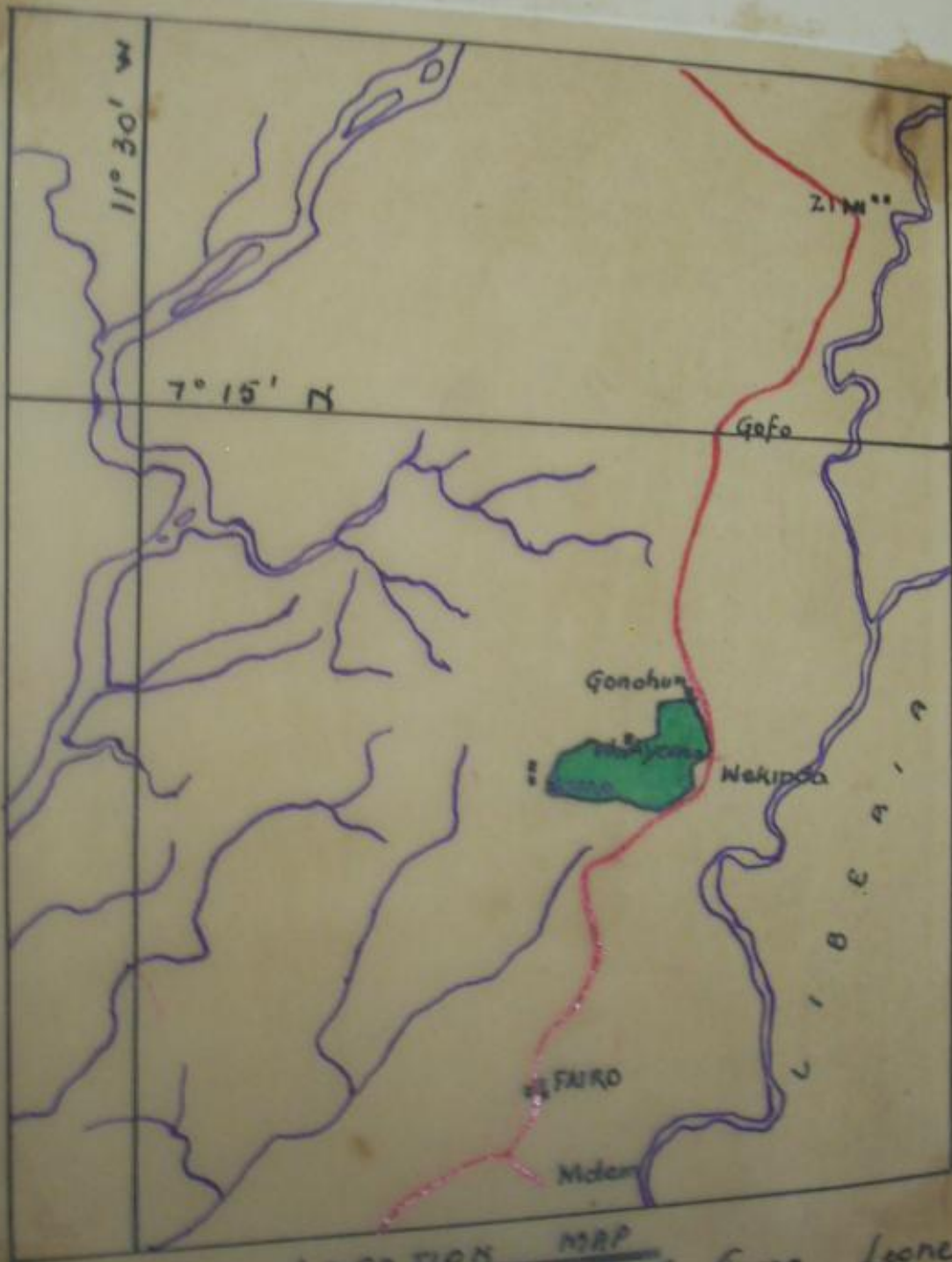


WAIKENDA WEST

THE FORESTRY ORDINANCE
(Cap. 86)

THE FORESTRY (WAIKENDA WEST PROTECTED FOREST)
ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1955

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by section 14 of the Forestry Ordinance, the following Order is hereby made at the request of the Tribal Authority, Soro-Gbema Chiefdom, Pujehun District South-western Province:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Waikenda West Protected Forest) Order in Council, 1955.
2. The lands described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby constituted a Protected Forest within the meaning of the Forestry Ordinance.

SCHEDULE

ALL THAT PIECE OR PARCEL OF LAND comprising 1,960 acres or thereabouts situated in the Soro-Gbema Chiefdom in the Pujehun District of the South-western Province of the Protectorate of Sierra Leone and bounded as follows:—

Starting from boundary stone 1, which is a stone cairn situated on the Western side of the motor road from Zimmi to Fairo and distant 17.92 chains in a southerly direction from Milestone 11 measured in the direction of Fairo; and thence by a series of cut and beacons lines as shown in the following table:—

Boundary stone 3 is situated on the northern side of the footpath from Gonohun Village to Woyema Village; thence along the said footpath to boundary stone 4, which is distant 24.4 chains, measured in a straight line on a bearing of 252½ degrees from boundary stone 3 and also on the northern side of the said path; thence by a series of cut and beacons lines as shown in the following table:—

Boundary stone 9 is situated on the southern side of the footpath from Woyema Village to Gbaama Village; thence by the said footpath to boundary stone 10, which is distant 10.00 chains measured in a straight line on a bearing of 263 degrees from boundary stone 9 and also on the southern side of the said path, thence by a series of cut and beacons lines as shown in the following table:—

Boundary stone 19 is situated on the northern side of the motor road from Zimmi to Fairo; thence by the northern side of the said road in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 81.36 chains to boundary stone 20; thence by a series of cut and beacons lines as shown in the following table:—

Boundary stone 23 is situated on the northern side of the motor road from Zimmi to Fairo; thence by the northern side of the said road in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 107.96 chains to boundary stone 1 which is the starting point.

As the same is illustrated on Plan No. Bo 141 in the office of the Chief Conservator of Forests, Freetown, and of the Divisional Forest Officer, Bo, and is shown thereon verged GREEN.

Note—

- (1) All bearings given above are approximate magnetic bearings taken in the year 1954.
- (2) All distances given above are approximate and are measured in Gunter's chains of 66 feet.
- (3) All boundary stones given are stone cairns.
