Enantioselective Radical Addition/trapping Reactions with α,β -Disubstituted Unsaturated Imides. Synthesis of *anti*-Propionate Aldols

General: Dichloromethane was distilled from calcium hydride under nitrogen prior to use. Tetrahydrofuran was distilled from sodium benzophenone ketyl under nitrogen. Magnesium perchlorate, Magnesium iodide and Magnesium triflimide were purchased from Aldrich chemicals. Cyclopropyl bisoxazoline ligand {3aS-[2(3'aR, 8'aS), 3aa, 8aa]}-2,2'-(cyclopropylidene)-bis{3a,8a-dihydro-8H-indeno[1,2d]-oxazole} was prepared according to literature procedure. Flash chromatography was performed using EM Science silica gel 60 (230-400 mesh). All glassware was oven dried, assembled hot and cooled under a stream of nitrogen before use. Reactions with air sensitive materials were carried out by standard syringe techniques.

Melting points were measured with a Fisher-Johns melting points apparatus and are uncorrected ¹H-NMR were recorded on a Varian Unity/Inova-500 NB (500 MHz) or Varian Unity/Inova-400 NB (400 MHz). Chemical shifts are reported in parts per million (ppm) down filed from TMS, using residual CDCl₃ (7.27 ppm) as an internal standard. Data are reported as follows: Chemical shift, multiplicity (s = singlet, d = doublet, t = triplet, q = quartet, m = multiplet), coupling constant and integration. ¹³C-NMR was recorded in a Varian Unity/Inova-500 NB (125 MHz) or Varian Unity/Inova-400 NB (100 MHz) spectrometers, using broadband proton decoupling. Chemical shifts are reported in parts per million (ppm) downfield from TMS, using the middle resonance of CDCl₃ (77.0) as an internal standard. HPLC analyses were carried out on Waters 515 HPLC pump and a 2487 dual λ absorbance detector connected to a PC with Millennium workstation. GC analyses were performed on a Hewlett Packard 5890 Series II gas chromatograph using helium as carrier gas. Rotation were recorded on a JASCO-DIP-370

instrument. High Resolution Mass Spectra (HRMS) (EI+) were obtained from Mass Spectrometry Laboratory, Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio.

General procedure for the synthesis of α,β -unsaturated imides:

To a cold solution of α,β -unsaturated acid (11.0 mmol) in 15 mL of dichloromethane at 0 °C, under nitrogen, oxalyl chloride (12.1 mmol) was added drop wise followed by addition of a drop of DMF. The mixture was stirred at 0 °C for 10 min, and at room temperature for two hours. The solvent and excess of oxalyl chloride were removed *in vacuo* to give crude chloride which was further used without purification.

In a separate flask, 11.0 mmol of carboxamide was dissolved in 46 mL of dry THF, and obtained solution was cooled at 0 °C, under nitrogen. This was followed by portion wise addition of sodium hydride (22.0 mmol, 60% dispersion in mineral oil). The mixture was stirred at 0 °C for 10 min, and at room temperature for 45 min. The reaction was cooled at 0 °C, and a solution of prepared chloride (11.0 mmol) in 10 mL of dry THF was added drop wise. The reaction mixture was stirred at 0 °C for 10 min and at room temperature for 4 hours. After completion of reaction, it was quenched by the addition of 10 ml of 1.5 M hydrochloric acid, and diluted with ethyl acetate (200 mL). The organic phase was separated, washed successively with saturated aqueous sodium bicarbonate, brine and dried with anhydrous magnesium sulfate. The solvent was removed *in vacuo*, and the residue was purified by silica gel chromatography.

General procedure for enantioselective reductive alkyl radical additions to α,β -disubstituted imides:

Chiral ligand (0.062 mmol) and corresponding Lewis acid (0.06 mmol) in 1.0 mL of dichloromethane were stirred vigorously at room temperature for 45 min, and cooled at -78 °C. The α , β -unsaturated imide (0.2 mmol) was added to the cold reaction mixture as a solution in 1.0 mL of dichloromethane, and obtained mixture was stirred at -78 °C for 30 min before initiation. The reaction was initiated by sequential addition of alkyl halide (1.0 mmol), tributyltin hydride (0.4 mmol), triethylborane (0.6 mmol) and oxygen. The reaction was monitored by TLC, and after completion was quenched by silica gel, evaporated, washed with hexanes, toluene and extracted with 20% ethyl acetate in hexanes. The crude product was purified by silica gel chromatography. Racemic standards were prepared using Yb(OTf)₃ as a Lewis acid in the absence of a chiral ligand and methylene chloride:tetrahydrofuran (2:1) as a solvent.

General procedure for selective methanolysis of imides:¹

To a solution of product-imide (0.55 mmol) in 10.0 ml of dry methanol Amberlyst 15 (2.90 g) was added, and obtained mixture was heated at 80 °C. The reaction was monitored by TLC, and after completion was cooled at room temperature. The cold mixture was filtered and Amberlyst 15 was washed with dichloromethane (5 x 15 mL). The combined organics were evaporated to give crude amide. The crude product was purified by silica gel chromatography.

alkyl radical addition reaction using Mg(NTf₂)₂ as Lewis acid, cyclopropyl (1*S*, 2*R*)-indabox **7** and *tert*-butyl iodide. The product was obtained as a white crystalline solid in 69% yield, as a mixture of two diastereomers in ratio 97:3 according to 1 H-NMR. Assay of enantiomeric excess. Product enantiomeric excess was determined by two step conversion to N-(2,3,4,4-tetramethylpentanoyl)-benzamide **5c**. The imide **5a** was selectively methanolyzed, according to the general procedure, to give 2,3,4,4-tetramethylpentamide **5a'** in 83% yield, as a white crystalline solid. 1 H-NMR (400 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 0.91 (s, 9H), 0.99 (d, J = 7.6 Hz, 3H), 1.18 (d, J = 6.8 Hz, 3H), 1.33 (qd, J = 7.2, 3.6 Hz, 1H), 2.49 (qd, J = 6.8, 3.6 Hz, 1H), 5.30-5.70 (m, 2H); 13 C-NMR (100 MHz, CDCl₃) δ 179.1, 47.8, 41.3, 34.2, 28.3, 19.7, 11.2. Amide **5a'** was converted to N-(2,3,4,4-tetramethylpentanoyl)-benzamide **5c**, according to the general procedure for imide synthesis in 45% yield, whose 1 H and 13 C spectra are same as for imide **5c**. Enantiomeric excess (69%) was determined by chiral HPLC analysis under same conditions as for imide **5c** (chiralcel AD column (0.46 cm x 25 cm)(from Daicel Chemical Ind., Ltd.), solvent Hexanes: Isopropanol = 99 : 1, flow rate 0.5 mL/min; $t_{r \text{ (major)}} = 24.0 \text{ min}, t_{r \text{ (minor)}} = 34.5 \text{ min}$).

N-(2,3,4,4-Tetramethylpentanoyl)-cyclohexanecarboxamide (5b). Prepared according to the general procedure for enantioselective alkyl radical addition reaction using

Mg(NTf₂)₂ as Lewis acid, cyclopropyl (1*S*, 2*R*)-inda-box **7** and tert-butyl iodide. The product was obtained as a white crystalline solid in 67% yield, as a mixture of two diastereomers in ratio 98:2 according to 1 H-NMR. m.p. = 139-140 °C. N-(2,3,4,4-Tetramethylpentanoyl)-trimethylacetamide (5d).

Obtained according to the general procedure for enantioselective alkyl radical addition reaction using MgI₂ as a Lewis acid, cyclopropyl (1S, 2R)-inda-box 7 and tert-butyl iodide. Assay of enantiomeric excess. Product enantiomeric excess was determined by two step conversion to N-(2,3,4,4-tetramethylpentanoyl)-benzamide 5c. The imide 5d was selectively methanolyzed, according to the general procedure, to give 2,3,4,4tetramethylpentamide **5a**' in 78% yield, as a white crystalline solid.

Amide 5a' was converted to N-(2,3,4,4-tetramethylpentanoyl)-benzamide 5c, according to the general procedure for imide synthesis in 41% yield, which ¹H and ¹³C spectra are same as for imide **5c**. m. p. = 136-137 °C. $[\alpha]_D = +12.8^\circ$ (c 1.0, CHCl₃). Enantiomeric excess (94%) was determined by chiral HPLC analysis under same conditions as for imide 5c (chiralcel AD column (0.46 cm x 25 cm)(from Daicel Chemical Ind., Ltd.), solvent Hexanes:Isopropanol = 99:1, flow rate 0.5 mL/min; $t_{\text{r (major)}}$ = 24.0 min, $t_{\text{r (minor)}}$ = 34.5 min).

The same value for enantiomeric excess was obtained by direct analysis of N-(2,3,4,4tetramethylpentanoyl)-trimethylacetamide 5c, by chiral GC analysis (BETA DEXTM 120 Capillary Column; oven temp = 90 °C, flow rate = 15.7 mL/min, $t_{\text{r (major)}} = 35.2 \text{ min}$, $t_{\text{r (minor)}} = 31.9 \text{ min}$).

N-(2,3,4,4-Tetramethylpentanoyl)-benzamide (5c). Prepared according to the general procedure for enantioselective alkyl radical addition reaction using Mg(ClO₄)₂ as Lewis acid, cyclopropyl (1*S*, 2*R*)-inda-box 7 as a chiral ligand and *tert*-butyl iodide. The product was obtained as a white crystalline solid in 78% yield, as a separable mixture of two diastereomers in ratio 98:2 according to 1 H-NMR. N-(2,3-Dimethylpentanoyl)-trimethylacetamide (5e and 6e). Prepared according to the general procedure for enantioselective alkyl radical addition reaction using MgI₂ as Lewis acid, cyclopropyl (1*S*, 2*R*)-inda-box **7** as a chiral ligand and ethyl iodide. The product was obtained as a white crystalline solid in 63% yield, as an inseparable mixture of two diastereomers in ratio 87:13 according to 1 H-NMR. The *anti* diastereomer can be obtained as a pure compound by careful chromatography. Major *anti* **5e**: m.p. = 87-88 $^{\circ}$ C. Assay of enantiomeric excess. Enantiomeric excess of major diastereomer **5e** (92%) was determined by two step conversion to N-(2,3-dimethylpentanoyl)-benzamide. The product was methanolyzed according to the general procedure. The amide 2,3-dimethylpentanoylamide **5e**, was obtained as a white crystalline solid in 61% yield as a mixture of two diastereomers in the same ratio 87:13. Major *anti* amide **5e**; m.p. = 111-112 °C. A solution of 3-bromomethacryloyl chloride (taken directly from the previous reaction) was added via syringe at room temperature and the mixture stirred for 4 hours. The reaction was quenched with approximately 5 mL of water and the THF was removed using a rotary evaporator. The concentrated mixture was then extracted with EtOAc (3 x 60 mL). The extracts were combined, washed with water (2 x 20 mL) and 1 M NaOH (2 x 20 mL), dried over MgSO₄ and concentrated. 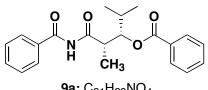
Synthesis of 8.

Under N_2 , to a flask containing **10** (2.0 g, 7.5 mmol) and benzoic acid (1.1 g, 9.0 mmol) in 15 mL of methylene chloride, was added N-methylmorpholine (NMM) (1.7 mL, 15 mmol) via syringe. The reaction was stirred for 48 hours at room temperature. The reaction was then washed with water (2 x 10 mL) and 1 M NaOH (2 x 10 mL), dried over MgSO₄ and concentrated. Representative experimental procedure for chiral Lewis acid catalyzed conjugate addition of radicals to alkoxy enoates. Under N_2 , a mixture of Lewis acid (0.045 mmol) and ligand (0.045 mmol) in CH_2Cl_2 (1.5 mL) was stirred at rt for 45 min. Imide (8) (0.15 mmol) (dissolved in 1 mL CH_2Cl_2) was added and the mixture was allowed to stir for an additional 30 min and then cooled to -78 °C. The reaction was then initiated by sequential addition of 2-iodo propane (or other radical precursors = RX) (1.5 mmol), n-Bu₃SnH (0.45 mmol), Et₃B (0.45 mmol 1 M solution in hexanes) and oxygen (introduced via syringe). The reaction was monitored by TLC (30% EtOAc in hexane) and when judged complete was quenched with silica gel, concentrated, washed with hexanes and extracted with ether. The ether extract was concentrated over silica gel and purified by silica gel chromatography (hexane-ethyl acetate) to give the products (9a-c). The reaction procedure for standard racemic reactions is the same as above with the following modification. Racemic standards were prepared using Yb(OTf)₃ as a Lewis acid in the absence of a chiral ligand and methylene chloride:tetrahydrofuran (2:1) as a solvent.

Stereochemical analysis:

The relative and absolute stereochemistry was assigned by converting known acid $(11)^6$ into the radical product (9a). It was found that the product from the propionate aldol radical reaction (9a) contained *anti-*(2S,3S)stereochemistry (see below).

Under N_2 , to a flask containing (2R,3R)-3-Hydroxy-2,4-dimethylpentanoic acid⁶ (11) (190 mg, 1.3 mmol), was added oxalyl chloride (0.18 mL, 0.20 mmol). After complete addition, 1 drop of DMF was added and the reaction was allowed to stir at room temperature for three hours.

To another flask containing benzamide (315 mg, 2.6 mmol) and THF (5 mL), was added

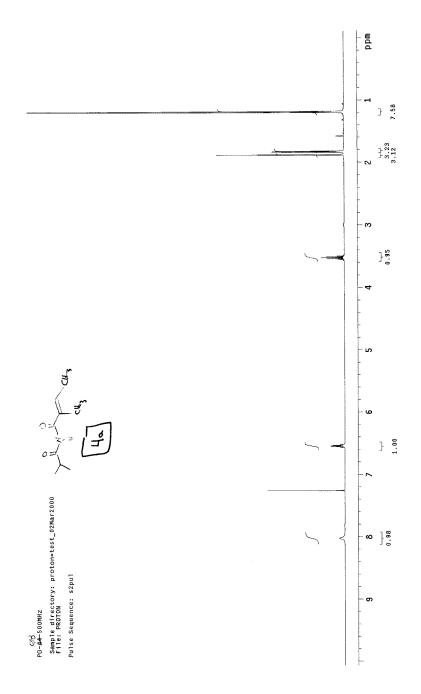
