

Supplemental Material S3. Participant's script characteristics.

All scripts were balanced based on the following parameters: total number of sentences, number of words in sentences, average words per sentence, average syllables per word, number of complex words (i.e., defined as number of words with three or more syllables that are not proper nouns, a combination of simple or hyphenated words, or two-syllable verbs made into three-syllables with the addition of *-es* or *-ed* endings), mean length of utterance in morphemes, ease of readability using a Flesch Kincaid Reading Ease score (Flesch, 1948), number of verb phrases, number of clauses, number of T-units, number of dependent clauses, number of complex T-units, number of coordinate phrases, number of complex nominals, number of clauses per sentence, number of verb phrases per T-unit, number of dependent clauses per T-unit, and complex T-unit ratio (Ai & Lu, 2013; Lu, 2010, 2011; Lu & Ai, 2015).
