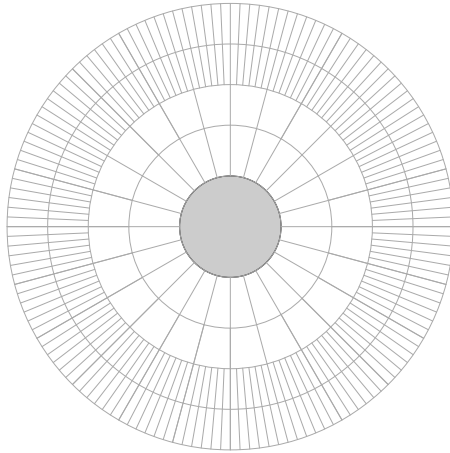

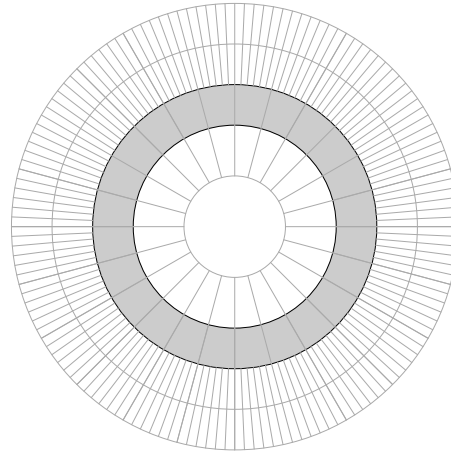

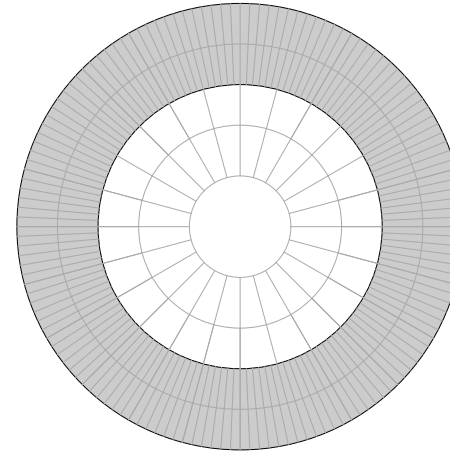

LINKS BETWEEN ASPECTS



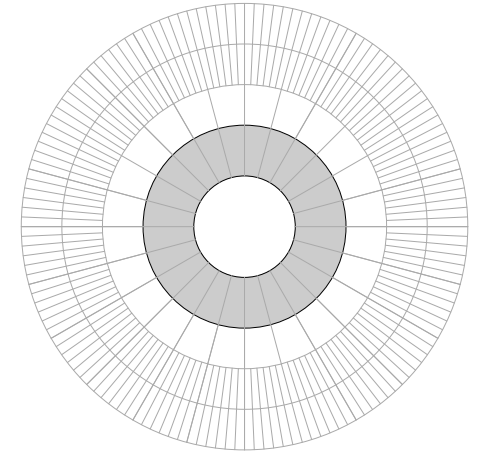
ZONE 1:
PRIMARY AND SECONDARY ASPECTS



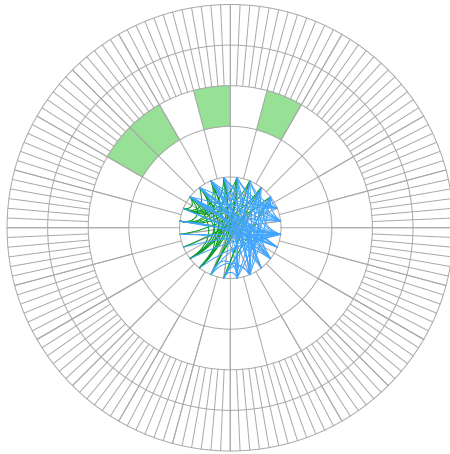
ZONE 2:
IMPACT OF ASPECTS



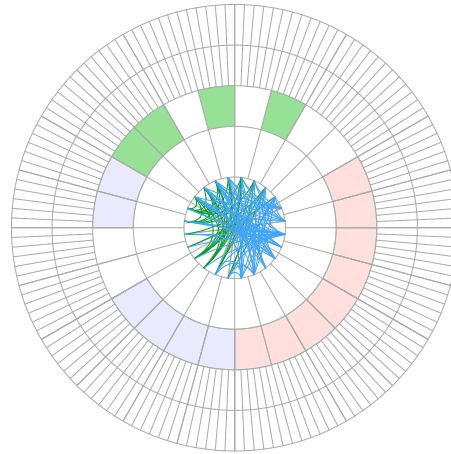
ZONE 0:
MISSING ASPECTS



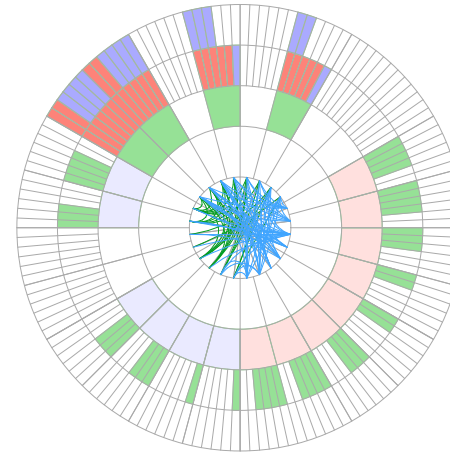
STEPS for
Transparency Assessment Framework (TAF)



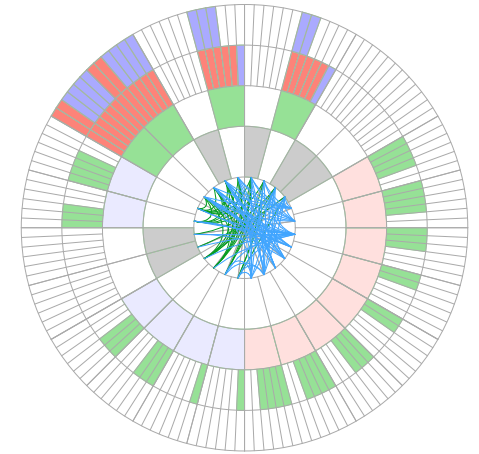
STEP 1:
Mark your primary aspects in Zone 1



STEP 2:
Using the links in the centre, mark the connected (secondary) aspects in Zone 1. Distinguish primary and secondary aspects with colour or hatching. This step shows the primary impact (aspects covered).



STEP 3:
Go through the primary aspects and mark their links with other aspects in Zone 2. Give two marks for each link (each aspect gets one mark). Distinguish the type of links (Spatial, Semantic, Technical) with colour or hatching. This step shows the overall impact of the project (aspects covered + weighting).



STEP 4:
Mark the missing aspects in Zone 0. This step shows the uncovered areas of the project.
