THE FORESTRY ORDINANCE, 1924
(Cap. 74)

THE FARANGBAIA FOREST RESERVE ORDER, 1945

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor by section 11 of the Forestry Ordinance, 1924, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Farangbaia Forest Reserve Order, 1945.

2. The land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby constituted a Forest Reserve.

3. The people of the Dansogoya Chiefdom shall be entitled at all times to enter the Forest Reserve hereby created, without fee, let or hindrance for the following purposes:—

- (1) To travel through the Reserve from place to place.
- (2) To collect the fruits of *Elaeis Guineensis*.
Kuranko name—Teynu (oil palm).
- (3) To collect the fruits of all plants sown or planted by them before 16th May, 1945.
- (4) To tap palms of the species *raphia vinifera* for palm wine. Kuranko name—Banyu (bamboo palm).
- (5) To hunt, capture or kill wild animals, birds, fish or reptiles in accordance with the law.
- (6) To collect such forest produce as may be reasonably necessary for erecting and maintaining buildings of native construction for their own domestic use and as may be set aside for this purpose by the Conservator of Forests, or by an Officer authorised by him in that behalf; and the Conservator of Forests or Officer so authorised by him shall set aside sufficient forest produce to satisfy the reasonable requirements of the said natives for the purpose aforesaid.

Provided always that none of these reserved rights may be sold or disposed of or exercised by Agents.

THE SCHEDULE

ALL THAT PART AND PARCEL OF LAND in the Dansogoia Chiefdom of the Tonkolili District and bounded as follows:—

Starting from B.S. 1 (P.C.S. 6039) which is on the right bank of the Mankani Stream at its confluence with the Tonkolili River; thence up stream along the right bank of the Mankani Stream in a north north-easterly direction to B.S. 2 for a distance of 720.0 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 48° to B.S. 3 which is on the bank of the Sankaleiye Stream for a distance of 2562.78 feet more or less; thence along the right bank of the Sankaleiye Stream in a north north-easterly direction to B.S. 4 for a distance of 1179.42 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 100° to B.S. 5 on the Farangbaia-Bumbuna Road Trace for a distance of 856.68 feet more or less; thence following the Farangbaia-Bumbuna Road Trace in a general north-easterly direction to B.S. 6 which is on the bank of the Masonkani Stream for a distance of 7557.7 feet more or less; thence up stream along the left bank of the Masonkani Stream to its confluence with an unnamed stream in a general north-westerly direction to B.S. 7 for a distance of 3235.32 feet more or less; thence up stream along the left bank of the Masonkani Stream to its source in a general north north-easterly direction to B.S. 8 for a distance of 935.22 feet more or less; thence along a water course in a general north north-westerly direction to B.S. 9 for a distance of 797.28 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of $302^{\circ} 30'$ to B.S. 10 which is on the crest of the hill for a distance of 1364.22 feet more or less; thence along the crest of the hill range on a magnetic bearing of 225° to B.S. 11 for a distance of 822.36 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 228° to B.S. 12 for a distance of 976.80 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 270° to B.S. 13 for a distance of 273.24 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 180° to B.S. 14 for a distance of 1588.80 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 155° to B.S. 15 for a distance of 976.80 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 225° to B.S. 16 for a distance of 1768.8 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 198° to B.S. 17 for a distance of 654.06 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 243° to B.S. 18 for a distance of 963.60 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 225° to B.S. 19 for a distance of 1320.0 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 285° to B.S. 20 for a distance of 2384.58 feet more or less; thence on a magnetic bearing of 228° to B.S. 21 for a distance of 1619.50 feet more

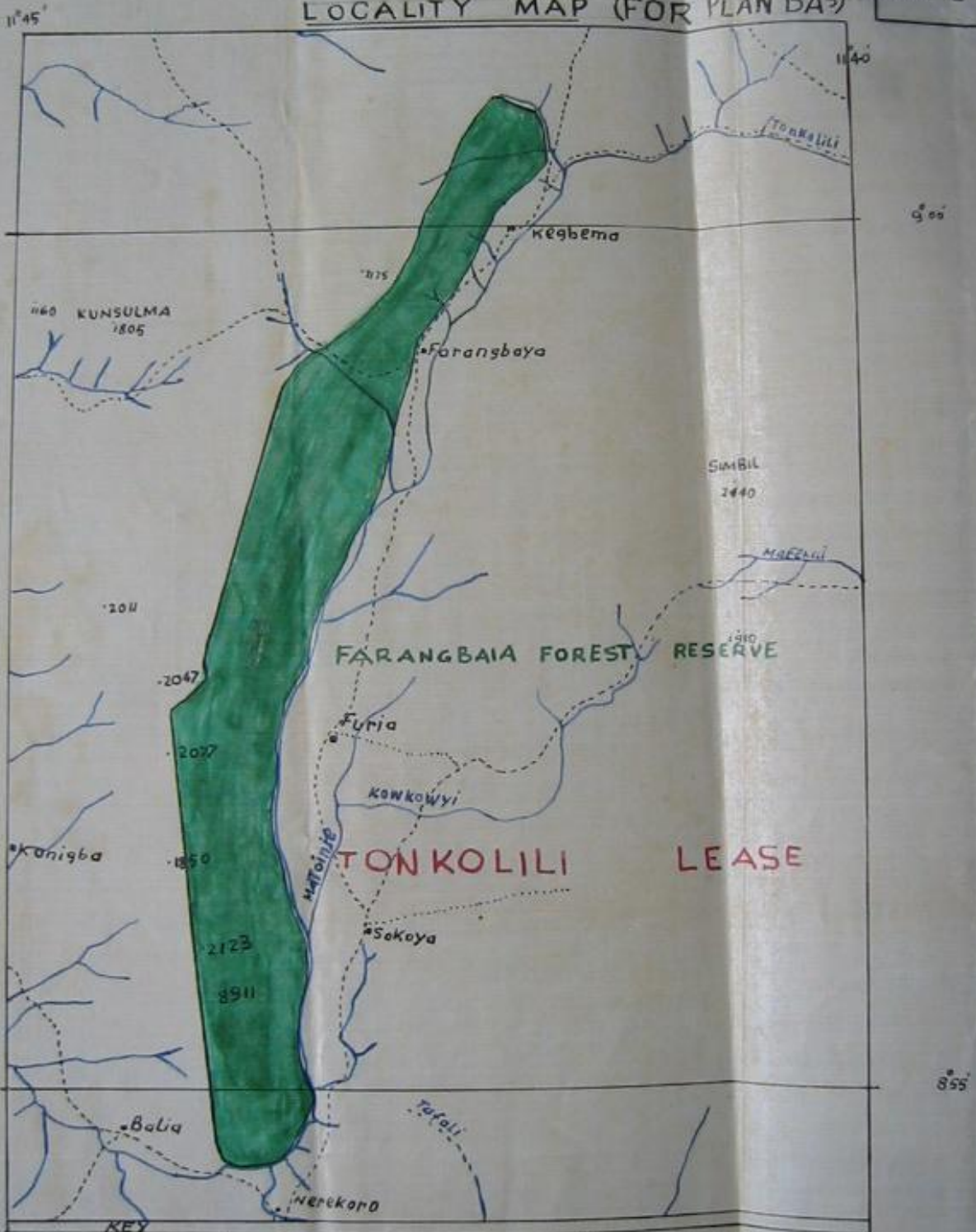
