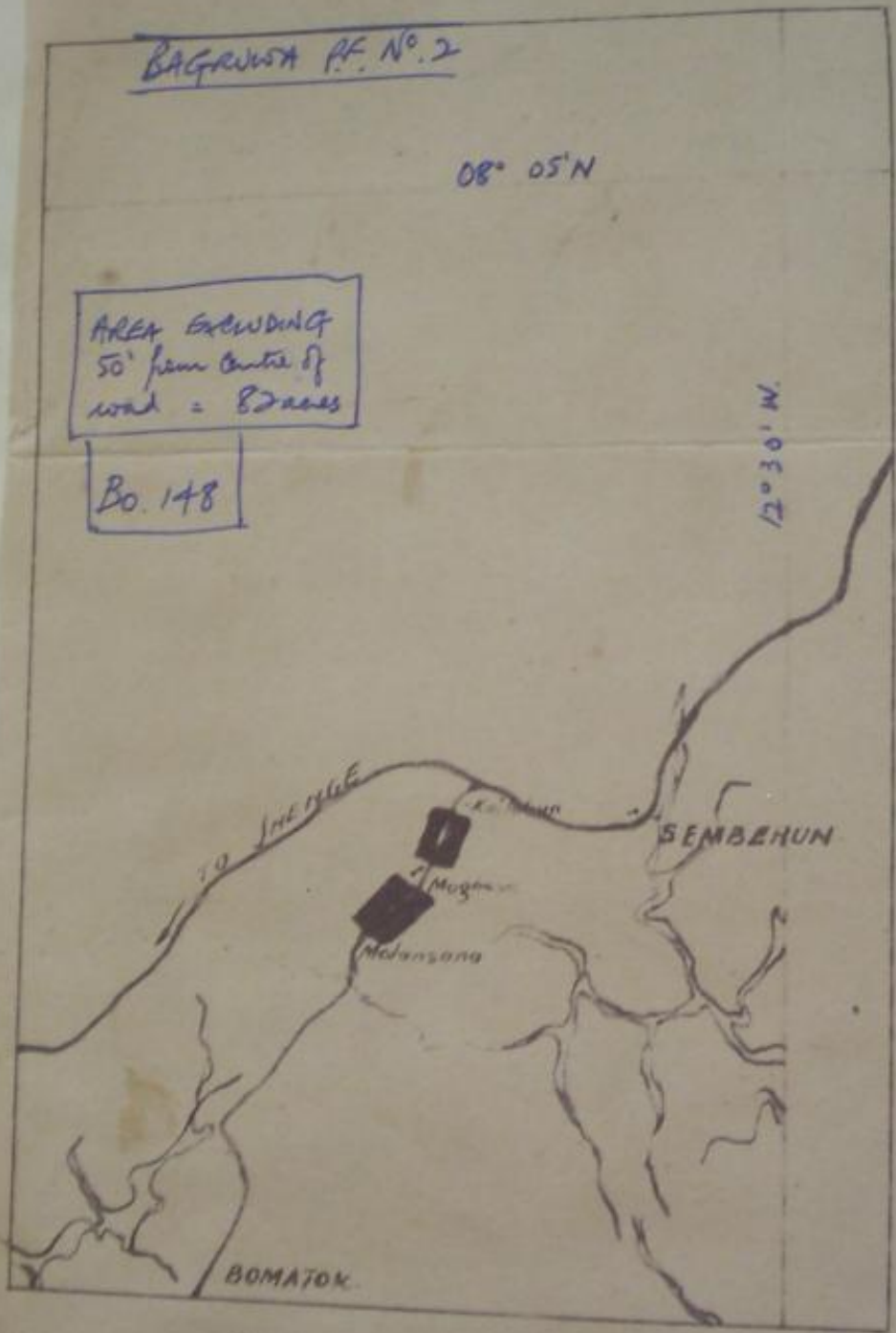

*THE FORESTRY ORDINANCE*  
(Cap. 86)

THE FORESTRY (BAGRUWA PROTECTED FOREST NO. 2)  
ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1960

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by section 14 of the Forestry Ordinance, the following Order is hereby made at the request of the Tribal Authority of the Bagruwa Chiefdom, Moyamba District, South-western Province:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Bagruwa Protected Forest No. 2) Order in Council, 1960.

2. The lands described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby constituted a Protected Forest within the meaning of the Forestry Ordinance.

SCHEDULE

ALL THAT LAND comprising 82 acres or thereabouts lying within 220 feet on either side from the centre of the motor road from Sembahun to Bomatok in the Bagruwa Chiefdom in the Moyamba District of the South-western Province of the Protectorate of Sierra Leone, starting at about 4,300 feet from Mokagbanda Junction and ending at about 12,900 feet along the road from the start of the Protected Forest provided that the following areas shall be excluded from the Protected Forest—

- (i) all that land lying within 50 feet on either side of the centre of the road;
- (ii) all that land on both sides of the road and lying between about 6,250 feet and 8,600 feet from the start of the Protected Forest which includes Moyakemu Swamp and Mogbese Village;
- (iii) all that land on the right hand side of the road and lying between about 12,076 feet and 12,250 feet from the start of the Protected Forest which includes an unnamed Swamp.

As the same is illustrated on Forest Department Plan No. B. 148 and shown thereon verged GREEN.

NOTE.—All distances along the motor road given above are measured along the centre of the said road in the direction Sembahun-Bomatok.

BAFI AND SEWA RIVERS.

O. S. C.  
27 of 1923.

1. This Order may be cited as the Bafi and Sewa Rivers Protected Forest Order.

2. The following lands in the Konno District of the Protectorate shall be, and the same are hereby constituted, protected forest within the meaning of the Forestry Ordinance, namely

(a) All the lands in the Nimmi Yemma Chieftdom to the extent of a quarter of a mile from each side of the Sewa River throughout the length of the said river in the said chieftdom, and all the land to the extent of a quarter of a mile from the left or south side of the Bafi River throughout the length of the said river in the said chieftdom.

(b) All the land in the Nimmi Korro Chieftdom to the extent of a quarter of a mile from the left or south side of the Bafi River throughout the length of the said river in the said chieftdom.

(c) All the land in the Kamara Chieftdom to the extent of a quarter of a mile from the left or south side of the Bafi River throughout the length of the said river in the said chieftdom.

(d) All the land in the Sando Chieftdom to the extent of a quarter of a mile from the right side of the Bafi River from the point where the road from Yeladu to Fwangb crosses the said river to its junction with the Sewa River.

(e) All the land in the Sando Chieftdom to the extent of a quarter of a mile from the left side of the Bafi River throughout the length of the said river in the said chieftdom.

(f) All the land in the Sando Chieftdom to the extent of a quarter of a mile from both sides of the Sewa River throughout the length of the said river in the said chieftdom.

This Order does not curtail any existing ferry or fishing rights enjoyed by the natives.
