).

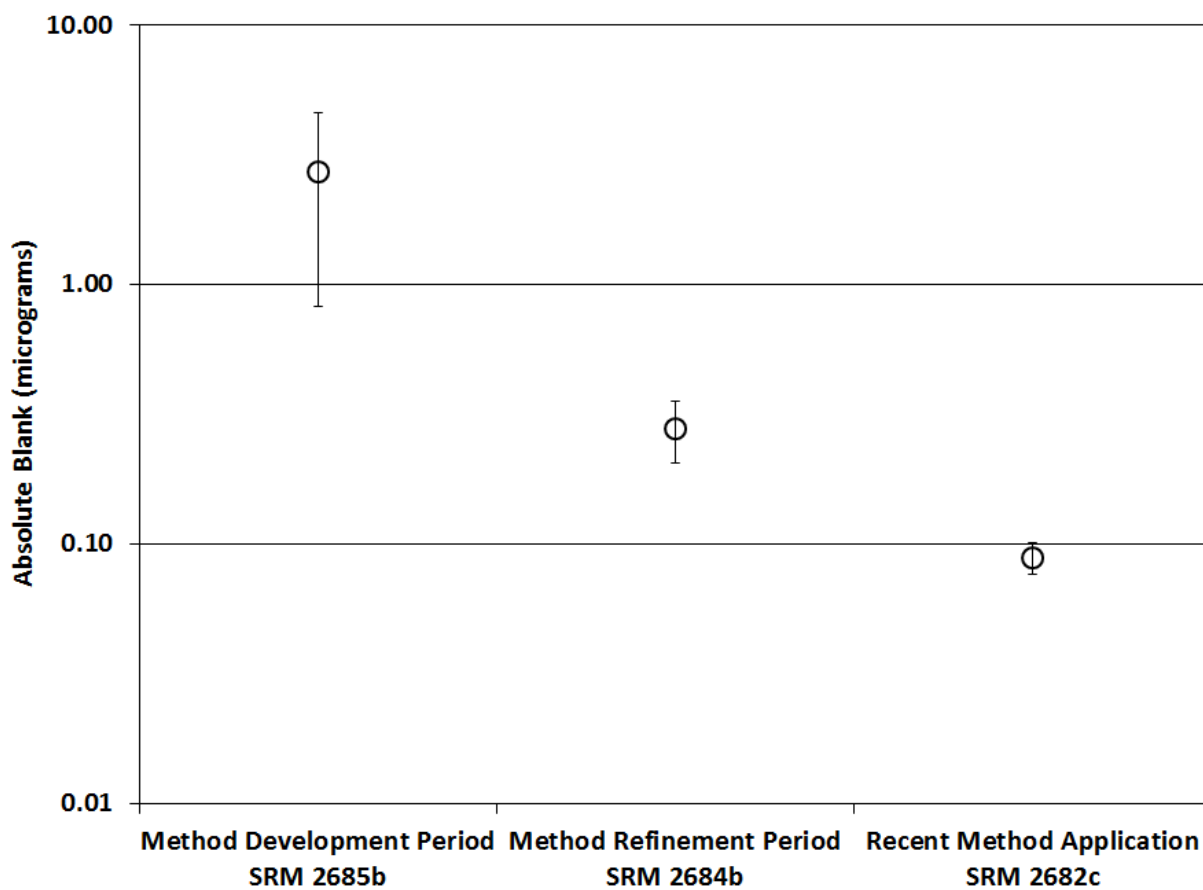

The most significant sources of uncertainty are readily apparent in the last data column (uncertainties calculated relative to the total variance). The results are based on a single permutation of the ID-MIC-SF-ICPMS measurement function (1 of 32 possible permutations, based on individual sample and spike solution pairs). The S mass fraction data for SRM 2682c described in the text are based on the average of all permutations (0.4902 % ± 0.0068 %).
