Undecylenic $_{\text{CH}_2=\text{CH}(\text{CH}_2)_7}^{\text{CH}_2=\text{CH}(\text{CH}_2)_7}$ co₂Me acid (3.81 mL, 3.48 g, 18.87 mmol) was added to a stirred solution of (COCl)₂ (11.98 g, 9.00 mL, 94.27 mmol) in CH₂Cl₂ (10 mL) and the mixture was allowed to stir for two hours. Me (±) 4-Cyclohexyl-4-hydroxy-2-methyl-2-butenoic Acid Lactone (10c). The procedure described for butenolide 10a was employed with allenic acid 9c (0.176 g, 0.978 mmol) with one variation: The reaction mixture was heated at reflux for 16 h. (±)-12-[(Methoxymeth)oxy]-8-dodecyn-7-ol (15). To a mixture of 4-pentyn-1-ol (4.52 g, 5.00 mL, 53.73 mmol) and Hunig's base (27.78 g, 37.44 mL, 214.9 mmol) in 100 mL of CH₂Cl₂ at 0 °C was added 8.16 mL (8.65 g, 107.5 mmol) of MOMCl. The reaction mixture was warmed to rt, stirred for 16 h, and then quenched with saturated NaHCO₃ and extracted with Et₂O. The combined Et₂O extracts were dried over MgSO₄ and concentrated under reduced pressure to give 6.07 g (88%) of 5-[(methoxymethoxy]-1-pentyne as an oil that was carried on without purification: 1 H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 4.61 (s, 2H), 3.61 (t, 2H, J = 6.2 Hz), 3.35 (s, 3H), 2.30 (dt, 2H, J = 7.1, 2.7 Hz), 1.93 (t, 1H, J = 2.6 Hz), 1.79 (app p, 2H, J = 6.7 Hz).

To a stirred solution of 5-[(methoxymethoxy]-1-pentyne (6.07 g, 47.42 mmol) in THF (100 mL) at -78 °C was added 28.45 mL of a 2.5 M solution of n-BuLi in hexanes. After 1 h, heptaldehyde (13.24 mL, 10.83 g, 94.84 mmol) was added and the reaction mixture was stirred at -78 °C for an additional 0.5 h and then warmed to rt. After 2 h, the reaction mixture was quenched with saturated NH₄Cl and diluted with Et₂O. The layers were separated and the organic layer was washed with saturated NH₄Cl and brine, dried over MgSO₄ and concentrated under reduced pressure. The residue was chromatographed on silica gel. The procedure used to prepare mesylate 22a was followed with 0.073 mL (0.50 mmol) of (S)-1-octyn-3-ol, 0.06 mL (0.75 mmol) of methanesulfonyl chloride, and 0.14 mL of Et₃N in 3.3 mL of CH₂Cl₂. ¹HNMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 5.16 (dt, 1H, J = 6.6, 1.8 Hz), 2.70 (d, 1H, J = 2.2 Hz), 1.90 (m, 2H), 1.54-1.30 (m, 6H), 0.90 (t, 3H, 6.97 Hz).

The procedure used to prepare allenic ester 23b was followed with 0.148 g (0.60 mmol) of mesylate 22a, 0.014 g (0.015 mmol) of Pd₂dba₃, 0.031 g (0.12 mmol) of Ph₃P, 0.091g (0.66 mmol) of K₂CO₃, and 0.93 mL (9.0 mmol) of benzyl alcohol in 6.0 mL of THF to give 0.145g (84%) of allenic ester 23a as a colorless oil. The procedure used to prepare allenic ester 23c was employed with 0.32 g (1.59 mmol) of mesylate 22b, 5.8 mg (0.0064 mmol) of Pd₂dba₃, 0.013 g (0.051 mmol) of Ph₃P, and 1.14 mL (7.94 mmol) of 2-TMS ethanol in 15.9 mL of THF to give 0.323 g (80%) of allenic ester 23d as a yellow oil. The procedure used to prepare allenic ester 23c was followed with 0.18 g (0.98 mmol) of mesylate 22c, 4.5 mg (0.0049 mmol) of Pd₂dba₃, 0.010 g (0.039 mmol) of Ph₃P, and 0.51 mL of benzyl alcohol in 9.8 mL of THF to give 0.172 g (76%) of allenic ester 23f as a yellow oil. 3-n-Butyl-4-iodo-2(5H)-furanone (24c). The procedure used to prepare iodobutenolide 24a was followed with 0.10 g (0.43 mmol) of allenic ester 23g, and 0.86 mL of 1.0 M iodine monobromide in CH₂Cl₂ to give 0.095 g (83%) of iodobutenolide 24c as a white solid. ¹H NMR (300 MHz, CHCl₃) δ 4.72 (s, 2H), 2.35, (t, 2H, J = 7.3 Hz), 1.52 (m, 2H), 1.37 (m, 2H) 0.94 (t, 3H, J = 7.0 Hz).

(*R*)-5-*n*-Pentyl-2(5H)-furanone (25b) A. From Iodobutenolide 25b.. The procedure used to prepare butenolide 25a was followed with 0.076 g (0.28 mmol) of iodobutenolide 24b, 1.3 mg (0.0014 mmol) of Pd₂dba₃, 1.5 mg (0.0056 mmol) of Ph₃P, and 0.08 mL (0.29 mmol) of Bu₃SnH in 2.8 mL of THF to give 0.030 g (70%) of butenolide 25b as a colorless oil. ¹H NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 7.45 (dd, 1H, J = 5.7, 1.5 Hz), 6.10 (dd, 1H, J = 5.7, 2.0 Hz), 5.03 (m, 1H), 1.71 (m, 2H), 1.48-1.28 (m, 6H), 0.89 (t, 3H, J = 6.8 Hz); ¹³C NMR (300 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 172.9, 156.3, 121.2, 83.4, 33.1, 31.4, 24.6, 22.4, 13.9; [α]_D -62.6 (CHCl₃, c 0.73); HPLC analysis on a Regis (*R*, *R*) Whelk-O column showed this sample to be of 95% ee.

B. From Mesylate 22b. In a flame dried, argon flushed flask, a solution of 2.3 mg (0.0025 mmol) of Pd₂dba₃ and 2.6 mg (0.010 mmol) of Ph₃P in 2.5 mL of THF was stirred under a stream of CO gas for ~ 2min. This Pd (0) solution was transferred by syringe to a Parr pressure reactor containing 0.102 g (0.50 mmol) of mesylate 22b in 2.5 mL of THF, then 0.36 mL of water was added. The Parr reactor was charged with 200 psi of CO gas. After 1 h at rt, the gas was vented and the mixture was extracted with EtOAc, washed with brine (2x), and dried over MgSO₄. After filtration the solution containing the crude acid 27b was used directly.

The above solution of acid was placed in a flask covered with aluminum foil to exclude light. To this was added 0.017 g (0.10 mmol) of AgNO₃. After stirring for 18 h, the reaction mixture was filtered through Celite. The filtrate was washed with sat. NaHCO₃, brine, and dried over MgSO₄. Following filtration and concentration under reduced pressure, the crude product was purified by flash chromatography to afford 0.07 g (91%) of butenolide **26b** as a yellow oil. 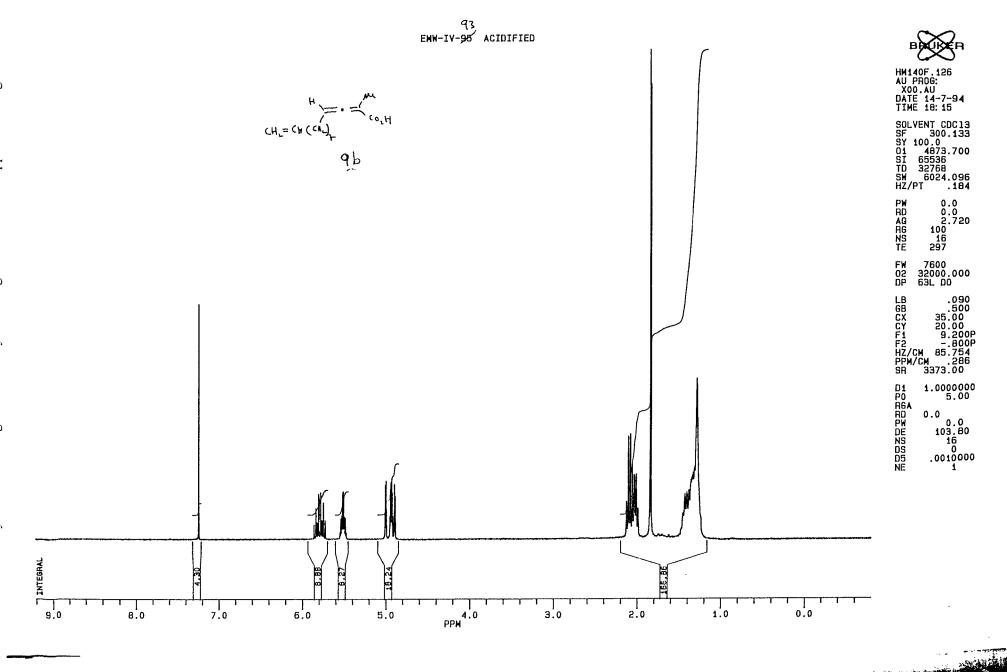

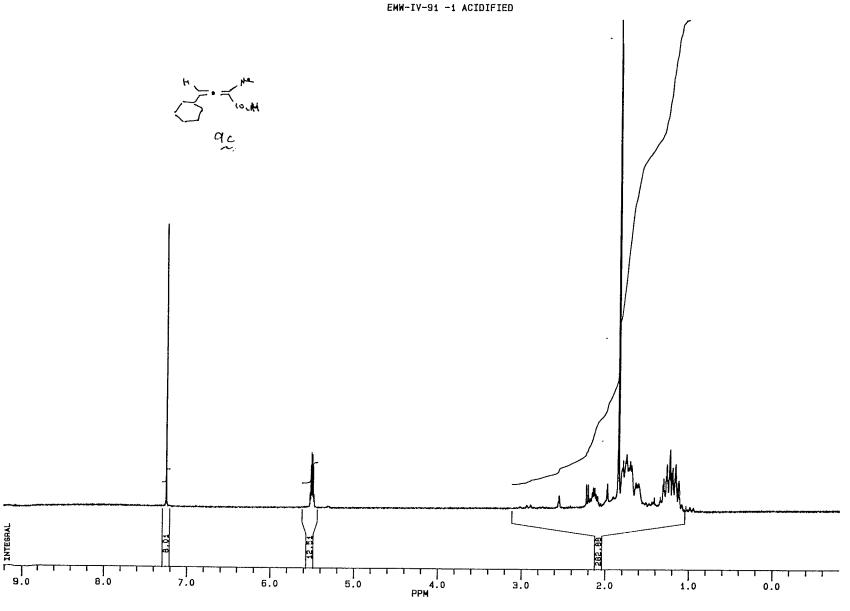

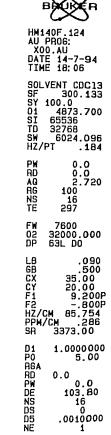

- **B. From Mesylate** (*R*)-16. In a flame dried, argon flushed flask, a solution of 2.3 mg (0.0025 mmol) of Pd₂dba₃ and 2.6 mg (0.010 mmol) of Ph₃P in 2.5 mL of THF was stirred under a stream of CO gas for ~ 2min. This Pd (0) solution was transferred by syringe to a Parr pressure reactor containing 0.16 g (0.50 mmol) of mesylate (*R*)-16 in 2.5 mL of THF, then 0.36 mL of water was added. The Parr reactor was charged with 200 psi of CO gas. After 1 h at rt, the gas was vented and the mixture was extracted with EtOAc, washed with brine (2x), and dried over MgSO₄. After filtration the solution containing the crude acid was used directly.

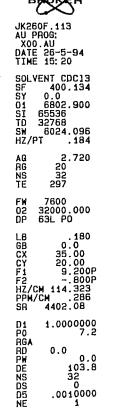
The above solution of acid was placed in a flask covered with aluminum foil to exclude light. To this was added 0.017 g (0.10 mmol) of AgNO₃. After stirring for 18 h., the reaction mixture was filtered through Celite. The filtrate was washed with sat. NaHCO₃, brine, and dried over MgSO₄. Following filtration and concentration under reduced pressure, the crude product was purified by flash chromatography to afford 0.087 g (61%) of butenolide **29** as a yellow oil. HPLC analysis on a Chiracel OB-H column showed this sample to be of 60% ee.

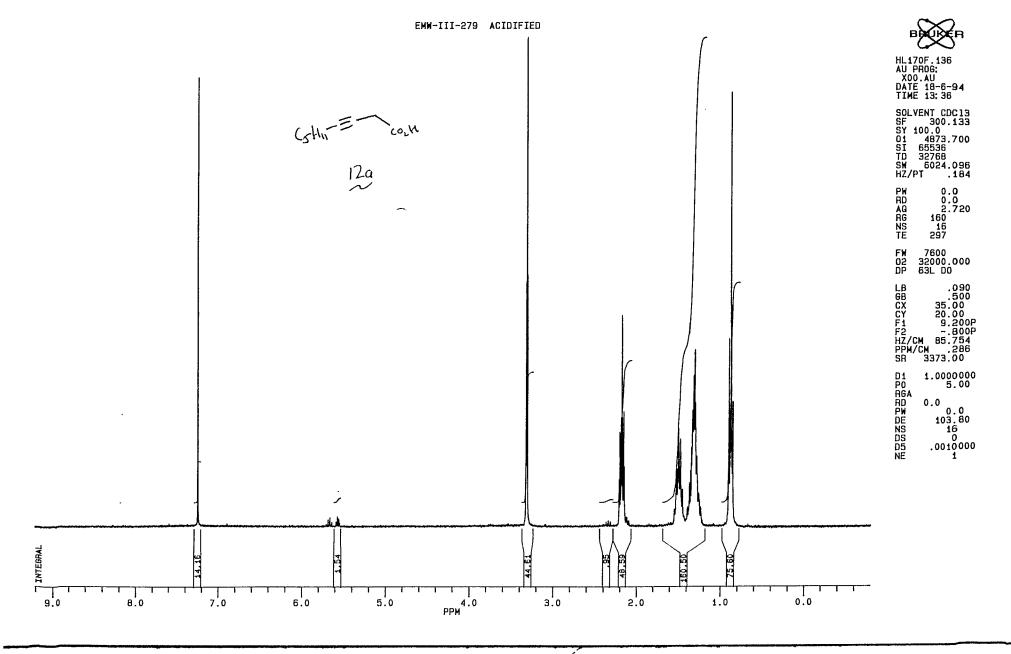


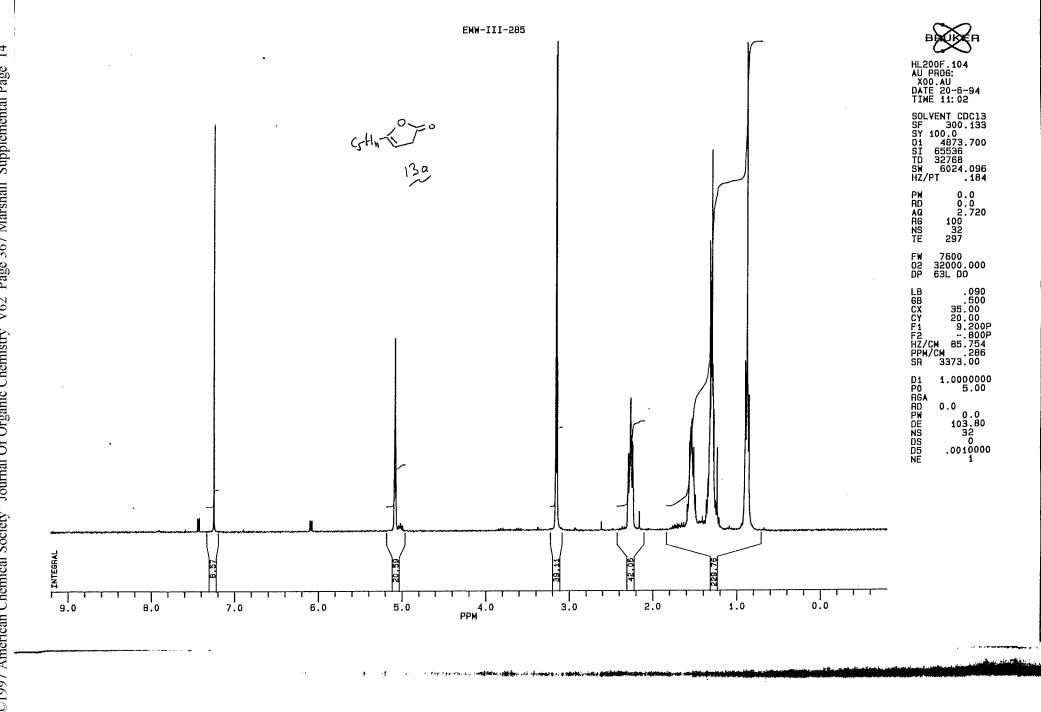


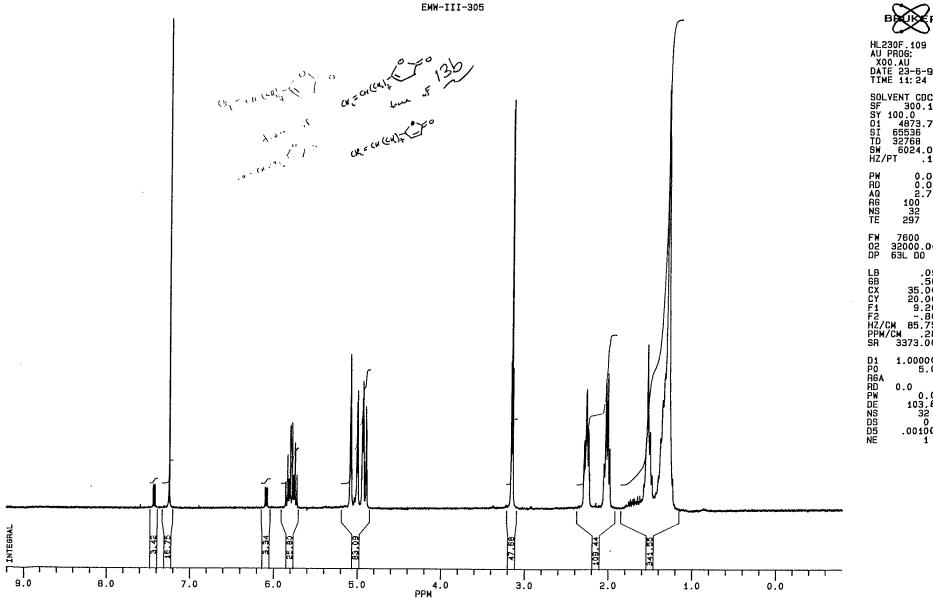


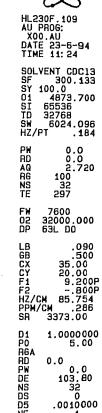
