

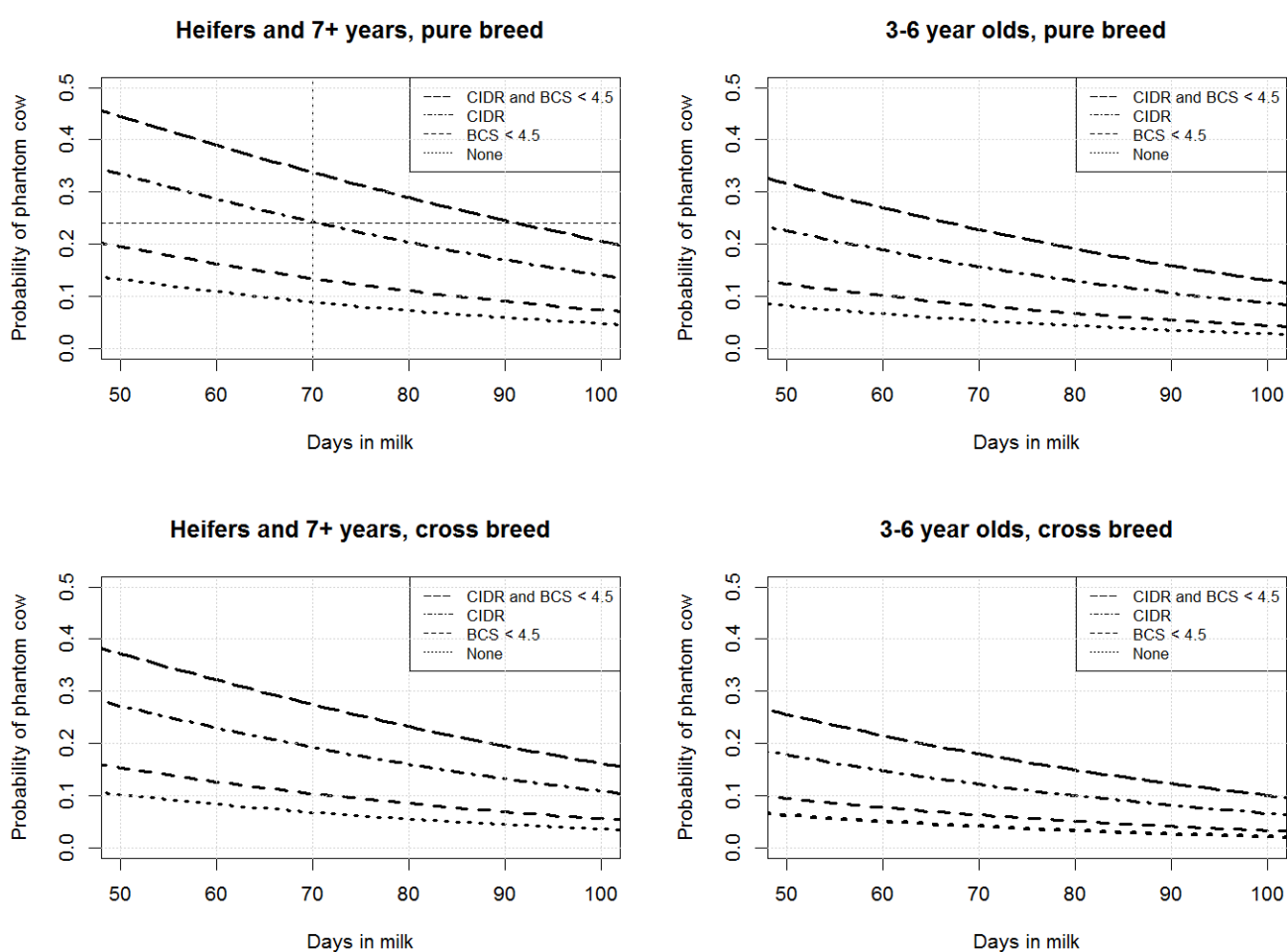

CIDR=cows treated with a CIDR device prior to, or at the start of mating; BCS <4.5=cows with BCS <4.5 at the start of mating; None=cows that were not treated with a CIDR device and had a BCS \geq 4.5 at the start of mating; pure breed=cow that is >13/16
