Note: ^a The density at 20 °C was estimated in this study following these procedures: a small vial containing IL was placed on a balance which was then zeroed; the vial was removed from the balance, and 50 μL of IL was withdrawn using a pipette; the vial was placed back to the balance to determine the mass loss due to IL removal; the density was calculated using the mass loss and the volume (50 μL). ^b The density cannot be determined by the method described above; in this case, the IL is too viscous and volumetric withdrawal using a micropipette is not reproducible. Therefore, the density was assumed to be 1.2 g mL⁻¹ for the purposes of calculating the Nernst sulfur partition coefficient. ^c This IL (**47**) tends to crystallize at room temperature over time; suggesting that its fluid state is a supercooled liquid.

Additional Synthetic Details:

1-hexylpyridinium thiocyanate, [C₆Py][SCN]: In a 100 mL round bottom flask, 5 g (20.5 mmol) of [C₆Py][Br] was dissolved in 25 mL of dry acetone, followed by addition of 2.42 g (1.0 eq) of potassium thiocyanate (KSCN) which resulted in a white, milky suspension. After stirring the reaction for 2 days, the white suspension was allowed to settle overnight and then stored in a freezer for 24 h. The reaction was filtered via gravity filtration to remove NaBr. The filtrate was collected and the solvent removed by rotary evaporation to give a slightly yellow liquid. ¹H NMR (500 MHz, CDCl₃): δ 9.57 (d, 2H), 8.52 (t, 1H), 8.14 (t, 2H), 4.99 (t, 2H), 2.03 (m, 2H), 1.33 (m, 2H), 1.27 (m, 4H), 0.82 (t, 3H).

1-octyl-1,4-diazabicyclo[2.2.2]octan-1-ium bis(trifluoromethylsulfonyl)imide, [DAB8][Tf₂N]: In a 100 mL round bottom flask, 5 g (16.3 mmol) of [DAB8][Br] was dissolved in 25 mL of deionized water, followed by addition of 4.70 g (1.0 eq) of lithium bis(trifluoromethylsulfonyl)imide (LiTf₂N) which resulted in the formation of a dense colorless bottom liquid phase. The reaction was washed with water five times and dried under vacuum for 2 days. ¹H NMR (500 MHz, D₂O): δ 3.21 (m, 14 H), 1.70 (m, 2H), 1.30 (m, 10 H), 0.87 (t, 3H).

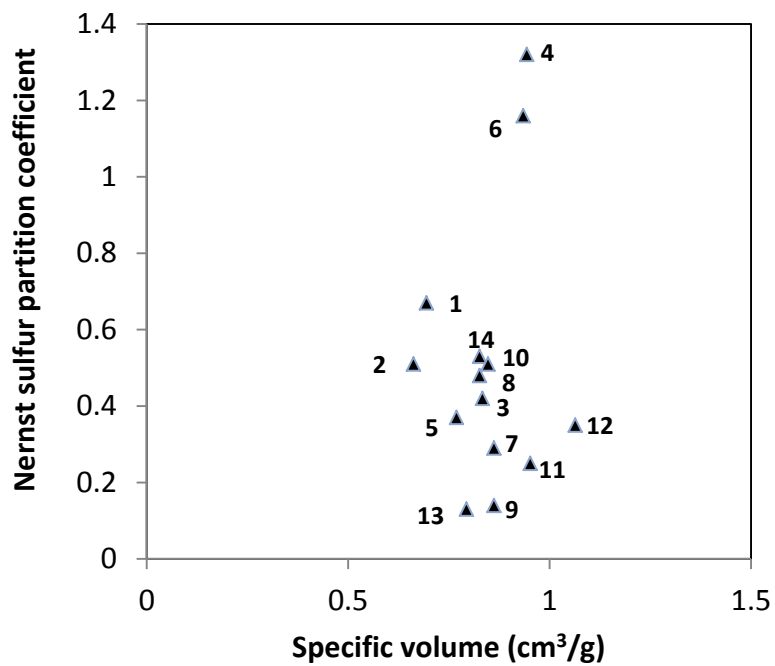


Figure S1. Correlation between the DBT partition coefficient and the specific volume of the ILs (specific volume = 1/density).

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
