

Table S1. Patient questionnaire for standardized allergy history assessment

Question number	Item	Response (verbal questionnaire)
1	What medication allergies do you have?	
2	What reaction(s) occurred when you took the stated medication?	
3	How many doses of medication did you take or receive prior to having the reaction?	
4	When did you take this medication and have this reaction (i.e. how much time has passed since you experienced this reaction with this medication)?	

Appendix:

The criteria of Sampson et al were utilized to classify reactions consistent with anaphylaxis. One of the following three criteria classified a reaction as anaphylactic:

- Acute onset of an illness (minutes to several hours) with involvement of the skin, mucosal tissue, or both *AND AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING*
 - Respiratory compromise
 - Reduced BP or associated symptoms of end-organ dysfunction
- Two or more of the following that occur rapidly after exposure to a likely allergen for that patient (minutes to several hours)
 - Involvement of the skin-mucosal tissue
 - Respiratory compromise
 - Reduced BP or associated symptoms
 - Persistent gastrointestinal symptoms
- Reduced BP after exposure to known allergen for that patient (minutes to several hours)
 - Systolic BP of less than 90 mm Hg or greater than 30% decrease from that person's baseline
