Each column represents one participant in each group (OA group and SCD group). Each row represents a question that each participant was asked regarding their perceptions of their own cognitive abilities, actions they have taken regarding their concern (e.g., speaking to family/friends), and each individual's MoCA scores. Cells marked 'x' indicate where the participant expressed that they had concerns. Cells marked '<' (less than) and '>' (more than) relate to the amount of time they have felt concerned. The rows marked 'Screening' are how they responded when first screened for eligibility in the study and the rows marked 'SCD Questionnaire' are their responses on the full questionnaire completed during the Assessment Session.
