## THE FORESTRY ORDINANCE

(Cap. 86)

### THE FORESTRY (KISI TUNGI NATIVE ADMINISTRATION PROTECTED FOREST NO. 2) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1952

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by section 14 of the Forestry Ordinance, the following Order is hereby made at the request of the Regent Chief and members of the Tribal Authority of the Kisi Tungi Chiefdom in the Kailahun District, South-eastern Province.

1. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Kisi Tungi Native Administration Protected Forest No. 2) Order in Council, 1952.

2. The land described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby constituted a Protected Forest within the meaning of the Forestry Ordinance.

### SCHEDULE

ALL THAT LAND, comprising 106 acres or thereabouts, situated in the Kisi Tungi Chiefdom in the Kailahun District of the South-eastern Province of the Protectorate of Sierra Leone, bounded by a cleared trace and lying within 330 feet on either side of the centre line of the main 1950 Motor Road from Buedu to Kailahun, starting from a point about 841 feet from Mile Post 34, measured towards Mile Post 35, and ending on the left bank of the WANAWA River, which is distant about 1,921 feet from Mile Post 33, measured towards Mile Post 32, provided that the following areas shall be excluded from the Protected Forest:—

Between points distant about 332 feet and 475 feet from Mile Post 34, measured towards Mile Post 33, which includes a coffee plantation and lies on the southern side of the Motor Road.

Between points distant about 1,068 feet and 1,424 feet from Mile Post 34, measured towards Mile Post 33, which includes a coffee plantation and lies on the northern side of the Motor Road.
