THE FORESTRY ORDINANCE
(Cap. 86)

THE FORESTRY (BOMBALI SEBORA PROTECTED FOREST NO. 1)
ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1955

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by section 14 of the Forestry Ordinance, the following Order is hereby made at the request of the Tribal Authority of the Bombali Sebora Chiefdom, Bombali District, Northern Province:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Bombali Sebora Protected Forest No. 1) Order in Council, 1955.

2. The lands described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby constituted a Protected Forest within the meaning of the Forestry Ordinance.

SCHEDULE

ALL THAT PIECE OF LAND, comprising 827.7 acres or thereabouts, situated in the Bombali Sebora Chiefdom in the Bombali District of the Northern Province of the Protectorate of Sierra Leone and bounded as follows:—

WEST—

Starting from Boundary Mark No. 1, which is milestone 76 on the Magburaka to Makeni motor road, and situated on the northern side of the said road; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 51°30' for a distance of about 29.46 chains to Boundary Mark No. 2; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 351°00' for a distance of about 10.45 chains to Boundary Mark No. 3; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 38°15' for a distance of about 43.08 chains to Boundary Mark No. 4, which is situated on the eastern side of the Petifu to Petbana foot-path; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 23°23' for a distance of about 18.70 chains to Boundary Mark No. 5, which is situated on the eastern side of the Petifu to Petbana foot-path; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 130°00' for a distance of about 36.00 chains to Boundary Mark No. 6; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 23°30'

for a distance of about 27.70 chains to Boundary Mark No. 7; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 315°30' for a distance of about 26.6 chains to Boundary Mark No. 8; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 55°30' for a distance of about 20.0 chains to Boundary Mark No. 9, which is situated on the eastern side of the Petifu to Petbana foot-path; thence

NORTH—

by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 115°00' for a distance of about 51.34 chains to Boundary Mark No. 10, which is situated on the right bank of the Teko River; thence

EAST—

by the right bank of the said river downstream in a south-westerly direction to Boundary Mark No. 11 which is

EAST—
by the right bank of the said river downstream in a south-
westerly direction to Boundary Mark No. 11 which is
distant about 112.00 chains measured in a straight line
from Boundary Mark No. 10; thence by a demarcated line
cut on a bearing of approximately $360^{\circ}00'$ for a distance
of about 14.60 chains to Boundary Mark No. 12; thence
by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately
 $309^{\circ}30'$ for a distance of about 15.00 chains to Boundary
Mark No. 13; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing
of approximately $220^{\circ}30'$ for a distance of about 13.50
chains to Boundary Mark No. 14; thence by a demarcated
line cut on a bearing of approximately $170^{\circ}30'$ for a
distance of about 13.88 chains to Boundary Mark No. 15,
which is situated on the right bank of the Teko River;
thence by the right bank of the said river downstream in a
south-westerly direction to Boundary Mark No. 16, which
is situated on the north-western corner of the Teko Bridge
and distant about 43.00 chains measured in a straight line
from Boundary Mark No. 15; thence

SOUTH—
by the northern side of the Magburaka to Makeni motor
road north westwards for a distance of about 41.06 chains
to Boundary Mark No. 1 which is the starting point.

As the same is more particularly delineated on Forest Depart-
ment Plan No. BA. 2/52 and is shown thereon verged GREEN.

NOTE:—

- (i) All bearings given above are magnetic bearings taken in
the year 1951.
- (ii) All distances given above are in Gunter's chains of
66 feet.
- (iii) All Boundary Marks mentioned above are stone cairns.
- (iv) Demarcated lines mentioned above are cleared traces
marked at salient points by stone cairns.
