General

Melting points were determined on a REICHERT apparatus and are uncorrected. Infrared spectra were obtained on a PERKIN-ELMER FT 1600 instrument and are reported in terms of frequency of absorption (v, cm⁻¹). ¹H NMR spectra were recorded on a BRUKER WP 200 (200 MHz), or on a BRUKER AM 400 (400 MHz) instrument. The chemical shifts are expressed in parts per million (ppm) referenced to residual chloroform (7.27 ppm). Data are reported as follows: δ , chemical shift; multiplicity (recorded as br, broad; s, singlet; d, doublet; t, triplet; q, quadruplet; hex., hexuplet; hept, heptuplet; oct, octuplet and m, multiplet), coupling constants (*J* in Hertz, Hz), and integration. ¹³C NMR spectra were recorded on the same instruments at 50.3 MHz and 100.6 MHz respectively. The chemical schifts are expressed in parts per million (ppm), reported from the central peak of deuterochloroform (77.14 ppm). Mass spectra were obtained on a HEWLETT-PACKARD HP 5989B spectrometer via either direct introduction or GC/MS coupling with a HEWLETT-PACKARD HP 5890 chromatograph. Ionization was obtained either by electronic impact (EI) or chemical ionisation with ammonia (IC, NH₃) or methane (IC, CH₄). Mass spectral data are reported as m/z. Thin Layer Chromatography (TLC) was performed on precoated plate of silica gel 60F 254 or aluminium oxide 60F 254. Flash chromatography was performed on silica gel 60, 230-400 mesh. Microanalyses were performed by the Service de Microanalyse, Institut de Chimie des Substances Naturelles, C.N.R.S., F-91198, Gif sur Yvette.

$(1E,3R^*,4S^*)$ -(4-Triethylsilyloxy-1-N,N-diisopropylcarbamoyloxy-3,5-dimethylhex-1-enylsulfanyl)benzene (\pm) -6.

To a -78°C solution of 11 g of hydroxy vinylcarbamate (\pm)-5 (42 mmol) and 12 mL of 2,6-lutidine (106 mmol, 2.5 equiv) in 100 mL of CH₂Cl₂ was added dropwise 13 mL of TESOTf (55 mmol, 1.3 equiv). The mixture was stirred for 1 h at -78°C then allowed to warm to 20°C over 1 h and partitioned between 100 mL of diethyl ether and 100 mL of saturated aqueous NH₄Cl. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x100 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography on silica gel (diethyl ether/petroleum ether 0:100 to 30:70) gave 16 g (100%) of the desired silyl ether as a colorless oil.

To a solution of 2.0 g (5.2 mmol) of the previous silyl ether, 1.6 mL (10 mmol, 2.0 equiv) of TMEDA and 4.5 g (20 mmol, 4.0 equiv) of diphenylsulfide in 20 mL of hexane at -78 °C was added dropwise 6.1 mL (10 mmol, 2.0 equiv) of a 1.7 M solution of t-BuLi in pentane. The resulting solution was stirred for 2 h at -78 °C. It was then quenched with 50 mL of a saturated aqueous NH₄Cl solution and the resulting mixture was allowed to warm to room temperature. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x50 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography on silica gel with a gradient of ether in petroleum ether (0:100, 10:90, 20:80) gave 2.3 g (90%) of sulfide (±)-6 as a colorless oil.

$(1E,3R^*,4S^*)$ -6-Benzenesulfonyl-6-N,N-diisopropylcarbamoyloxy-2,4-dimethylhex-5-en-3-ol (\pm) -7

To a solution of 1.58 g (3.2 mmol) of sulfide (\pm)-6 in 30 mL of ethanol at -10 °C was added a solution of 600 mg (0.48 mmol, 0.15 equiv) of ammoniumheptamolybdate tetrahydrate in 0.90 mL (9.6 mmol, 30 equiv) of a 33% aqueous solution of H_2O_2 . The resulting solution was then allowed to warm to room temperature and stirred for 3 h. It was quenched with a crystal of FeSO₄ and 30 mL of a saturated aqueous NH₄Cl solution, and stirred for one more hour. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x50 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and

concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography on silica gel with a gradient of ether in petroleum ether (0:100, 10:90, 20:80, 30:70, 40:60) gave 1.28 g (100%) of the desired sulfone as a colorless oil.

To 1.3 g (2.4 mmol) of the silyl ether was added 50 mL of a solution (HF/acetonitrile 5:95). The resulting solution was stirred for 3 h at room temperature and quenched with 50 mL of a saturated aqueous NaHCO₃ solution. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x50 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography on silica gel with a gradient of ether in petroleum ether (40:60, 50:50, 60:40, 70:30) gave 890 mg (89%) of alcohol (\pm)-7 as white crystals. **mp** 68 °C.

 $(2R^*,4R^*(1R^*/S^*),5R^*,6R^*)$ -4-(Benzenesulfonyl-N,N-diisopropylcarbamoyloxymethyl)-6-isopropyl-5-methyl-2-phenyl[1,3]dioxane (±)-8

To a solution of 650 mg (1.6 mmol) of vinylsulfone (\pm)-7 in 6 mL of THF at 0 °C was added 180 μ L (1.74 mmol, 1.1 equiv) of freshly distilled benzaldehyde, followed by 18 mg (0.16 mmol, 0.1 equiv) of *t*-BuOK, and the resulting solution was stirred for 15 min at 0 °C. This sequence (addition/stirring) was repeated twice and the reaction mixture was quenched with 10 mL of a saturated aqueous NH₄Cl solution. The layers were separated. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x15 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. The crude ketal (one major diastereomer > 95:5 by 1 H NMR) was purified by recrystallization from ether to give 675 mg (83%) of a single diastereomer of ketal (\pm)-8 as white crystals.

$(2R^*,4R^*,5R^*,6R^*)$ -(6-Isopropyl-5-methyl-2-phenyl[1,3]dioxan-4-yl)carbaldehyde (\pm) -9

To a solution of 130 mg (0.25 mmol) of carbamate (\pm)-8 in 2 mL of THF at room temperature was added 29 mg (0.75 mmol, 3.0 equiv) of LiAlH₄. The resulting mixture was stirred at reflux for 1 h. It was then quenched with 10 mL of a saturated aqueous potassium/sodium tartrate solution and diluted with 10 mL of ether. The resulting mixture was stirred until the organic phase became clear. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x10 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography on silica gel with a gradient of ether in petroleum ether (20:80, 30:70, 40:60, 50:50) gave 51 mg (81%) of the desired alcohol as a colorless oil.

To a solution of 152 mg (0.53 mmol, 1.5 equiv) of IBX in 1 mL of DMSO (dissolved for 20 min) was added a solution of 90 mg (0.35 mmol) of the alcohol in 1 mL of THF. The resulting mixture was stirred for 3 h at room temperature. The same amount of IBX was added and the reaction mixture was stirred for an additional 3 h. It was then diluted with 10 mL of water and the white precipitate was filtered (rinsed several times with ether). The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x10 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography on silica gel with a gradient of ether in petroleum ether (30:70, 40:60, 50:50) gave 64 mg (74%) of aldehyde (\pm)-9 as white crystals.

(1E,3R,4R,6R)-(6-Benzyloxy-1-N,N-diisopropylcarbamoyloxy-4-triethylsilyloxy-3-methylnona-1,8-dienylsulfanyl)benzene 15

To a solution of 760 mg (1.9 mmol) of vinylcarbamates **14** and **14dia** and 440 μ L (3.8 mmol, 2.0 equiv) of 2,6-lutidine in 10 mL of CH₂Cl₂ at -78°C was added dropwise 510 μ L (2.2 mmol, 1.2 equiv) of triethylsilyl trifluoromethanesulfonate. The resulting solution was stirred for 1 h at -78°C and was allowed to warm to room temperature over one more hour. It was then quenched with 10 mL of a saturated aqueous NH₄Cl solution. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x10 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography on silica gel with a gradient of ether in petroleum ether (0:100, 10:90, 20:80) gave 832 mg (86%) of two inseparable diastereomers in a 1:1 ratio of the desired silylated vinyl carbamate as a colorless oil.

To a solution of 535 mg (1.0 mmol) of the previous carbamates, 310 μ L (2.1 mmol, 2.0 equiv) of TMEDA and 900 mg (4.0 mmol, 4.0 equiv) of diphenylsulfide in 5 mL of hexane at -78°C was added dropwise 1.2 mL (2.0 mmol, 2.0 equiv) of a 1.7 M solution of *t*-BuLi in pentane. The resulting solution was stirred for 2 h at -78°C. It was then quenched with 10 mL of a saturated aqueous NH₄Cl solution and the resulting mixture was allowed to warm to room temperature. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x10 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. (1E,3R,4R,6R)-(1-Benzenesulfonyl-6-benzyloxy-1-N,N-diisopropylcarbamoyloxy-3-methyl nona-1,8-dien-4-ol 16

To a solution of 573 mg (0.9 mmol) of sulfide **15** in 5 mL of ethanol at -10°C was added 210 mg (0.14 mmol, 0.15 equiv) of ammoniumheptamolybdate tetrahydrate and 130 μ L (2.7 mmol, 3 equiv) of a 33% aqueous H_2O_2 solution. The resulting solution was then allowed to warm to room temperature and stirred for 18 h. It was quenched with 10 mL of a saturated aqueous NH_4Cl solution. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x10 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous $MgSO_4$, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. To a solution of 312 mg (0.55 mmol) of vinylsulfone **16** in 2 mL of THF at 0°C was added 70 μ L (0.65 mmol, 1.2 equiv) of freshly distilled benzaldehyde, followed by 6 mg (0.06 mmol, 0.1 equiv) of *t*-BuOK, and the resulting solution was stirred for 15 min at 0°C. This sequence (addition/stirring) was repeated twice. The reaction mixture was quenched with 10 mL of a saturated aqueous NH₄Cl solution and diluted with Et₂O. The layers were separated. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x10 mL of Et₂O. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. To a solution of 256 mg (0.39 mmol) of carbamate 17 in 2 mL of THF at room temperature was added 45 mg (1.2 mmol, 3.0 equiv) of LiAlH₄. The resulting mixture was stirred at reflux for 1 h. It was then quenched with 10 mL of a saturated aqueous potassium/sodium tartrate solution and diluted with 10 mL of ether. The resulting mixture was stirred until the organic phase became clear. The aqueous phase was extracted with 3x10 mL of ether. The combined organic layers were washed with brine, dried over anhydrous MgSO₄, filtered and concentrated *in vacuo*. Purification by flash chromatography on silica gel with a gradient of ether in petroleum ether (40:60, 50:50, 60:40, 70:30) gave 121 mg (80%) of the desired alcohol as a colorless oil.
