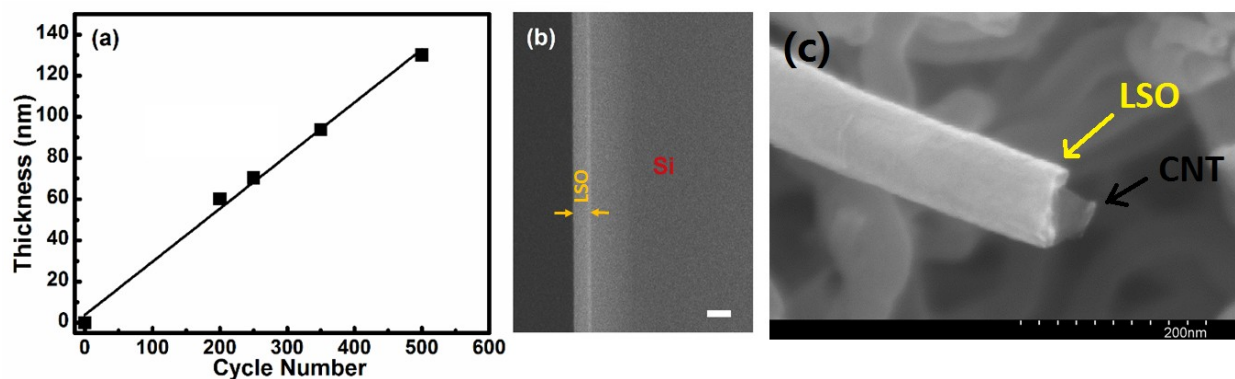

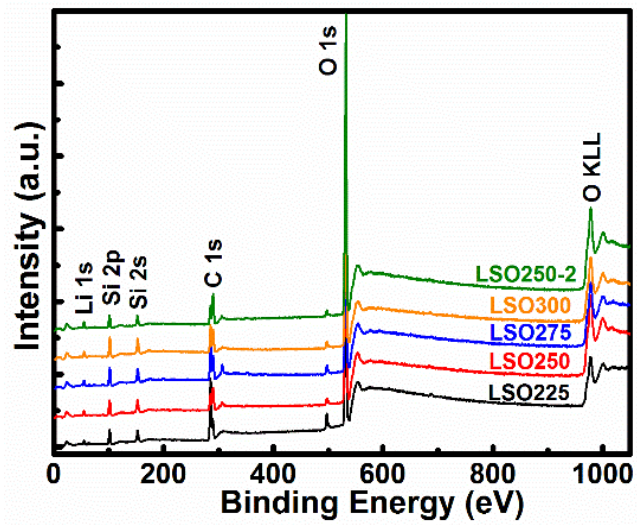


Figure S2. XPS survey of lithium silicate thin films deposited on carbon nanotubes (CNTs).
