C_2 -Symmetric Copper(II) Complexes as Chiral Lewis Acids. Catalytic Enantioselective Carbonyl-Ene Reactions with Glyoxylate and Pyruvate Esters

General Information. All reactions were carried out under an atmosphere of nitrogen in oven-dried glassware with magnetic stirring. Solvents and reagents were purified prior to use following the guidelines of Perrin and Armarego. CuCl₂ and AgSbF₆, from Cerac Chemical, and Cu(OTf)₂, from Aldrich, were stored in an inert atmosphere dry box and used without further purification. Purification of reaction products was carried out by flash chromatography using EM Reagent silica gel 60 (230-400 mesh). Analytical thin layer chromatography was performed on EM Reagent 0.25 mm silica gel 60-F plates. Visualization was accomplished with UV light and aqueous ceric ammonium molybdate solution followed by heating. Melting points were measured with a Büchi SMP-20 melting point apparatus equipped with an Omega Model 450 AET thermocouple and are uncorrected. Optical rotations were measured on a Jasco DIP-0181 digital polarimeter with a sodium lamp and are reported as follows: $[\alpha]_D^T$ (c g/100 mL, solvent). Infrared spectra were recorded on a Perkin Elmer 1600 series FT-IR spectrometer. ¹H NMR spectra were recorded on a Bruker AM-400 (400 MHz) and AM-500 (500 MHz) spectrometers and are reported in ppm from internal tetramethylsilane. Data are reported as: (br = broad, s = singlet, d = doublet, t = triplet, q = quartet, m = multiplet; coupling constant(s) in Hz; integration; proton assignments). Ambiguous assignments were resolved on the basis of standard one dimensional proton decoupling experiments. Proton-decoupled ¹³C NMR spectra were recorded on a Bruker AM-400 (100 MHz) and AM-500 (125 MHz) spectrometers and are reported in ppm using solvent as the internal standard (CDCl₃ at 77.0 ppm). High resolution mass spectra were obtained on Jeol AX-505 or SX-102 spectrometers in the Harvard University Mass Spectrometry Laboratory. Gas chromatography was performed on a Hewlett-Packard 5890 Series II gas chromatograph equipped with a split-mode capillary injection system and flame ionization detector using the following chiral columns: J&W Scientific CYCLODEX-B (30 m x 0.25 mm) and J&W Scientific DB-1701 (30 m x 0.25 mm). Medium pressure liquid chromatography (MPLC) was performed using a high capacity pump (Fluid Metering, Inc. Model RPD-OSSY) and Merck LiChroprep Si 60 (column size B) silca gel columns. Preparative HPLC was performed on a Ramin Dynamax system equiped with a SD-200 Solvent Delivery System and a variable wavelength detector (Model UV-C) using a Zorbax Sil (21.2 mm x 25 cm) column. Analytical high performance liquid chromatography (HPLC) was performed on a Hewlett-Packard 1050 Series HPLC equipped with a variable wavelength detector using a Chiralcel OD-H column (0.46 cm x 25 cm) from Daicel or a Zorbax Sil column (0.46 x 25 cm). X-ray crystallographic data was collected using a Siemens SMART CCD (charge coupled device) based diffractometer equipped with an LT-2 low-temperature apparatus operating at 213 K.

[Cu((S,S)-tert-Bu-box)]Cl₂•CH₂Cl₂. A round-bottom flask with a magnetic stirrer was charged with (S,S)-tert-butyl-bis(oxazoline)² (1.472 g, 5.0 mmol, 1.0 equiv) and CuCl₂ (0.672 g, 5.0 mmol, 1.0 equiv). Methylene chloride (20 mL) was added *via* syringe and the reaction stirred 3.5 h, until the insoluble CuCl₂ had solubilized. The

green solution was transfered via cannula under nitrogen to a syringe fitted with a 0.45 μ filter, and into a Schlenk flask. The solvent was removed *in vacuo* to deliver 2.52 g (99%) of a light green powder: mp > 180 °C; [α]_D -251° (c 1.06, CH₂Cl₂); IR (CH₂Cl₂) 2968, 1655, 1484, 1371, 1239, 1135, 947 cm⁻¹. Anal. Calcd for C₁₈H₃₂Cl₄CuN₂O₂: C, 42.08; H, 6.28; N, 5.45. Found: C, 42.21; H, 6.24; N, 5.51.

 $[Cu((S,S)-tert-Bu-box)](SbF_6)_2$ (2a)

 $[Cu(S,S)-(tert-butyl-box)](SbF_6)_2$ (2a). To an oven-dried round bottom flask containing a magnetic stirring bar was added, in an inert atmosphere box, Cu(tert-Bubox)Cl₂•CH₂Cl₂ (51.2 mg, 0.10 mmol) and AgSbF₆ (68.7 mg, 0.20 mmol). The flask was fitted with a serum cap, removed from the inert atmosphere box and charged with CH₂Cl₂ (2.0

mL). The mixture was stirred 2-3 h in the absence of light to produce a green solution with a white AgCl precipitate. The mixture was filtered through a plug of oven-dried Celite to provide a solution of 2a as a clear dark green solution. The development of a blue color in room temperature solutions of this catalyst is indicative of the formation of the bis(aquo) complex 4a.

 $[Cu(S,S)-(tert-butyl-box)(H_2O)_2](SbF_6)_2$ (4a). solution of 2a obtained after the Celite filtration step in the preceding experiment was washed through with 4 x 15 mL CH₂Cl₂ (sat. with H₂O) into a flask. The blue solution containing the aquated complex was concentrated slowly in vacuo to afford 344 mg (99% yield) of 4a as an air-stable light blue solid.²

Method A: General Procedure for the Addition of Olefins to Ethyl Glyoxylate Catalyzed by 1 and 2. To an oven-dried, 10-mL round-bottom flask containing a magnetic stirring bar was added, the olefin (0.50 mmol). and ethyl glyoxylate (3-10 equiv). To this mixture was added the catalyst solution 1 or 2 (0.05-0.005 mmol in 1.5 mL CH₂Cl₂) in one portion. After the reaction was complete (1-48 h) the mixture was directed loaded onto a 2 x 6 cm silica gel flash column and eluted with the indicated solvent to provide the title compounds.

Method B: General Procedure for the Addition of Olefins to Ethyl Glyoxylate Catalyzed by 4. To an oven-dried, 10-mL round-bottom flask containing a magnetic stirring bar was added, the olefin (0.50 mmol), ethyl glyoxylate (3-10 equiv) and CH₂Cl₂ (1.5 mL). To this solution was added solid 4 (0.05-0.005 mmol) in one portion. After the reaction was complete (1-48 h) the mixture was directed loaded onto a 2 x 6 cm silica gel flash column and eluted with the indicated solvent to provide the title compounds.

Preparation of (R)-Ethyl 3-(1'-Cyclohexenyl)-2-hydroxypropionate (6). Prepared according to Method A (0 °C, 12 h) using methylene cyclohexane (60 µL, 0.50 mmol), ethyl glyoxylate (200 µL, 1.5 mmol) and catalyst 1c (0.05 mmol, 1.5 mL CH₂Cl₂) to provide the pure product as a clear oil in 99% yield (98 mg, 0.49 mmol, 87% ee) after flash chromatography with 30% Et₂O/hexanes.

Preparation of (S)-Ethyl 3-(1'-Cyclohexenyl)-2-hydroxypropionate (6). Prepared according to Method B (1.5 mL CH₂Cl₂, 0 °C, 1 h) using methylene cyclohexane (60 µL, 0.50 mmol), ethyl glyoxylate (200 µL, 1.5 mmol) and catalyst 4 (0.005 mmol) to provide the pure product as a clear oil in 96% yield (95 mg, 0.48 mmol, 97% ee) after flash chromatography with 30% Et₂O/hexanes. General Procedure for preparation of Mosher MTPA Esters: To a solution of substrate (0.1 mmol) in 2 mL CH₂Cl₂, triethylamine (28 µL, 0.2 mmol), MTPA-Cl (28 µL, 0.14 mmol), and DMAP (catalytic) were added. After stirring overnight at RT, the resulting suspension was filtered through a plug of SiO2 and concetrated in vacuo to afford the product.

Preparation of (R)-Ethyl 2-Hydroxy-5-methyl-5-pentenoate (7): Prepared according to Method A (0 °C, 12 h) using a 1-M solution of isobutylene in dichloroethane (500 µL, 0.50 mmol), ethyl glyoxylate (200 µL, 1.5 mmol) and catalyst 1c (0.05 mmol, 1.5 mL CH₂Cl₂) to provide the pure product as a clear oil in 92% yield (73 mg, 0.46 mmol, 92% ee) after flash chromatography with 30% Et₂O/hexanes.

Preparation of (S)-Ethyl 2-Hydroxy-5-methyl-5-pentenoate (7). Prepared according to Method B (1.5 mL CH₂Cl₂, 0 °C, 1 h) using a 1-M solution of isobutylene in dichloroethane (500 µL, 0.50 mmol), ethyl glyoxylate (200 µL,1.5 mmol) and catalyst 4 (0.005 mmol) to provide the pure product as a clear oil in 97% yield (77 mg, 0.48 mmol, 96% ee) after flash chromatography with 30% Et₂O/hexanes. Determination of Absolute Configuration (S)-Ethyl 2-Hydroxy-4-methyl-4-pentenoate (6) by Correlation OEt with (S)- Leucinic Acid Ethyl Ester: To a solution of (S)-ethyl 2-hydroxy-4-methyl-4-pentenoate (150 mg, 0.95 mmol, 97% ee) in 4 mL EtOH at RT, Adam's catalyst

(PtO₂) (22 mg, 0.095 mmol) was added. The flask was purged with H₂ and allowed stir under 1 atm H₂ for 16 The eluent was h. The reaction was then diluted with Et₂O and eluted through a short plug of SiO₂. concentrated in vacuo and purified by flash chromatography with 30% Et₂O/hexanes to afford (S)-leucinic acid ethyl ester as a volatile liquid (115 mg, 72% yield). Preparation of (R)-Ethyl 3-(1' Cyclopentenyl)-2-hydroxypropionate (9). Prepared according to Method A (0 °C, 12 h) using methylene cyclopentane (52 µL, 0.50 mmol), ethyl glyoxylate (200 µL, 1.5 mmol) and catalyst 1c (0.05 mmol, 1.5 mL CH₂Cl₂) to provide the pure product as a clear oil in 97% yield (89 mg, 0.48 mmol, 76% ee) after flash chromatography with 30% Et₂O/hexanes.

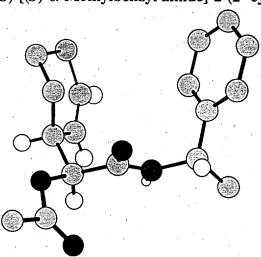

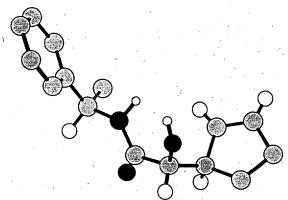

Preparation of (2S, 3S)-Ethyl 3-methyl-2-hydroxy-5-pentenoate (19). To an oven-dried, round-bottom flask containing a magnetic stirring bar was added, in an inert atmosphere box, Cu((R,R)-Ph-box)Cl₂ (23.4 mg, 0.05 mmol) and AgSbF₆ (34.3 mg, 0.10 mmol). Preparation of (2S, 3S)-Ethyl 3-methyl-2-hydroxy-5-pentenoate (19). To an oven-dried, round-bottom flask containing a magnetic stirring bar was added, in an inert atmosphere box, Cu((S,S)--t-Bu-box)Cl₂ (21.4 mg, 0.05 mmol) and AgSbF₆ (34.3 mg, 0.10 mmol). The flask was fitted with a serum cap, removed from the inert atmosphere box and charged with CH₂Cl₂ precipitate. 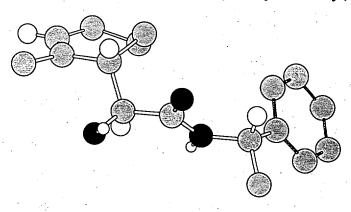

Large Scale Preparation of (S)-Ethyl 3-(1'-Cyclohexenyl)-2-hydroxypropionate (6). To a -78 °C solution of methylene cyclohexane (3.0 mL, 25 mmol), ethyl glyoxylate (10.5 mL, 75 mmol) in CH₂Cl₂ (25 mL), catalyst 4 (43 mg, 0.05 mmol) was added and the solution allowed to warm to 0 °C and stirred for 18 h. To an oven-dried, 10 mL round-bottom flask containing a magnetic stirring bar was added, the olefin (0.50 mmol), and ethyl glyoxylate (50% in toluene, 352 μ L, 1.5 mmol) and CH₂Cl₂ (1.5 mL).. To this mixture was added the catalyst solution 1c (0.05 mmol in 1.5 mL CH₂Cl₂) in one portion. Preparation of (R)-Ethyl 3-(1' Cyclohexenyl)-2-azidopropionate (25). To a solution of 350 mg (1.76 mmol) of (S)-methyl 3-(1' cyclohexenyl)-2-hydroxypropionate (6) in 10 mL DMF at RT was added 774 mg (2.11 mmol) of bis(para-nitrophenyl) phosphorazidate forming a heterogeneous solution. Upon addition of 1,8-diazabicyclo[5.4.0]undec-7-ene (250 μ L, 1.67 mmol) the solution became homogeneous and turned yellow. After 12 h at

50 °C, the solution was poured into 2% HCl and extracted with EtOAc (50 mL). The organics were washed with water (3x50 mL) and brine (50 mL), dried (Na₂SO₄), filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography with 10% EtOAc/hexanes afforded 265 mg (72% yield) of the title compound as a oil.

Preparation of (S)-Methyl 3-(1'Cyclohexenyl)-2-hydroxy-2-methylpropionate (26). Prepared according to Method A (1.5 mL CH₂Cl₂, reflux, 48 h) using methylenecyclohexane (600 μ L, 5.0 mmol), methyl pyruvate (45 μ L, 0.5 mmol) and catalyst 2a (0.10 mmol) to provide the pure product as a clear oil in 84% yield (84 mg, 0.42 mmol, 98% ee) after flash chromatography with 15% EtOAc/hexanes. 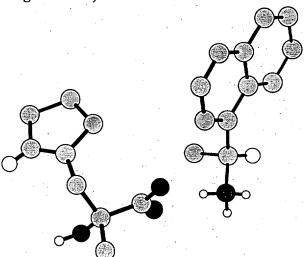
Preparation of (S)-3-(1'Cyclopentenyl)-2-hydroxy-2-methylpropionic acid. To a solution of (S)-methyl 3-(1'cyclopentenyl)-2-hydroxy-2-methylpropionate (688 mg, 3.73 mmol) in 20 mL MeOH was added 20 ml aqueous 10% KOH. After 2 h, the solution was acidified to pH 2

with 1 N HCl and extracted 3 x 50 mL ethyl acetate. Preparation of (S)-3-(1' Cyclopentenyl)-2hydroxy-2-methylpropionic acid, (R)-1-(1-napthyl) ethylammonium salt. To a solution of (S)-methyl 3-(1' cyclopentenyl)-2hydroxy-2-methylpropionic acid (150 mg, 0.88 mmol) in 5 mL CH₂Cl₂ was added (R)-1-(1-napthyl)ethylamine (149 µL, 0.92

mmol). Preparation of (S)-Methyl 2-Hydroxy-2-methyl-5-methyl-5-pentenoate (28). oven-dried, round-bottom flask containing a magnetic stirring bar was added, in an inert atmosphere box, Cu((S)-t-Bu-box)Cl₂ (21.4 mg, 0.05 mmol) and AgSbF₆ (34.3 mg, 0.10 mmol). The flask was fitted with a serum cap, removed from the inert atmosphere box and charged with CH₂Cl₂ (1.0 mL). The mixture was stirred 2-3 h in the absence of light to produce a green solu-

tion with a white AgCl precipitate. The mixture was transfered via cannula under nitrogen to a syringe fitted with a 0.45 μ filter, and into an oven dried sealed tube with 14/20 side arm joint attached containing methyl pyruvate (45 µL, 0.5 mmol) and 0.5 mL CH₂Cl₂. The flask was cooled to -78 °C and 2-methylpropene was condensed into the flask using a dry-ice condenser (large excess). The flask was then sealed and allowed to warm to 45 °C for 48 h to provide the product as a clear oil in 76% yield (60 mg, 0.38 mmol, 98%ee) after flash chromatography with 15% EtOAc /hexanes.
