

Task Force Description:

There has been increasing demand from the community for guidelines on implementing ORCID in book publishing workflows. During 2016, publishers, including Springer Nature and Cambridge University Press, started integrating ORCID in their books systems. Representatives from those organizations and other publishers (small and large) and service providers, volunteered for an ORCID-facilitated community working group to draft a set of best practice recommendations. We worked with a consultant who has expertise in all aspects of book publishing to survey and interview representatives from the books community, and write a summary report on ORCID in book workflows. In July 2017, the working group released its [recommendations](#) for ORCID to encourage ORCID implementation for books.
