THE FORESTRY ORDINANCE (Cap. 86)

FORESTRY (MOKANJI HILL NATIVE ADMINISTRATION PROTECTED FOREST) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1950.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by Section 14 of the Forestry Ordinance, the following Order is hereby made at the request of the Paramount Chief and members of the Council Authority of the Banta Chiefdom, Moyamba District, South-western Province.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Mokanji Hill Native Administration Protected Forest) Order in Council, 1950.
2. The lands described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby constituted a Protected Forest within the meaning of the Forestry Ordinance.

SCHEDULE

ALL THAT PIECE OF LAND comprising 260 acres or thereabouts, situated in the Banta Chiefdom in the Moyamba District of the South-western Province of the Protectorate of Sierra Leone and bounded as follows:-

STARTING - Starting from Boundary Mark No.1, which is situated about 4,060 feet south-east of the hammock path from Moyamba to Bantajuma on a cleared trace cut on a bearing of approximately 125 degrees from a point on the said hammock path about 757 feet west of the Njawul stream; thence by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 74 degrees for a distance of about 1,388 feet to Boundary Mark No.2 and on a bearing of approximately 110 degrees for a distance of about 1,197 feet to Boundary Mark No.3, which is situated on the boundary between Banta and Dasse Chiefdoms; thence

LAST - by a demarcated line cut as follows:-

by a demarcated line cut on a bearing of approximately 310
degrees for a distance of about 217 feet to Boundary Mark
No. 7, on a bearing of approximately 330 degrees for a dis-
tance of about 664 feet to Boundary Mark No. 8, on a bearing
of approximately 35 degrees for a distance of about 661 feet
to Boundary Mark No. 9, on a bearing of approximately 350
degrees for a distance of about 4,355 feet to Boundary Mark
No. 10, on a bearing of approximately 295 degrees for a
distance of about 837 feet to Boundary Mark No. 11 and on a
Bearing of approximately 346 degrees for a distance of about
830 feet to Boundary Mark No. 1 which is the starting point.

As the same is more particularly delineated on Plan No.
16/50 in the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Be, and shown
in green verged GREEN.

- (i) By "demarcated line" is meant a cleared trace marked at salient points with stone cairns.
- (ii) All Boundary Marks referred to above are stone cairns.
- (iii) Bearings are magnetic bearing taken in the year 1947.
