Absolute Stereochemistry of Allylic Alcohols, Amines and Other Ene Moieties: A Microscale Cross Metathesis / Exciton Chirality Protocol

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Materials and General Procedures

Anhydrous dichloromethane was dried and distilled from CaH₂. Acetonitrile used for CD and UV-vis measurements were Optima grade. Unless otherwise noted, materials were obtained from a commercial supplier and were used without further purification. Grubbs' second generation ruthenium catalyst, tricyclohexylphosphine [1,3-bis(2,4,6-trimethylphenyl)-4,5-dihydroimidazol-2-ylidene][benzylidine]ruthenium (IV) dichloride 1 is commercially available from Strem Chemicals. Prostaglandin A₁ ethyl ester and Corey lactone diol 4 were purchased from Cayman Chemical. (R)-2-Aminobut-3-en-1-ol, benzoate salt was purchased from Acros Organics. All reactions were performed in predried glassware under Ar. Olefin metathesis reaction was first optimized at a 50 mg level of the sample and scaled down further at an 1 mg ~ μg level of the sample. Purification was performed either by column chromatography using ICN silica gel (32-63 mesh) or by preparative TLC using silica gel plate, 60 F-254, 0.25 mm, E. Merck. ¹H NMR spectra were obtained on Bruker DMX 300 or 400 MHz spectrometers and are reported in parts per million (ppm) relative to TMS (δ), with coupling constants (J) in Herts (Hz). Low- and high- resolution FAB mass spectra were measured on a JEOL JMS-DX303 HF mass spectrometer using a glycerol matrix and Xe ionizing gas. UV-vis spectra were recorded on a Perkin-Elmer Lambda 40 spectrophotometer, and reported as λ_{max} [nm] (ε_{max} [Lmol⁻¹cm⁻¹]). The CD spectra were recorded on JASCO-810 spectrophotometer. The CD spectra were measured in millidegrees and normarized into $\Delta \varepsilon_{max}$ [Lmol⁻¹cm⁻¹]. Molecular modeling calculations were executed with MacroModel 7.1 package (Schrodinger, Inc., Portland, OR) including Maestro 3.0 as GUI, on a Dell Precision 330 workstation.

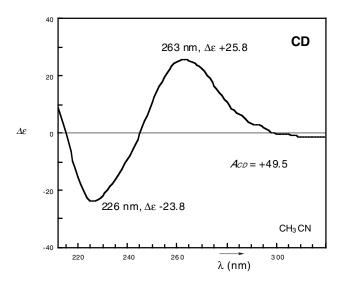
Styryl ketone (2a) and styryl *p*-phenylbenzoate (3b).

To a solution of prostaglendin A_1 ethyl ester (100 µg, 270 nmol) in dichloromethane (1 mL) was added Grubbs' second generation ruthenium catalyst **1** (53 µg, 63 nmol) and styrene (310 nL, 2.7 µmol) at room temperature, and the mixture was stirred at 40 °C for 2 h. The reaction mixture was concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products which were purified by preparative thin layer chromatography on silica gel (25 % ethyl acetate

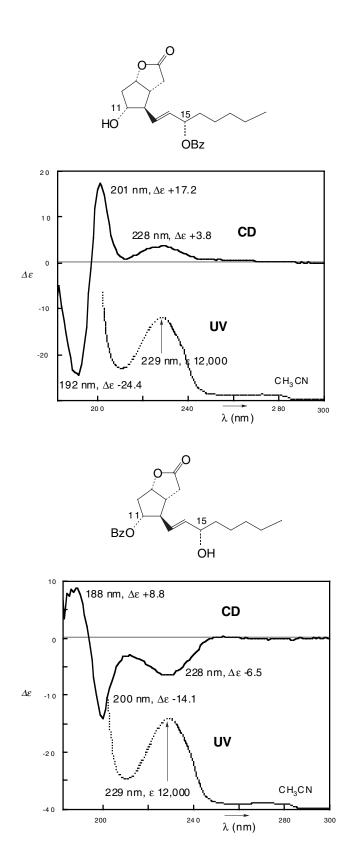
in hexane) to afford the desired styryl ketone **2a** (85 %) and styryl alcohol **2b** (89 %) as yellow oils. The above mentioned procedure of olefin metathesis was first optimized at an 1 mg level of the sample, and the yields for **2a** and **2b** were calculated: Data for **2a**; UV (MeCN) 253 nm (ϵ 17,000); H NMR (400 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 1.22-1.62 (m, 12H) including 1.24 (t, 3H, J = 7.2 Hz), 1.80-1.88 (m, 1H), 2.15-2.19 (m, 1H), 2.26 (t, 2H, J = 7.5 Hz), 3.40 (brdd, 1H, J = 8.4, 2.2 Hz), 4.11 (q, 2H, J = 7.1 Hz), 6.11 (dd, 1H, J = 15.8, 8.4 Hz), 6.22 (dd, 1H, J = 5.6, 2.0 Hz), 6.50 (d, 1H, J = 15.8 Hz), 7.23-7.37 (m, 5H), 7.54 (dd, 1H, J = 5.7, 2.5 Hz); HRFABMS calcd for $C_{22}H_{29}O_3$ [M+H]+ 341.2117, found 341.2118.

To a solution of the styryl alcohol **2b** (50 μg, 240 nmol) obtained above in dichloromethane (1 mL) was added *p*-phenylbenzoic acid (53 μg, 270 nmol), EDC (80 μg, 420 nmol), and DMAP (36 μg, 290 nmol) at room temperature, and the mixture was stirred for 15 h. The reaction mixture was concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products which were purified by preparative thin layer chromatography on silica gel (25 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to afford the styryl benzoate **3b** (80 %) as a white solid: CD (CHCl₃) 275 nm, $\Delta \varepsilon$ +9.8, 250 nm, $\Delta \varepsilon$ -9.4 (A_{CD} = +19.2); UV (MeCN) 265 nm (ε 30,000); ¹H NMR (400 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 0.89 (t, 3H, J = 6.9 Hz), 1.25-1.57 (m, 6H), 1.77-1.96 (m, 2H), 5.68 (dt, 1H, J = 6.8, 6.8 Hz), 6.26 (dd, 1H, J = 15.9, 7.2 Hz (7.2 Hz in CD₃CN), 6.71 (d, 1H, J = 16.0 Hz), 7.25 (d, 1H, J = 5.4 Hz), 7.31 (dd, 2H, J = 7.8, 7.8 Hz), 7.38-7.41 (m, 3H), 7.47 (dd, 2H, J = 7.9, 7.9 Hz), 7.63 (d, 2H, J = 7.2 Hz), 7.67 (d, 2H, J = 8.2 Hz), 8.15 (d, 2H, J = 8.2 Hz); HRFABMS calcd for $C_{27}H_{28}O_2$ [M]⁺ 384.2090, found 384.2097.

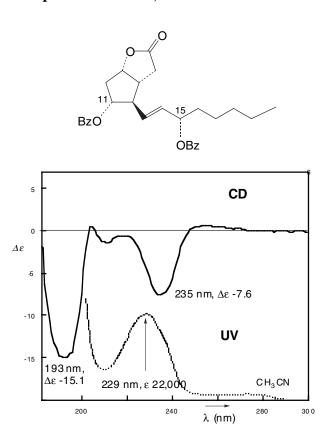
CD spectrum of 2a (after subtraction of CE of PGA₁ ethyl ester).

Styryl p-phenylbenzoate (6a).

To a solution of Corey lactone diol 4 (10 μ g, 37 nmol) in dichloromethane (0.5 mL) was added Grubbs' second generation ruthenium catalyst 1 (20 μ g, 24 nmol) and styrene (1 drop) at room temperature, and the mixture was stirred at 40 °C for 1 h. The reaction mixture was concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products which were purified by preparative thin layer chromatography on silica gel (25 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to afford the styryl alcohols 5a (66 %) and 2b (63 %) as yellow oils, which were respectively acylated without further purification. The above mentioned olefin metathesis was optimized first at a 50 mg and an 1 mg level of the sample and the yields for 5a and 2b were calculated.

To a solution of the styryl alcohol **5a** obtained (100 μ g, 410 nmol) in dichloromethane (1 mL) was added *p*-phenylbenzoic acid (89 μ g, 450 nmol), EDC (130 μ g, 700 nmol), and DMAP (60 μ g, 490 nmol) at room temperature, and the mixture was stirred for 18 h. The reaction mixture was concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products which were purified by preparative thin layer chromatography on silica gel (33 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to afford the desired styryl *p*-phenylbenzoate **6a** (170 μ g, quant.) as a white solid: UV (MeCN) 264 nm (ϵ 30,000); ¹H NMR (400 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 2.30 (ddd, 1H, J = 15.6, 5.2, 2.0 Hz), 2.56-2.72 (m, 2H), 2.87-2.92 (m, 3H), 5.12 (ddd, 1H, J = 4.8, 4.8, 4.8 Hz), 5.37 (ddd, 1H, J = 11.6, 5.6, 5.6 Hz), 6.09 (dd, 1H, J = 15.6, 7.2 Hz),

6.55 (d, 1H, J = 16.0 Hz), 7.22-7.25 (m, 1H), 7.29-7.40 (m, 5H), 7.47 (dd, 2H, J = 5.6, 5.6 Hz), 7.61 (d, 2H, J = 6.8 Hz), 7.66 (d, 2H, J = 8.4 Hz), 8.10 (d, 2H, J = 8.8 Hz); HRFABMS calcd for $C_{28}H_{25}O_4$ [M+H]⁺ 425.1753, found 425.1775.

p-Methoxystyryl p-dimethylaminobenzoate (8a) and p-methoxystyryl p-methoxycinnamate (8b).

To a solution of Corey lactone diol **4** (100 μg, 370 nmol) in dichloromethane (1 mL) was added Grubbs' second generation ruthenium catalyst **1** (36 μg, 42 nmol) and *p*-methoxystyrene (500 nL, 3.7 μmol) at room temperature, and the mixture was stirred at 40 °C for 3 h. The reaction mixture was concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products which were purified by preparative thin layer chromatography on silica gel (25 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to afford the *p*-methoxystyryl alcohol **7b** (73 %) as a yellow oil and crude **7a** which was again purified by preparative thin layer chromatography on silica gel (67 % ethyl acetate in hexane, 61 % as a white solid). *p*-Methoxystyryl alcohols **7a** and **7b** were acylated without further purification, respectively. The above mentioned procedure of olefin metathesis was first optimized at a 50 mg level of the sample and the yields for **7a** and **7b** were calculated.

To a solution of the *p*-methoxystyryl alcohol **7a** thus obtained (9.5 mg, 35 μ mol) in acetonitrile (1 mL) was added *p*-dimethylaminobenzoylimidazole (7.8 mg, 36 μ mol), and DBU (5.3 μ L, 36 μ mol) at room temperature. After the reaction mixture was stirred for 3 h at this temperature, H₂O was added, and the resulting mixture was extracted with ethyl acetate. The organic layers were combined, washed with brine, dried over Na₂SO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products, which were purified by column chromatography on silica gel (from 40 % to 67 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to afford the *p*-methoxystyryl *p*-dimethylaminobenzoate **8a** (13 mg, 89 %) as a white solid: UV (MeCN) 310 nm (ϵ 27,700), 264 nm (ϵ 21,300); ¹H NMR (400 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 2.24 (ddd, 1H, J = 15.4, 4.6, 1.4 Hz), 2.54-2.65 (m, 2H), 2.84-2.93 (m, 3H), 3.03 (s, 6H), 3.80 (s, 3H), 5.11 (ddd, 1H, J = 5.0, 5.0, 5.0 Hz), 5.29 (ddd, 1H, J = 10.4, 5.3, 5.3 Hz), 5.92 (dd, 1H, J = 15.8, 7.2 Hz), 6.46 (d, 1H, J = 15.9 Hz), 6.64 (d, 2H, J = 9.0 Hz), 6.84 (d, 2H, J = 8.7 Hz), 7.27 (d, 2H, J = 8.9 Hz), 7.86 (d, 2H, J = 8.9 Hz); HRFABMS calcd for C₂₅H₂₈NO₅ [M+H]⁺ 422.1967, found 422.1950.

To a solution of the *p*-methoxystyryl alcohol **7b** obtained above (4.0 mg, 17 μmol) in dichloromethane (2 mL) was added *p*-methoxycinnamic acid (3.3 mg, 19 μmol), EDC (5.6 mg, 29 μmol), and DMAP (2.5 mg, 20 μmol) at room temperature, and the mixture was stirred for 33 h. The reaction mixture was concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products which were purified by preparative thin layer chromatography on silica gel (25 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to afford the corresponding *p*-methoxystyryl *p*-methoxycinnamate **8b** (6.2 mg, 92 %) as a yellow oil: UV (MeCN) 307 nm (ε 23,700), 298 nm (ε 23,900), 269 nm (ε 22,700); ¹H NMR (400 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 0.89 (t, 3H, J = 6.8 Hz), 1.26-1.42 (m, 6H), 1.67-1.85 (m, 2H), 3.80 (s, 3H), 3.84 (s, 3H), 5.51 (dt, 1H, J = 6.8, 6.8 Hz), 6.05 (dd, 1H, J = 15.9, 7.4 Hz (7.2 Hz in CD₃CN), 6.33 (d, 1H, J = 15.9 Hz), 6.59 (d, 1H, J = 15.9 Hz), 6.84 (d, 2H, J = 8.7 Hz), 6.90 (d, 2H, J = 8.7 Hz), 7.32 (d, 2H, J = 8.7 Hz), 7.48 (d, 2H, J = 8.7 Hz), 7.65 (d, 1H, J = 16.0 Hz); HRFABMS calcd for C₂₅H₃₀O₄ [M]⁺ 394.2144, found 394.2138.

Styryl naphthimides.

To a solution of (R)-2-aminobut-3-en-1-ol, benzoate salt **9** (30 mg, 140 µmol) in pyridine (1 mL) was added 2,3-naphthalenedicarboxylic acid anhydride (31 mg, 160 µmol) at room temperature.¹ After the reaction mixture was stirred at 80 °C for 10 h, saturated aqueous CuSO₄ solution was added, and the resulting mixture was extracted with ethyl acetate. The organic layers were combined, washed with brine, dried over Na₂SO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products, which were purified by column chromatography on silica gel (from 25 % to 50 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to give the corresponding naphthimide (31 mg, 81 %) as a white solid: ¹H NMR (400 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 2.86 (brs, 1H), 4.02 (dd, 1H, J = 11.7, 4.3 Hz), 4.21 (dd, 1H, J = 11.6, 7.6 Hz), 5.00-5.05 (m, 1H), 5.285-5.295 (m, 1H), 5.32-5.33 (m, 1H), 6.21 (ddd, 1H, J = 17.2, 10.3, 6.9 Hz), 7.68-7.72 (m, 2H), 8.02-8.06 (m, 2H), 8.32 (s, 2H); HRFABMS calcd for C₁₆H₁₄NO₃ [M+H]⁺ 268.0974, found 268.0989.

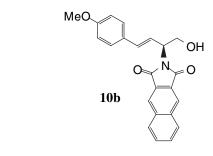
Styryl naphthimide (10a, X = H).

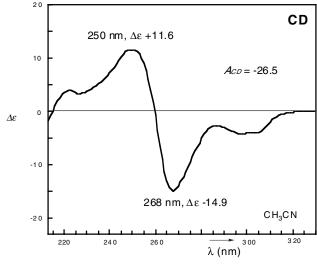
To a solution of the naphthimide obtained above (6 mg, 22 μmol) in dichloromethane (1 mL) was added Grubbs' second generation ruthenium catalyst **1** (4.3 mg, 5.1 μmol) and styrene (X = H) (26 μL, 220 μmol) at room temperature, and the mixture was stirred at 40 °C for 10 h. The reaction mixture was concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products which were purified by column chromatography on silica gel (from 25 % to 40 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to give the desired styryl naphthimide **10a** (X = H) (6.5 mg, 84 %) as a yellow oil: CD (MeCN) 266 nm, $\Delta \varepsilon$ –18.4, 245 nm $\Delta \varepsilon$ +10.5 ($A_{CD} = -28.9$); UV (MeCN) 260 nm (ε 52,000); ¹H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 2.68 (dd, 1H, J = 8.6, 3.9 Hz), 4.03-4.12 (m, 1H), 4.25 (m, 1H), 5.16 (ddd, 1H, J = 7.4, 7.4, 4.6 Hz), 6.61 (dd, 1H, J = 15.9, 7.1 Hz), 6.69 (d, 1H, J = 15.9 Hz), 7.19-7.51 (m, 5H), 7.65-7.70 (m, 2H), 8.01-8.05 (m, 2H), 8.31 (s, 2H); HRFABMS calcd for $C_{22}H_{18}NO_3$ [M+H]⁺ 344.1286, found 344.1305.

p-Methoxystyryl naphthimide (10b, X = -OMe).

To a solution of the naphthimide (10 µg, 37 nmol) in dichloromethane (1 mL) was added Grubbs' second generation ruthenium catalyst **1** (20 µg, 24 nmol) and p-methoxystyrene (X = OMe)(1 drop) at room temperature, and the mixture was stirred at 40 °C for 12 h. The reaction mixture was concentrated *in vacuo* to give the crude products which were purified by preparative thin layer chromatography on silica gel (25 % ethyl acetate in hexane) to afford to give the desired p-methoxystyryl naphthimide **10b** (X = OMe) (61 %) as a yellow oil. The procedure of olefin metathesis was first optimized at a 2 mg level of the sample and the yield for **10b** (X = OMe) was calculated: UV (MeCN) 260 nm (E = 0.000); H NMR (400 MHz, CDCl₃) E = 0.000 (brs, 1H), 3.79 (s, 3H), 4.07 (dd, 1H, E = 0.000), 4.23 (brs, 1H), 5.14 (ddd, 1H, E = 0.000), 6.50 (dd, 1H, E = 0.000), 6.66 (d, 1H, E = 0.000), 6.83 (d, 2H, E = 0.000), 7.34 (d, 2H, E = 0.000), 7.39 (m, 2H), 8.04-8.07 (m, 2H), 8.34 (s, 2H); HRFABMS calcd for E = 0.0000 (M+H) 374.1392, found 374.1402.
