Figure 1: Sketch of participant water practices for the story-map narrative

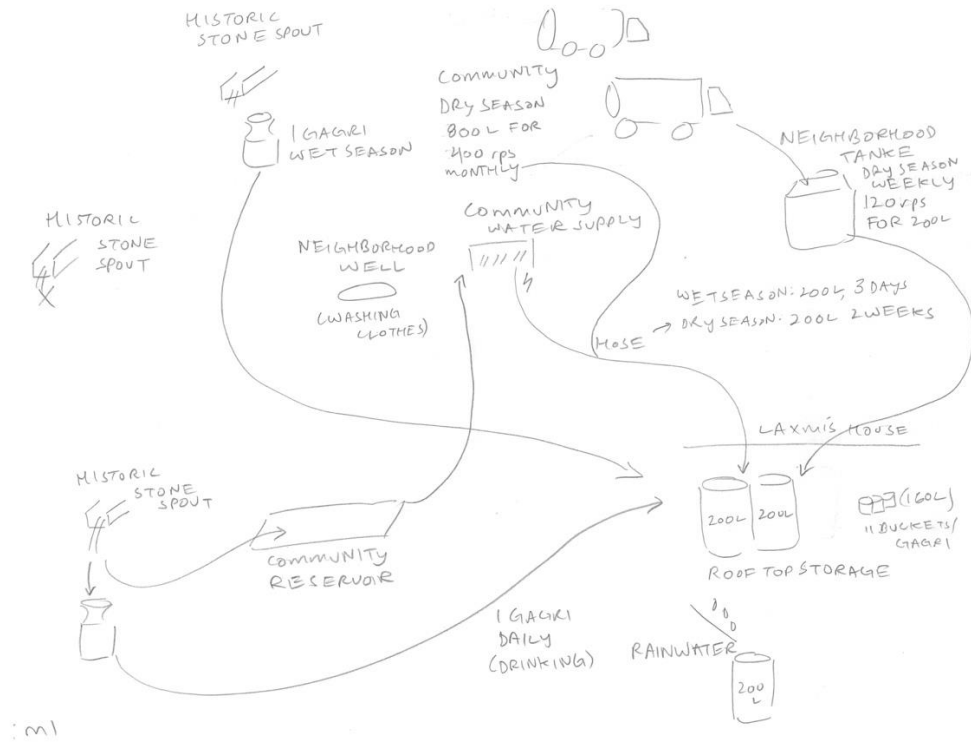


Figure 2: Introduction to a participant's story-map narrative

Figure 3: Narrative section about a participant's water situation during the research period

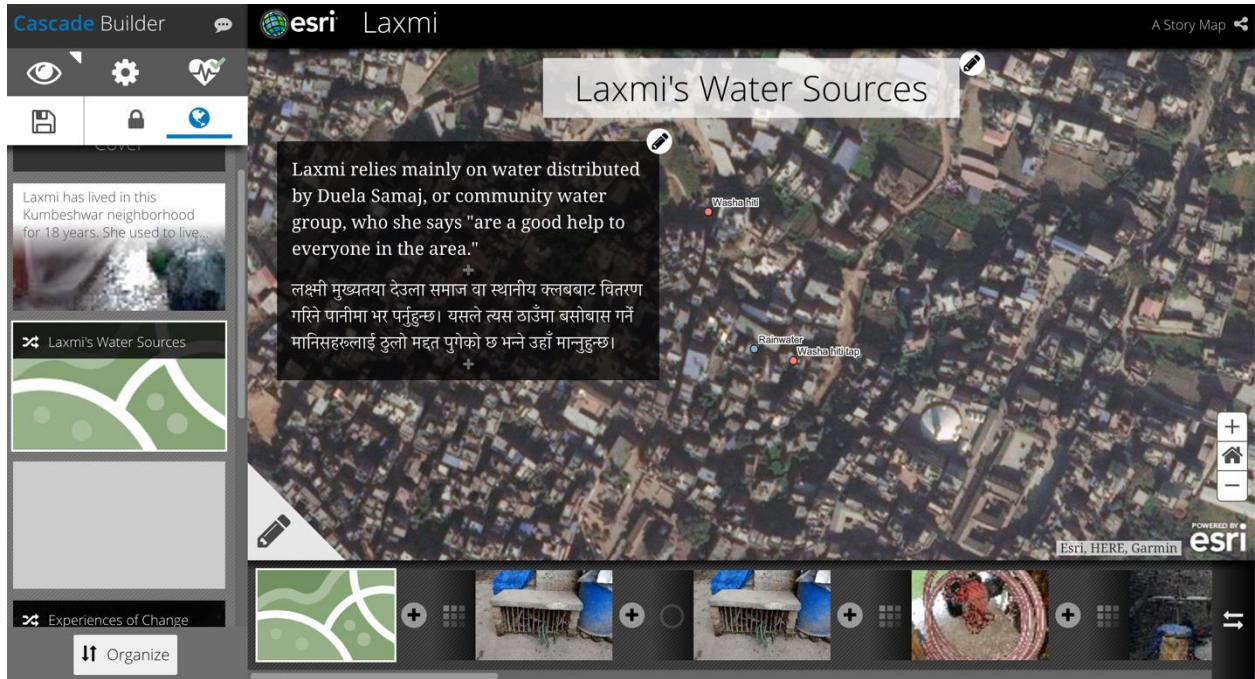


Figure 4: Narrative section about a participant's experiences of change
