## 1. What is CWYW?

The effects of humans on biodiversity and landscapes have been widely recognized. As the human population continues to increase, demands on natural resources grow larger; few places on Earth are unaffected by human a **(Bearer, et al., 2008)**. Even many nature reserves, or "protected areas", are not well protected from human interference. Nature reserves are a traditional approach to biodiversity conservation, but their effectiveness is limited by increasing human pressures.(Figure 1)<sup>↵</sup>

The objective to protect wildlife and other species is often in serious conflict with the needs for socioeconomic development by local re **(Christiansen, 2008)**. Although increase in human population pressure has been recognized as a major threat to environmental protection and biodiversity conservation , the mechanisms underlying complex interactions between population and environment or population and biodiversity are largely unknown **(Wildt, 2006)**.

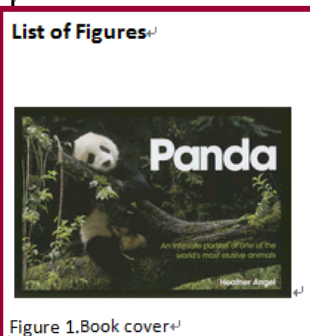
