Samples started within 5 lines of the end of the reliability portion so as to begin at a new topic or topic shift to aid the reader; except for P7's conversation, which is provided from the beginning of the reliability portion to demonstrate coding for CIUs (the required sample of 300-400 CIUs occurred entirely within the reliability portion). For P8, 84 lines are provided in her conversation sample because of her limited verbalizations. Coding is always conducted while watching video recordings. Coders also watched each conversation from the beginning of the recording not the beginning of the transcription which occurs approximately two minutes later. Coders made coding decisions based on all material available (i.e., the transcript, the videorecording, context, etc.). Coding may at times be difficult to interpret without this context used by the coders.
