About σ^* constant

The substituent constants σ^* for aliphatic groups have been originally determined with the aid of alkaline and acid hydrolysis of esters RCOOR' by the eqn. (1) where subscripts A and B refer to acidic and basic hydrolysis, respectively. Rate coefficient k_o refers to the reaction of $\text{CH}_3\text{COOR}'$.

$$\sigma^* = (1/2.48)[\log(k/k_o)_B - \log(k/k_o)_A] \quad (1)$$

The factor 2.48 is chosen to put σ^* values on about the same scale with Hammett σ values. The σ^* values thus obtained describe the polar effects of the groups R because the polar effects on the acidic hydrolysis are thought to be small and the steric effects are cancelled by eqn. (1).¹⁰
